



HK protesters target malls, shops

HONG KONG (Reuters) - Hong Kong pro-democracy activists and riot police clashed in chaotic scenes around the city on Sunday, with police in riot gear chasing protesters through crowds of lunchtime shoppers.

Rallies in shopping malls on Hong Kong island and across the harbor in the Kowloon district began peacefully around midday with a few hundred people at each chanting "Free Hong Kong" and other slogans.

The <u>Committee on Health, Tourism, Historic Preservation, Land and Justice</u> convened a public hearing on <u>Thursday, October 17, 2019</u> at <u>1:00</u> PM in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of <u>Angela M. Camacho</u> to serve as a <u>Member</u> of <u>Guam Ancestral Lands Commission</u>, and whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by <u>I Maga'hågan Guåhan</u> on <u>September 19, 2019</u>, for <u>four (4) years; August 18, 2019 to August 17, 2023</u>, to fill the expired term of <u>Antonio A. Sablan</u>;
- Appointment packet forwarded to I Liheslatura on September 20, 2019;
- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on <u>September 30, 2019</u>.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 1:03 PM.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you very much. We're going to begin with the appointment of Angela M. Camacho as a member of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission is a very unique commission on Guam authorized to and directed to establish and maintain 5 separate registries for the purposes of recording accurate information in the settlement of ancestral claims on original landowner's registry, excess lands registry, a claims registry, conditional awards registry and an ancestral title registry.

Which is a listing of applicants granted land title in return for the surrender of all their ancestral property claims. As we know ancestral property was taken from the Guam landowners and the U.S. government and it was the Government of Guam that decided to create a commission.

And that when land was returned to the Government of Guam they would in turn, return that to the original landowners. And so, it is this the duty of this commission to determine those original landowners to ensure that fairness and justice occurs and owners who ones are unlikely to get their land back.

Yet the Government of Guam is trying to also compensate them for the loss of that lands and so, that is where it gets very complex for the commission to solve those problems. We're not problems but to solve and to really benefit these landowners. And we've seen now decades of the effects of land takings on families, on generations.

And so, your work is not only very important but very urgent. That being said, if you would like to provide testimony please do.

Angela M. Camacho:

Please see attached testimony.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you very much, Ms. Camacho. I'm glad you read the statute that you talked about your and ancestral lands history because that is what are the criteria for this board. And so, that is satisfied.

Si Yu'os ma'åse'

I'm going to now all the Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission to testify Mr. Joseph Angoco.

Joseph Angoco:

Yes. Good afternoon, Senator Terlaje and Senator Taitague. My name is Joseph Angoco, I'm the Executive Director for the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission. Have been as this position since January 23rd of this year. As confirmed by the GALC board.

Several months ago, Ms. Camacho, indicated her interest in serving as a board member. I advised her that one it prerequisites to become a board member was you had to be either a dispossessed landowner heir or descendent. I instructed her these steps to take, to find out and she did contact the staff at the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission. And from there was confirmed that she was indeed a dispossessed landowner descendent.

My testimony will be short. I've known Ms. Camacho approximately for a year. In my observation over, she has uncanny way of dealing with any given subject situation. Her meticulousness is commendable. I have witnessed her in several of the meetings with the administration where she has sat in to speak on behalf of her boss namely – Alice Taijeron, the Director for the Guam Housing Corporation.

She presents several options and alternatives giving it a very clear and approachable and logical way to address certain matters. I believe and I guess that's why I am here to testify in her behalf as the Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

There are many beneficiaries that would be critical of the decisions that we make. Since they are concerned about you know particularly compensation and many issues. The lack of access, patience into their ancestral lots. I need a person like Ms. Camacho. Simply to present different alternatives as there are many, many, many different options that the public provides during my you know the GALC board meetings. That's held twice a month; the second Wednesday and the fourth Wednesday of every month.

And so, given that is why I'm here to support for a confirmation. She brings a fresh approach and is very knowledgeable of both the business and government sector in dealing with situations that most an average citizen does not. And that is my testimony.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Si Yu'os ma'åse' Mr. Angoco.

Senator Taitague?

Senator Telo Taitague:

Thank you, Madame Chair. And Madame Chair for the record, I just wanted to indulge that I'm a very good friend of Angie Camacho. We've known each other for over 16 years or 15 years and Angie, if I was not sitting here, I'd be sitting down there right now testifying in your favor and your character, your honesty and all the things that I've known you to be.

I've actually Madame Chair actually seek advice from Ms. Camacho on several occasions, you know certain things. Subject matters that would be helpful in actually making decisions that are morally and ethically correct.

That's why I know especially in this position that you're taking. Which needs those attributes to be honest, ethically, morally correct when it comes to people's properties. And I know that you carry that trait as someone who's known you for over 15, 16 years and I'm my only sad thing is that now you're probably going to get rid of one of these things. Which is the real estate property. You're not going to have time just taking your position at the Guam Housing has limited you know extra work that you have placed on your time.

Which is almost nil now because of all the good work that you've done at Guam Housing. I commend you for that. I knew they chose the right person. So, congratulations on your new program that you have going and put in place and it's long needed.

There is something I'm hoping that you stay on top of it with the good Director here. Thank you, Joe. Good to see you, Joe. And that is the part where GEDA is actually your administrator for properties. They oversee some of the lands that have you know and they help generate funding and revenue for you, for ancestral land.

And one of the biggest findings is when we were working with the fiber optic cables. They looked into it and I knew about that but I'm glad that they finally you know decided to take it

by the rain and move forward and that is the \$4.5 million that were discovered that AT&T owes the Guam Ancestral lands.

Now there's going to be a lot of movement, a lot of movement moving forward or hoping that a bill that passes in the next session on the fiber optic cables task force will be put into place. And there's going to be a lot of help and information needed by ancestral lands to be able to recover or assess fees.

And this is another opportunity that I hope Angie that you take this by the horns and go with it because I know that ancestral lands needs funding and it's very interesting. Please come to my office anytime you know you have my number, I think you know it by hear.

Call me up if you want more information on it, to help you. But I think GEDA they were in a conference call with me, with FCC yesterday and they're very were a little bit more versed on what the federal side is on fiber optic cables now we need the local side to assess.

Okay. So, that's what's happening Angie. Ai adai ready go, set, go because I know you're going to do a lot of things at ancestral lands and don't over you know extend yourself because I know you tend to want to help everybody.

So, good luck to you. You know you have my support and I asked kindly ask Madame Chair you know for this support or and she can watch

Angela M. Camacho:

Thank you, senator.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you, senator.

Ms. Camacho?

Angela M. Camacho:

Yes.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

If we could get a copy of your testimony sometime that would help us and putting together the committee report. But also, if I could just ask you a couple of things from what you said.

So, first of all you are the housing manager at the Guam Housing Corporation, that is an unclassified position?

Angela M. Camacho:

Correct.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

How long have you had that position?

Angela M. Camacho:

January of this year.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Okay so, do you see that this is there any potential conflict in holding that position and being on this commission?

Angela M. Camacho:

I don't see any but definitely if there were any if it was a voting thing I wouldn't vote on it. As a realtor we follow a high standard of code of ethics and honesty's definitely big in our business.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

I was going to ask you the same thing about your role as a realtor. If that if you foresee any conflict and with the role as an ancestral land commission member.

Angela M. Camacho:

As Senator Taitague mentioned I have very little time for real estate. Although I do have you know not very many but a few clients and customers that I've taken care of for a very long time and will be there if they need me. But other than that, I'm not taking new business and I don't actively work as a realtor.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right. Well we know that the Ancestral Lands Commission is involved with you know they're looking for investment of use of their property. So, for income as we discussed but mostly yeah, it's a fiduciary role for the benefit of the beneficiaries. That's your primary goal, right as opposed to creating any kind of kingdom at the ancestral lands commission.

We need to benefit these beneficiaries whose families have been displaced in many, many occasions and they've waited many years. So, it's tough it's going to be tough but I think I'm hoping your realtor expertise and your housing management expertise is actually going to help this ancestral land commission in very specific ways.

What about business interests? Do you have any other outside business interest that might conflict?

Angela M. Camacho:

No, senator I don't have time for anything other than what's in front of us already.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right. Well I want to thank you for taking this position. What about your ancestral land is that resolved, pending or what is the status?

Joseph Angoco:

If I may chime in Senator Terlaje. First of all, I just wanted to just add in the Guam Economic Development Authority performs as a property management team for the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission that is simply a memo of understanding. That there's no legal binding wait should we decide to outsource and seek other means of investment consultants or investment management.



Secondly, in regards to Ms. Camacho requisite as a descendent of an ancestral landowner. Several board members are also realtors. They have also but they have been they have gone to the briefings and have been made clear of the law regarding possible conflicts on interest.

In Public Law 25-45, if I may just go back that was passed, I believe in June of 1999 by republican-controlled work with then democratic Governor Carl Gutierrez. They came together I believe to exact some form of justice for the ancestral landowners dispossessed lands by coming together and when bringing about coming together and with the intent of doing pursing or starting the process of pursuing. A means to take care of these folks. The board members that are serving right now. A majority of the 7 board members I believe at least 4 of them are realtors. But at no time have they every displayed to me any and mind you they were all nominated by previous administrations. Have displayed any form of conflicts and I work very well with them simply because we agree to disagree.

Yes, they do give me a hard time that every board meeting at that's twice a month and so I believe that Ms. Camacho in her meticulous way and her objectivity will likewise do the same. I'm just hoping that we can work together.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

As Chairperson of the committee put these things on the record so that it's clear going forward and these are historical documents that look back on later. And I just want those to be clear on the record.

So, Ms. Camacho, if you don't mind if you could just tell us what you understand to be the status of your ancestral land's claims.

Angela M. Camacho:

So, we're talking about Lot 5172 which is Oka, Tamuning. We reside there, so, I'm pretty sure that's already been resolved.

Joseph Angoco:

I could easily provide that answer for you senators. As Mr. Joseph Borja the Department of Land Management Director. I was just I believe confirmed here in August of this year states in his during his confirmation hearing process.



Records with the Department of are there. However, about 40% of the records are still have not been scanned so to speak. So, intensive research will have to be conducted within the Department of Land Management, the Superior Court of Guam and the District Court of Guam and any other resources.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Mr. Angoco, I'm not asking you to resolve her claim right now. I just want to know what is the status. If she has pending claim that's relevant. I think if she her land is one of the those that's for example under the Tiyan airport and if there are beneficiaries of compensation that's I just think that's relevant. So, she thinks that those claims are resolved.

Angela M. Camacho:

Not to my knowledge.

Joseph Angoco:

Understood. I just wanted to clarify that a majority of them several the board members as a prerequisite and in the process of serving as commissioners. You need to be I don't know I believe I understand the intent why the 25th Guam Legislature inserted that requirement that you be a descendent. You know just simply because I guess you would have the feeling.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

We've established she's qualified. So, thank you. All right. So, thank you, Mr. Angoco and *Si Yu'os ma'ase' talu* Ms. Camacho. And thank you for agreeing to serve on this commission. It might be very time consuming they have 2 meetings a month. Are you going to be able to make those?

Angela M. Camacho:

I'll be there.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right. Si Yu'os ma'ase' Thank you very much.



Angela M. Camacho:

Thank you too.

<u>Joseph Angoco:</u>

Thank you, senators.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right. That concludes the portion of this public hearing regarding the appointment of Ms. Angela Camacho to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

Thank you.

The public hearing was adjourned at 1:57 PM.

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

- Mr. Joseph Angoco, Executive Director of the Ancestral Lands Commission submitted testimony in support of the nominee, describing her meticulousness and ability to presents solutions and alternatives in very clear, approachable, and logical way to address certain matters
- Ms. Camacho testified in regards to her qualifications and commitment to serve.
- Ms. Camacho indicated she did not foresee any conflicts of interest in her role as Housing Manager at Guam Housing Corporation and her designation as a realtor but would abstain from voting on the Commission should a conflict present itself, and that she does not currently actively work as a realtor. MS. Camacho assured the Committee that she would adhere to high ethical standards, as is required of her as a realtor.
- Ms. Camacho indicated that her Ancestral Land Claim has been resolved, as she is currently residing on the lot that was claimed.
- Ms. Camacho assured the Committee that she would attend said meetings.
- The Committee finds that Ms. Camacho also possesses the experience, expertise, and commitment to serve on the Commission.
