Madame Chairperson; Members of the Committee on Health, Tourism, Historic Preservation, Land, and Justice; and the People of Guam. I am Arlene Bordallo, wife of the late Senator Paul Joseph Bordallo, who introduced the bill that established the Chamorro Land Trust Commission in 1974.

My husband created the Land Trust because he predicted that Guam's land would fall into foreign ownership to such an extent that the CHamorus would be pushed out of their homeland. He saw when the tourist industry started developing on Guam in the late-sixties that many landowners sold out to Japanese, American, and other business interests.

So here we are now. As the years go by, this trend has only accelerated, which has brought great challenges to many CHamorus who struggle daily to raise their families and make a living on Guam.

I fully support the original intention behind the creation of the Land Trust. I support my fellow CHamorus, and I believe this entity is the best hope for our people to continue inhabiting our homeland.

I still remember a time when CHamorus felt comfortable and safe anywhere on this island. Through my own experience in business, government, and civic involvement, I sense the anxiety and hardship among the people. My hope is that the Land Trust fulfill its purpose and that we CHamoru people face our future with confidence and dignity.

Si Yu'os Ma'ase Senator Therese Terlaje and members of the Committee for allowing me to testify before you and the people. Also, Si Yu'os Ma'ase, Maga'håga Lou Leon Guerrero and Lieutenant Governor Josh Tenorio for allowing me to serve the people of Guam in your administration.

Chamorro Land Trust Commission (§ §13500 - 13516), enacted by P.L. 12-226. Section 5 of P.L. 12-226 reads as follows:

"Section 5. Effective Date. Section 1 shall take effect in two steps: Section 1 of the bill and Sections 13501 and 13503(b) of Section 2 of the bill shall take effect January 1, 1975. The remaining sections in Section 1, and Sections 2 and 3 shall take effect on the date the Commission has its first meeting."

The Chamorro Land Trust Commission held its first meeting in March of 1993.

2017 NOTE: Past print publications of the GCA included an annotation from the previous Compiler, recognizing that, since the enactment P.L. 12-226 (Feb. 4, 1975) that created the Chamorro Land Trust Commission, "the Legislature has passed many laws dealing with the transfer, lease, exchange and sale of governmental land," and some "make no reference whatsoever to the Chamorro Land Trust Act" while others "expressly waive its provisions." The Compiler's Note listed "all laws, which, in some manner, waive the applicability of the Land Trust Act to certain land transactions." This annotation is outdated and therefore, has been removed from future publications of the GCA.

#### § 75101. Definitions.

When used in this title:

- (a) The term *Commission* means the Chamorro Land Trust Commission.
  - (b) The term territory means the territory of Guam.
- (c) The term *Chamorro homelands* means all lands given the status of Chamorro homelands under the provisions of § 75105 of this Chapter.
- (d) The term *Native Chamorro* means any person who became a U.S. citizen by virtue of the authority and enactment of the Organic Act of Guam or descendants of such person.
- (e) The term department means the Department of Land Management.
- (f) The term Suruhana or Suruhanu means a publicly recognized individual who heals through massage and the use of traditional Chamorro remedies that include the use of roots, leaves, bark, plants, and grass and incorporates the cultural healing process.

SOURCE: GC § 13500 repealed and reenacted by P.L. 12-226. Subsection (d) amended by P.L. 15-113:1. Subsection (f) added by P.L. 30-032 (June 16, 2009).

§ 75102. Commission: Composition, Chairman, Compensation.

- (a) There is within the government of Guam the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. The Commission shall be composed of five members to be appointed by the Governor with the confirmation of the Legislature. Commission members shall be appointed within sixty (60) days after the enactment of this Chapter. All members shall have been residents of the Territory at least three (3) years prior to their appointment and at least three of the members shall be native Chamorro. Members shall serve terms of three (3) years, provided, however, that of the members first appointed, one shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year and two shall be appointed for terms of two (2) years. The members of the Commission shall be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each day's attendance at a meeting of the Commission, provided, however, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred dollars (\$100) per month. The Governor shall appoint the Chairman of the Commission from among the members thereof. The Commission shall have its first meeting within twenty (20) days after confirmation of its members.
- (b) The Commission may employ such clerical and other assistants who shall be classified employees as may be necessary to effectively execute its responsibilities. In addition, the Commission shall employ and fix the compensation for an Administrative Director who shall serve in a full-time capacity and who shall exercise such powers and authority as may be delegated to him by the Commission. The Director shall be a native Chamorro. Furthermore, the Commission may employ and fix the salary of professional consultants.
- (c) The Commission shall meet regularly on the third\_Thursday of every month at 1 p.m. or more often as determined by the Chairperson of the Commission. At its first meeting the Commission shall select a Vice Chairperson who shall conduct the meetings in the absence of the Chairman. In the absence of both the Chairperson and the Vice-Chairperson from a meeting, a quorum of the members shall select an Acting Chairperson to conduct the meeting until the Vice-Chairperson or Chairperson is in attendance. In the absence of a quorum, Minutes shall be prepared indicating the lack of a quorum, the date, and the members in attendance. Any appointed member of the Commission who fails to attend three (3) consecutive regular meetings, without being excused pursuant to a motion passed by the Commission, shall automatically be disqualified to continue serving in his or her position and the appointing authority shall then be required to appoint a replacement for said member. The Executive Director

shall transmit to I Maga'lahi and I Liheslatura notice of three (3) unexcused absences of any member.

#### § 75103. Administration.

- (a) The Commission shall adopt rules, regulations, and policies in accordance with Article 3, Chapter 9 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, Government Operations. The Commission may accept grants, contributions, and appropriations and may make such expenditures, loans and other disbursements as are authorized by this Chapter. These disbursements shall be allowed and paid out in accordance with the direction of the Commission upon presentation to the Administrative Director of itemized vouchers therefor signed by the Commission certifying officer.\* The Administrative Director shall give bond in the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for the faithful performance of his duties. These funds created by § 75112 of this Chapter shall be maintained separate and apart from any other government fund and shall be in the custody of the Commission certifying officer. The Commission shall make an annual finance and progress report to the Legislature upon the first date of each regular session thereof and such special reports as the Legislature may from time to time require.
- (b) When land originally leased by the Commission is, in turn, subleased by the Commission's lessee or sublessee, the Commission shall submit, within ten (10) days of the convening of any regular session, a written report to the Legislature which shall cover the sublease transactions occurring in the calendar year prior to the regular session and shall contain the names of the persons involved in the transaction, the size of the area under lease, the purpose of the lease, the land classification of the area under lease, the lease rental, the reason for approval of the sublease by the Commission, and the estimated net economic result accruing to the Commission lessee, and sublessee.
- (c) The Commission shall have the power and authority to invest and re-invest any of the money in any of its funds, not otherwise immediately needed for the purposes of the funds in such bonds and securities authorized in 4 GCA Chapter 8. Any interest or other earnings arising out of such

investment shall be credited to and deposited in the Chamorro Home Loan Fund.

NOTE: Reference to Chapter III, Title V of this Code, (Retirement of Public Employees), changed by Compiler to conform with the GCA recodification.

- (d) The Commission is authorized to carry on any activities it deems necessary to assist lessees in obtaining maximum utilization of leased lands, including taking any steps necessary to develop these lands for their highest and best use commensurate with the purposes for which the land is being leased as provided for in § 75107, and assisting lessees in all phases of farming and ranching operations and the marketing of their agricultural produce and livestock. In these efforts the Commission shall coordinate its efforts with the Department of Agriculture.
- (e) The Commission, may designate and plan subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 62 of this Title 21 Guam Code Annotated, on available lands, in, adjacent to, or near any village. Subdivision lots shall be leased in accordance with § 75107.
- (f) Assistance in the Development and Administrative Implementation of Loan and Fund Programs The Chamorro Land Trust Commission is authorized to enter into memorandums of agreement, or contract with government or private agencies or lending institutions, relative to servicing loans made or guaranteed by the Commission pursuant to §§ 75112, 75113 and 75114, or other applicable provisions of this Chapter 75, applicable law and regulation.

The Commission shall provide for in its administrative rules and regulations the processes by which non-government of Guam agencies, to include Federal agencies and instrumentalities and private lending institutions, may participate in the Commission's revolving fund and special fund programs, to the extent authorized pursuant to this Chapter 75, applicable law and regulation.

- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on <u>June 25, 2019</u>.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was called to order at 5:00 PM. Chairperson Therese Terlaje presented the agenda items that would be heard during the hearing. The appointment of Arlene P. Bordallo to serve as a Member of the CHamoru Land Trust Commission was the only item on the agenda.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Håfa adai! Thank you all for being here today.

The Committee on Health, Tourism, Historic Preservation, Land and Justice is now called to order. Today is August 16, 2019. The time is 5:05 PM.

Notices for this Confirmation Hearing were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on August 10th, 2019 and again on August 14th, 2019. The notice was also published in the Guam Daily Post on August 5th and August 14th, 2019.

We only have one item on the agenda today and that is the Confirmation Hearing for Arlene P. Bordallo as a Member of the CHamoru Land Trust Commission.

I'd like to thank those who are in attendance here today and also acknowledged the presence of Tan Amanda Santos, who is a Commissioner of the CHamoru Land Trust for many years. Thank you, Tan Amanda for being here.

So, I'd like to ask anyone who's interested in testifying and the nominee, Ms. Arlene Bordallo, if you could come and sit in the middle. And if there's anyone else who would wish to testify orally, if you could please have a seat.

Before we hear from the panel. Thank you.

I'd like to acknowledge the presence of my colleagues. Thank you, Senator Régine Biscoe Lee and Senator James Moylan. Thank you for being here senators.

So, before we hear from the panel, I would first like to site mandates of the CHamoru Land Trust Commission, which can also be found on their website:

- CLTC is responsible for the disposition of CHamoru Homelands (public lands)
  pursuant to mandates to advance the social, cultural and economic development
  and well-being of the CHamoru people by way of residential, agricultural and
  commercial land distribution and economic assistance programs.
- It is CLTC's mission to carry on any activities necessary to assist and inform the CHamoru community in obtaining maximum utilization of lands, including development of lands for their highest and best use, in all phases of Residential and Agricultural leasing, and Commercial licensing.

I want to thank Ms. Bordallo for accepting the executive appointment as a Member of the CHamoru Land Trust Commission and congratulate her on her nomination. Mrs. Bordallo is the wife of the †late Senator Paul Bordallo.

The †late Senator Paul Bordallo, coincidentally was the author of the CHamoru Land Trust Commission Act, the CHamoru Land Trust Act.

He had the vision and the fortitude and political will to get this passed in 1975, 44 years ago. It was passed unanimously by the 12th Legislature.

After passage and for 44 years, or for maybe less than 44 years now maybe 20 years, no Governor would implement the Act until the *I Nasion CHamoru* under the leadership of *Difunto* Senator Angel Santos, *Difunto Maga'lahi* Ed Benavente and their wives, and others, led an education and advocacy campaign urging the Governor to implement the Trust.

The Governor refused to implement and a suit was filed by Attorneys Mike Phillips, Mike Bordallo, and Therese Terlaje (myself). This was a pro bono lawsuit (without fees) on behalf of Angel Santos and the Chamorro Nation to force implementation.

The AG argued at the time that the Trust was unconstitutional. A hearing in the lawsuit was held while hundreds led a protest and campout on the grounds of Adelup. A decision was made in 1992 by then Judge Benjamin Cruz that the law was valid and ordering the Governor to implement the Act and appoint the first Commissioners.

Several years later, in 1995, when Angel Santos was a senator, he introduced the rules and regulations for the Trust which were slightly different than what the Commissioners had originally written, and controversial at the time. Again, he led hundreds in appearing before the Legislature to urge lawmakers to adopt the rules, which they eventually did.

With a few amendments over these years, the rules continue today. Of course, last year the CHamoru Land Trust Commission and the island were shaken by the news of inconsistent treatment of applicants, non-collection of commercial lease payments, and other issues, as well as a lawsuit filed against the CHamoru Land Trust Commission by the U.S. Department of Justice for housing discrimination.

These seeming problems forced the Trustees and CHamoru Land Trust Commission, the staff under the direction of the Chair, Pika Fejeran, to put in many, many hours investigating, accounting, and finding solutions to the problems that were raised.

The lawsuit is still pending and settlement negotiations are ongoing. The work of the Commission to resolve past management issues is intense, and time consuming and requires truly dedicated Commission members.

The Commissioners are strictly volunteers, and under Chairwoman Fejeran meets at a minimum once a month for approximately 4 hours, and for the past several months have met twice a month for approximately 8 hours. Preparing for the meetings takes 2-3 hours, they've told me. The subcommittee work also requires additional time outside of the commission meetings.

So, I just wanted to put that on the record so that we are under this understanding of the work that's really involved in this commission.

And to thank you again for accepting. So, without further ado if I could hear from *Tan* Amanda first and then we'll hear from the nominee.

Tan Amanda?

#### Amanda Santos:

Please see attached testimony.

#### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os ma'åse' Tan Amanda.

Are there any questions for Tan Amanda at this time?

All right. And so, if Mrs. Bordallo, if you could give your testimony.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Please see attached testimony.

Si Yu'os ma'åse' Tan Amanda, Senator Therese Terlaje, Senator Lee and James Moylan, senator.

I'm sorry. Thank you.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

No need to be sorry. Thank you very much.

So, my colleagues have any questions for any member of the panel?

Senator Lee?

## Senator Régine Biscoe Lee:

Si Yu'os ma'åse' Madame Chair.

I just want to also start by thanking our *Maga Haga* for this appointment. I think it's very, obviously, its timely but I think it's very well-reasoned and thought out. And I think that I also want to thank you, Madame Chair for hearing this appointment and Auntie Arlene, I want to thank you and your family especially. As the Chair had mentioned, this board takes a lot of not just time and preparation, but a lot of heart.

And I think that those of us who know you know that you possess all of the qualities that are going to be really important for this board. You're very hard worker, that's evidence in the work that you do not just for your business and for your family but all of the civic engagement that you've done. I know we've both been members of the Guam Women's Club and other organizations for many years. And so I thank you so much for giving of your time and your free time, what limited time you have, you give back to the community.

So, as the Chair had mentioned it really requires time, attention, preparation for these commission meeting and the subcommittee meetings as well. And as *Tan* Amanda had so eloquently put, it's both a challenge and a privilege.

I know that you will take that to heart and that you will really do your very best and so we're really hoping that you're able to meet quorum each time should the rest of the legislature confirm you.

You certainly have my support. I did want to just ask you one question. So, I was reviewing your packet and reviewing your statement of financial interest. I wanted to thank you for providing that to the committee. This is kind of a question that I asked many board members that come before us.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Sure.

### Senator Régine Biscoe Lee:

Do you foresee any conflicts of interest that you have with regard to any business that you own or any organizations?

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

There's no conflict as far as I'm concerned. You know this Land Trust is for the people not for myself. Thank you.

## Senator Régine Biscoe Lee:

Si Yu'os ma'åse' and thank you so much Madame Chair for the opportunity to ask these questions. Again, I just thank you so much for giving of your time to this very important part of our government and you're absolutely right, it's for the people of Guam. Thank you.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you, Senator Lee.

Senator James Moylan?

# Senator James Moylan:

Thank you, Madame Chair.

Ms. Bordallo, thank you for accepting the nomination. You do have the experience and I believe you'll do wonderful things. It's a hard time for the Commission but I believe that with your influence there, I think we can make it through it and you have the support of your other board members.

So, I'm really looking forward to the next process when your name will come up during hopefully the next session. And that we can get you to work as soon as possible.

Thank you so much.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Your welcome.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

I'd like to again acknowledge the presence of your family; the Perez family, the Bordallo family, and the Blas family.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Thank you.

### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

And I also like to ask you a few questions for the record.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Sure.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

And so, the business interests or conflicts of interest has already been asked. Thank you, Senator Lee.

At one point you were a board member of the GEDA, the Guam Economic Development Authority.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Yes.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Can you tell us your experience working on that board; if that will serve you and your service on this board?

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Well you know Guam Economic Development is to help people make Guam grow in terms of business for the people. So, I know sometimes there are businesses that want to deal with CHamoru Land Trust and I leave that to the Board in their decisions.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you. I appreciate your business background. So, the making of meetings, will there be any conflicts in your schedule that might prevent you from making the meetings?

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

No.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right.

## Arlene P. Bordallo:

I am my own boss. So, no one's going to tell me not to go.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

That's great. We all need that luxury.

How would you address controversial decisions on the board, if the board was not in agreement? Do you feel like you'd be comfortable to handle that situation?

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Yes, as long as they follow the law. That's all there is to it.

# Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Do you have a position on transferring CHamoru land to government agencies? It has been a common practice over the last 10 years, maybe.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Well I really feel that CHamoru land, the land should stay with the CHamoru Land Trust. Transferring it to another agency, I'm not too sure about that but I believe it should stay with the trust board to make those decisions. Personally, I don't support it.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Do you have a position on mineral extraction or mining? There have been many proposals to use CHamoru Land Trust to quarry. Do you have any position on that? It's general, I know.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

It all depends you know if there's a need in the community, the need for it. I think that should be a legislative decision to make.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you.

There's been in the news even very recently but we've also seen it in the past. That you know there's been some past problems regarding collection of the commercial lease payments. Do you think you can contribute to the board's management in that area?

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Well they can sue them for collection you know. The people that are leasing the property and you know just regular collection even going to court to make sure that the trust receives that money and if they don't then they have to go.

#### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

I think you know of course that's always been the goal but I think they kind of have been a little bit lenient or else they look the other way for a little while thinking it will be resolved and then next thing you know it's years, years, and years. And still not resolved and it looks terrible in retrospect.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Right.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

So, I would ask all of your all the commissioners' diligence in really being demanding on the people's behalf.

#### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Well you know sometimes when it comes to leasing after four years of not doing anything to collect, you might lose that time to collect.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you. Will you ensure that the trust stays true to its mission which is residential and agricultural leases as a priority?

### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Yes.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you. I want to acknowledge also that here in support signed up are Maria Bordallo, Jonathan Bordallo, Grace Bordallo, Nieves Omega Garces.

### Arlene P. Bordallo:

That's my family.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you. If there any other questions from the senators. Thank you and recently your sisters' here. Yeah. Thank you.

Judy Salas, thank you also for being here and she stated her support for your nomination.

## Arlene P. Bordallo:

Thank you. And thank you for having this.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you. So, Arlene Bordallo I'd like to thank you for your commitment to this commission. I appreciate your answers so I can see the sincerity and you're a little shy. I think you've got a lot of business experience and life experience that is absolutely going to be a huge plus for this commission.

And I urge you to just stand your ground and be you know be who you are and I think that luckily the commission seems to be very open right now for ideas and ways to move forward. And that there so I appreciate the timing of your presence on this commission also.

### Arlene P. Bordallo:

Thank you.

## Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

And we're here also to support you and all of the commissioners. So, there's anything that you need, I welcome you to please we're here to help you.

Si Yu'os Ma'åse'

There being no additional individuals to present further testimony, this Committee continues to accept testimony until close of business on August 30, 2019.

I'm sorry I'm going to change that the committee will continue to accept testimony until August 23, 2019.

## Arlene P. Bordallo:

The public hearing was adjourned at 5:30 PM.

## III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

In her testimony to the Committee, Mrs. Bordallo stated that she fully supports the original mission of the Land Trust to prevent the displacement of the CHamoru people in their homeland and believes that the Land Trust is the best hope to accomplish this mission.

Bordallo conveyed sincere concern for the daily challenges that the CHamoru people face with raising families and making a living on Guam and stated that she supports prioritizing the original intent of the CHamoru Land Trust, to provide residential and agricultural leases.

Bordallo further stated that she will be able to dedicate the required time and attention needed to do the work of a Commissioner; will be able to attend meetings to fulfill quorum; and does not have any conflicts of interest that will impede her work on the Board.

Bordallo was asked by Chairperson Terlaje about her previous work as a board member of the Guam Economic Development Authority and how it will serve her on the CLTC Board. She conveyed her awareness that businesses may want to deal with the CLTC and would leave these cases to the Board in their decisions.

Chairperson Terlaje asked Bordallo how she would address controversial decisions on the board, and her level of comfort in handling these types of situations. Bordallo stated that she would be poised to handle controversial decisions and emphasized the need of the Board to follow the law.

Chairperson Terlaje further inquired about Bordallo's stance on using CLTC land for mineral extraction or mining; position on transferring CHamoru Land Trust land to government agencies; and view on the past problems with collection of commercial lease payments. Bordallo stated the following:

- Mineral extraction- her stance would depend on whether there is a need in the community and she believes that determinations should be a legislative decision.
- The transfer of CLTC land to governmental agencies- her preference is for Trust land to be utilized for its intended purpose.
- Commercial lease payments management- Bordallo spoke of the option of pursuing late payments through the court system and active repossession of delinquent CLTC commercial leased properties.

The Committee finds that Arlene Blas Perez Bordallo possesses the necessary sincerity, knowledge, life experience, time and focus required to be an effective Commissioner of the CHamoru Land Trust Commission.

The <u>Committee on Health, Tourism, Historic Preservation, Land and Justice</u> hereby reports on the appointment of <u>Arlene P. Bordallo</u> to serve as a <u>Member</u> of the <u>CHamoru Land Trust Commission</u>, with the recommendation <u>TO DO CONFIRM</u>.
