



On Tuesday, the Consolidated Commission on Utilities voted to release all audio recordings of the executive session in which pay raise discussions took place.

The motion carried with four votes in favor and one against. CCU Chairman Joey Duenas was the sole dissenting vote. The recordings covered salary discussions for power and water utility personnel, executives and lawyers, and the CCU board secretary. There was

also discussion on leave hours, but a decision on that matter was reserved for a different meeting.

There was mention of public perception throughout the executive session discussion.

GWA General Manager Miguel Bordallo did not want a pay raise, according to Duenas. However, Duenas did recommend that Bordallo's pay be increased to \$200,000 annually - Bordallo was making \$175,000 at the time. Sanchez had some reservations about the hike. Meanwhile, Duenas also recommended a \$25,000 bonus to GPA General Manager John Benavente,

who was making \$225,000 at the time.

He said both general managers had been doing outstanding jobs at their respective agencies.

"How about we pay Miguel a one-time bonus," Sanchez said. "I think it looks better for us when the pay stays the pay and you just give them a bonus."

Guthertz, referring to GPA, said it would look better to the public if there were an actual raise to salary rather than a bonus check to Benavente.

"That's going to raise hell," she added.

Sanchez, reverting back to GWA, said he was more comfortable with a

one-time bonus for Bordallo.

Santos, who is Bordallo's brother-inlaw, noted pay in the private sector is tied to performance. This is when the discussion on performance evaluations took place.

"I'm for giving (Bordallo) a raise because we haven't done it in three years," Santos said.

The commissioners ultimately agreed on increasing Bordallo's salary to \$190,000 plus a \$10,000 bonus.

"I think that would look better, too. Public perception," Guthertz said. Commissioners also agreed on the \$25,000 bonus for Benavente.



Thank you for this opportunity to provide background information of my professional and personal life experience as an appointee to the Guam Social Work Board.

I was a career government employee with twenty-eight years of service at the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), and two years at the University of Guam (UOG). At DPHSS, I worked in three of the five divisions that comprise the department, including the Division of Public Health, Division of Senior Citizens, and Division of Public Welfare. I spent twenty-two years specifically in the Division of Public Welfare, serving as supervisor for income maintenance programs, working with our IT Team to maintain program software, and various program management and development activities. I retired from DPHSS as Chief Administrator for the division, which administered all public aid programs, as well as child welfare services, for the Island of Guahan.

At UOG, I worked at CEDDERS performing evaluations of parent grants, as well as a team member developing disaster preparedness tools for individuals with disabilities and their families. II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was called to order at 1:12 PM. Chairperson Therese Terlaje presented the agenda items that would be heard during the hearing. The appointment of Diana B. Calvo to serve as a Member of the Guam Board of Social Work was the second item on the agenda.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you. So we're going to now move on the agenda to the appointment of Diana B. Calvo as Member of the Guam Board of Social Work.

Mrs. Calvo?

There are other people who have signed up in support of Mrs. Calvo but did not indicate that they would provide oral testimony but they are here in support.

So thank you all for being here and for your support.

Mrs. Calvo before we go on with your testimony. I would like to read the function of the Guam Board of Social Work very quickly for the public.

The Board provides a framework for developing rules, which effectively responds to the regulatory needs of social work licensure. The Board shall have all the duties, powers, and authority specifically granted by or necessary for the enforcement of this Article, as well as other duties, powers, and authority as may be granted it from time to time by applicable law.

Board members who are social workers shall at all times:

- (1) be a resident of Guam;
- (2) be currently licensed and in good standing to engage in the practice of social work on Guam or be eligible for licensure within thirty (30) days of the passage of this Act;
- (3) at the time of appointment have been actively engaged in the social work profession; and
- (4) have at least three (3) years of experience in the practice of social work.

And for the record I'd like to also mention that we have received in advance written testimony from Dr. Margaret Hattori Uchima at the University of Guam in support of the nomination.

We will now accept your testimony, Mrs. Calvo.

Diana B. Calvo:

Please see attached testimony.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you very much and thank you again for accepting the nomination and especially with all your years of experience. It's a great addition to the board.

Have you served on this board before?

Diana B. Calvo:

No, ma'am.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Mrs. Calvo, I'm going to ask you a few questions also to put on the record.

Do you have any continuing business or potential conflicts of interest that may affect your ability to serve in this board?

Diana B. Calvo:

No, I don't.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

What is your current work?

Diana B. Calvo:

I'm currently the Executive Director at Catholic Social Services. We are a Catholic non-profit organization. We do have government contracts as well as federal and local grants that provide for the array of services we currently administer.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Do you employ social workers?

Diana B. Calvo:

Yes, we have five social work staff on board.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Will your current work schedule affect your ability to attend regular board meetings and perform the duties?

Diana B. Calvo:

No.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Per one section of the code there are specific duties with regard to the conduct and competence of social workers practicing in the territory. The section states that the board is responsible for the enforcement of those provisions in the act relating to the conduct or competence of social workers practicing. The investigation of any such activities related to the practice of unauthorized practice of social work and the suspension, revocation or restriction of licenses to engage in the practice of social work.

What is your experience with such cases in which a social worker is in violation of the standards and rules of conduct and what do you think are the factors that lead to such cases or your ideas for deterrence of said cases?

Diana B. Calvo:

Well in my government career, I've not had the experience to have employees who have been involved in what could be unethical behavior or involved in any kind of illegal activity.

In general, for employees who may be involved in those kinds of situations at the government level there is an adverse action procedure that can be implemented but for the management philosophy that I have had there is a standard that I hold all of my staff to including the para professional staff as well as direct services staff.

And that is because we do provide direct services and every action that our employees take including positions like eligibility staff and homemakers, it has a very big impact on any future decisions that may be recommended on behalf of that family. And so I've held my staff to a higher standard than what could be incorporated in the ethics of being a social worker.

As a representative of the community, it would be my responsibility, I see to ensure that kind of ethical and moral standard of behaviors of health and that you know we endorse a very strict process to assure that to not only the departments that employs those individuals but also to the community because they do have a very powerful role.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Yes.

Diana B. Calvo:

In the quality of life and in helping those individuals you know to move forward.



Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

I agree. Thank you.

Another part of the code gives authority to a police officer, a child protective services social worker or a physician to assume protective custody of a child without court order if the child is in such circumstances or condition that the child's continuing in the custody or care of the person responsible for his welfare presents a situation of harm or threatened harm to the child.

Notwithstanding this mandated authority at a roundtable discussion held last legislative term with CPS, GPD, and various non-profits, we learned that there has been cases of children reported to be in environments of immediate threat of harm that were not taken into protective custody.

Some of the reasons cited were a lack of placement options and resources.

Have you thought of as a board member if there are any ways that you can better promote the enforcement and improvement of standards of the practice of social work and accountability of social workers for the protection of the health and welfare of the public especially children to make sure they're removed from situations of harm or threat of harm?

Diana B. Calvo:

Well depending on where that social workers have employed and particularly if we're referencing child welfare services, I can say that it is a very emotionally demanding job and you the workers have to not only be a strict interpreter of the law to ensure the health and safety of that child because that is in the mandate of the Child Welfare Services Act.

But they also need to effectuate what kind of authoritative action that needs to be done which means that if at any time there is a potential threat of harm to a child it becomes the social workers' mandated responsibility to ensure the safety of that child or children.

And to engage law enforcement particularly to exact that kind of protection and there are different mechanisms that are in place to expedite the authority of child welfare services to assume being a part of that child.

It is ongoing and it has been an ongoing challenge to recruit foster families particularly because a lot of the children have been exposed to much violence and trauma and the behaviors of the children are very challenging to these families and so it really becomes inherent particularly with the Department of Public Health and Social Services to not only foster, there are much more active recruitment campaign but also to provide the necessary supports to foster families who will need that as they are caring for that child in a home setting.

And social workers need to be held pretty much to the fire if they are complacent in their work to try and find a more suitable placement or to initiate reunification of that child with family.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

One of the toughest jobs.

Diana B. Calvo:

Yes, it is.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

How would you improve the professional training and support needs of practicing social workers on Guam?

Do you believe the board has a role in that?

Diana B. Calvo:

Yes, I am.

When I was pursuing my master's degree it was at a time when Edward Dunning philosophies were being highlighted and the Japanese economy who had used his practices we're seen as being efficient and effective in various costs of saving ways.

And one of his philosophies has to do with continuous improvement and constant innovation and the only way that we can sharpen the skills of our Social Work professionals is for continuing education.

And so there would be really two parts to that one is to encourage all of the Social Work staff as well as other professionals through continuing units requirements. To seek

those kinds of educational opportunities so that they are able to meet the challenges that you know the new the new era brings.

But I also think that it's incumbent upon the board to try and bring out other options because the availability of those kinds of training options have been limited. I don't think that there's been any one organization that holds it is part of their responsibility to ensure that there are those opportunities for staff.

And through those kinds of professional development then I believe it would also strengthen the ethical part of their responsibility in working with individuals and families and then ensuring also that the board is serious about any kind of deviation from the ethical standards and moral standards that come with the position.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you.

My final question is, in the last term, the legislature passed a measure that extended the sunset provision on the Social Work Practice Act which for those applying for a certificate of exemption.

I think the board is still working on the rules and regulations and I wonder what your thoughts are on the need for this social work licensure. Is this urgent? Or do you know we had extended it I think a couple of times now, the requirement that they be licensed.

Diana B. Calvo:

Well the credentialing process communicates to the populace that the individuals have gone through the discipline of learning the field of practicing the techniques that would be helpful to the individual and it holds the individual down to a higher standard of performance.

So if there is a law that requires the credentialing and it also provides acknowledgement to individuals who may not have a Social Work degree but who have been practicing in the field.

Then it just adds to the pool of individuals who are part of that helping community and there are a lot of individuals who do not have a Social Work degree but who are one of the most effective and efficient Social Work staff that I know.

And so that would as I say maintain at least a current pool of Social Work staff as we move forward in the credentialing and licensure process.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you again Mrs. Calvo for agreeing to this but more than that thank you for your almost 40 years now of service to the government, to the people of Guam in your current capacity at Catholic Social Services.

It's very hard work I think that you have done all your life and so I want to commend you for that and thank you really. And for continuing to take up this challenge which would you know deal with the new social workers and licensing and I'm sure they are going to benefit from your experience if they have any contact with you at all during this process.

So I also want to thank you from my committee for your continued helpfulness. You're always willing to give us advice on bills that we are working on or how to best get the children that are in need off the streets and how to help them and so I want to thank you especially for all of that work. And I know that in your job you have to go way beyond what is written down on that paper and your contract pgrobably because that's just the way our community is right now. It's in need of dire help and I know that you do that all the time.

And I want to thank you very much for that.

Diana B. Calvo:

Thank you, senator.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you.

Thank you, Mrs. Calvo, that will conclude our testimony. So for all the nominees if we can get our committee reports done before the last of the month, then we would try to put these on the session agenda that normally occurs at the last week of the month.
