The availability of activity, recreation for the children that said I think an issue that has been long-standing but this park safety issue is really almost more dire right now and I think Chief Suba can attest to this because they've... you know, actually GVB has a role, parks and recs has a role, mayors have a role and everybody has a role and they're even proposals to privatize parks because they don't have much faith in parks and rec being able to take care of these parks. But I want to challenge you to please prove that we can do that, and I know Parks and Rec has had a boost of some grant money that they can do some repair and... But really, it's the safety I think you know, once we repair.

The government has really not been that delinquent in repairing although... it's because things have been damaged almost, you know repeatedly. Repeatedly and continuously and so but I think that with your experience, maybe you're going to be able to come up with a solution for that. That is... that is that continues to allow accessibility to the parks. Because that's what we're trading off... right? A lot of the mayor's tell me they're just going to fence it off. They're going to lock it up and that's one way to handle it but it's not... it's not going to do the other side of your job which is to encourage, you know recreation... And our beaches already are so limited.

Access to beaches are very limited on Guam right now. The more access we can provide that is safe. And I'm sure as a woman that you can appreciate... Things have changed probably even as you've grown up. For sure as I've grown up access to beaches is completely different now for us. We don't go where we used to go. We don't go, you know, even alone or even with another person sometimes you need a whole group because just to keep yourself safe. All of those things have changed the way we are able to enjoy Guam and so, I know that you appreciate all of those things and I'm just... I just want to put that on the record that I'm looking to you. I'm hoping that you're going to push this board and push the department to really make that a priority. Right? We can be proud I think of what we can do.

The other thing that the Department of Parks and Recreation isn't responsible for right now is this historic preservation. Some of our, you know, parks our beaches and different things but many of our parks are historic properties, historic places. We've put a lot of investment into trying to, you know, protect. Protect our culture keep a place for people to enjoy that and... but... there's a million more things to do in that regard.

I'm sure you've heard of people; artifacts being picked up every day and but one of the responsibilities of this board is to... We've got the whole Historic Resources Division in the Department of Parks and Rec. I hope that you can do what it takes to get up to speed in that regard and to make sure that we are as critical as we can be as to what our role is.

You know, sometimes we've criticized private companies or even recently, you know, the military for what they have done to cultural sites and they turn around and want to say well what have you done to your cultural sites? And so of course we have to... we have to... we will always have that challenge, right? We have to do our part and, but we are all relying on Parks and Rec in this regard and the State Historic Preservation Officer up at Parks and Rec has a very unique role in many instances. They are the only people are only person who has access to information. Has access to these sites that I'm sure you can check all the *manåmko'* you know... They've never had that privilege to go to a lot of these places and I appreciate that these *latte* sites, for example, are still intact and that what they really represent too, you know, and so... I'm also looking to you to make sure that those types of things that has to be a priority right now.

Somebody was talking to me the other day about all the rain that we're having and the flooding and how that makes all these historic places also very vulnerable to, you know, being washed away and permanently damaged or, you know, lost. We've got a huge challenge. You've got nature, you've mother nature and you've got, you know, crime and we've got the other challenges that our youth face and historic preservation. Lots of things so... I just but... I'm very confident and I want to congratulate you on being on the women's team and your performance in the South Pacific games.

MRS. DERIN J. STINNETT: Thank you very much.

SENATOR THERESE TERLAJE: And wish you the best and if there's anything that I can we can do to help you... please... you know, don't take no for an answer. Don't take this is the way it's always been done. Please don't take that. I want that to be the number one rule that that's not what you're going to accept because I think we can really show that Guam, we can do

these things and we have to work together. I know that you've said that in your testimony, so I appreciate that also seems -

MRS. DERIN J. STINNETT: If I may add, you know, I had the privilege of being in one of your classes up at UOG and that's really something I took away from your classes. Never take no for an answer especially being a woman. I appreciate that and thank you for everything.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse Senator Terlaje. You brought forward just a lot of really important points about the potential of you as a nominee and then the potential of our parts and all the efforts that it is that we really need to take as a community to safeguard them, to promote them and to be utilizing them and I really like that you highlighted that we as a community can do this. Sometimes I think being very humble as part of our nature. Maybe we also don't always recognize our capabilities or we're looking to sort of complement or support others, which can be a trait that you find in Pacific island communities. But you know, we really have so much talent. We really have so many people that are willing to volunteer such as yourself. Your list is quite lengthy and so I think that speaks to your understanding the commitment it involves. You've had many years of experience of volunteerism and your ability to perhaps coordinate and see some overlap between these organizations like the Micronesian Sports Foundation. There are, may be ways or the National Basketball Team for the women, that can be brought in to partner up or network with the Department of Parks and Rec. I think that those are definitely some opportunities that you bring with you. I do want to point out since you've been... and I was quite impressed, part of the women's national basketball team for 10 years and...

MRS. DERIN J. STINNETT: Correct.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: And so just yesterday... I don't remember why but I had sort of lightheartedly said that we should create a ladieslature basketball team. I don't know if you heard that Senator Terlaje. Apparently, we're getting pulled in different directions. Academic challenge bowl team but if we do go in that direction, I know who I can call.

MRS. DERIN J. STINNETT: Definitely. I'll be there.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Oh, wonderful and like I said, your volunteerism has been quite extensive. I really think that speaks to your ability to be such a contributing person to this board.

One of the issues that we've had for many years across many boards is getting quorum and so it looks like you have that commitment of understanding the importance of being part of a board and then making sure that... excuse me, quorum is there so that business can be conducted.

MRS. DERIN J. STINNETT: Yes

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: And looking to your background. Some of what we're working with... We're very fortunate the Department of Parks and Recreation has about \$5.6 million to upgrade a lot of its facilities including some of our

sports facilities and other facilities and part of that is also set aside for putting in some security cameras. I think this is some of what you'll be able to offer is understanding issues like security cameras. There are some partnerships with the department of the police to set up other security cameras as well. I think that will be something that you can help address as well as the other safety issues there. We do want our families and individuals to feel safe when they go to the parks.

And as we've mentioned or at least is. I mentioned earlier in one of the other nominations that a lot of what we're seeing for damage to our public facilities or issues like illegal dumping or littering that these... a lot of it really is behavioral issues. With your criminal justice background, with your volunteerism and other elements, hopefully as a board member you would really be able to help tackle some of those issues and think through or develop a subcommittee whatever needs to be done to help them tackle those issues and get the community on board with really appreciating and taking care of our resources.

MRS. DERIN J. STINNETT: Yes.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: They are important to us there. We have family time versus celebrate our birthdays and so forth.

MRS. DERIN J. STINNETT: Yes.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Let's see... with all of the commitments that you do have. On one hand, they mentioned that it's very positive because you it shows that you understand the commitment involved. Do you see that there would be any issue and being able to keep up with this this board as well on top of your other commitments?

MRS. DERIN J. STINNETT: No issue is at all. And you know, I've taken everything you guys have said to heart and I hope and I'm excited to work on this board.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (**TAITANO**), **PH.D.**, **CHAIR:** Si Yu'os ma'åse and I already mentioned the overlap that you have between some of the groups that you that you are a part of so I think we've covered a lot of the issues again. I think you have a lot of potential to help resolve some of those issues and I think you're just an example of one of our community members that really brings a lot to the table, really cares about our island, cares about making a difference.

MRS. DERIN J. STINNETT: Yes.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: So, if there are no further comments or questions the Committee will conclude the confirmation hearing of Derin J. Stinnett to serve as a member on the Board of Commissioners Department of Parks and Recreation. The Committee will continue to receive testimonies for the next few days.
