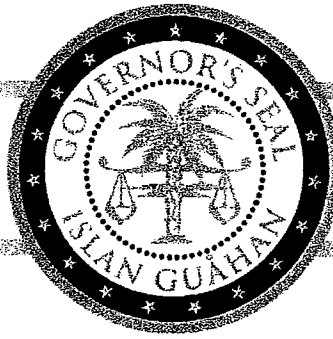

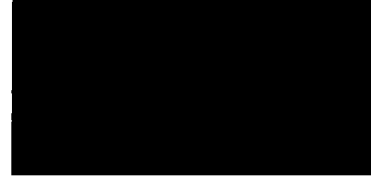

**Re Appointment to Public Utilities Commission**

Hafa Adai Senator Perez and Committee Members:

Thank you for holding this confirmation hearing. I also extend Un Dang Kulu Si Yu'os Ma'ase to Governor Lou Leon Guerrero for nominating me to serve as the CPA member of the Public Utilities Commission (PUC).

During my time as Public Auditor I became familiar with the agencies who come before the PUC, namely Guam Power Authority (GPA), Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA), Port Authority of Guam (PAG) and most recently Guam Solid Waste Authority (GSWA). This familiarity should help me as a Commissioner.

**GPA**

In 2016 the PUC approved the procurement of 180 MW dual fired combined combustion turbine plants. Last week, after review of GPA Docket 19-13, the PUC approved the award of the construction of a 198 MW power plant to the winning bidder, KEPCO. This will be Guam's first new base-load plant since the 1990s.

In addition GPA will be adding 120 MW of solar power to its generating capacity. This is a capital project I am very familiar with as the procurement appeal came before OPA.

Of concern to me is an issue that I raised while Public Auditor, GPA's heavy debt burden. GPA now has a negative Net investment in capital assets of \$39 million (M) as of September 30, 2018. This negative in equity or Net Position first occurred in FY 2016 when it was \$49M. I would be most interested in knowing what GPA will do to address this negative position.

In the FY 2018 OPA financial highlights of GPA, the 2010 Bond Refunding caught my attention. GPA refunded its 2010 Series Bonds through the issuance of 2017 Series Bonds in December 2017. This refunding resulted in an accounting "non cash"

loss of \$17.3 M and will reduce aggregate debt service payments by \$11.5M over the next 22 years and obtain a \$7.8 economic “non cash” gain.

### GWA

Another item before the PUC is GWA Docket 19-08, GWA’s Third Five-Year Financial Plan (Base Rate Increases), a third round of base-rate increases requested by GWA. This third rate request is substantial and if approved as presented, it would result in a 44% rate increase over five years. From my initial review of the document submissions, I have a number of questions, ranging from the 2 days on the CCU, update on court orders, water losses, and water purchases from the Navy. The GWA general manager addressed some of my concerns in his responses to questions posed at last week’s PUC meeting.

### GSWA

In July 2019 the PUC established the Protocol whereby the PUC will review contacts and obligations of the Guam Solid Waste Authority (GSWA) in excess of \$750,000. GSWA is to submit its Capital Improvement Budget by September 15 of each year plus a two-year estimate CIP plan. This will be the first time PUC will review GSWA financial issues.

Similar protocols are already in place for GPA, GWA and PAG but with different thresholds, \$1.5 million for GPA and \$1 million for GWA and PAG.

In the interest of disclosure, I bring to the committee's attention that GSWA’s former legal counsel was Georgette Concepcion. Mrs. Concepcion is the partner of my stepson Terry Brooks of the Brooks Concepcion law firm.

The PUC and staff and in particular Fred Horecky have done a tremendous job of keeping utility rates at reasonable levels. I look forward to working with the other Commissioners and ensuring that the rate payers of Guam have affordable utility rates and efficient service.

Thank you again for holding this hearing. I am ready to answer any questions you may have.



### COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

#### I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Environment, Revenue and Taxation, and Procurement convened a public hearing on November 6, 2019 at 9:00 a.m. in *I Liheslaturan Guahan* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of Ms. Doris F. Brooks to serve as Member (CPA Representative), Public Utilities Commission, whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero on September 20, 2019, to serve for six (6) years: November 1, 2019 to October 31, 2025; to fill the seat of Filomena Cantoria, whose term will expire on October 31, 2019.
- Appointment packet forwarded to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* on September 20, 2019
- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on September 30, 2019

#### Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all Senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on October 29, 2019 and again on November 4, 2019. Publication was conducted in the **Guam Daily Post**, a newspaper of general circulation, fulfilling the 5-Day Notice and 48 Hour Notice of the Open Government Law requirements respectively.

**Chairperson Perez:** *Si Yu'os ma'åse'*, Mr. Camacho. Thank you. Next is Jeff Johnson.

**Jeff Johnson, Chairman, Public Utilities Commission:** Hi, Madame Chairperson and fellow Senators. I'm going to read a testimony by our Administrative Law Judge, Mr. Frederick Horecky. Sincerely, Frederick J Horecky. And I, too, would echo all the sentiments previously expressed by Mr. Camacho and Mr. Horecky. Mrs. Brooks will be an excellent Member of the PUC in the future. Thank you, very much.

**Chairperson Perez:** Thank you, so much, Mr. Johnson. So now, for the nominee to provide her testimony.

**Doris Flores Brooks, Appointee:** Thank you very much, Senator Perez, and Senator Taitague, and Senator Ridgell, and Senator Castro. I'm very happy to be here. I do have written testimony, and if I may, I'll just go ahead and read it into the record. I also want to extend an *Un dānkolo si Yu'os ma'āse'* to Governor Lou Leon Guerrero, for nominating me to be the CPA Member of the PUC. And as was previously stated, during my time as Public Auditor I became very much aware of the government agencies that come before the PUC, namely, GPA, GWA, the Port Authority, and, of course, Guam Solid Waste, you know. And so, this familiarity will help me in my role as Commissioner. I'd like to speak to GPA. In 2016, the PUC approved this procurement of, the procurement of a 180-megawatt dual-fired, combined, combustion turbine plant. And, of course, last week at the PUC meeting, held last Thursday, the GPA Docket 19-13, the, the PUC unanimously approved the award of the construction to the winning bidder, KEPCO. And if you see in today's newspapers, you know, the contract has been signed. This will be Guam's first baseload plant since the 1990s. In addition, GPA will be adding 120-megawatts of solar power to its generating capacity. This is a capital project I am very familiar with in the procurement appeal, came before OPA. Now, and so let me just add, I know that the Legislature has, had expressed concern about going into renewables. I think with the new plant, what will happen is that this 120-megawatts will be able to be interfaced more efficiently. One of the things at the PUC hearing that was mentioned last week is the issue of storage. And one of the things in, in this thing, it will add for just one hour of storage so that the intermittency, you know, the fluctuations of solar, will affect, not adversely affect the grid when it's coming in. In Phase 3, what will happen, is storage capacity, where a lot of that storage will be reserved, so that it can be an interface in the evening hours where that's the most peak. And I do applaud the Legislature for the goal of having fifty percent renewables by, what—2035? And I think that that is certainly, well achievable. I'm at the hearing last week, the good Chairman said in all those areas, where there is so-called one hundred renewables, one of the areas where, he said is, do not go completely renewables because it cannot be baseload, meaning, there all the time. And that fossil fuel plants is still going to be needed to

overcome the inconsistencies, so to speak, of renewables. One concern I do have of GPA, and this is a concern I raised while I was the Public Auditor, is GPA's heavy debt burden. GPA has a negative net investment in capital assets of 30 million dollars, as of its latest financial audit of September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018. This negative equity, or net position, first occurred in FY 2016 when it was 40 million dollars. And so, I would be most interested in knowing what GPA will do to address the negative position. In 2018 according to the OPA financial highlights, the G, the 2010 bond refunding caught my attention. GPA refunded its 2010 Series bonds through the issuance of 2017 Series bonds in December of 2017. This refunding resulted in accounting non-cash loss of about \$17.3 million, and will reduce debt service payments by 11.5 so, it has a non-cash loss of 17 and it will have a cash savings of 11.5. That's going to take twenty-two years to amortize, okay. And, although it will have, through that process, an economic gain, again, non-cash of about 7.8 so we did this, you know, refunding at a twenty of—and it's going to take us twenty-two years, pardon the expression, to 'break even'. Yeah. And so, what I had noticed in the past is that GPA before was refinancing and extending the, the term. Therefore, whatever savings that you could have gotten from a lower rate was eaten up by the fact you had more interest, and that's why now it has a negative \$39 million dollars. And also, on the next Docket of GWA, I'm, on, the next Docket for PUC is GWA. And this is Docket 19-08. And this is going to be their third five-year rate increase. This rate request is quite substantial, and if approved as presented, it would result in a forty-four percent rate increase over five years. And I calculated, just based on my, my average fifty-six dollars water bill. It would be fifty--I just use fifty dollars. It's going to be over seventy-seven dollars in five years. You know, just based on, if the rate increase, as presented, is approved by the PUC. So, I've also looked at the document submission and I do have, I do have a number of questions. And, as Fred Horecky alluded, you know, last week I did have a chance to answer some of those questions. For example, the CCU did not unanimously approve the rate request. There were two commissioners who opposed it. And according to Mr. Bordallo, it was because they thought the rate request should have been lower. And then, of course, other concerns I've always had continuously, is the continued water losses that GWA has had for many, many, many years. And what I've asked the chair, I mean, Mr. Bordallo, is, 'what is your plan to mitigate those losses and what time frame are you going to establish that?' You know. And then, of course, the Navy purchase of water, you know, that continues to increase. And so, although, according to Mr. Bordallo, now, that increase has stabilized but the rate per water purchases is, is quite significant. And as I was talking to Senator Nelson, you know, how much is the Navy drawing from the aquifer? And so that should be of concern to us, also. And, I guess fundamentally, why is the Navy in the water business? Why can it be a customer of GWA, as opposed, like the way the Navy is the customer of GPA for power. You know. So why is the Navy in the water business and selling water as opposed to being a customer. Okay, so those are just some of the concerns I have. And, of course, more, most recently and hopefully come January, the Guam Solid Waste Authority will become truly independent with the, the receivership going away. And the PUC has already established the protocol whereby the PUC will review all contract obligations in excess of \$750,000 and, and Solid Waste submit its capital improvement budget by September of each year and a two-year estimate. And so, this will be the first time the PUC will be reviewing the Guam Solid Waste because, with the ending of the receivership, you know. And, of course, we already know that GPA, I mean the PUC, has similar protocols for contract review. For example, last week the PUC approved the contract for some capital improvement project, projects out of the Port Authority. So, GPA has a threshold of 1.5 that contracts have to come before the PUC, whereas GWA and the Port have a \$1 million threshold, and the Solid Waste has a \$750,000 threshold. And

in the interest of disclosure, I bring to the committee's attention, the Guam Solid Waste's former legal counsel was Georgette Concepcion. Ms. Concepcion is a partner of my stepson, Terry Brooks, of the Brooks Concepcion Law firm. The PUC and the staff, in particular Fred Horecky, have done a tremendous job of keeping utility rates at reasonable levels. I look forward to working with the other commissioners and ensuring that the ratepayers of Guam have affordable utility rates and efficient service. Thank you, for again, for holding this hearing. I'm ready to answer any questions you may have.

**Chairperson Perez:** Thank you, Mrs. Brooks. I think that's amazing, we just got an education here today, and I think it just goes to show you have a depth of knowledge. You're well-prepared for this position. You have my support. I just want to thank you for accepting the nomination.

**Ms. Brooks:** Thank you, Senator. I look forward to serving, and I hope the rest of your colleagues will feel likewise.

**Chairperson Perez:** Okay, so I would like to acknowledge my colleague that is joining me today, Senator Ridgell. And I would now like to also open the floor for questions to my colleagues. Senator Castro.

**Senator Castro:** Thank you, Madame Chair. No questions, just a few observations. First of all, I'm both amazed and comforted by the fact that we have another highly qualified, highly capable woman leader from the community to replace the vacancy of Dr. Cantoria, another person of high esteem and tremendous character. I'd also like to cite, for the record, that there simply wasn't enough space in the submission, in the packet, and submitted. So, I went through her resume and I could see why she, she didn't have enough space there. For the record, it's, it's worth noting that Ms. Brooks, here, has an honorary Doctorate. She's a certified Public Accountant. She's also a Harvard graduate, and a fellow educator. For me, it's important to see that we have someone who's a citizen-volunteer, as I highlighted in the previous nomination. Ms. Brooks, here, is a member of the Soroptimists, has volunteered with Girl Scouts of America, and is an active volunteer in her institution of worship. Thank you, for that. If, that wasn't enough Madame Chair, she's a biker and a runner, and paddler. Three things I am not, so, all the more power to you, ma'am. Thank you, Dr. Brooks, for accepting the appointment. I want to also publicly thank you, Madame Chair, for hearing this appointment within a 60-day window. I think it's important that all nominations from the island's Chief Executive be publicly heard and given equal opportunity to be voted up or down, notwithstanding the non-partisan nature of the Commission. I want to publicly thank Governor Lou Leon Guerrero for appointing a highly qualified, highly capable, but fair and well-rounded Republican to the Commission. You have my full vote of confidence, Dr. Brooks. Thank you.

**Ms. Brooks:** Thank you. I'm not a doctor—

**Senator Castro:** An honorary doctorate is good enough for me, ma'am. Thank you.

**Chairperson Perez:** Thank You, Senator Castro, and yes, thank you for reminding me about the service of Dr. Cantoria, and I do appreciate all her service on the PUC Board, as well. Senator Taitague.

**Senator Taitague:** Thank you, Madame Chair, and like the previous nominee, the Chair divulged an interest in the last person. And I have to also, for disclosure, say that I, too, am a southern girl, as well—

**Ms. Brooks:** Yes. Yes, *Inarajan*—

**Senator Taitague:** *Inarajan* rules—

**Ms. Brooks:** Yes—

**Senator Taitague:** Sorry, *Yoña* or *Talo'fo'fo'* or anybody. So, I've known Doris for many years, and we do come from the same village, and this one southern girl is very proud because of what you, the pathway you made for us, us young women in the south and I, I looked up to you, and you were my mentor when I was going after public service, as well. And, and being here today, Doris, I know that with the wealth of knowledge that you have, you can do anything you want. So, it really, it's just humbling to know that you, you still want to serve the people and volunteer for something like this. It's just amazing. It speaks well of you. You know, I had a list of questions and I'm still trying to put my head around this testimony that you brought, with all this additional information my head's going around that, you know. But, I was gonna ask you, if you, you know, went after some other previous board minutes and reviewed it? It's obvious that you're already engaged and finding out and, you know, I tell you, you board members, get ready. Because Doris is on the board and she is going to cross every 't' and dot every 'i', as well as add it up. So, you have my full support. Again, thank you for serving the people of Guam, doing this for us. I very well, appreciate it. Thank you.

**Ms. Brooks:** Thank You, Senator, for your kind words and I look forward to the opportunity of serving our people, yeah.

**Chairperson Perez:** Thank You, Senator Taitague. Senator Ridgell.

**Senator Ridgell:** Thank you, Madame Chair. Just a couple of questions. One, you mentioned about the fifty percent renewables but also the bill we passed requires a hundred percent renewables by 2045 so you're correct, fifty percent by 2035 and then a hundred percent by 2045 is the recent legislation we've passed. What are your thoughts on a hundred percent renewables by 2045?

**Ms. Brooks:** I'm not going to be around by that time, I'm sure, so I think the technology is still there. From what I've read, from the testimony, in fact, our good Chairman here had indicated, all those who do have so-called one hundred percent really don't have one hundred percent renewables. But I think, eventually it will become that, you know, with, you know, whoever thought of the internet and we do now, so I think with that. But you know 2035 is, I think, achievable. Do we want one hundred percent? I think, I think so. Yes. The question really, what the real question is, will the technology be there to support that? That's not really the issue, it's the technology.

**Senator Ridgell:** Thank you, Senator.

**Ms. Brooks:** Because, you know, going back to the 120-megawatt, you know, because afterwards I, when they were talking about it and I asked John, ‘John, I thought we had storage capacity because that was one of the driving factors, you know, in the appeal decision?’ And what he explained to me was, it was for the intermittent to, to stabilize the fluctuation. But it wasn’t enough storage capacity for, to be able to use all that solar-generated, so we could use it at night, because you know, Guam’s peak load is in the evening. And he said that’s going to be Phase 3 of the renewable project. And I’m glad to know that they want to achieve that. And if we can achieve it sooner, let’s do so, you know. But a lot’s going to depend on the, the storage capacity and that’s why you have, right now, for example, like electric cars, it’s, it’s the battery that’s the challenge, yeah.

**Senator Ridgell:** Thanks. Yeah I, I agree. I believe that the store-, I mean, the technology will be there. I think twenty-five years is enough time for the technology to get there. I liken it to, you know, just think where we were at, technologically, twenty-five years ago. I think we were using pagers.

**Ms. Brooks:** Yes.

**Senator Ridgell:** Instead of cellphones.

**Ms. Brooks:** Yeah.

**Senator Ridgell:** And, you know, remember back then, when you had to page? And then, when the two-way pager came out, everyone went bananas. And now, we have smart—

**Ms. Brooks:** Or the fax machine.

**Senator Ridgell:** Fax machines. You know, now we have cell phones with smart technology. You can literally log on to the internet from wherever you’re sitting. So, I think twenty-five years, technology will be there. But you’re right, of course, it’s all going to be contingent upon whether or not the technology is actually there to achieve a hundred percent. So, I’m happy to hear that you do think that a hundred percent is a good goal to set, and that your main issue is whether or not technology is available for that. One other question is, what are your thoughts on the net energy metering program? Specifically, the Guam Power Authority has previously petitioned the PUC to change the ratio, at which NEM customers would be reimbursed for, or, I forget the exact term. Basically, how much NEM customers would be credited, I believe, is the correct term for the power that they produce from their solar panels. So, currently they’re getting, basically, like a one-to-one kind of ratio. They’re basically getting the same amount that GPA charges its customers, is how much they’re crediting NEM customers for the power they produce. But GPA has been seeking a reduction in that amount, which would negatively impact NEM customers. What are your thoughts on that?

**Ms. Brooks:** Well, first of all, I’m not sure, is that before the PUC right now?

**Mr. Johnson:** It's still ongoing. From time to time, they approach us and bring that up. Right now, it's, we're kind of in a holding pattern, again. So, it's still dollar-for-dollar. We're gonna revisit it maybe within, about a year or two.

**Ms. Brooks:** Okay. Well, I myself, have been wanting to get solar, you know, because I think it's the right thing to do. But what has what has, in my own personal review, what has discouraged me is, because the fact that there is no storage, right now. And that's why I have not gone and made that investment. We've had a lot of, you know, people, you know, salespeople come and talk to us about it. We've done a lot to minimize our own power bill, like double-pane windows and re-doing the roof, and things of that nature, you know, because the bills were very high. But right now, I would like to continue to see incentives for the consumer, so that they will take that investment, you know, because we all have to do our part, yeah.

**Senator Ridgell:** Thank you. You have my support.

**Ms. Brooks:** Thank you very much, Senator.

**Chairperson Perez:** Well, thank you, Senator Ridgell. So, this concludes this portion of this agenda. So, thank you very much for being here today and providing testimony. *Si Yu'os ma'åse'*.

Chairperson Perez then adjourned the confirmation hearing for **Ms. Doris F. Brooks**.
