The Guam Legislature

The 32nd Guam Legislature is one of the three co-equal branches of the Government of Guam. The Guam Legislature is the lawmaking body of our government, setting policy for our island. The Legislature consists of fifteen senators, elected at-large from our island's voters, and serving a term of two years.

In creating laws for our island, senators create and introduce bills that address specific issues important to education, public safety, healthcare, social issues, etc. These bills have public hearings where members of the public are encouraged to comment, participate in, support or oppose the bill. Senators also conduct roundtable discussions, oversight hearings of government agencies, and participate in Legislative Sessions where bills are deliberated among all senators.

Among the fifteen members of the Legislature, the Senators have elected officers to guide their proceedings. Currently, the Speaker is Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D. Vice-Speaker is Benjamin J.F. Cruz, and the Legislative Secretary is Tina Rose Muña Barnes








