



II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 5:32 PM.

Vice Speaker Telena Nelson: And now we'll move over to Ms. Cepeda. If anyone would like to testify on her behalf.

Serafina Paulino: Håfa Adai, my name is Sarafina Paulino and I'll be speaking on behalf of my mother. Tenacity, resilience and determination. I know my mom at its most personal level and I can truthfully say she displays these characteristics on a daily basis. There are certain words we use to describe others, but when it comes to my mother the words are simply endless. Motivated. hard-working, compassionate, assertive, prayerful, sincere, consistent, determined, selfless and beautiful. These are just a few that come to mind when I think of her. My mother raised my brother and I as a single parent in such a way that there is no potential way to pay her back. She constantly sacrifices for us. She is the type to give her last 10 dollars to my brother and I to buy snacks even though she has 20 miles left on an empty gas tank. She raised us in the church, teaching us the essence of prayer. She's the type to wake us up at 20 years old to remind us that Sunday's always start with morning mass. She raised us to finish what we started. When my brother and I want to give up, she's the type to give us the look of love if we aren't giving her 110 percent to show what we signed up, for she emphasizes the importance of growth and self-preservation she is fearless and is always looking for an outlet to improve herself and the environment. Though a single parent she never lets statistics or the hardships define us. Rather she showed my brother and I that with tenacity and prayer all things are possible. She is phenomenal and never disappoints, but let me warn you, she may say no, she may be feisty, she may be vocal, she may be argumentative, but one thing for certain is that she is genuine, down-to-earth, humble, and rooted in doing what is right with all that is being said today. I'm beyond proud of all that she has accomplished and contributed to. She is the best person to fulfill the task of the Guam Academy Charter School Council because she is insightful, dedicated and driven to improve all that she sets her mind to. Thank you.

Vice Speaker Telena Nelson: Thank you very much for that lovely testimony.

Nadine Cepeda: Håfa Adai Vice speaker. My name is Nadine Cepeda and I'm speaking on behalf of my sister, Evangeline Cepeda. I'm in full support of her. I didn't come with anything written, I'm gonna speak from my heart. It truly takes a lot to be a leader. We can all say we're leaders, but how do you define that? It's given a lot of traits and characteristics, determination, commitment, compassion being empathetic, carrying those are a few that people can say they don't have and some that may say they have, but speaking for my sister, she has all of it. Being young, we were forced to go, and I say force, my mom being to my right, we were raised in the church. She took on CCD, which people don't know that's catechumen, that we she taught confirmation, very difficult when it comes to formation in regards to faith. She actually did it for many many years. Took on as the coordination for Santa Barbara, a huge parish. Took on kids in our youth that were outside of the church, didn't have a good place to go home to, thought "hey

let me take you out" and feed them. She worked for GHURA in the government and she's always given to service. Has been in the government in Guam and currently now is in private sector in Century 21. Given that, her history, her experience she even served and was an elected official with Guam Department of Education. (It's) challenging, mind you, I'm currently employed there and I see many many challenges. Not to say it's a struggle with the charter schools as well you know when you're trying to shape young minds, it takes a village, a community, to make a change. It starts with people who are caring. We can all be educated. I sit here with two master's degree and that doesn't define who I am. I come here with tons of credentials, as a licensed person sitting in the Allied Health Board, but that doesn't define who I am because I make a difference. I do pro bono work, which goes back to what she does is service, making a difference in our community and that I have given again for you consider and I give my full support that would demonstrate what it takes to make a change. She's a changing agent, she wants to make a difference and it's one step at a time and I think she can do that. Therefore please consider Evangeline Cepeda. Thank you.

Vice Speaker Telena Nelson: Thank you very much for that powerful testimony.

Evangeline Cepeda: I guess I don't know how to beat that. My daughter made me cry and my sister is you know, she's the really educated one of my siblings. I want to say good afternoon Vice Speaker and Chairperson on the Committee on Education Air, Transportation, Statistics, Research and Planning, Telena Nelson and to my family and friends who are here today in support of my confirmation. My name is Evangeline Marie Cepeda I am proud to say, and I say this every time I go before a public, I am from the Lago district of Dededo. Anyone that knows me one way or another, whether it be from the church where my mother raised us, we've been there one way or another, to doing the library the public library, when I did mother read, father read literacy program for ten years on my own stuff. With regards to education and service, my mom has put that in the forefront for all of us. My mother has always informed us that you can be educated, you lack respect or you don't do service, ti bali lastima i education. If there's no respect or the community service that you give back to the community. I'm not gonna sit here and say did this, I did that, you've got my resume before you. My entire life has been based on service. I'm not lip service, I'm do service. If I see something that I'm not pleased with, I go to the right place. I've always been one to step up, step out. Sometimes I'm a radicalist and that's okay. My point comes across and as my sister said I'm a passionate being. On the board I'm not afraid to stand alone and make tough decisions that may be unpopular, but I'm a team player. I know what it takes to make a vote, it doesn't take one it takes the required five plus so I understand that dynamics. I come with a different personality, I'm considered vibrant, tough, energetic, I'm a doer. You give me something to do, I like to start. I'm going to finish it one way or another. My only goal to be on this board and I need to say that I'm honored and humbled by our Maga-håga, Lou Leon Guerrero and our Lieutenant Governor Joshua Tenorio for entrusting

me to this task. I'm going to say that I know the people on the board, I've worked with them in one way or one form and past life, We've been there and I'm just saying that I'm going to give it my best and I'm not going to pretend it's going to be easy. I like things that are tough because it just builds my character and I just want to say that you know I've been elected from the Lagu district. My people in the Lagu district elected me and I didn't run the last time because I wanted to make sure my kids graduated on time and I wanted them to go off to do whatever they needed to do as a single mom. So I was out of the limelight for about two to three years. I'm back because they're in school or they're adults now, but you know even as adults they're your children so you have to step up, step out. And so I want to say that all I can say is I'm gonna give it my all, I'm gonna be productive, I'm gonna make it an honest day at every time that I'm there. A good sound decision whether it be tough or easy and I just want to say if I am confirmed that I won't disappoint the people of Guam thank you.

Vice Speaker Telena Nelson: Thank you very much. I'd also like to thank our Maga-håga for the appointment of Mrs. Mears and you Mrs. Sanchez and Ms. Cepeda. Just to address some of the Charter School issues. So some of the council duties is the council may grant Academy Charter school charter status to qualifying applicants pursuant to this chapter and just a couple weeks ago a conversion bill appeared and was passed by this body and so now we're anticipating another charter school to be formed so there's something that we need to consider, especially in the budget aspect how is the school going to be funded and one of my bigger concerns is that we fund another charter school and then we start to again siphon money out of DOE and so really it's just about holding the charter schools accountable. I'm sure you've seen in the news for the past couple of months, perhaps within the last year, some of the challenges that the charter schools face. So we've been working on some of the policies to allow them more flexibility, but they do need a functioning Council and we are moving forward towards that. I'd like to thank our governor for your appointments because I am very excited and humbled to be in the company of outstanding women. So I really look forward to the decisions that you make, the accountability that you'll hold each charter school for because it's not just they're nonprofit organizations. If you look beyond that, they are backed by some big-time investors and so not only are they backed by big-time investors, but they're also supplemented by the general fund within our government through the people's taxes. So really to provide that transparency that we need, the legislature cannot have an oversight hearing with the charter school themselves, but we can have an oversight hearing with the council to explain to us some of the challenges that the charter school is having some of the corrections that we look to implement so that the charter schools stay above board and ensure that they get accreditation and provide the education to the children that they greatly deserve. So I want to thank you and I'm just very honored to be here and hear you know the the support that comes from your family and your mentors. I'm really excited to see the work that you're going to be doing for our charter school so thank you very much for accepting this service it's really gratis it's really a free service especially for the expertise that you're

bringing to the table so thank you very much. And now we'll conclude our confirmation hearing it is now 6:05 and the Committee on Education, Air Transportation and Statistics, Research and Planning now calls this confirmation hearing adjourned. Thank you very much.
