BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

WHEREAS, the Girl Scouts was founded in 1912 and is the largest girl-serving organization in the United States and a member of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts, a sisterhood of close to 10 million girls and adults in 145 countries; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Girl Scouts is license by Girl Scours of the USA and incorporated on Guam and was established in 1935 by Agueda Johnston and Frances Darr and is 100% locally funded through board fundraisers, grants, and cookie sales; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Girl Scouts is to build courage, confidence, and character to make the world a better place; and the Girl Scouts is a value based organization dedicated to helping girls develop their leadership skills and are also given the opportunity to discover more about themselves, connect with others in their community, and take action to make their world a better place; and

1 **WHEREAS**, the Guam Girl Scouts strives to be the premier leadership
2 organization for girls and is open to all girls ages 5-17 with 18 troops in schools and
3 villages currently in place across the island with over 40 leaders and mentors; and

4 **WHEREAS**, the Guam Girl Scouts enjoy activities including environmental
5 care, sports, art, music, service project, career exploration, technology events, cultural
6 diversity celebrations and summer camps; and

7 **WHEREAS**, Girl Scout Leader's Day, also known as Girl Scout Leader
8 Appreciation Day, is an annual celebration held on April 22 that honors all Girl Scout
9 volunteers and troop leaders; Girl Scout Leaders are adult volunteers who serve as
10 guides and mentors that help girls develop skills and confidence to new experiences that
11 show Girl Scouts what they are capable of; and volunteers make exceptional
12 contributions as role models and belong to a network of nearly one million adults who
13 help share in the effort to preparing Girl Scouts to lead successful lives in a safe learning
14 environment that allows them to pursue their interests, causes, and roles that are most
15 important to them; now, therefore be it

17 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people
