

granted motions to dismiss John Ilao. Deanne Torre and Rosie Blas on Tuesday morning.

Their former co-defendants. David Sablan, Roland Selvidge and Cecile Suda, stood trial in October and were acquitted of the charges against them, which stemmed from an alleged illegal meeting in December 2011 and a poll vote conducted in April 2015.

Ray Topasna, a former and now current GHURA executive director. was not called to the witness stand. an action with which he took issue.

Torre, Ilao and Blas faced similar charges, which the Office of the Attorney General chose to dismiss following the trial. The government

tleblower plaintiffs involved in what's called "qui tam" actions "are supposedly privy to the alleged fraud and therefore the whistleblowers should have adequate knowledge to plead matters with sufficient particularity," the commissioners contend. In a qui tam action, a private party brings


a case on the government's behalf, according to Cornell University's Law School website.

Former GHURA Executive Director Michael Duenas was the seventh and only defendant to accept a guilty plea, admitting to conspiracy as a misdemeanor.

All of the former defendants faced misdemeanor charges only, but at nearly 50 misdemeanors when the case was first filed.

Former Chief Prosecutor Joseph McDonald called it a "milestone case" in early 2018 after Duenas pleaded guilty. McDonald is no longer with the AG's office.

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

On behalf of the Guam Preservation Trust (GPT) Board of Directors and Staff, I write to express our strong support for Dr. David Atienza to serve as the Archaeology representative on the Board of Directors, Guam Historic Preservation Review Board (GHPRB). David currently is an Associate Professor at the University of Guam teaching Anthropology and has produced and published extensive scholarly work on the Mariana Islands, studying early CHamoru history in relation to Spanish colonization of the region. Confirming Dr. Atienza to the GHPRB will also allow him to sit on the Board of Directors of the GPT. Currently the Archaeology discipline remains vacant and his presence will allow for a more complete board that allows for better management of our work to advance historic preservation in our community. It is in this regard that I once again extend GPT's strongest support of Dr. Atienza to the GHPRB and respectfully request that you and your colleagues confirm him and begin the great work needed to accomplish the mandates of both GHPRB and GPT. The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 12:08 PM.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Okay, we're going to begin again. We are here for a hearing on the confirmation of Mr. David Atienza, for the nomination of the Archaeologist Representative to the Guam Historic Preservation Board.

This is wrong, I'm going to start this all over again. Just one second.

All right. We're here, we're reconvening our Public Hearing. It is now 12:08 PM. I apologize for the delay. It's December 5th. We are reconvening a Public Hearing that has been noticed for the Appointment of Dr. David Atienza as a Member, the Archaeologist Representative to the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board and subsequently the Guam Preservation Trust.

Notices for this Confirmation Hearing were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Wednesday, November 27, 2019 and again on Tuesday, December 3, 2019. The notice was also published in the Guam Daily Post on Wednesday, November 27, 2019 & Tuesday, December 3, 2019.

So, without any further ado I would like to ask for those who signed up to testify. We'll accept testimony and then we will hear from the nominee. I would like to thank Senator Sabina Perez for being present at today's hearing.

So, Mr. Makio, if you could begin.

Michael Makio:

Håfa adai Madame Chair, Senator. Thank you very much for taking the time to help us to rebuild our board and personally both of you have been instrumental in kind of building the strength and the momentum that's happening now in the preservation community. So, thank you for that.

I am here to express my support. I'll say for both the nominees that you folks have entertained today. Just a quick comment about Nicole. She's one of the most articulate and talented professional women I know and her ability to reach out and engage the public and share

information and synthesize that back into priorities which will be very important as we look toward conversations about the MITT and the Programmatic Agreement and what Guam's priorities are. So, I'm very excited about Nicole's participation in that.

And now, to Dr. Atienza, he is extremely important to the work that both the Historic Preservation Review Board, SHPO's Office and the Trust are undertaking because it's based also in anthropology, which is about the human side of it. It's not just artifacts. It's the meaning of the space and the place and the artifact and how the people on Guam have interacted with it in contemporary times, but also in the past.

And I think that conversation sometimes gets lost and it's east to compartmentalize things and talk about them as artifacts and in a way, almost dehumanize it and then we have an anthropologist now.

We can't ignore that this space has a meaning to the people on the island and that is extremely valuable and extremely important. The other fact that I think David brings to both boards that's very important is he's engaged with education and Nicole was too.

So, this is for both of them but the University of Guam has played a really important role galvanizing younger CHamoru's and Guamanians in the values and the struggles that we're dealing with right now.

And that is really his forum right now. He's in that community in the university, in the postsecondary community helping people to examine what their priorities are, helping people to formulate their positions and their priorities.

And I think that's a really important place to be and it's an important place for an advocate of culture and anthropology. Which of course he's the head of, but it's a really important place for that interaction to occur.

So, as for his participation in both the review board and the trust this far just even based on his nomination, that's really been exemplary. He's here, he's informed himself. He asks pertinent questions and again as we are forming or reforming our positions and our priorities with the preservation and in the dealing with private sectors, the Government of Guam itself and the federal government.

I think it's important to have people questioning and seeking answers as we move through that process. So, that is my statement and support.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Si Yu'os ma'åse' Mr. Makio, Chairperson of the current Preservation Review Board.

Mr. Quinata?

Joe Quinata:

My name is Joe Quinata from the Guam Preservation Trust Chief Program Officer and I'd like to read a testimony.

Please see attached testimony.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Si Yu'os ma'åse' Mr. Quinata. It says William Jeffery but I believe it's Dr. Jeffery, is that correct?

Dr. Jeffery please proceed.

Dr. William Jeffery:

Thank you very much Madame Chairwoman. Thank you for the opportunity to come and support David. I've just started four years ago; it feels like I've only just started with the University of Guam, 2015 in the Anthropology faculty.

So, I worked closely with David. I came to understand and respect his commitment to the community. Which is really what I wanted to emphasize. I will be brief but that's not an indication of what I know about David and the respect I have for David.

I know you're busy but I was felt it was very important to come here and provide an oral presentation, brief as it would be. As I said, I came to understand and respect the commitment that David has had to the community for fourteen years through our students at the University of Guam, through his teaching.

A nice service to the University of Guam and the community and his research. I think it's all been invaluable and it's something that I've learned from since I've been here.

He's been a great friend and a mentor for me for the last couple of years and continues to be. So, we're working very closely together with on Guam and the area that I'm interested in is the broader Micronesia area.

We're bringing that together cooperatively and it's a great enjoyment. I enjoy working with David. It's a lot of fun and he brings a lot to it. There's that commitment. He was the UOG or our Anthropology faculty representative with the community group that we had for a number of years.

And I took over when I arrived. So, I know he has the respect from students at the university. I know he gets on very well with the students. I actually sometimes follow him in my teaching a class that he's taught before and I come along and they talk very well with great respect about David and his teaching.

So, I can see that from the students as well and I can see it in other colleagues at the university too. Not only in our division, Humanities Division, but throughout the university in general. So, I really don't want to say much more.

I know his research and he will point it out. But his research in cultural identity, which is something that I'm personally interested in, the CHamoru identity and other social and cultural issues is something that he's very dedicated and passionate about here.

So, I just wanted to reemphasize that and give my support to that. So, thank you very much for the opportunity to talk.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you very much Dr. Jeffery. Appreciate that and Dr. Atienza?

Dr. David Atienza:

Good morning, Senator Terlaje and Senator Perez. Thank you for receiving me.

My name is David Atienza. I am being nominated to be a member of the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board as Anthropologist Representative. My academic professional background has been oriented mainly to anthropology, identity studies at the university.



However, I also have taught linguistic, philosophy, art and many other disciplines to all my life's teaching – has been twenty years already; more than twenty years.

I complete a Bachelor Degree in History, one Master Degree in Applied Linguistics, second Master Degree in Anthropology and a PhD. in Anthropology. By the grace of God and the support of my wife, that is here today with me.

Today I am an Associate Professor in Anthropology at the University of Guam. I have participated in very national, international conferences as a member in some research projects and teams in national and international.

And I published in different journals and editorials. I believe this is what brought me to say yes to this nomination - that our own history that interacts with a living culture is a fundamental element to reinforce a national, historical identity.

I also believe that heritage is not just a meta cultural product or an ideological elaboration merely for its exhibition or consumption. Heritage or the process of its making- heritaging, should establish the basis for today's social action.

That is why in the middle on an unstoppable process of change, like the eminent militarization incrementing Guam or the liquid aspect of our culture today, it is more urgent than ever to potentiate and give durability to those tangible and intangible core symbols and experiences that make the people of Guam and the Marianas unique in the world.

For more than three thousand years; different people have left their footprints on this island. They linked their human experience to caves, mountains, landscapes, buildings, bridges, villages, roads. Many of these features that anchored traditional historical memories were lost due to catastrophes that blighted this island.

So, it is time to remember. It's time to recover, to protect and rebuild. I'm grateful for the opportunity that this legislature is offering me to participate in this endeavor.

I can make available to the people of Guam, a multidisciplinary approach on cultural heritage. I have experience in grant management, academic research. I understand material heritage in this relationship with the people that generate it and I live in it.

I can offer my international experience on my Spanish culture and sensibility to look into the past of Guam. I can provide a critical analysis on material resources and a non-ideological understanding of history.

I can participate in an educational aspect offering my twenty years of teaching experience and I can offer of course, my honesty and my capacity of work. Thank you very much.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you very much. All very important offerings. I've never heard the non-ideological history, I think. But anyways, I appreciate your testimony Dr. Atienza and your commitment to not just history and anthropology, but the community and your involvement in the community and with the students at the University of Guam. Thank you very much.

Senator Perez?

Senator Sabina Perez:

Thank you, Madame Chair. Thank you, Dr. Atienza. I'm just looking over your resume and it's interesting to see that you actually had a position at a university that's no longer in existence and it was focusing on what was it, Oceania? And I'm just curious to learn what was your draw to learn about Oceania?

Dr. David Atienza:

I came to Guam to do voluntary work on that institute, that was a Theological Institute that was affiliated with the Latin University and operated to form priests for the Catholic Church-some priests that were ordained here.

My function- was primarily to teach Philosophy, History and Anthropology. Which I did and I helped in the academic organization; the courses, schedules and all these things. This institute stopped when the seminary was closed in 2017.

But I already was working for the university since 2010 because that work was volunteer.

Senator Sabina Perez:

So, I'm just looking over your CV and it's quite extensive and it's very prolific, as well. Can you just talk to me- speak to, about the progression of your academic endeavors?

Dr. David Atienza:

Yes, well, I will start with when I was twelve when I first read Frazer Anthropology and I fell in love with cultures in the world. I understood since very young that a big world full of variety and diversity was out there and this attracted me mentally.

To see these faces of humanity to understand humans as a jewel- something precious, every culture. Since then I started pursuing this knowledge of history and anthropology, which led me to do a Master's in Linguistics to be able to teach Spanish.

While I was doing my PhD. that focus was on identity issues in Brazil first. Even though I have to change to Ecuador for practical questions. I finished my PhD in 2006 after six years of research in Highlands Ecuador and Spain following Quichua indigenous people trying to understand how they managed to maintain the indigenous identity in a world that is highly globalized.

And I understood that globalization is not an enemy, but could be an ally, during my thesis. That took me to the Pacific, but the other side. It is my first contact with culture that in a sense, that would touch in the Pacific.

In that moment when I finished my PhD. I offer with my wife and my kids to go anywhere to help the needs of the Catholic Church and they send me here to Guam. Where I enter into this island I felt home, in a sense because I understood that there in this culture were familiar things but at the same time were not totally familiar. That feeling attracted me. So, I started to read all of what happened with the last three hundred years and I understood that there has been a constant attack about the identity of the people of the Marianas.

And the last that for me was more subtle, more hidden was that even though everybody has this feelings of continuity there was three hundred years of the history that disappeared- not only tangible, intangible, immaterial and I started digging into the possibility to come to prove, to offer due to my perspective from coming from another place of the world, this hidden or forgotten history, that is necessary to continue waving the time.

So, the youth of today can link themselves with three thousand years ago people, without jumping or not knowing. But they can, because it's there. The problem is that it was hidden. So, that's why my articles and my research go from present identity linked with past, trying to show that there was never a total break. There was catastrophe. They were suffering but there was a continuity and the culture was transmitted always.

Senator Sabina Perez:

So, going onto the position of as a board member, what is your view about mitigation versus preservation in place?

Dr. David Atienza:

I think, I'll be clear. We don't know what will be the future political status of this island. And our task is to protect the heritage over mitigation as Senator Terlaje mentioned before. I agree, it is the protection first and to make a balance because we have to see, to look into the future to what we left to our great grandkids.

Because once something is open, Archaeologist know well, once we open a trench, it is gone forever and this is a difficult decision. Archaeologist are always the most reticent to open trenches and that's my opinion, also to open less trenches as possible.

Senator Sabina Perez:

Thank you.

Dr. David Atienza:

Thank you.

Senator Sabina Perez:

Thank you, Madame Chair.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you, Senator Perez.

Dr. Atienza, this is a demanding position. I think, as these members can tell you it's going to be challenging especially because of the challenge within our community in general, right? They're going to be reflected here in this board.

What the competing interest might be and how do we do this in the best way? Everyone has perhaps a different opinion but I appreciate that your perspective will be added to this board and that your enthusiasm seems to serve. I thank you for that.

Do you have any continuing business interests that might- I don't see any on your resume-but that might pose a conflict or perhaps your teaching at the university? Do you think that might pose a conflict with your duties on this board?

Dr. David Atienza:

No, the only work I have is the university that can adapt well to my duties on the board.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Are you affiliated with the university- it used to have its own life archaeology team?

Dr. David Atienza:

Used to, I think. But I'm not associated with them. We don't have any business and I'm not associated with the MARK neither, even though I collaborate with them.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Okay. All right. I appreciate what you said about the preservation versus mitigation and that is what we are looking to you as a member of the Board to do for us. You're representing us. We need you to do your best because that's what our children's children are going to be seeing- the fruits of our efforts today.

So, again I want to thank you and those of you who've testified today again thank you very much to those who are present here in support. I thank you for that and that will be it for today's hearing for Dr. Atienza.
