## Group rosary resumes despite restrictions

On Wednesday about 20 people gathered at the former police "koban" in Barrigada for a rosary in celebration of Our Lady of Fatima, the Blessed Virgin Mary, despite a government mandate limiting gathering to no more than 10 people due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Fatima, in Portugal.

On May 13, 1917, three children - Lucia dos Santos and her

cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto saw visions of Mary just outside the town of Fatima while the children

were taking sheep to graze, according to portugal.com. The event has inspired devotion to holding rosaries across the world.

"We have been doing this for the past three years since the 100th anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima," said Cruz. "Her main message is to pray because there will be a terrible war if we don't."

Cruz said she personally experienced a miracle after praying to Our Lady of Fatima 10 years ago and promising to swear off all makeup and hair dye if her granddaughter, who doctors said would be born with severe brain damage, would be born healthy.

Cruz's prayers were answered.

"(My granddaughter) was born and she was perfect. And she is the smartest thing today," she said.

# Restaurants to reopen for dining in May 25

Mask-wearing waiters, more space between tables, and perhaps some discounts on to-go orders may just well be among the new realities when Guam restaurants reopen their doors for dining in, as early as May 25 which coincides with Memorial Day.

Gov. Lou Leon Guerrero on Monday said the business restrictions on dine-in restaurants will be lifted soon, but they are allowed only up to 50% of their normal occupancy to make enough room for social distancing.

After the news briefing, Adelup clarified the governor expects to receive draft Department of Public Health and Social Services guidance on restaurants' reopening for her consideration on May 21.

"After this guidance has been reviewed and approved, the goal is to permit the opening of restaurants for dine-in services by Monday, May 25," Press Secretary Krystal Paco-San Agustin stated.

The Office of the Governor also reminds everyone that restrictions will be relaxed based on available case data and other factors.

"While we work to meet this goal,



dates are fluid and may be revised,"

### the office said. Parks, beaches under review for reopening

Besides lifting some restrictions on dine-in restaurants, the governor is also looking at allowing the reopening of public parks and beaches and yoga and pilates studios.

But the reopening of gyms is still under discussion because it's "a little bit more risky," the governor said.

She asked that people don't "let their guards down" and continue to practice preventive measures to defeat COVID-19, including wearing masks, frequent hand washing, and maintaining social

"It's the new normal for employees and customers. We just have to get used to it for health reasons," Christina Perez, the owner, manager and baker, said.

But once customers are in their seats, they can take off their mask.

There will be enough space between customers because there will be fewer seats in the restaurant to maintain social distancing, Perez said.

Discount for to-go orders

Michelle Kosloski, owner Michelle's Coffee Shop, cooked up a new business strategy that she said will give more incentive to people choosing to order to-go food than dine in.

She said she will continue to offer

a 15% discount to customers ordering food-to-go, even after dining-in is allowed again.

"COVID-19 will still be here. But customers ordering to-go will continue to help prevent the spread so that's why we will continue to give them 15% off if they are to-go customers," she said, as social distancing will still be in people's mind long after the executive orders are lifted.

After more than a month of closure, Michelle's Coffee Shop reopened on May 1 for pick-up orders.

"But I'm very grateful that customers are coming back. They cheer me up," she said.

Future diners at Denny's at Micronesia Mall will also be greeted by food servers and staff wearing masks, according to assistant restaurant manager Kawika Palieassei.

"Spacing between tables will be changed so there will still be social distancing. There will be fewer people allowed in at any given time, depending on what (the Department of Public Health) will allow as far as occupancy. There will be constant sanitizing. This is going to be the new normal," she said.

Rotten Apple Steampunk Restaurant in Tamuning reopened on May 4 for to-go orders and the customer response was "a little crazier" than expected according to its owner, Eddie Chien.

"It was like a jolt to the system," Chien said. "It's a nice feeling."



### § 60401. Guam Land Use Commission.

- (a) There is within the government of Guam the Guam Land Use Commission (Commission). The Commission shall be composed of five (5) members to be appointed by I Maga'låhi (the Governor) by and with the advice and consent of I Liheslatura (the Legislature) for a period of five (5) years; provided, however, that of the five (5) members first appointed, one (1) member shall serve for a term of one (1) year, two (2) members shall serve for terms of three (3) years each, and the remaining two (2) members shall serve for terms of five (5) years each, as designated by I Maga'låhi. Quorum shall require the presence of three (3) members.
- (b) When, pursuant to this Act, a Hybrid Commission is to be empaneled, four (4) additional members shall be seated as part of the Guam Land Use Commission, and designated as "Municipal Commissioners" (MCs).
  - (1) MCs shall be appointed on an ad hoc basis as determined by the location of a land use application submitted pursuant to Chapter 61 of Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, and in accordance with the following guidelines:

- (A) The first (1st) Municipal Commissioner shall be the Mayor of the respective municipality where the land use action will occur.
- (B) The second (2nd), third (3rd), and fourth (4th) Municipal Commissioners, who *shall* be elected Mayors or Vice-Mayors, *shall* be appointed by the President of the Mayors Council, with the recommendation of the first (1st) Municipal Commissioner.
- (2) The term of the Municipal Commissioners *shall* terminate when final disposition of the land use project or application for which the Hybrid Commission was empaneled has been completed."
- (3) Quorum under an empaneled Hybrid Commission *shall* be five (5) members.
- (c) Votes Needed for Approval.
- (1) When a Hybrid Commission is empaneled, a total of five (5) affirmative votes is required for the approval of any Commission action for any decision in any land use matter; except summary zone change applications.
- (2) Otherwise, when a Hybrid Commission is not empaneled, a total of three (3) affirmative votes is required for the approval of any Commission action for any decision in any zoning matter, change or variance; except summary zone change applications.
- (d) Empanelment of a Hybrid Commission. A Hybrid Commission shall be empaneled for projects or applications projected to have a development cost, exclusive of the cost of the subject real property, of more than Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000).

- (b) recommendations, if any, of new names for streets and highways already named, either under the provisions of Chapters 61

and 62 of this Title of the Guam Code Annotated or by common usage within Guam.

- (c) a map incorporating proposed highway and street names of all the streets and highways of Guam (except such streets and highways as are located upon military reservations of the United States), including in such map both those names already established and accepted and the new names proposed by the Commission.
- (d) in determining highway and street names, the plan shall include as far as practical Chamorro or Spanish words for the terms street, drive, avenue, alley, and similar words, utilizing in lieu thereof Chamorro words as *chalan* or Spanish words as *camino*.

Upon the transmittal to the Legislature of the approved plan as provided in § 60406, the Legislature shall hold at least one (1) public hearing in order to permit the public to present its views as to the proposed street and highway names. The legislature, upon the conclusion of such hearing may, by statute, adopt the plan as submitted or may amend the same in whole or in part. Upon adoption, the names so approved shall be the official names of the streets and highways of the territory.

All proposals for the use, lease or purchase of government land for the purpose of commercial mining or removing therefrom any minerals, rocks or sand for processing shall be presented to the Guam Natural Resources Board. The Board shall determine if the proposal is consonant with the public interests and in keeping with proper conservation practices. The Board may recommend any such use, lease or sale of government land to the Governor including any such conditions that may be necessary such as bonds for compliance with the proposals presented.

- (a) a public hearing on the proposed lease or sale of government land must be conducted by the Board;
- (b) a notice for said hearing shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation at least ten (10) days before the day set for the hearing; and
- (c) the notice for hearing shall contain a summary description of the proposed mining operations.

### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was called to order at 1:06 PM. Chairperson Therese Terlaje presented the agenda item that would be heard during the hearing, informed of public notice compliance and presented the general rules of conduct and protocol for the virtual confirmation hearing. The appointment of Anita B. Enriquez to serve as a member of the Guam Land Use Commission was the first item on the agenda.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> I'd like to acknowledge the presence of my colleagues beginning with the Legislative Secretary, Senator Amanda Shelton, Senator Regine Biscoe Lee; Thank—I'm sorry, the Vice Speaker, my apologies, Senator Telena Nelson, Senator Wil Castro. Thank you, colleagues for being here. I'd also like to thank the appointees who are here and those who have come to testify on their behalf.

So we will begin with the appointment of Dr. Anita B. Enriquez as a member of the Guam Land Use Commission. The Guam Land Use Commission is composed of five members and I think the quorum is three. The purpose of this centralized planning Land Use

Commission is to ensure that the people are not subjected to unbridled and unmanageable growth that would threaten the benefits, comforts, and privileges to which each Guam resident is entitled.

The Guam Land Use Commission receives reports from the agency review committee, which is composed of different agencies. They give their recommendations as to the proposed either rezoning or variance to the zoning laws and then—but it's the Commission that actually makes the decision, despite whatever might be in that report and sometimes the Commissions, they also hear from, of course, the public and the Municipal Planning Councils of the different villages.

So we first have signed up to testify on behalf of Dr. Enriquez, is Sonny Ada here? Alright, I don't see him so we'll move to the Director Melanie Mendiola.

Melanie Mendiola: Håfa Adai, it's great to see everyone again. Again, my name is Melanie Mendiola and I'm the administrator and CEO at the Guam Economic Development Authority. I'm here in my personal capacity to provide testimony for my professor, my colleague and my friend, Dr. Anita Enriquez for her nomination to the Guam Land Use Commission.

Dr. Borja Enriquez was the first representative of the University of Guam with whom I had the pleasure of interacting upon my return home from college and in my involvement at the Guam Chamber of Commerce's Guam Young Professionals Subcommittee. Dr. Enriquez and her husband, Noel, were always very support of our fledgling group, providing guidance and mentorship to us.

I subsequently joined the Professional Master's in Business Administration, PMBA cohort in 2011 and graduated in 2012 and Dr. Enriquez was a constant presence in this program, which I later found out was a program that she played a pretty pivotal role in establishing. Dr. Enriquez advocated for the scholar practitioner approach towards problem solving and she'd always say, "this is what the research and data say. Now how can we make it relevant for our community."

And I believe that this approach will be of great use to the Guam Land Use Commission. During my time at the University of Guam Endowment Foundation, she was extremely

supportive of our efforts to fundraise for the University of Guam. She impressed upon her Deans and the team at the Endowment the importance of cooperation and her bridge

building really helped us get a campaign off the ground. This is our campaign for scholarships called "the G is for Giving Campaign" and this continues to break records after three years since its launch.

I was very happy last year to have co-taught the last cohort that came through the PMBA program and I hope to be a professor someday at the University of Guam because I mean who wouldn't want to be just like Dr. Anita Enriquez, you know?

This is just a snapshot of my experiences with Dr. Enriquez. I hope that I was able to convey how much of an impact she'd had on me personally and professionally and the kind of impact she'd had on Chamorro women leaders, current leaders and future leaders on the island. Thank you very much.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you very much, Director Mendiola. We will now hear from Sonny Ada. You may begin, please state your name for the record.

<u>Sonny Ada:</u> Hi, good afternoon. Håfa Adai, everyone. Sonny Ada. I'm here to testify in favor of Dr. Enriquez to the Guam Land Use Commission Board and I really, I just have to say it—ever since I was back at the University of Guam Board of Regents from 2004-2012, I've come to know Dr. Enriquez and I've always known her to be very professional, certainly educated but most important was she was engaged.

She was always there. She was always present. And even subsequent to my time at the University, I've just seen her in the community in multiple, not just social events but meetings. And again, representing the University, which she does very well. So you know taking the three attributes that I mentioned, being educated, professional and engaged.

Those are quantities that I think any board serving the community should have and she's ready, willing and able to do so. I mean out all that together and I think it's a slam dunk. So I'm totally in favor and I hope that this Committee does see that she is worthy to throw her hat into the public service in the position as a board member for the Guam Land Use Commission. Thank you.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you very much, Mr. Ada. We will now hear from Ms. Holly Rustick, President of the Guam Women's Chamber of Commerce.

<u>Holly Rustick:</u> Thank you so much, Senator Therese Terlaje. It's a pleasure being here and it's a pleasure reading—I actually have a letter on behalf of the Guam Women's Chamber. So I'd like to go ahead and read that to you now.

(Please refer to written testimony submitted by the President of the Guam Women's Chamber)

Thank you very much.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> I would like to recognize the presence of Senator Telo Taitague. Thank you for joining us. And we will now hear from Mr. David Tydingco.

<u>David Tydingco</u>: *Håfa Adai*, Madam Chairperson and members of the Committee. Thank you for this opportunity to testify in support of Dr. Anita Enriquez. I am testifying as a private citizen. My wife and I kind of own and operate the Valley of the Latte. I serve as CEO and she serves and Commander-in-Chief and whatever she says, I do.

I've known Dr. Anita for close to 20 years and one of the first engagements I've had with her was when we talked about building our national museum as it stands today, back in the early 2000s. Dr. Enriquez was not just a team player but a truly committed and a leader in the project.

Her dedication and perseverance as part of the team ultimately led to the funding and construction of what we know now as the Antonio Palomo Guam National Museum. Her resume will clearly show ow she cares about our island and our people with the various organizations and initiatives she has been or is currently involved in. She is a person who I know will serve with integrity and can be counted on to make fair and unbiased decisions as a member of the Guam Land Use Commission as it will affect our people, our island and our economy.

The other thing I just want to add is she is so accessible and responsible. I called her about a month ago and said we, as small businesses, need the help and resources of the University to try to get through this COVID 19 pandemic and the impact it is having on all our little businesses. And she was right there for us. She stood up resources at the University.

We have an ongoing program now that we hope to launch with the University to train our people about safe practices, develop programs that will just help Guam recover a lot faster and its because of her leadership at the University that we were able to stand this up really quickly. So I want to personally thank her for that.

As a member of the Guam Land Use Commission, I know the tough decisions to balance economic development with what is good and right for our people and I just know she will always make the right decision. I hope you consider this testimony for her conformation. I will gladly answer any questions if you have of me on Dr. Anita's appointment.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> *Hågu Mås*, Mr. Tydingco. And I want to also welcome to our zoom hearing, Senator Kelly Marsh Taitano. Thank you for joining us. And now, we have Dr. Krise, President of the University of Guam.

<u>Dr. Thomas Krise:</u> Thank you, Senator. Thank you all Senators. I've very pleased to provide oral testimony in favor of Dr. Anita Borja Enriquez's appointment to the Guam Land Use Commission. I think her commitment to economic development are experienced in that and the way that she's connected, the preparation of future business leaders and even current business leaders in the School of Business and Public Administration to actual businesses to actual innovation will be a great asset to the Land Use Commission.

And I think, you know, years of experience as a business professor, Dean of the School of Business and Public Administration and now as provost and senior Vice President of the University, where she's, of course, the Chief Academic Officer and the Chief Student Affairs Officer for the University, all of that will provide terrific connections, I think, for the board. I think the experience and expertise will be just what the board needs and I can't recommend her more highly so I urge you to confirm her.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you very much, Dr. Krise. Thank you for being here with us. And we will now hear from Dr. Enriquez.

<u>Dr. Anita B. Enriquez:</u> Buenas yan Håfa Adai, Honorable Senator Therese Terlaje and members of the Committee on Health, Tourism, Historic Preservation, Land and Justice and Honorable Senators. Si Yu'os Ma'åse' for this opportunity to provide my testimony based on my appointment to serve on the Guam Land Use Commission. I'm very grateful for the confidence Governor Lou Leon Guerrero and Lieutenant Governor Josh Tenorio have expressed through this appointment and very humbled and quite mamålao and greatly appreciative of the overwhelming support of those who have provided oral testimony on behalf of my appointment.

I'm aware that the GLUC is a decision-making body empowered to grant subdivision approvals, zone changes, conditional uses and variances from land use laws and regulations as well as seashore reserve and wetland perks and the overarching benefits to our communities and the island's economy. And this comes with heavy responsibility and the need to exercise extreme care and review and balance how decisions are made.

Integrity and transparency are paramount. My passion and commitment to our island is enduring and has been the compass that has guided me throughout my life. This includes extensive experience with several community development projects and organizations that enable me to appreciate the particular challenges and the long-term planning goals that will be presented to the GLUC.

The experiences I have had on government and nonprofit boards, coupled with the key administrative positions at the University of Guam and collaborative work with private sector, government and nonprofit organizations have provided me with a deeper appreciation for addressing multiple stakeholder interests, fiscal, environmental and compliance considerations and ensuring the best possible outcome and strategic planning and decision making.

My engagement with the Hågatña Restoration and Redevelopment Authority and the significant towards revitalizing our historic downtown capital as a founding—sorry,

working with various stakeholders to plan and build our new Guam National Museum as a founding member of the Guam Museum Foundation Board and a member of the Guam Department of Chamorro Affairs Board of Trustees, and understanding and respect for our cultural barriers through collaboration with the Guam Preservation Trust as part of the revitalization of downtown Hågatña's small business development initiative, the one village, one product and Guam Green Growth initiative in alignment with the United Nations Sustainable Development goals, give me an expansive frame to draw from in my role as a prospective member of the GLUC.

In closing, with confidence of your committee, with the confidence of our honorable senators and our people, I will commit towards providing a strategic and insightful approach towards responsible, sustainable and balanced development that respects our natural environment, our heritage and our community at large. I am always mindful of the importance of building our human capacity and assets to improve the overall quality of life for our island and its people socially and economically.

I intend to leverage the values of integrity, respetu and Inafamåolek as they support the responsible development of our island's land, coastal shorelines and natural environment ecosystem within the purview of the GLUC and compliance. It will be an honor and a privilege to serve in this new capacity. Si Yu'os Ma'åse'. Anita Borja Enriquez. Thank you.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you very much, Dr. Enriquez. Appreciate your testimony and your willingness to serve on this Commission. It has a very big role, as you said, in the development of Guam, in our prosperity and also in our quality of lives so thank you for recognizing that. I wanted to also put on record that we have received testimony in support of your nomination from Siska S. Hutapea, President of Cornerstone Valuation Guam; from Mr. Quinata the Chief Program Officer at the Guam Preservation Trust; from Rita Pangelinan Nauta from Guampedia; from Denise R. Selk from Coco-Jo's; and from Doyon A. Morato, Operations Manager of Silver Mountain Construction.

I guess—if I could just start off with the questioning—I'd like to ask...The biggest issue with this Commission is the pressure that it faces. There's huge pressure, huge stakes, as you know, developments are very costly, the investments for our businesses and our families and so I know from the Commission, it's a very hard thing to do and we've seen it, that the communities have actually, you know, risen up in protests of the decisions by this commission and so we want you to weigh everything fairly, of course, but I just want to know if you think there's also a new push for speed, right?

They want these things to be done fast. Sometimes they'll try to push it through the legislature so that they will be faster but it really, you know, requires deliberation and consideration of every agency's input because there are agencies charged with protection of seashores, protection of water or water sources and all those that are crucial to our lives and so I guess I want to just hear from you on that, on the pressures that, if you can anticipate that and how you think you might handle that. I'm sure you know everyone who might be applying, and you know, it's going to be your friends, who are coming to you at the point.

**Dr. Anita B. Enriquez:** Si Yu'os Ma'åse' Madam Chair. I was listening to the three plus hours hearing by...or meeting rather by the GLUC back in March of this year and, of course, those links are posted on the Office of Public Auditor's page—and certainly, there's always a desire to take advantage of opportunities that are going to sort of, you know, grow different businesses, different developers portfolios and the one thing that I'm always reminded, essentially, is the need to have a balanced approach at development and is there

an overarching plan and have all the stakeholders who have interests in this particular development, even if their interests are not direct but they will be impacted somehow whether it'd be directly or indirectly, have they been consulted somehow.

And it goes to—I don't know if its partly training that I've had over the years in dealing with different governance bodies at the University of Guam. We have a faculty union; we have a faculty senate; we have an Administrative Council; we have Staff Council. We have the Student Government Association and so recognizing that there's a lot at stake, the question that always poses, have we consulted with this group; have we consulted with that group.

And review, obviously, of the Department of Land Management and its website and knowing, essentially, some of the processes that are involved in who needs to review what prior to anything actually appearing before the GLUC and to also hear the presentations during the GLUC meetings, at least through the recording that I heard and its usually a representative on behalf of the investor or on behalf of the developer and so I often think about, over the years, how different parts of the island have gone through some sort of development but there's a lot of this sort of disparate condition in terms of we've got those who are very poor and those who are relatively wealthy and you have the in-between, and what are we doing about affordable housing and what are we doing about preserving ancestral lands and zoning and "oh gosh, you know, I want to have this development because it has an amazing view but what about the environment," and so forth.

So having that balanced approach and exercising due diligence is going to be critical, I feel, in this particular role and, of course, they're gonna be a lot of pressures but you know, I've seen all types of pressures very similar to this and of course, you know, it always comes back to what is the responsibility of the person holding that role within any board, within any Commission and having served on multiple boards, recognizing the need to exercise integrity, the need to exercise purpose, the need to align with the mission, the need to protect a much boarder comprehensive stakeholders interests and in light of the fact that we haven't seen much progress in that balanced approach towards development of our lands, it's high time that we do have a more comprehensive and balanced approach at doing so.

And so as all of these different requests come in, the question is where do they fit or where do they not fit and what other kinds of investments are being made to ensure that the infrastructure is as adequate and that neighboring communities or neighboring residents are going to be, you know, okay with this. I hope that answers your question.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Yes, I appreciate the thoughtfulness of your response, Dr. Enriquez and I know, I have known you for many years, even at the University of Guam and prior to that. I...very early on, as a young lawyer, is, I think, when we met. And so, I want to thank you for all your work in the community as well and I hope that helps you in this newest endeavor. I'd like to open it now for questions from the Senators, beginning with Vice Speaker. Vice Speaker Nelson?

<u>Vice Speaker Telena C. Nelson:</u> Thank you, Madam Chair. That was actually the primary question that I wanted to ask as well and I appreciate, Dr. Enriquez, that you took the time out to listen to the meeting minutes of the board that you are being appointed to. Yeah, many people don't do their research of their appointment and so I thank you for that. I thank you for answering the call to serve our community and you know, I'm really concerned about the protection of our natural resources.

We have had many protests in the past and, you know, myself, I felt that they didn't consider the natural resources of our island and it was almost as if the pressure was on the Guam Land Use Commission to push development agenda but not really looking at Guam in a holistic approach and really seeing where should we prioritize commercial businesses, where we should prioritize residential businesses.

I mean we also see it with the way that they did the land for the landless or Chamorro Land Trust. You know, these plans weren't really thought out and so I hope that as we move forward and that, you, as an anticipated member of the Commission that you would be able to, you know, help guide them in this way, in a comprehensive approach on where we are doing our development and how is it impacting our natural resources and also the people of Guam. Thank you very much and, you know, I'm a great fan of you. I look up to you as a role model and I'm happy to be here and to support your appointment. Thank you.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you, Vice Speaker. We'll now here from Legislative Secretary, Senator Amanda Shelton.

<u>Senator Amanda L. Shelton:</u> Thank you very much, Madam Chair. And I think, you know, Senator Terlaje, her question and Vice Speaker's comments are really what I was thinking as well, but I think your background, Dr. Enriquez, as an academic, as a women in business, as a community advocate, as so many different facets of your background will

really help make you a trusted voice on this board that will do what's right by the people of Guam.

And I especially appreciated what Holly brought up about your work now with the G3 initiative and your concern about the environment and your community work in that area and at the University of Guam. I know that you care about our island and what's best for our island in that way.

So, although there will be challenges, I'm sure to make decisions that you feel torn at, you are a strong woman who is able to make decisions like that and so I know you're also a very busy woman but I have the confidence that you'll be able to take on all the tasks at hand and continue your work at the University while serving in this position so thank you very much for answering the call and I thank the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor for appointing such a qualified person to this board. Thank you.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you very much, Senator Shelton. We'll now hear from our Minority Leader, Senator Taitague.

Senator Telo Taitague: Si Yu'os Ma'åse' Madam Chair, and the questioning was excellent for Anita because all you're gonna hear from me is like I love you, Anita. You are great. I've known you for so long and every question that I had, you were always there to give your point of view and I definitely respect all the answers you've given me, and they've helped me in the past and now, I look to you hoping that you use that well knowledgeable person that you are and but most especially, the balance that I see in your life, the balance in the environment, and the balance in the economy. Those two together. If there's any other person that would know something more or would know more about putting the two together, it is definitely you. I see your love for our island and I know that you won't let it go a row to something that's not going to be sustainable and better for our people, especially our economy. Let's grow that economy, Anita.

You know, one of the biggest issues is having these agencies and directors to provide the reports in a timely manner. I put a bill out recently that would put a penalty for directors who do not, within a certain time, provide the information needed for businesses wanting the report for their property, the ARC, for example and it would find them. I hope you support that because you know that time is money too when it comes into the economy but most especially Anita, you're a beautiful person in every aspect of the word of a woman that we can be able to be proud of, as women, to say that you definitely represent us well.

Thank you so much for all you're doing for the island and thank you, congratulations and, of course, you have my full support. Thank you.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you, Senator Taitague. We'll now hear from Senator Régine Biscoe Lee.

<u>Senator Régine Biscoe Lee:</u> Thank you, Madam Chair. Can you hear me? Okay. Thank you, Madam Chair, and I also want to thank the Governor and Lieutenant Governor for this awesome appointment. I want to thank everyone who has participated in our hearing today, for giving us your time and lending your support to the nominee. Thank you for, both, the live and the written testimony.

I know there are a number of people who submitted written testimony as well and last but not least, certainly, thank you to Dr. Enriquez for accepting the nomination. I have the pleasure of knowing Dr. Anita, both personally and professionally, and one of the things that gives me great confidence in her nomination is knowing that she is a mother and she is a grandmother and she is really truly invested in what we are gonna leave for future generations to our island and so that's certainly something that's very important for me and I know that if confirmed to this Board, that Dr. Enriquez will kind of be our representative and make sure that we're trying to move in that direction that's gonna provide the best for future generations.

With that, Dr. Anita, I did want to ask, you know, we've had a lot of different variances, zone changes, different things that the GLUC is responsible for and it's been a challenge sometimes to kind of balance the environmental concerns and economic development and you spoke a little bit about that in your opening statement but I wanted to ask if you could give the committee an example of either here at home or aboard where they really got it right; where you can see a true concern for the environment balanced with developing. So if you could give us an example of a project either here locally or somewhere off island where you think that land use was done well.

**Dr. Anita Enriquez:** You know, I'm trying to recall. You could probably research a lot of these different examples. For an urban example—I think it was Santa Barbara, with regard to establishing a well-planned jurisdiction and ensuring that there is consistency in development of their housing sections, as well as commercial and so forth. I also think about what goes on in Palau, with regard to the concern of preserving their natural resources, their environment and what they've done in terms of abolishing plastic bottles and the kinds of legislation that has kicked in, in order to ensure that, you know, that is

something that their entire country addresses as a whole and how that also been embedded in their tourism industry.

I think about the banana leaf initiative of taking what's in the environment and sort of turning it to this somewhat circular economy and the initiatives that have already started based on a lot of these promising practices under the direction of Dr. Austin Shelton through the Center for Island Sustainability, which jumpstarted the whole Guam Green Growth initiative and certainly something that the executive administration, together with the Guam Legislature, has joined forces to support.

But, you know, when I got involved with the one village, one product initiative, which was something borrowed out of Oita Prefecture in Japan, it was really taking into consideration the natural resources that we have in each of the different villages and how can we turn that into an opportunity for residents within each village to help reduce carbon footprint by providing job opportunities within their respective villages but to take what is considered waste that comes from the natural environment and turn it into an entrepreneurial opportunity.

We think about what we have with the bamboo and the surplus of bamboo and the negative impact it has had on our environment and how do we turn that into an opportunity or a small local production base but there are a lot of different things that come into the equation and a lot of promising practices that we can still look to and certainly other jurisdictions that we can certainly research and ensure that there is that balance of...

I think about homelessness on island and also the pretense of something that looks like an affordable housing and yet it doesn't do anything that's more expansive than that. So when we think about making Guam an attractive place for investment and development, we need to ensure that there is a way to balance all of the through some kind of updated comprehensive plan. So, you know, something that has factored in new technologies, new best practices and takes into consideration a review of existing legislation, existing ordinances that may need to be updated and rather than be a rubber stamp for anything that comes through the Commission, there really needs to be a total review of what we're doing now, how are we doing it and how could it be done better to make more progress for our island.

<u>Senator Regine Biscoe Lee</u>: Right. Thank you so much, Dr. Enriquez. I really appreciate your time. I appreciate you accepting this nomination and I look forward to supporting your nomination once it is brought to the floor. So thank you so much again and thank you, Madam Chair.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you very much, Senator. We'll now hear from Senator Kelly Marsh Taitano.

Senator Kelly Marsh Taitano: Si Yu'os Ma'åse' Madam Chair and Håfa Adai to Dr. Enriquez. Si Yu'os Ma'åse' for accepting the nomination. It's not always easy work but I know, you're up to the challenge and going through your packet and listening to what's been discussed thus far; you know, we know you've had quite a number of administrative positions and you've had quite a broad range of types of memberships and boards and commissions that have to do with tax review procurement, women in business administration, and the like. So you bring a wealth of background with you and, of course, along with the others, I really support and looking forward to you bringing your mindset and your framework of developing but doing so with that big picture in mind that there has to be balance and we know that they can coexist, that, yes, we are going to develop but it doesn't have to be only in one way or mean only one thing.

So, in fact, with that kind of mindset, we may be finding, as you were mentioning with the bamboo issue and so forth, that there may be many more development potentials then we would have thought of without having that mindset there. So, I think that will be really serving as well and we've had some discussions about quality of life on Guam being a major concern of yours.

And we know that in our community, we have major challenges and too many that are struggling to have a better quality of life so if there's anything short and if not, I know time is tight, we can forego it but is there anything that comes up as an issues that you could provide just as an example of where development and quality of life might come into play, either working together or challenging one another?

<u>Dr. Anita Enriquez:</u> Yeah, so you know, balancing both social concerns with the economic development concerns, and we can see, you know, just different examples whether it be downtown Hågatña, with our homeless population and you know, trying to preserve what we have down there and trying to make it a more attractive place.

There's still a huge growing poverty, you know, amount of our residents at the poverty level and many dependent on federal subsidies. And so you know, there is an opportunity to leverage a lot of what we have in the form of federal resources, earmarks and others that

perhaps could help to bring about the kind of development that we like to see so that when we have...

For example, recent college graduates from GCC and UOG still cannot afford decent homes or to purchase decent homes because the great economic divide and a lot of social inequity that still exists especially in the area of connectivity and so how do we get all the investors take a look at what has already come in and a number of them that are still wanting to come in and what are the other types of social investments that need to take place in order to ensure that we do have the right type of infrastructure that's going to benefit a much broader number of folks in the respective villages.

<u>Senator Kelly Marsh Taitano:</u> *Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* for that answer and I'll leave it at that. Great answer and *Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* Madam Chair.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you so much, Senator Kelly Marsh Taitano. Oh and we'll now hear from Senator William Castro.

<u>Senator Wil Castro:</u> *Håfa Adai*, thank you, Madam Chair. Congratulations Dr. Borja Enriquez on your nomination to the Guam Land Use Commission. Everyone can affirm and attest to the fac that you're a professional who has committed so much of her life, personal life and career time to improving, as Dr. Kelly Marsh mentioned, of the quality of life for all residents of Guam.

We all know you're methodical. You're open-minded. You're aspirational and with the distinctive quality, as I look at you on the tv and speed to my laptop, with the distinctive quality of being methodical and looking ahead at that perils, Dr. Anita, we've seen that at public hearings, you looked ahead and you saw the challenges but you're also able to come back and propose solutions to complex problems, even understanding the context, albeit political or otherwise, so I can appreciate that of you.

Many don't know and those who do, great. You have been a shining star who has won the admiration of many men and women that I had the privilege to serve whether I was at the University of Guam or at even the Northern Marianas College, people respected your role in your professional capacity, even when I was a chief planner at DOE so thank you. You definitely have your work cut out for you.

As you become a member of the Commission, Dr. Enriquez, I would like to encourage you as a fellow stakeholder to look towards technology and apply your business skills to be a

lot more entrepreneurial for that agency and other related agencies, not the Commission per se, but in guidance to those agencies that sit atop a whole bunch of data that can generate revenue notwithstanding they already do that in a brick and mortar environment but definitely building on things like the Guam Land Use app that we've developed years ago in addition to that.

I think you can see that there's a natural alignment, as maybe Senator Biscoe Lee can attest to, through the Bureau of Statistics and Plans and looking at this land data and putting that together to forge ahead and a big data concept and so with that said, I know you see the revenue potential and others have already stated it well, I will restate it for the record. We look forward to your balanced approach at protecting our natural resources but also moving us forward so that we can improve the quality of life through additional revenue generating opportunities for the people of Guam. God bless you in your new capacity and you do have your work cut out for you. You have my full confidence. Thank you. Thank you, Madam Chair.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you, Senator Castro. Again, Dr. Enriquez, we're looking forward to, as all these witnesses have testified, to your expertise and your work ethic on this board. I'm also counting on your integrity, which I am familiar with because this particular board, the Guam Land Use Commission, not too long ago, in recent years in fact, has acted in total defiance of the Attorney General's opinion that their actions would be in violation of the law, granted variances that created an inequity in our community that the legislature continues to struggle to remedy at this point and so I'm just hoping not to see any behavior like that in defiance of what our legal authority on Guam has told us is a violation of law.

So, again, I congratulate you and I thank you for being willing to do this. And there being no further testimony, we're going to consider this hearing completed and all of you who testified on her behalf, *Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* for being here. And all of you are free now to log out of this virtual hearing.
