1BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I2MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, "Rosalia "Mama Chai" Fejeran Mateo is a Yo'åmte (master traditional healer), who has positively impacted many lives throughout her 63 years of service to the Guam community and the Micronesian Region. She is Saina to her 7 children, 40 grandchildren, 28 great grandchildren and 6 greatgreat grandchildren, as well as to many other children, youth and families who look to her for guidance and counsel; and

9 WHEREAS, Rosalia is fondly known as Mama Chai. She started her 10 apprenticeship in traditional healing practices at the age of 19 under the 11 mentorship of Yo'åmte Regina Terlaje. Mama Chai has learned and continues to 12 exchange experiences with other traditional healers in the Pacific; and

WHEREAS, In 2014, the late Yo'amte, Emilio (Uncle Mil) Ayuyu introduced Mama Chai to members of the Haya Foundation. Uncle Mil encouraged her to join Haya Foundation to promote indigenous healing practices, and to teach those desiring to learn. With more encouragement by Yo'Amte Frances Meno, Mama Chai agreed. Mama Chai's Håya family fondly describe her to be "dudus" (flirty) and "tak'la'lu" (temperamental). She's direct with her
approach when needed and mild when a client needs the tenderness and loving
care of a mom. Some are taken aback by her direct approach, but many persevere
and work with her and see phenomenal results and end up referring their friends,
families and acquaintances; and

WHEREAS, Many grow in awe of her selflessness, strength and 6 compassion. There are many testimonials of people who have been helped or 7 family members who witness her amazing gift in action such as: Men and women 8 who suffered strokes, resulting in limited physical mobility and speech 9 impairments, who then were helped to speak with more clarity and walk without 10 assistance; their emotional and mental health status also improved; A few 11 individuals suffering from diabetes and who faced possible amputations, 12 however, after receiving treatment from Mama, such surgeries were not needed; 13 Women who were experiencing fertility problems and conceiving, and felt 14 hopeless prior to being treated, yet returned the following year(s) with their babies 15 16 in tow, to honor and thank Mama Chai; and

WHEREAS, As tradition dictates, Mama Chai does not charge a fee for her services. She attributes her abilities as a gift from the Ultimate Healer. Tradition also dictates that people participate in their healing by caring for the welfare and well-being of the healers with gifts of cash or goods. Aside from the time spent helping people, she spends a lot of time tending to her plants and gardens and going around the island to collect the medicinal plants, herbs and trees to prepare her remedies; now therefore, be it
