Puffed Up Believers? by Pastor John Fredericksen

During a Sunday morning service, we had a dear saint get up and do something that made us cringe. He was expressing thanks for the preciousness of rightly dividing the Word of God. Unfortunately, he was doing so by comparing ourselves to a denomination, saying how foolish and incorrect they were in interpreting God's Word. We've seen wild Tom Turkeys all puffed up, spreading their feathers and strutting their stuff to impress the ladies around them. Sadly, this was the impression our Christian friend was leaving with those who were visiting from the denomination he was ridiculing.

The knowledge that God has placed divisions in His Word is, indeed, precious, it helps us better understand truth in Scripture, and dissolves what otherwise would seem to be contradictions. But there are two dangers we should be keenly aware of and avoid.

The first is to search only for "knowledge" when we read God's Word, Please don't misunderstand what we are trying to say. The knowledge of sound doctrine, or information, from God's Word is essential. Paul told the saints at Corinth that when he ministered to them, "what shall I profit you, except I speak to you...by knowledge...or by doctrine" (1 Cor. 14:6). He encouraged believers to "give attendance...to doctrine (1 Tim. 4:13), to be "nourished up in . . . good doctrine" (1 Tim: 4:6) and to become skilled in sound doctrine (Titus 1:9; 2:1). But the trap that many fall into is thinking that information is all they should be looking for when studying God's Word. When this happens, it only leaves us "puffed up" with pride. Our study will then, in effect, leave us worse off in pride and less pleasing to the Lord.

The second trap is failing to look for application to change our lives. Paul told the saints in Romans 6:17, "But God be thanked...ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you." God is not impressed with how much we know, unless it shows itself in a transformed life of greater godliness. Therefore, after every time in the Scripture, we should always be able to answer the question: "So what difference does God want this information to make in my life today?"This is the most essential aspect of every Bible study. Demand of yourself, and anyone who teaches God's Word, that this kind of application be made.

Let's not be puffed up over how much doctrine we know. Let's be transformed into lives of greater godliness!



II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was called to order at 1:00 PM. Vice Chairperson Sabina Flores Perez presented the agenda items that would be heard during the hearing. The appointment of Dr. Annette David to serve as a <u>Member</u> of the <u>Guam Board of Medical Examiners</u> was the only item on the agenda.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Dr. David, thank you for being here today with us and for accepting the nomination. We're very honored and pleased that you accepted the nomination. It's great that all of you have already took your seats at the table to testify.

And I understand there's some time constraints for Dr. Taitano. So, I'd appreciate if he could go first before giving your testimony, Dr. David. Thank you. And when you speak in the mic, please reiterate your name for the record. Si Yu'os ma'åse'.

Dr. John Taitano:

Håfa Adai. I'm John Taitano.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you so much, Dr. Taitano. For the record, we've received many written testimonies in support of Dr. David's appointment to the Guam Board of Medical Examiners from the following people.

We have Rose Grino, RN, BSN of Guam Nurses Association. And we are still receiving many more testimonies in support of your nomination. So, thank you. So, before we hear from the panel, I would like first to read the duties of the Guam Board of Medical Examiners as stated in section 12203 of Chapter 12, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated.

The Guam Board of Medical Examiners, within the context of this Article and the requirements of due process, shall have the following powers and responsibilities: to promulgate rules and regulations; select and administer licensing examination(s); evaluate medical education and training of applicants; evaluate previous professional performance of applicants; issue or deny initial or endorsement licenses; approve or deny applications for license re- registration and renewal;

Receive, review and investigate complaints; receive, review and investigate reports, receive from law enforcement agencies, health care organizations, governmental agencies, insurers and other entities having information pertinent to the professional performance of licensees;

Issue subpoenas, subpoenas duces tecum, administer oaths, receive testimony and conduct hearings; discipline licensees found in violation of the Medical Practice Act; institute actions in its own name and enjoin violators of the Medical Practice Act; establish appropriate fees and charges to include support of active and effective pursuit of its legal responsibilities;

Re-instate revoked license at its discretion, but to use such discretionary authority in a

consistent manner and with great assurances that the re-instatement of a licensee will not jeopardize the public, develop and adopt its budget; receive, review and investigate a peer review finding and action received from a health care organization pertinent to the professional performance of a licensee.

Upon the receipt of an appeal of a peer review finding and action, the Board shall have: the responsibility to review the peer review findings and action by a health care organization, and shall have the authority to either, uphold the peer review action and finding; refer the peer review action back to the initiating health care organization for further consideration or reconsideration; or reverse, vacate, or otherwise "void" the peer review action and findings.

Okay, so that's a deep responsibility. So, without further ado, we will accept the testimony on behalf Dr. David. We ask that oral testimony be limited to five minutes to allow for the timely progression of this hearing.

So, we would like to start with the nominee, Dr. David.

Dr. Annette David:

Thank you, Senator Sabina and Senator Louise for this honor. I am humbled and very grateful for the opportunity to be able to serve our island community. I think as a physician and a health professional, I'm a bit of a hybrid. And I know, in a way, that is an advantage for the position that is being considered.

As a medical student and as a medical resident, my education and clinical training is a cross over between the developing world and the developed world. I started out as a student at the University of the Philippines, College of Medicine, the State University of the Philippines. And it was a very difficult institution to get into. Every year, they take in a hundred twenty (120) students out of the thousands of the hundred million people of the Philippines. My son, who's at the University of Chicago said, "U-Chicago and Stanford are the most tough because they only take four to six percent but at the University of the Philippines, that's closer to one to two percent but it was not a bed of roses. Because our training hospital was the largest tertiary care Charity Hospital of the country. Everyone without insurance and without the ability to pay came to that hospital. So, it was not unusual for us, as interns, to be chasing away the cats from the ward so they wouldn't eat the patient's foods. We would have patients who were sharing a bed

while in labor; two women to a bed. We had to, at that time, boil syringes and needles because there was not enough to go around.

So, I saw what it was like to practice medicine in an area of need. Fast forward to when I married my boyfriend, at the time, and he wanted to come back to Guam, which meant we had to train in the U.S. And so, we ended up at another state University, the State University of New York. And when I first walked into the supply room of that hospital, I thought I had died and gone to heaven. You only had to use gloves once. You didn't have to boil them again. There were enough needles to go around. It was, in a way, highly blessed with resources and yet, health was still difficult to attain. And I think that, in a way, having this bipolar perspective, if you would call it, would be an advantage because when I think of Guam, in some ways, Guam is like a resource challenge setting.

We don't have enough physicians for the population. We have specialties that are missing. Sometimes, we don't have enough resources and yet the same time, we need to answer to the standards of the United States, which is the most developed country in the world. And so, I think that perspective will help.

And the other reason I am a hybrid is, I am not just a medical doctor, I am a public health professional. And in many ways, Guam's Board for Medical Licensure is not so much a clinical issue as it is a health systems issue. It refers to health human resource planning and ensuring qualifications within the administration of health care. And I feel that this will be an advantage to the position if the legislature should see fit to confirm me. I will do my best, my utmost, to contribute to our island community which is the home I have come to love. Thank you.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you so much, Dr. David. So, we would like to actually extend the testimony to the other guests that are here today. So...

Rose Grino, R.N. BSN:

Senator Perez. Senator Muña. Good afternoon, everyone. My name is Rose Grino. I'm a registered nurse for 28...29 years. I have to think about that. I'm a former chairperson of the Guam Cancer Coalition. I've been a long-time member of the Non-Communicable

Disease Consortium and currently, president of the Guam Nurses Association and now as the administrator of FHP Health Center.

I am here to convey my strong support for the nomination of Dr. Annette M. David to the Guam Board of Medical Examiners. Dr. David has a long and consistent record of service to Guam's community, with significant contributions to the practice of clinical medicine and public health safety.

Dr. David's training and advanced education in both clinical medicine and public health make her eminently qualified to serve on the Board of Medical Examiners. Her global experience ensures familiarity with the diverse health systems within the Pacific Region and the United States, which will be useful when deliberating the qualifications of various applicants seeking to practice medicine in Guam.

As she had mentioned, in Guam—kind of like a hybrid, is a cross bridge with health system issues. We're kind of like progressive but I also think...same time, we really need a lot of help.

Furthermore, Dr. David has proven to adhere to high ethical standards and cultural respect. I have worked with her on multiple projects for the Guam NCD Consortium, the Guam Medical Society and the Guam Nurses Association. I fully support her nomination to be a member of the board. Thank you.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you so much, Ms. Grino. I apologize. I would like to acknowledge my colleague that's joined me today, Senator Louise Muña. Thank you for being here. So, we would like to extend...the next testifier.

Dr. Joel Rubio:

Good Afternoon, Senators. And I am indeed guilty of bringing Dr. David to Guam. I am here for a couple of reasons. The first is as former president of the Guam Medical Society. I'm here to read the current president's testimony. From Dr. Edward Blounts...

As a private practitioner and as clinical director of Health Partners LLC, a private clinic, I can't show the emoji, but two thumbs up for Dr. David's confirmation. I cannot think of anyone more qualified for the job. Thank you so much, Senators.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you so much.

Cathy Rivera Castro:

Buenas yan Håfa Adai, Senator Sabina Perez, Vice Chairperson of the Committee on Tourism, Land, Historic Preservation, Health and Justice and Senator Louise Muña.

My name is Cathy Rivera Castro, a resident of the village of Mong Mong. I know that the other panelist here has given you their credentials and so, I'll give you mine. My name is mommy and mama, as my grandchildren call me. So, that's my credentials.

I also have a testimony that was just given to me on behalf of the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalition that I would like to read if...thank you.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you so much, Ms. Castro. The next person...If you can introduce yourself into the mic, thank you.

Dr. Roger Martinez:

Hello, my name is Dr. Roger Martinez. I'm a private practitioner chiropractor here in Guam for the past 10 years, coming—hailing from California. I've had the privilege of working with Dr. David for the past four or five years with the Guam Medical Society as a member at large. One of the things that really, really excited me with working with

her is just the amazing energy and enthusiasm she puts in everything that she does which is required for not just on an administrative level but to rally people around her.

And as her candidacy came up, I was thinking about some of the challenges we have in our medical system, both on the side of bringing in and attracting practitioners to this island—quality people, you have to have quality people to draw them.

And one of the things that I realized with her being on...serving on the Medical Society and working alongside with her, was she brought up, not only the energy but the standards in which we abide by and when we put together our medical symposiums, when we had our bimonthly meetings. And what that translated into is to bring in quality doctors for a continuing education and so on so forth.

But one of the things that I really see her as an example and coming here from an off island was...wow. I looked at her credentials. I'm like, I'm amazed that someone with her caliber would come and settle in this community. Well, it's because she's—it's not the money, it's the fact that she really has a love for this place besides this guy here. I mean obviously he was part of the reason, Dr. Rubio.

But she stayed here and remained here because I believe that she truly has a heart for the community, in general. You can tell by her...just amazing resume of the things that she's been involved in and has touched an affected many of the lives in this community, particularly those who have the lack of resources, who have the inability to connect to the system that we have here.

On the other note, I also believe that she'll stand on a moral ground, as well as understanding that there are times that we have to hold our medical professionals accountable. Just because they're here, doesn't mean that we're privileged to have them here but if they make mistakes or they come in and they do something that's substandard to the standards of the care, they need to be held accountable.

And they need to be held, not only to the accountability, but also, we need to raise that standard in order to raise the standards of our medical system. So, coming from the outside and being a resident here, I see Dr. David helping in this coalition of accountability to raise the standard of quality of care and raise the standards of the type of people that we attract to Guam. So, that's my testimony. Thank you.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you so much, Dr. Martinez. Yeah, that's amazing. I think your resume speaks volumes and I think just meeting you as a person, I understand the basis for all of that. You have so much passion and energy behind it so—and brilliance, I should say.

We also have others that have come to testify. So, I would like to invite whoever has not come to testify but has signed up. Angelina Mertz, Ken Platt and also Linda Flynn. And if there's anybody that I missed, please come up to the table.

So, we can start with Angelina. If you could just say your name before your testimony for the record.

Angelina Mummert:

Håfa Adai. Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to write in support of Dr. Annette David's nomination. My name is Angelina G. Mummert. I'm an active member of the Guam Non-Communicable Disease Consortium and former chair of the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalition, as well as retired former public health administrator. I am writing to respectfully request that you and your committee members recommend to the full legislative body that Dr. Annette David be confirmed to serve as a member of the Guam Board of Medical Examiners.

I have known Dr. David in a professional capacity and on a personal level for more than 20 years. Prior to moving to Guam from the Philippines, she worked full time for the World Health Organization as its Regional Adviser for the Western Pacific Tobacco Free Initiative. It was in her capacity as WHO Regional Adviser that I was fortunate enough to first meet her, in the late 1990s, in my previous work as Administrator of Community Health Service at Public Health.

We also worked together for 10 years at the University of Guam Cancer Research Center, she as Senior Researcher and myself, as Community Health Educator on National Cancer Institute funded cancer research community outreach projects. She is a recognized expert in the field of tobacco cessation and control and continues to provide valuable services to further cancer research and health programs and policies that benefit Pacific Islander communities.

Annette is a proven leader and has been recognized for her achievement and contributions, not only to Guam, but to society in general, through her mentorship and legacy and she's been recognized by several organizations. For instance, in 2013, she was recognized by the Global Filipina Women's Network and named one of the '100 Most Influential Filipinas in the World' by this organization.

That organization recognize women of Philippine ancestry who are influencing the face of leadership in the global workplace, having reached recognized status for outstanding work in their respective professions, industries and communities. She was also one of several Guam women who were awarded the "Women of Movement Award" in 2010 by the Guam Women's Club in recognition of her tobacco-control efforts, as well as her focus on advocacy, education and support of patient's quality of life.

One of the previous testifiers talked about Dr. David will make decisions based on her heart, her mind but also with her feet—what she says, she does.

Annette is a highly respected and greatly admired individual, not only in our Guam community, but throughout the Western Pacific. Through our efforts with our health organizations, we have made great strides toward achieving a healthier environment as recognized recently by the World Health Organization/ Western Pacific, and as well as the Secretariat of the Pacific Community.

With her guidance and expertise in public health policies and best practices that support health for all, she has provided ways to enhance health care systems to serve our communities more effectively. She has worked alongside our university, health organizations, cancer coalition and the NCD Consortium in providing tobacco control, public health and qualitative social research. Her commitment and dedication to the health of our island is seen in her objective and fair approach to prevention and healthcare.

The Guam Board of Medical Examiners, the board she's being nominated to, was created by law and is responsible 'for the licensing of physicians in Guam and to protect the public from the unprofessional, improper, incompetent, unlawful, fraudulent and/or deceptive practice of medicine.'

Given Dr. David's long-standing commitment to the highest standards for Guam and its people in her capacity, not only as a healthcare professional—at that, her leadership, achievements as global health advocate and educator, her nomination and membership will enhance the Guam Board of Medical Examiners.

As her friend, and sometimes travel companion, I could not ask for a better or more compassionate person to have in my life, nor a better person to ensure that the public interest is protected. Annette has the unique combination of character, acumen, and humanity that she is so professionally, intellectually, and personally qualified to offer the Guam Board of Medical Examiners.

Si Yu'os ma'åse' and thank you for the opportunity to provide support for her nomination. I'm sorry I took so long but I was trying to squeeze 20 years into two pages. Please forgive me.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you so much, Ms. Mummert. Next one on the list is...

Ken Platt:

Håfa Adai. I'm Ken Platt. I'm not in the medical profession. I had the honor and pleasure of meeting Annette through Angie and that one over there too...several years ago. I'll be short and sweet. She is by far one of the most elegant classy women of integrity and professional, even in her personal life, that I have ever met. I've traveled the world. I've been in many, many countries and cities and she is up there on the top of the list. You couldn't ask for somebody better. I'm done.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you so much, Mr. Platt.

Ken Platt:

Sure.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Ms. Flynn?

Linda Flynn:

My colleague, Dr. Annette David.

(Please see attached testimony)

So, as you can see, I'm a big fan of Dr. David. I've had the privilege of knowing her for about 3 years and I would probably have pages and pages if we had a longer history together.

But just in my time in working with her and being involved in a lot of these issues that are affecting our people, one of her greatest skills besides her heart is her ability to communicate the issues in terms that we can all understand and all recognize how certain factors in our community affect our health negatively and what are solutions that we can take up to address them.

And that's an amazing gift that she has; to be able to communicate those priorities and the information behind it in a way that we can all understand and get behind. So, I really appreciate those gifts that she uses on behalf of the people of Guam and I think she will be a wonderful addition to the Guam Medical Board of Examiners. Thank you.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you, Ms. Flynn for coming here and providing testimony in support of Dr. David and *si Yu'os ma'åse'*, Dr. David, for accepting the nomination and for your over 30 years of contributing to the wellness of, you know, people internationally, as well as on Guam and I'm hopeful that your dedication to help out improve the situation here on Guam with your knowledge will further benefit us here as member of the board of the Guam...Board of Medical Examiners.

So, as you know, Senator Therese Terlaje asked me to fill in for her. And so she did prepare a couple of questions just to do due diligence. So according to the Guam Board of Medical Examiners Statement Policy, "The practice of medicine is a privilege granted by the people acting through their elected representatives. It is not a natural right of

individuals. In the interests of public health, safety and welfare, and to protect the public from the unprofessional, improper, incompetent, unlawful, fraudulent and/or deceptive practice of medicine, it is necessary to provide laws and regulations to govern the granting and subsequent use of the privilege to practice medicine. The primary responsibility and obligation of the Guam Board of Medical Examiners is to protect the people of Guam."

So, having said that, are you willing to fully investigate and take disciplinary action against fellow licensees who have been determined to be in violation of the Medical Practice Act?

Dr. Annette David:

Absolutely, Senator. I think the line that we cannot cross is the line of patient safety. And that requires a lot of meticulousness, in terms of ensuring that any applicant who applies for licensure is fully qualified.

I think if you look at our medical Act, the specific components that would qualify a person could really fall under two domains. The first domain is that of competence. Do they have the necessary knowledge and skills and abilities to practice good medical practice? But the other side is also equally important and that's the domain of character.

And I think that is very very critical and requires a degree of persistence, in terms of verification. I'll just share one quick story, a true story. When I was Chief Resident at the Northport VA in New York, at that time, I had an intern who was highly competent and so passionate. He would come to my office and say 'Doctor D, if anyone calls in sick, any time of the day, I am there. I am willing to be there to help'.

He was highly competent for an intern. And then he changed his name halfway through the internship. And I thought, 'well, that was strange, but okay. He's still very good.' The Chief of Medicine actually came to me and said 'Annette, you have to convince this guy to join our program'.

Until the FBI came...it turns out five years ago, five years before, he had been a neurosurgical resident in a mid-west state and the hospital became very curious because patients who were previously well would die unexpectedly after he tended to them.

He would also work as an EMT, emergency medicine technician and would bring food for his coworkers. One day, he brought donuts. Everyone who ate them got sick. And there were some donuts left over, turns out there was ant poison in them.

When the police came to investigate his home, he had—at that time, there was no internet and no smart phone. So, he had a box, with index cards filled with recipes for poison. He had actually been jailed and told not to practice medicine but this was before the National Practitioner Database and before Google, so it wasn't easy to find out.

And so, he came and became an intern in our program. It turns out his story has been on America's Most Wanted, the television show. And I think that to me really brought home the importance of being very very meticulous and careful in ensuring, not just the competencies of our physicians but the character, the ability to have true compassion and empathy and to keep the patients safe.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Absolutely. Thank you.

The GBME, has the discretionary authority to re-instate a revoked license. This authority demands that the safety of the public be taken into great consideration. In your professional opinion, what are the criteria that constitute the reinstatement of a revoked license?

Dr. Annette David:

I think, again, if it was an issue of competence, competence is something that you can address. You can acquire new knowledge. You can strengthen skills and fill in gaps in competencies through education and training. And I think if it was in that area—technical area, then the candidate will be able to demonstrate sufficient acquisition of the necessary knowledge and skills. Then I think that would be a consideration.

With the issues of character, I think we have to be really careful. We certainly do not want to, at any point in time, expose our community to hazardous practice. And

perhaps the one situation I can think of where it might be possible to consider reinstatement would be if there was an impairment that was temporary.

I think the example I can think of is if a surgeon suffered a stroke, for instance, and is not able to perform as a surgeon but is able to undergo physical therapy and recover full function. Then, I think that's an issue...Highly improbable but not impossible. But certainly, when it comes to ethical standards—moral standards, I think we have to be very cautious and really err on the side of being conservative and precautionary.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you. Do you think that Guam medical licensing minimal requirements which allow physicians to practice on Guam need to be improved? Please explain. What are your suggestions?

Dr. Annette David:

I would say maybe in three things. I think first—and this is already on the horizon, I think what we used to call TeleMedicine, but I think now it's more appropriate to call it virtual health care, where you have expertise that is not physically present on island, providing care to our people.

There is an app already in the U.S. It's called doctorsindemand.com. You can be anywhere in the U.S. You turn on the app and you can find whatever expertise in which ever state to meet whatever you need for that time and place.

And I think that at the VA here, I was told for psychiatry at least, they are practicing this sort of virtual health care already. And we probably need to think this through very carefully in terms of figuring out how we qualify unlicensed physicians who are physically not here but are providing or could provide care for our patients. I think the second area is in the area of patient confidentiality. I think we need to bolster training and requirements for training in this. I know at the Guam Memorial Hospital, it is required. But in private practice, it's pretty much left to the individual. But medical confidentiality, I think is very crucial and it needs to maybe be incorporated into qualifications for licensure.

And the third may sound far off but I think we are getting there. I think it's in the area of artificial intelligence in health care. It may sound like science fiction but already we are using a lot of artificial intelligence applications in health care.

We have what we call Artificial Neuro Networks in hospitals that try to predict things—likelihood of infection, likelihood of transfer to the ICU. And there are now even robots. Robotic surgery is becoming quite common place. The current generation of robots are still handled by live persons but there are many models like the one called STAR, which is Smart Tissue Automatic Robots which can operate on their own.

And in 2016, they did clinical trials and the machine outperformed surgeons, all the time. I think we are going to be arriving to that era where perhaps the physician is no longer a human. And while it may sound bizarre right now, I think we need to start thinking about that because it is coming. So these are some of the areas where I think we need to have a little bit more thought and attention.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Interesting. I heard artificial intelligence was really rapidly advancing but I didn't realize to what extent.

Dr. Annette David:

Already, it's used in many areas of the world. I think soon will be here.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Okay, thank you. Do you have any continuing business or potential conflicts of interest that may affect your ability to serve in this position?

Dr. Annette David:

To my best knowledge, no. I'm not at all involved in recruitment or hiring of physicians and so I feel that I do not have conflicts of interest.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you. Will your current work schedule affect your ability to attend regular Board meetings and perform the duties required of Board members?

Dr. Annette David:

That's a really good question. I have a crazy schedule, but I think if meetings are set far enough in advance where we could block off the dates, I think that would be manageable.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you so much. I would like to open the floor to my colleague for questions.

Senator Louise Muña:

Actually, I don't really have any questions but I do want to say that, first and foremost, I was hoping that maybe you would have some of your motivational movement when we first came in because I'm so used to that whenever we attend any of the NVC Consortium meetings, that you're the one who gets everyone involved and active.

So, I was kind of looking forward to that actually. Maybe that's something I can incorporate in the legislature before every session. That might be something that we can look forward to because it really works and you're the right person for that.

You have that energy and that inspirational characteristic in you that just resonates to everyone and also a very humble human being. And I think that's one of the reasons why I wanted to come here because I wanted to hear all these people talk about wonderful things that you have done that you tend to kind of look beyond. That's your personality. You want to bring the best out in other people and in turn, your characteristics kind of get put on the backside.

And so, I wasn't surprised when I was going through your packet and going through all this list of acknowledgements and all these conferences and everything that you've done. I'm actually surprised that it's only this many paper. I thought it'd be a whole lot more.

But really, this is a long time coming and I think it's a great opportunity for the board of medical examiners to have you in there and be a part of that great team that's going to work towards the better health of the community. I don't know how you do all this and manage to look beautiful and calm and relaxed throughout all of that.

And you're so humble that I was going to—actually, I was going to tell Dr. Rubio, rather than placing blame on you for bringing her here, I think we all really thank you so much for that opportunity to share her with the public here.

And, not that it's a requirement, but you have risen up on my book as one of the top five inspirational women here on Guam. So, thank you so much for stepping up to the plate and I look forward to supporting your confirmation.

Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:

Thank you, Senator. So, Dr. David, thank you again for accepting the nomination for the executive appointment for the Guam Medical Examiners Board.

And I also want to thank you so much for your dedication to improving the island health care system. Also, we look forward to seeing your work as far as contributing to the wellness and safety of our community here on Guam. Thank you so much.

So, there being no additional testimonies, the Committee will continue to remain open until September 16th for the acceptance of any additional public testimony on the agenda items discussed today.

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

During the confirmation hearing on the appointment of Dr. Annette M. David as a Member to the Guam Board of Medical Examiners, oral testimony was presented and written testimony submitted to the Committee in support of Dr. David's appointment by numerous distinguished professional colleagues who had worked alongside Dr. David at some point during her almost thirty-year career, as a medical doctor and public health advocate on Guam and internationally.

Testimonies recognized Dr. David's outstanding leadership, valuable services, achievements and expertise in her field and highlighted her long-standing commitment to the improvement of health programs and policies that benefit Pacific Islander Communities.

During the hearing, the Committee inquired with Dr. David on the following issues of concern, to which she responded reasonably and with great insight:

- Are you willing to take disciplinary action against licensees who have been determined to be in violation of the Medical Practice Act?
- The GBME, has the discretionary authority to re-instate a revoked license. This
 authority demands that the safety of the public be taken into great consideration.
 In your professional opinion, what are the criteria that constitute the
 reinstatement of a revoked license?
- Do you think that Guam medical licensing minimal requirements which allow physicians to practice on Guam need to be improved? Please explain. What are your suggestions?

Dr. David also stated for the record that she does not have any continuing business or potential conflicts of interest that may affect her ability to serve as a member of the GBME. Furthermore, if meetings are set far enough in advance, her current work schedule can be managed as to not affect her ability to attend regular Board meetings and perform the duties required of Board members.

Given Dr. David's long-standing commitment and contributions to the highest standards of health care and her vast knowledge and experience as a healthcare professional on Guam and global health advocate, as well as the overwhelming testimony in support of her appointment, the Committee finds that Dr. Annette M. David possess the essential knowledge, experience and dedication required to be an effective member of the Guam Board of Medical Examiners.

The <u>Committee on Health, Tourism, Historic Preservation, Land and Justice</u> hereby reports on the appointment of <u>Dr. Annette M. David</u> to serve as a <u>Member</u> of the <u>Guam Board of Medical Examiners</u>, with the recommendation <u>TO DO CONFIRM</u>.
