

rea mulls measures against Japan

(Japan News-Yomiuri) - The administration of South Korean President Moon Jae-in will play up Japan's move to remove its neighbor's fast-track export status with the United States and other foreign partners until the measure is enforced on Aug. 28, with the aim of mounting pressure on Tokyo to withdraw the decision, according to sources close to talks among Japan, the United States and South Korea.

Seoul will take countermeasures when Tokyo eventually removes it from the so-called Group A list of trading partners qualified for simplified export procedures.

As one highly possible option, the South Korean government is mulling abandoning the General Security of Military Information Agreement, a framework for the two neighbors to share information on North Korea's nuclear and missile programs. The agreement is up for annual renewal in late August.

If South Korea decides not to extend the agreement, the move will likely trigger a backlash from the United States as it means Seoul would disrupt cooperation among the three countries against North Korea.

However, Seoul believes this could work to prompt the United States to call for Japan not to remove its neighbor from its fast-track export status, the sources said.

"We will step up safety measures starting with areas such as tourism, food and waste," said Hong Nam-ki, South Korean deputy prime minister and economy and finance minister, during a news conference on Friday.

According to the sources, the South . Korean government is considering an option to expand its import bans on fishery products from Fukushima and seven other prefectures.

Trump: NKorea tests don't violate pacts

(Bloomberg) - President Donald Trump said that North Korea's recent tests of short-range rockets and missiles may run afoul of United Nations resolutions but haven't violated agreements with his administration.

North Korea on Friday conducted its third test in a week of a new short-range ballistic missile that weapons experts say was designed to strike U.S. allies in East Asia.

Trump has met three times with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un in the hope of persuading him to surrender his nation's nuclear arsenal. While the diplomacy has led Kim to cease tests of nuclear weapons and long-range ballistic missiles that once threatened the U.S. mainland, Trump has little else to show for his effort.

But on Friday, the president said that he believes Kim still seeks to reach an agreement with him.

'Chairman Kim does not want to disappoint me with a violation of trust, there is far too much for North Korea to gain," Trump said in the second of three tweets, "Also, there is far too much to lose.

"I may be wrong, but I believe that Chairman Kim has a great and beautiful vision for his country, and only the United States, with me as president, can make that vision come true," he added.

Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said at a Bangkok summit earlier on Friday that the missile tests wouldn't interfere with U.S. efforts to restart talks with

Kim. The two sides haven't made progress since Trump walked out of a summit with Kim in Hanoi in February after the North Korean made what the U.S. side considered unreasonable demands.

'You should never doubt what we are communicating to North Korea, there are conversations going on even as we speak." Pompeo said in question-and-answer session with Bloomberg TV's Haslinda Amin. But he noted the diplomatic road is often a bumpy one.

"We are still fully committed to achieving the outcome that we laid out, for a fully verified denuclearization of North Korea, and to do so through the measure of diplomacy."

Friday's projectile reached an altitude

of about 15 miles and flew for about 140 miles at a maximum speed of Mach 6.9, South Korea's Defense Ministry said. This means it could strike some U.S. military bases in the country a minute or two after launch.

North Korea appears to be testing its KN-23, solid-fuel, short-range ballistic missile, with its first test coming in May followed by another volley that month and three more volleys since July 25.

The KN-23, similar to a Russian iskander, is capable of carrying nuclear warheads and has been shown to fly as far as 30 miles — putting U.S. allies South Korea and parts of Japan at risk. It's designed to be mobile, which makes it easier to hide, and fly at a height and speed that makes it hard for U.S. interceptor systems to shoot down, weapons experts have said.



COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Environment, Revenue and Taxation, and Procurement convened a public hearing on August 7, 2019 at 9:00 a.m. in *I Liheslaturan Guahan* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of Mr. Dean Manglona to serve as a Member (Attorney) of the Guam Banking and Insurance Board, whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero on July 23, 2019, to serve for six (6) years: May 6, 2019 to May 5, 2025
- Appointment packet forwarded to I Liheslaturan Guahan on July 23, 2019
- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on July 26, 2019

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all Senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on July 31, 2019 and again on August 5, 2019. Publication was conducted in the **Guam Daily Post**, a newspaper of general circulation, fulfilling the 5-Day Notice and 48 Hour Notice of the Open Government Law requirements respectively.

The confirmation hearing for Mr. Dean Manglona commenced at 9:00 a.m.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Perez call up the appointee and those who have signed up to testify.

Dean Manglona, Appointee: Good morning Madam Chair, Senator Terlaje. My name is Dean Manglona, thank you for the opportunity to appear before you today. I am honored and grateful that Governor Lou Leon Guerrero has nominated me to serve on as the Attorney Member of the Banking and Insurance Commission Board. I accept the nomination with this board. Entrusted within the important function of implementing regulations for the administration of banking and insurance laws in Guam and modernizing such regulations when necessary. This function extends to enforcing such laws fairly and expeditiously. I firmly believe that my experience as an Attorney of over 10 years and as a Certified Public Accountant that will enable me to effectively serve as a member of the board. I have gained broad knowledge of regulatory financial matters and an understanding of policies facing our banking and insurance industries. I look forward to working

with the committee and my fellow board members to implement and modernize regulations that are reasonable and that foster compliance. Thank you again for the opportunity to testify before you I look forward to any questions you may have.

Chairperson Perez: Thank You Mr. Manglona.

Joyce Tang, Attorney, Civille and Tang: Good morning, Madam Chair and Senator Terlaje. Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in support of Mr. Manglona's nomination to the Insurance and Banking Board. Although we may not give it much thought as we go about our daily lives, the services provided by these two industries played important roles in our lives and a health of our economy. Responsible oversight of these industries help protect our people and our businesses from the ever-present danger of abuse and neglect and also ensures that Guam keeps pace with the changes in these sectors, so that the people of Guam and the businesses are able to enjoy the benefit of these new services and changes in how business is conducted. Responsible regulation is also critical to keeping Guam competitive in attracting new businesses. I have known Dean for more than four years. I first worked with them as an attorney for the settlement fund on Saipan. He was in-house counsel for the fund. I was very impressed with his work ethic, in his diligence and the quality of his work. And we eventually hired him in our Guam Office, and he has been with us ever since. He has continued to develop as a very well-rounded lawyer and last year became a Certified Public Accountant. He is a licensed CPA both on Guam and Saipan. He is very detail-oriented and does excellent work.

Dean was also a team player, he works well with others and is often asked to participate in Guam Bar or court activities and to help, for instance, he helps organize many these activities: the 5K's, the employee fundraisers, even though he is no longer an employee with the court. In addition to strong work ethic, he possesses a strong, a tremendous integrity. He is absolutely trustworthy, and he takes his responsibilities very seriously, does his homework and you can count on him to show up for every meeting prepared. These are vital qualities in the member of a regulatory board. Finally, as you may be aware Dean grew up on Guam, he attended FD before going off to college and law school. Guam is his home; he embodies the virtues we so strongly associate with Guam. He's a man of faith, he has strong family values, he's a man you can trust. Without reservation I wholeheartedly support his nomination. Thank you.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you Attorney Tang for your testimony and endorsement. The next person we have on the list I believe is.... Leslie Travis.

Leslie Travis, Attorney, Civille and Tang: Good morning Madam Chair and Senators, my name is Leslie Travis, I'm an attorney practicing at the Civille and Tang Law Firm here on Guam. I'm pleased to testify in support of the appointment of Dean Vincent Atalig Manglona as the Attorney Member for the Guam Banking and Insurance Board. I've known Dean for seven years, first as a casual friend and a fellow member of the Guam Bar Association and for the past five years as a work colleague and a close friend. I've had extensive opportunity to interact with and observe Dean in both a personal and a professional capacity and I believe I can speak to both his qualifications and his character. I could tell you for example that Dean is hardworking and that would certainly be true. Dean and I have spent countless late nights and early morning hours turning over every proverbial stone, studying the intricacies of specific legal issues necessary to

the zealous representation of our clients. He often comes in on weekends not even necessarily in furtherance of a specific work task but in pursuit of a better fuller understanding of the issues in his field of interest, notably taxes and finance. Dean has passed the rigorous CPA licensing exams and he did that while practicing law, a feat that very few others have attempted let alone accomplished.

I could tell you that Dean is dedicated and reliable, that he has sacrificed his down time, which is a scarce and precious resource in our field, to help friends set up businesses. As my boss mentioned, to organize 5K's for the court, to serve on various committees of the Guam Bar Association or even just to invite the rest of us out for coffee or exercise or some self-care. I could tell you that he left a promising start in New Mexico to be close to his family and to service the needs of this community, his community. I am here to wholeheartedly support Governor Leon Guerrero's appointment of Dean Manglona to serve as a member of the Guam Banking and Insurance Commission Board. Not only is Mr. Manglona an attorney licensed to practice in Guam and the CNMI, but he is also a Certified Public Accountant. Don't hold it against him he comes from a family of overachievers. Putting aside Mr. Manglona's educational accomplishments, I have had the pleasure of working with him over the past few years on a very technical land title issue, which was primarily resolved due to his understanding of the law and implementation of practical solutions. In my experience Dean Manglona is a solution driven problem solver. He does not shy away from hard work and keeps an open mind when dealing with complex issues. I believe his education, intelligence and high moral character are exactly the qualities I would hope to find in a government of Guam board as important as the Banking and Insurance Commission. Thank you.

Chairperson Perez: Si Yu'os ma'åse' Mrs. Young. The next one, Mr. Ilagan would you like to provide testimony as well?

Art Ilagan: Dean is a lot younger than me, I've known his family, his father and I are FD graduate, he was a couple years younger than me. The common thing with the three of us is we are FD grads and we have a tight association. We see each other at basketball games and functions at FD. From

what I know about Dean, I mean I've associated with him with his family, his mother's Benita, I worked with her for several years as she was the Director of Rev and Tax and with the finance team of Calvo Tenorio. I've known Dean through that relationship, and I've known the father for years. Through his background of being a CPA and an attorney and me being a prior Insurance and Banking Commissioner, that is a very valuable asset for this commission to have such a person like Dean to serve in this capacity. Again it's \$50 a month and anything he does wrong; he goes to jail like all the other boards. I am so proud of him being so young and being eager to learn insurance and banking. I am support of Mr. Dean. Thank you.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you Mr. Ilagan and I'm glad that he's still here despite the... going in with an open eyes. I had a pleasure of meeting you Dean and judging from everybody's endorsement it really confirms my first impressions with you. I just want to thank you for accepting the nomination but I also do want to open the floor to questions from my colleagues, but I also do want to acknowledge Senator Kelly Marsh Taitano who's joined me here today. Thank You Senator. Senator Terlaje do you have any questions for the nominee?

Senator Therese Terlaje: Yes, thank you all for your testimony and thank you for Dean for accepting this nomination. I guess I just want to ask you, because you are a lawyer, do you foresee any conflicts with your clients and your work on this board?

Mr. Manglona: At this time, Senator, no conflict. I take conflicts very seriously, understand my obligations under the Model Rules of Professional Conduct as an attorney and I can assure you that as a board member my duty is to the board and ultimately to the people of Guam. I take conflicts very seriously and I don't see any conflicts at this time.

Senator Therese Terlaje: All right I appreciate your background and your recent, the CPA, that's really fantastic for Guam and I'm very proud of you also but do you think... how do you foresee I mean, I can see the board is really going to benefit from your ability to help them, with, as you pointed out rules, updating, modernizing those rules keeping in line with the developments in the industry. I was reading again some of the powers of the board as in regards, you know in relation to the Commissioner and you are advisory but you also have some powers to like overturn rulings of the Commissioner or orders of the Commissioner to modify those in some respects. I appreciate the testimony that everyone's given today in regard to your integrity and I know some of them. Their experience working with you over the years is it's important. I'm glad to hear it. I'm glad that that's on the record. I'm looking forward to your contributions, do you, I know you haven't served on the board yet but do you foresee any areas in particular that you think the board should address immediately, that they may be or give a little bit more attention to?

Mr. Manglona: Yeah, I think just a brief overview or the review of the minutes show that they're really taking steps to try to improve efficiencies, like updating the online. I think the online licensing application for insurance companies and also making sure that there's oversight over money service businesses. Are there steps that are currently being taken and I think that we can continue to address those at the next board meeting.

Senator Therese Terlaje: All right thank you. Yes, I think I ran into someone at Rev and Tax who had just finished trying to update their licenses and was expressing frustration at that an

insurance company. I'm glad that the board's taking a look at that right away. Thank you, your willingness to do this.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you, Senator Terlaje. Senator Marsh Taitano, you have any questions for Dean?

Senator Marsh (Taitano): Håfa adai yan manana Si Yu'os. Thank you all so much for coming out here, we have a pretty good number of people that have made it out and it's so important that we're all part of the process and take that time to do so. It really helps us, as have been mentioned, to hear from those that know people that are up for nominations and get their assessment of those years of experience with the candidates. Certainly, we've heard, I agree with one of the written testimonies, that when I looked through the employment record and training background, I found it to be very impressive, as somebody else had stated. One of the things that stood out to me was Dean Manglona had come and taken the time to meet with many if not all of us, including myself. I think that shows real initiative, it shows real integrity and shows real dedication. Some of what we talked about was with some of his experience, working with nonprofit organizations. That really spoke to me because I think that's a really important part of our community, that's not often understood or fully appreciated. The fact that he had that background I think broadens what he brings to the table. I thought that was really important. Certainly, he has participated in numerous organizations. Again, I think that speaks to his understanding, the time that it takes, the dedication that it takes, the thoroughness that it takes. This is so important because what we've heard over the years is that a lot of boards struggle meeting quorum and getting their work done for a variety of reasons.

The more that we have that have demonstrated and have this past experience, where they know what it takes to be a board member and they're willing to do it again. Not only that but he spoke about assessing the landscape of Guam and seeing where he could serve in a way that was utilizing his time that he had available and was not over committing himself. Again, those sorts of things really meant a lot to me. As he just mentioned he had also noted that he had done that extra diligence. He had been going through the minutes, he was reviewing who was on the board and really working to understand the work of the board. That is something that not everybody does before they become a member. I think that speaks to the type of person that will be getting on the board, should everything follow through. Things that were noted by those who do know him, the integrity, the high moral character, the dedication, the passion, the cooperativeness, being open to hearing other ideas and other arguments. Those again are all very important. I am very supportive and also very appreciative of your accepting this and putting the effort into it that you did to feel that it's a very good fit for you and that you can continue to be a good board member, should the nomination go through. so Si Yu'os ma'åse' for that.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you, Senator Taitano. I do want to thank everybody who came out here in support of Mr. Dean Manglona. I think it's really telling Dean's employer is all in support of him being here considering, I know how hard the job is. I think it's... to kind of reiterate the comment, the sentiments of my colleague is that it's great to see such expertise that you bring to the table as well as the fresh perspective. I think that's really critical when you're taking a public service position and I do appreciate you accepting the six-year nomination and the commitment that is important to support that. thank you again for being here Si Yu'os ma'åse'.

Chairperson Perez then adjourned the confirmation hearing for Mr. Dean Manglona.
