

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Dorian heads north after swiping NC

KITTY HAWK, N.C. (Reuters) -Hurricane Dorian briefly made landfall on the Outer Banks of North Carolina on Friday, hitting the beach-fringed barrier islands with powerful winds and battering waves days after reducing parts of the Bahamas to rubble.

The storm made landfall at Cape Hatteras about 9 a.m. with maximum sustained winds of 90 mph, according to the National Hurricane Center. That was far weaker than its slow, deadly tour through the Bahamas earlier in the week that caused at least 43 deaths, according to news media accounts late Friday, and likely many more.

By late afternoon, Dorian was moving away from the mid-Atlantic states and headed toward Canada where it was expected to bring hurricane-force winds to parts of Nova Scotia by Saturday evening, the National Hurricane Center said.

The storm surge inundated the Outer Banks' Ocracoke Island, cutting off power and submerging many homes and buildings, North Carolina Gov. Ray Cooper told reporters.

Floodwaters came halfway up to kitchen countertops and battered fences and boardwalks, according to images on social media. One island resident uploaded a video on social media showing people driving a speedboat down a flooded street.

"We estimate about 800 people remained on the island during the storm and have heard reports from residents who say the flooding there was catastrophic," Cooper said. "We're thankfulinot to have reports of serious

injury or death since the storm arrived." One resident in need of immediate medical attention was airlifted off

Ocracoke, and helicopters will fly in food and water, the governor added.

The Outer Banks are a picturesque series of narrow islands known for their beaches, lighthouses and natu-

The Kitty Hawk area, on the northern end of the Outer Banks, emerged from the storm with little damage. Many houses near the ocean lost power on Friday, but houses on higher ground continued to have power and cable television.

Storm surge

Stacy and Ryan Marshall said their home, which is not oceanfront, came through unscathed. They drove to the beach on Friday afternoon to view the storm surge. "We got lucky, just lost a couple of boards on the fence," Stacy Marshall said.

South Carolina Gov. Henry McMaster held a news conference with smiling officials, saying that the storm had not been as bad as had been feared and floodwaters had ebbed in coastal areas.

Ryan, Booker temper attacks on Biden

MANCHESTER, N.H. (Tribune News Service) - Two Democratic presidential hopefuls walked back their attacks on front-runner Joe Biden as they faced questions Saturday about their previous statements on the former vice president.

Rep. Tim Ryan of Ohio, who this week said he's lost faith in the front-runner's ability to beat Donald Trump, and New Jersey Sen. Cory Booker, who spent weeks criticizing Biden's record on race, both said their goal is to win back the White House.

"I have some concerns with a lot of the candidates," Ryan said at the New Hampshire state Democratic Convention in Manchester, "It was a comment that I made and I'm not backtracking from it; it is a concern you're hearing from a lot of people."

But Ryan, who has languished in the low single digits in polls and failed to qualify for the third debate next week, said to reporters at the event that he isn't concerned about Biden's age, after telling Bloomberg on Thursday that he doesn't have faith that a "declining" Biden can defeat Trump.

When pressed to explain, Ryan cited "a lack of clarity" when Biden articulates his positions. Asked about whether such attacks threaten Democratic unity. Ryan said the party has a common goal.

There is a very unifying force in this world for Democrats and he is the current occupant of the White House," Ryan said.

In his call for unity in Manchester, **Bookerofferedupaveiledswipeagainst** rival Bernie Sanders of Vermont.

'We Democrats have to be careful," Booker said in prepared remarks. "I don't care who our nominee is, but we cannot tolerate Democrats who

turn against other Democrats and try to tear us down.

Booker's remarks were seen as directed at Sanders, who refused to wholeheartedly back Hillary Clinton after she won the nomination in 2016.

Booker, who trails the top-tier candidates at 2.5% in a recent average of polls by RealClearPolitics, was asked later by reporters to explain his call for unity after repeatedly faulting Biden on race issues, including calling him "an architect of mass incarceration" for working on the 1994 toughon-crime legislation.

"I think pointing out differences is OK," Booker said. "I'm talking about what we've seen in the past election where you had Democrats literally, even after the primary was over, trying to tear down the nominee of our party."

Sanders was widely criticized by Democrats in 2016 for not being sufficiently supportive of Clinton after she won the nomination. While Sanders eventually backed her, aides and allies complained his tone was begrudging and didn't help bring his supporters on board.

Philip Flores, President, CEO, BankPacific: Honorable Senator Perez, Marsh Taitano, my fellow Republicans. I come here today to testify in full favor of the nomination of John McKinnon to the Guam Bank Insurance Commission. In my role as an officer and board member of Guam's first locally owned financial institution, BankPacific, I worked with John McKinnon for 12 years. During that time, he has served in various roles in the bank including in credit, in operations. However he now holds one of the most important positions at BankPacific as the Vice President, Compliance and Security Officer. Security Officer is a pretty straightforward definition and it's challenging. I mean what happened to the good old days when they'd robbed us with guns instead of computers. The Compliance Officer however is a much more involved and meaningful since the days of 9/11 whose heroes we honor today, to the stateside housing disaster in the 2008 era. Since then compliance, the ever-evolving rules and regulations has risen to the forefront of every bank in America. John defends that forefront for us and does so in an exemplary manner. By chance just this morning John and I were on a conference call with two FDIC examiner's, there's no need to worry everything's good. I just bring it up to my point that FDIC values what John does for us at BankPacific. In my mind he would make a great addition to the banking insurance commission. Senator, Madam Chair, you asked one of the other members what they would do if they saw something going wrong, that's John's job. When he first started took over as compliance, we used to call him the Archbishop, but it was a much more popular term then. Now we just call him John and he's the Security Officer. It is his job to go around saying that's not right you got to fix that. He'll do that in the banking commission. I had a couple of jokes I thought I was gonna get a smile, that's it.

Rob San Agustin: Good morning, Senators and I thank you for the opportunity to allow me to speak in support of Mr. McKinnon for his appointment. I've known John since 1990 when I first came to the island and went to FD. He's one of my closest friends for almost the last 30 years. As far as his character, he's a soft-spoken funny guy, even keeled and he's always stayed out of trouble. He's always been the guy that I can talk to about my life for my problems and he's always made time to listen to me. He's a great father to his four children, he's helped to raise another Friar and he has three younger children and he's doing a great job with it. I inspire to be a father like him if I get the chance. As far as his work, he's always loves cars so that speaks to his problem-solving ability. He's a hard worker. When we were younger, we'd be hanging out and John always had to go to work, whether it's going to his father's house to help rebuild a car on the weekend or work to afford his next project car. He's been in the banking industry for a couple decades now so and he's worked hard to get where he is today. I think he would be good for the board because he

has experience, knowledge and perspective. He's a capable and responsible guy and I'm happy he's being given the opportunity to help the island. I'm proud of him that he's stepped up and accepted the challenge. I fully support him being part of the board. Thank you.

Karl Pangelinan: Håfa adai, good morning, thank you Madam Chairman and the rest of the Senators that are joining us on the panel this morning. I am also here in favor of the nomination for Mr. John McKinnon for the Banking and Insurance Commission. I guess to start my personal feeling, we need another board like we need another WhatsApp chat group but, in this sense, I truly stand by the importance and the functions of our Banking and Insurance Commission. They play a vital role in our economy and with that you need proper leadership. You need the proper vision; you need the steady professional and you get that actually with John. Like Rob, John and I and another young handsome man up there, all four of us are class of '92 Father Duenas grads and so I'm here to support our brother for nomination and your consideration on this board. Just to close it out and I don't want to take too much time because it's freezing in here, but I heard the testimony earlier and some of the reaction to Mr. Sgro's nomination and had a lot of wonderful things to say. I, if I could, would like to also ask for your support for his confirmation but you need, I think a nice balance of that out-of-the-box new thinking with some seasoned, coupled with some seasoned professionalism. With the two candidates that you have here today I think that's a very nice duo. If you can just package them together and do the bundled confirmation, I think that would be a great win for the island. Si Yu'os ma'ase'.

Chairperson Perez: Si Yu'os ma'åse'. Now we're on to the questions, Mr. McKinnon, I'm going to ask the same question, have you been in a situation where you had to make a determination, where you had to enforce certain rules that may go against an employee or a subordinate and in this case if by serving on the board you would have to make the determination on a person that is questioned for their conduct, regards to compliance of law.

Mr. McKinnon: Yes, I have. As Philip stated that's actually part of my duties right now. Security at the bank and also with the regulations. My role is really to make sure that we're doing what the law says and if I see any new factors there, I have to go to that person to find out what's going on. My role is to understand why they made the decisions and if it's valid or not and of course, unfortunately, if it's not a good reason then I have to enforce that we take action against that. That's no problem with me.

Chairperson Perez: Are you able to determine when a conflict of interest exists?

Mr. McKinnon: Definitely, I can't say that have any specific experience that I could share with you but I do understand the way it is today when people are being accused or charged with something or reviewed for their actions and stuff like that, that if there's any kind of idea that they might think the person's biased against them, it's best to step away from it. I have no problem. If there's any kind of situation where they might feel that, to walk away or to remove myself from that discussion.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you. Do you have any conflicts of interest? I mean maybe that's a question that can be answered already but are there any conflicts of interest that you have?

Mr. McKinnon: I do not have any conflicts of interest, unless BankPacific would be involved, if I understand the question correctly. Of course, at that situation I would excuse myself.

Chairperson Perez opened the floor to her colleagues.

Senator Taitague: Thank you Madam Chair. Thank you so much John for stepping up to the plate to do this especially with four children. It's kind of difficult.

Mr. McKinnon: One moved out so it's three now. It's a little easier.

Senator Taitague: I really greatly appreciated it. Though I don't know you personally, I really appreciate the testimony of others, especially people I know, Mr. Flores, San Agustin and Karl. I know these gentlemen and what they have to say about you, all the good they have to say, says a great deal about you because I do respect these gentlemen here today. With their support I'm sure, you have my support as well. The only thing I have a question is have you had an opportunity to be a part of the program or you'll probably have to go through it, it's an ethics for government that I think board members are required to go through. Have you been through any type of ethics programs?

Mr. McKinnon: I have not but I'm willing to do that.

Senator Taitague: That's one thing that's important that you need to attend on that one. Have you been to any of the meetings they've had, or have you had the opportunity to read the minutes?

Mr. McKinnon: I haven't attended any of them, but I did go through several of the minutes for the last couple years and just review to see what its about.

Senator Taitague: Great. Being in the industry, I'm sure you have a wealth of knowledge to contribute to this. I again greatly appreciate you stepping up to the plate and spending some of your time to help our community. Thank you so much, John.

Senator Moylan: Thank you, Madam Chairman. Mr. McKinnon congratulations on your nomination. I appreciate you taking, you're busy at the bank especially with the FDIC so that's a good thing but you're still going to make the time, so I appreciate that. Your fellow brothers from FD had some excellent statements to say about you, Mr. San Agustin and Mr. Pangelinan. Obviously, they want to continue their long-term friendship with you and have a lot of good things to say. That's another plus for you. My fellow Republican, his notes were really clear of all the experience that you have done at the bank and being in your position as Compliance and Security Officer, it's a lot of weight on your shoulders but you're managing it quite well. Just like the FDIC recognizes all your accomplishments and what a good job you're doing, I'm looking forward to seeing your name on the next session so we can get you nomination approved. Congratulations sir.

Senator Castro: Madam Chair, despite the rain it's a great day. We had the privilege earlier to recognize the fallen and the heroes of 9/11, but it's an awesome day because even the Chairman emeritus of the Republican Party can acknowledge that you too Madam Chair would make a great Republican. Thank you so much for that Phil. In all seriousness I wanted to ask my colleague here

and in full disclosure, I'm his classmate we're both FD graduates. I have two questions and we also have a very distorted sense of humor. Why you and why now? I don't want Mr. McKinnon to answer that question instead Madam Chair I'll put myself forward. Why him? John has always been a very humble member of the class; he's always been a positive light all throughout the duration of our high school career. If I had to trust the people's assets to serve as a trustee on behalf of the great territory, I trust John with our money and our policies. You're very educated gentlemen. You're well suited for the position and I want the listening audience and all my colleagues to know on the question of conflicts of interest, Madam Chair, I couldn't get John McKinnon to cheat on an FD exam even if we filled in all the questions for him. His credibility and integrity is intact. I trust and I respect you, John, and I wish you well. Also, in all seriousness to my colleagues you've heard from someone who's a registered Democrat and who served a respected person, elected official the former delegate to Congress the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo. You also heard from a very independent thinker, someone we all respect as a competitive world-class athlete, a decorated golfer and so you have people from both sides of the spectrum speaking to your credibility Mr. McKinnon. I thank you very much for accepting the nomination, for accepting more work and for accepting the charge to serve as a guardian for the people over a major industry that is perhaps the single greatest driver this economy thus the region. Thank you so much.

Senator Marsh (Taitano): Håfa adai and good to see you continuing to be here. This hearing is an important event that allows us to be able to hear what you have shared. What you have shared is extremely helpful in providing us that confidence in the nomination of Mr. McKinnon. Each of you have known him for quite a length of time, so you have that to really provide weight to your assessment and to your endorsing him. That means a lot of course. Looking at his track record, Mr. McKinnon's experienced the positions that he's had for 19, 20 years, that really says something, and he has risen through the ranks. That says something about his ability and people's belief in what he is providing. Those are very good as well. Certainly, having that experience in compliance and review some of the other work that he does, and it was a very important point I think that Mr. Flores brought up. This is an ever-evolving set of rules and regulations and it takes a lot to be able to stay on top of all of those continuing changes. He really has a lot of just belief in and has seen that you have done that very well. Again, that means a lot to us. I really liked also what Mr. Pangelinan mentioned is that he is seasoned and at this time when we're thinking about the board it is very good to have a balance of about those who are perhaps from other sectors of the community and bringing aboard new ideas perhaps or new perspectives but also needing to balance that with somebody who has that wealth of experience. With all of that and even hearing from fellow colleagues who were classmates about your level of integrity and their trust and belief in you. All of that really adds to my, along with the others, being able to provide my support to your nomination. Si Yu'os ma'ase' to all of you for coming out today.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you so much Mr. McKinnon for accepting the executive nomination and taking on public service at such a young age and applying what you have experienced and your expertise in the private sector. We look forward to seeing your work and protection of the laws that oversee banking and insurance. *Si Yu'os ma'åse'* for everyone who has come here today to testify and taking time out of your busy schedule. Thank you very much.

Chairperson Perez then adjourned the confirmation hearing for Mr. John McKinnon
