

Incumbent GHURA commissioners seek dismissal of whistleblower suit

Incumbent commissioners of the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority have jointly filed a request for the U.S. District Court of Guam to dismiss a whistleblower lawsuit filed by GHURA Executive Director Ray Topasna involving alleged fraudulent activities

Topasna raised during his previous role as GHURA's chief years ago under a different administration.

granted motions to dismiss John Ilao, Deanne Torre and Rosie Blas on Tuesday morning.

Their former co-defendants, David Sablan, Roland Selvidge and Cecile Suda, stood trial in October and were acquitted of the charges against them, which stemmed from an alleged illegal meeting in December 2011 and a poll vote conducted in April 2015.

Ray Topasna, a former and now current GHURA executive director. was not called to the witness stand. an action with which he took issue.

Torre, Ilao and Blas faced similar charges, which the Office of the Attorney General chose to dismiss following the trial. The government

tleblower plaintiffs involved in what's called "qui tam" actions "are supposedly privy to the alleged fraud and therefore the whistleblowers should have adequate knowledge to plead matters with sufficient particularity," the commissioners contend. In a qui tam action, a private party brings

a case on the government's behalf, according to Cornell University's Law School website.

Former GHURA Executive Director Michael Duenas was the seventh and only defendant to accept a guilty plea, admitting to conspiracy as a misdemeanor.

All of the former defendants faced misdemeanor charges only, but at nearly 50 misdemeanors when the case was first filed.

Former Chief Prosecutor Joseph McDonald called it a "milestone case" in early 2018 after Duenas pleaded guilty. McDonald is no longer with the AG's office.

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

Honorable Senators,

Thank you for your consideration of my nomination to the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners in the Veterinary Medical role.

I have been a veterinarian for the last 12 years. I'm licensed in 5 jurisdictions: California, Guam, Hawaii, Maryland, and Virginia, I'm APHIS accredited in all of those save Hawaii. My practice outside of Guam is now mostly limited to advising distant relatives to see their local veterinarian.

A two week stint in a local clinic after graduation convinced me that relief work was my niche. Being able to choose my employment settings, set my own schedule, and the numerous advantages of being an independent contractor are all factors for that path. An opening for a 6-month relief veterinarian position at Isla Veterinary Clinic brought me to Guam for the first time in mid-2014. When a 6-month extension was offered, I jumped at it.

I returned stateside after that just long enough to pack what I wanted shipped to Guam.

While I came to love Guam, relief veterinary work here pays at most half of what I earned stateside. In January 2017 I started the application process to become a Supervisory Veterinary Medical Officer for the USDA Food Safety and Inspection Service. I was hired April 30th of that year and with whom I work for today.

A relief veterinarian experiences many different practice cultures and ways of doing things. I've been the sole doctor in many situations. In some clinics I do everything from setting catheters to shooting radiographs. Others have an A-team of technicians that allow me to focus more on the patient. All of these experiences add up to the conclusion that there's no ONE way of meeting the standard of care our ethics code requires.

Guam veterinary clinics fit into that continuum. I've worked an extended time at Isla and covered Dr Oshiro's absences at Marianas Vet Care. I volunteered for several months as a spay/neuter surgeon at GAIN. I have a broad perspective on the issues facing the veterinary community on Guam.

The immediate issue is the public's perception of GBAHE as ineffectual. This stems from a 14 May 2015 letter from AG Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson to GBAHE stating, "[...] I have determined, however, that our role heretofore cannot and shall not extend to the investigation or prosecution of disciplinary complaints before the Allied Health Board." This has kneecapped the Board because it has had little funding available for hiring its own attorney. Without a prosecuting attorney, avoidable procedural errors end up as grounds to reverse Board actions to protect the public. I urge the Senators to either appropriate the necessary funds and/or query our new AG as to whether that policy letter is still in effect.

Looking around I see many colleagues that have urged me to apply for this position. I want to assure them and you that like the oath I took upon entering the veterinary profession, I will take my responsibilities seriously and perform my duties with integrity and transparency.

I have a small correction to my financial disclosure sheet. I maintain a Guam business license for my sole proprietorship, Furry Friends Veterinary Service, a in-home euthanasia service. This generated \$250 of income last year. Otherwise I have no other veterinary business interests.

Full disclosure: Dr Silk of Isla Veterinary Clinic overlooked a large payroll anomaly January to April 2015 that resulted in ongoing overpayments to my account. I didn't notice as I only dig into expense flows when the balance dips too far.

When we weren't able to agree on an equitable settlement that addressed our several responsibilities, she sued in Small Claims for the remaining third of the overpayment and won. One year of monthly \$500 payments fulfills the settlement. I had my day in court, my arguments were heard, and I lost. I bear Dr Silk no personal animosity and will recuse myself if



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Presentation to the Senators of Guam Allied Health Board Nomination Paul Pomes

Introduction:

Good Morning Senators! My name is Dr. Robert Hildreth. I am a veterinarian working here on Guam. I began my career in veterinary medicine over 40 years. I graduated first from UC Berkeley, and then UC Davis. For the past 26 years, I have been a licensed veterinarian. I have worked in California for 23 years as an emergency veterinarian, a practice associate, and eventually a practice owner until moving to Guam 2 ½ years ago. I have spent much time working in 2 private clinics here in Guam and also at Anderson Air Base clinic. I have long been a proud member of the veterinary profession known for its exceptional ethics and high moral standards.

The State of Veterinary Medicine on Guam:

Pets have become important members of many families here on Guam and all over the world. Dogs and cats are a great source of pride for many owners, and offer support to their families even in the roughest of times. As such, these families depend on the veterinary community to help keep their pets healthy and live long lives. Unfortunately, <u>some</u> in the veterinary community do not live up to this responsibility, and in my opinion, have dishonored the trust of the people. This dishonor casts a shadow over the entire veterinary community, <u>even those</u> who perform their duties admirably.

Veterinary medicine here on Guam has been in a state of turmoil for many years. Veterinary practice here on Guam is substandard compared to much of the western world, some of which is due to lack of resources, but much is due to a climate of conflict and turmoil within the profession here. While it is common on the mainland for clinics to share information and provide detailed medical records about the care of a particular patient, the cooperation among veterinarians here in Guam is almost non-existent. This often prevents patients from getting the care they need in a timely manner, and often results in repeated testing, leading to increased costs being placed on the pet owners families. *Guam deserves better than this!*

Many pet families would like to file complaints, but do not do so as they have come to believe that their complaints will fall on deaf ears, and nothing will be done about it anyway. There is a continuous stream of discontent amongst veterinary consumers that feel frustrated, feel taken advantage of, and feel unable to protect their pets from incompetent or unscrupulous care. **WE MUST CHANGE THAT PERCEPTION:** we must enforce our laws in order to re-establish the credibility of the veterinary profession here in Guam.

The Allied Health Board has been honest, fair, and <u>diligent</u> about trying to address the complaints: *I have witnessed myself their hardworking attempts to address these issues.* But their hands have been tied by not having a veterinarian on the board to help review in detail the complaints filed.

The Nominee

Today we are hearing testimony regarding the nominee to the Allied Health Board, Dr. Paul Pomes. I am here to put forth my strong and unshakable support for his nomination to the board. I believe many of the other veterinary professionals are here in support of and to empress upon you the importance of having a veterinarian on the board, and in particular, Dr. Paul Pomes.

Dr. Pomes has spent many years as a relief veterinarian for hospitals when their own doctors are out sick or on vacation. The value of this is that Dr. Pomes has seen how a vast number of different clinics operate which give him a great understanding of the "acceptable standards of care for animals". In his role as a relief veterinarian, Dr Pomes has had to quickly analyze veterinary operations and work within that individual practices culture. This is INVALUABLE experience when it comes to being a board member: he has been personal witness to the general standards of care at dozens of clinics and can compare those widely held standards to those here on Guam.

I have known Dr. Pomes for several years and have found him to be an honest individual. I have discussed many cases with him, and while we don't always agree, I have found him to be thoughtful, insightful, and honest in those discussions, weighing the many options of treatments and their potential for success or failure. He has made helpful suggestions and provided insight from his unique experiences as a relief veterinarian. But he has too been open to suggestions, to keeping an open mind; a vital characteristic of any one in the

medical field. *Most importantly, Dr Pomes has always and unwaveringly dedicated himself to putting the care of the patient first and foremost.*

Furthermore, Dr Pomes is independent of any veterinary business on Guam by virtue of his employment with the USDA. Familiarity with government processes in general comes with the job. And as Dr Pomes has been a regular attendee to the Allied Health public meetings and is aware of the issues the board is currently facing, he will quickly become a useful contributor to the board.

Again, Dr Pomes has the years of experience, the breadth of knowledge, the proper perspective, and the willingness to participate that would make him a great addition to the Allied Health Board.

The Next Steps

Dr. Pomes appointment to the Allied Health Board is a very important <u>first step</u> towards improving the care of pets and their families on Guam. *It is huge step forward in getting the veterinary community to be held accountable for their actions*. This will in turn serve to bring back the confidence in the government of Guam by the pet owning public.

The second step is for the government of Guam to provide the funding to investigate, <u>and if necessary</u>, prosecute. **Veterinarians need to be held accountable just as any other medical professional**. To date, however, this critical funding has been held up by a technical matter that has delayed several cases before the board. The government of Guam needs to quickly remedy this matter.

Conclusion

Again, I want to give my full support to the nomination of Dr Paul Pomes to the Allied Health Board. *Dr. Pomes will do much to bring much needed accountability to the veterinary community*. I hope that the senators will see what I see in him and vote unanimously to appointment him to the Allied Heath Board.

Thank you for your time today and your thoughtful consideration of this very important milestone for veterinary medicine.





II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 10:53 AM.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right. For all those who have testified who signed up to testify for the Appointment of Dr. Paul Pomes, please have a seat and Dr. Pomes if you could sit in the middle. All right. Before I go any further Dr. Pomes, am I pronouncing your name correctly? Okay. All right.

All right. So, we're not on the part of our agenda for the Appointment of Dr. Paul Pomes to serve as a Veterinary Medicine Representative Member of the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners.

So, we will the powers and responsibilities of the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners. This is a combination of different specialties. For example, one veterinary representative but specialties from other disciplines and they are the licensing board for the allied health professions.

And they approve or deny applications for license, license renewals. They investigate complaints. They cooperate with law enforcement and they're really our regulatory board when it comes to ensuring that those and the allied health professions are conducting safe practices for the community as required by law.

All right. So, signed up to testify is let's begin with this side, Mr. Cyrus, Cyrus Luhr.

Cyrus Luhr:

Thank you, Chairperson. My name is Cyrus Luhr and I'm here to provide testimony on behalf of the Appointment of Dr. Paul Pomes to the position of Veterinary Medicine Representative on the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners.

In the interest of transparency, I should share that I am a current employee of the Guam Legislature. In fact, I do work for Senator Perez but my testimony today is being provided purely in my capacity as the President of the Board of Directors of GAIN.

And so, thank you, Senator Terlaje and thank you, Senator Torres and thank you, Senator Perez for being here this morning.

I first met Dr. Pomes about a little over three years ago and at GAIN we have a spay and neuter clinic. And we pride ourselves in holding very high standards at that clinic we follow not only DEA and local regulations but we exceed them and we try to stick to that very strictly.

And what was very striking is that when Dr. Pomes came and began his services throughout clinic like many local and military vets do, he wanted to double-check all of our procedures. He checked our paperwork. He ran scenarios through with our staff just to test them out.

And I've found that very reassuring that he never took anything for granted. He's a by the book person who follows the rules and checks to make sure that, you know, the backups are in place and that everything is run safely.

And I think that's something that we have found consistently in all of his actions over the years. He is very ethical by the book person, that's fair and reasonable. And he's also takes a pride in being able to educate as well in the surgery room.

In veterinary medicine in general it can be very stressful environment and when conducting surgeries. Our staff have said consistently that he's very calming presence and he takes a leadership role.

And he's able to teach as well as performing the surgeries and so in many of these different examples he's consistently demonstrated a level of caliber of expertise that is very notable. And I think that we're very lucky that he is on Guam and that he's offering to make to serve on the board.

Over the years he's also been extremely generous with both his time and his energy whenever we've had questions at the shelter in general. It could be anything from veterinary medicine to just general practice type of questions, he's been available. I can give him a call and he'll take the time out of his day to be able to walk me through questions and concerns I have. And that's sort of the attitude that we need in public service, that we need on a board.

He's a very approachable person. Again, he's very reasonable and he's just a presence that I think will be very valuable to have in any team environment. And so, in given the position that he has now this federal position, is one that requires extremely advanced expertise,

advanced certifications and I think it's reassuring that he meets those standards and is also willing to devote his time to Guam.

So, I thank the Governor for making such a strong selection for the board. I thank Senator Terlaje for chairing today's meeting and receiving testimony. And I thank Dr. Pomes for making Guam his home and offering to serve the people of Guam. Thank you.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you, Mr. Luhr also for your work with GAIN and I've seen a lot of progress with GAIN over the recent years. So, I want to thank you for that. You're doing a huge service for our entire community. Dr. Pomes? Ms. Vanessa Oshiro?

Please see attached testimony.

Senator Mary Torres:

We have listed as one of the supporters, Susuico? Is that person here to testify? Yes, Susuico, do you care to testify you're just going to do some written. All right. Thank you.

Is there anyone else that's would like to testify before the panel? Okay. If not, may I ask Dr. Pool if you like to testify.

Dr. Paul Pomes:

Dr. Pomes.

Senator Mary Torres:

Dr. Pomes, I'm sorry, Dr. Pool, you just finished. Thank you very much. Dr. Pomes, if you'd like to offer some testimony.

Dr. Paul Pomes:

Thank you, Senators, for your time and consideration here today. I have been a veterinarian for the last twelve years. I'm licensed in five jurisdictions, including Guam. My practice outside of Guam is now limited because of my focus on my USDA job, but it was a relief veterinary work that brought me here.

And it's been a feature of my life since graduation that is was the best suited for me to pick my schedule, pick my hours, pick my place of business and clinic didn't measure up to the standards I thought it should be that I'd needed to continue working there. I could move onto another place and after a while, I had a fairly stable set of clients who practiced high quality medicine and a delightful place to work. I found that when I came to Guam the environment, the ocean, the culture and the clinics, I had a chance to work at. Dr. Oshiro and Dr. silks, both exemplary clinics. As a relief veterinary and I've been exposed to hundreds of clinics. I would say over the last twelve years.

When the recession of 2009-2009 came across, I applied to Virginia and Maryland. Licensed there and went away across the country to see how they do things and it's about the same as we do in California.

The problem with the Guam board at this time is the lack of funding for prosecuting and investigating complaints. Complaints come in, they are referred to the committee over an attorney for investigation, who is not veterinary trained and that leaves people in limbo.

And so, I would like to offer my services in that regard to move forward the regulation and the making veterinary medicine on this island more respective profession. I look around and see my colleagues who have recommended me and actually I'm very flattered.

I didn't know I was I had such a halo but I guess I must have maintained it somehow. I'm here to answer and they've covered everything I wanted to say.

Please see attached testimony.

Senator Mary Torres:

I have a question for you, Dr. Pomes, can you give us a general idea of significance of care for animals on Guam? Not only health care but the population of animals on Guam that would be serviced by veterinary medicine.

Dr. Paul Pomes:

There's two populations. One very small. One very large. The very small ones, are the animals that are kept in good care. They're not, let me enlarge on that – three categories. There's the indoor pets; the ones that are traditional pets as has been come to been known for many people. They're part of the family. They live inside, they provide companionship and are generally are considered part of the family.

Then there's a second category much larger of outdoor pets. They're just kept in the yard. Very little social interaction. Oftentimes tied up. And the very large population of animals that run free sometimes they have a collar on. Somebody feeds them but they're the ones who are sleeping in the street and laying under parked cars at Payless.

Senator Mary Torres:

This is dogs and cats mostly?

Dr. Paul Pomes:

Pine march dogs. Cats keep a much lower profile. You see them and they're thin and scrawny and they're not doing as well as I see in other places. More competition for food and the chickens are meaner, I think.

The meaning of veterinary care for the first population is like it is everywhere. We will provide vaccines and health matters, advice on husbandry, how to prolong their lifetimes, advice on diet, weight control, skin issues. Those are two big things for animals on Guam.

Allergies, skin issues, parasites. Parasites kill. We didn't have certain diseases. The actual dog problem ensign would be far worse without hook worms, parvo and heartworm. We could probably have doubled the population that we do now.

There's nothing that's going to address the last problem without some serious consideration of population control measures. There's just too many. I don't think we can spay or neuter our way out of that, out of that problem.

We can give it a good try and perhaps there's some technologies that can come along to make it easier and faster, but if I have to control an animal's reproductive capability by doing abdominal surgery that limits just how far and fast we can handle it.

Does that answer your question, Senator? I know it's rambling.

Senator Mary Torres:

No, it does answer my question. The reason I ask is oftentimes we overlook the relationship and interaction between pets or animals and humans and how the necessity to regulate both ultimately determines how our quality of life is affected.

Not only in terms of emotional companionship, service animals but also the destructive nature if the feral animal population and safety on the community and how I think, if we're talking about Allied Health, we can't address just human care or healthcare without recognizing the impact of the lack of care for animals who live alongside us.

Dr. Paul Pomes:

Who deserve better.

Senator Mary Torres:

Would deserve- yeah, that's why I want to ask just how that is and I think that your mention of the larger category. Which is the category of the feral animals who are breeding uncontrolled and you know succumbing to diseases not necessarily transmitted to humans but diseases that just make you know they're existing in our community less than desirable.

I think it needs to be addressed. So, I certainly appreciate the support that's been leant to you today and also just for broadening our horizons on veterinary care and how that's an important component of healthcare on Guam, generally.

Dr. Paul Pomes:

I also look forward to working with the senators on other issues that are related to veterinary care and a veterinary profession as they come up.

Senator Mary Torres:

But I would also be curious what you are talking about; investigation and prosecution. How that's lacking? How it's not funded. Is it currently that the Attorney General's Office is the default for any matters that are referred from the Allied Health Board?

Dr. Paul Pomes:

I'll read from my written testimony on that board. In a letter dated 14 May 2015, then Attorney General Elizabeth Barret-Anderson wrote to the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners stating in quoting, "I have determined however that our role heretofore cannot and shall not extend to the investigation or prosecution of disciplinary complaints before the Allied Health Board."

So, with that one letter, she cut off our prosecutorial ability and without replacement funding for the board to hire outside counsel or have one made her full-time counsel. They have been lacking in prosecuting. Some of the latest most recent prosecutions have been overturned in court; not for any violation, not for any mistakes in the evidence that showed errors and judgement errors and practice but rather open meeting law violations. The newspaper failed to publish the agenda. That announcement that they said they would, and with that whole prosecution went out the window.

Senator Mary Torres:

Sorry to hear that. All right. Thank you.

Dr. Paul Pomes:

Thank you.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Senator Perez?

Senator Sabina Perez:

Thank you, Madame Chair. Thank you, Dr. Pomes, for being here and for accepting the nomination. I just wanted to ask you what are some of your initiatives that in serving on the board? What are some of the initiatives that you will take on in addition to looking maybe in reinitiating the Attorney General's Office- having them relook at providing some service?

Dr. Paul Pomes:

I actually cornered the current AG on an airline flight from Saipan and he danced around the issue very nicely but he wasn't prepared. So, I can't blame him for that. I hope to hear back from him since then about the resolution of this issue and I think his plates just been very full.

As far as initiatives I would like to bring to some degree back the collegiality among the profession that I see everywhere else. As practitioners have learned to be very defensive in our practice because other veterinarians have not been hesitant to throw the first veterinary under the bus.

Saying, that the inadequate care ...they didn't do this test, they misinterpreted it wrong, they didn't find this problem and that test. That has to stop. So, I would like to initiate, independent my board membership, some sort of like journal club- some way of bringing the veterinarians together to talk about things rather than be so defensive with each other. But there are certain bad actors on this island that have promoted this defensive attitude. It's not without reason that it's there.

And so, that's one of the things that has to be dealt with in time as well. It's continuing education. It's also an issue for veterinarians. We don't get paid the big bucks like the medical doctors do and the Guam Board has been very generous and allowing us to get CE credit for a number of things like online education. But providing some sort local CE would help a great deal for us to meet our obligations.

I think that can be done by possibly recruiting a speaker to come in and share the cost among the other veterinarians. if there's interest of the profession can be dealt with to some degree by the board but a lot of it has to be dealt with by the veterinarians themselves. There's no other way around it. You can only use a club so much then you have to get out your carrots.

Senator Sabina Perez:

Thank you.

Dr. Paul Pomes:

Thank you.

Senator Sabina Perez:

Thank you.



Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you, Senators. Thank you, Dr. Pool again. And so, Dr. Pomes, again, thank you for accepting this nomination and for all your works. You are both correct. There are issues that have been brought up regarding the Guam Allied Health Board that they've been very delayed in their prosecution or following through on complaints that have been made to the board.

And it's been explained to me, because I also have oversight of these boards, that it stems from a change in the policy of the Attorney General's Office for as to who's going to investigate, who's going to prosecute.

But my understanding is that with the appointment of a veterinary member, we are going to be able to proceed with cases involving veterinarians, with the use of fees that have been paid by the various allied health boards, I mean members, of profession to this board, that we are going to ensure that the revolving fund operates as it's supposed to and so that you have access to those fees for use in your investigations, prosecutions and to hire a hearing officer.

And of course, I'd like to continue to work with the Attorney General to see which of those they can provide in addition to the resource- the attorney that they're providing for board advise at board meetings. But I think I'm hoping that they can provide at least one of these others so that it's not all at cost to the boards.

But you're not alone that this board; all the boards have this issue. They all need to step up in their investigations and their prosecutions. They are our only protection really against malpractice. You are our first line of that kind of protection to ensure that the practice is proceeding as it's supposed to- that people are getting the continuing education that's required and that our standards are what the community is entitled to. So, it's a big amount of work. I just have two questions for you.

You do run a private business for relief veterinary service?

Dr. Paul Pomes:

Yes, and I wanted to enlarge on that a little bit. I have made a very small income from that, but it wasn't doing euthanasia even though that what I set up the business to do. It turns out that all that income was made writing health certificates for travel- for animals to get on an

airplane and go somewhere because the CSR fee was raised to such a high level that it became an unaffordable expense for an amount of income I expected to derive from the business.

The Controlled Substances Registration fee is now five-hundred dollars a year. Which is two and a half times more than any other state in the union. and normally of the twenty-three states that do have their own registration requirements the average fee is eighty-five dollars and I've queried the public health to find out what the justification for such a high increase was. Where does the money go? Other states run their controlled substances programs with far less and it's really put a crimp on the small practitioners to pay that five-hundred dollars year after year.

A one-time fee would with some reduced recurring fee would be acceptable. But five-hundred dollars a year after year was just a lot for many practitioners.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right. I appreciate that. I expect that there's a lot of topics we could go on for the veterinary field by itself. Unfortunately, I'm pressed for time this morning. But I do just want to ensure that- so we have a practicing veterinarian, who is serving on the board that oversees and licenses all veterinarians and this is the same with all of the other health professions.

So, this is not unique. But it is where we're kind of monitoring ourselves, right? The legal profession does the same. But I just want to ask you for the record, do you foresee any conflicts in this regard? Where you are one practicing veterinarian- there are others- those are your competition perhaps. You also have a court dispute with one of them.

Dr. Paul Pomes:

That has been resolved.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

I mean are you going to be able to do your work on the board without any conflicts?

Dr. Paul Pomes:

I believe so. The experience I had with the clinic's from working with them, in them plus the fact that I have now a federally employed food safety veterinarian. I have no ties to any one practice and as far as my court case. I feel I was I had a fair hearing. I lost, life goes on.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right. Okay. Again, I thank you all and we will address some of the other concerns that you've brought up in a separate hearing or some separate way. But again, I want to thank you Dr. Pomes, for accepting this appointment, this nomination.

Dr. Paul Pomes:

And I thank you for your time and consideration.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you. Si Yu'os ma'åse'

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

- Testimony in support of the nomination of Dr. Paul B. Pomes to serve as a Veterinary Medicine Representative of the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners (GBAHE) was presented by Cyrus Luhr, President of Guam Animals in Need (GAIN) and by fellow veterinarians.
- Supportive testimony highlighted Dr. Pomes's professionalism, level of caliber of expertise and confidence in Dr. Pomes's care of patients.
- Dr. Pomes conveyed to the legislative panel, his willingness to assist with addressing the lack of funding for the prosecution and investigating complaints and improve veterinary medicine on the island.
- Chairperson Terlaje asked Dr. Pomes's if her foresees any possible conflicts of interest to appropriately carry out his duties as a Board member given his veterinary business and a past court dispute with another provider. Dr. Pomes stated for the record that he is no



longer affiliated with any one veterinary business in particular and that the prior dispute with another provider had received a fair hearing and was settled.
