



I have known Mr. Meno for more than ten years. In that time, he has consistently been an advocate for the Chamorro culture and a living testament to the fortitude and strength of our people. His entire life reflects his love for our heritage and his desire to preserve our way of life.

In Joseph's personal life, he cherishes and respects what our people value the most, our elders. He took care of his grandparents in their final days. He did not turn his back on them or abandon them. In a time when it is easy to get caught up in the priorities of the world, he did not lose his focus. He sacrificed his own ambitions in order to care for his grandparents without complaint, never did he find this to be a burden. I remember feeling such a sense of pride in my Chamorro culture when I saw this young man, choose to put his life on hold so that he could honor his grandparents.

In Joseph's public life, he has always done work in service to others. This is another way he uses his life to perpetuate our culture. He never just belongs to a community. He is always an active, contributing member of his communities. He gives back in service to his friends, his work, and his Church. He will go to the hospital or the family's house and offer words of consolation and prayer. He has spent years as a trusted *techa*. Joseph has become like a member of the family to those who invite him year after year to lead their prayers and devotions. Not only does Joseph think and behave in ways that carry on our heritage, but he also speaks it. He is one of the few people I know in his age group who can fluently speak the Chamorro language. Although Joseph also speaks English fluently, I would consider Chamorro to be his first language. Speaking the language shows how much he values the culture. It links him to his grandparents and his elders. It connects him to our people. It gives him a sense of belonging to our island.

Joseph R. Meno, Jr. has a profound respect for the Chamorro heritage and for the island. You can be assured that decisions he makes on the Board will always be in the best interest of Guam and her people. Hafa Adai! I am delighted to provide a written testimony to the Committee on Heritage and the Arts, Parks, Guam Products, Hagatna Revitalization, Self-Determination, and Regional Affairs, and especially pleased to have the opportunity to share my thoughts and observations about appointee to the Kosas Board of Advisors, Guam Museum – my good friend, Joseph R. Meno Jr.

Joseph (Joe) and I have been friends for twenty-one years and he is about four years older than me.

Joe is the epitome of a leader of the Chamorro language and culture.

But there are many individuals who personify this leadership. So why Joe among all others? There are proportions to Joe that set him apart from most people; particularly, his fluency in the language and understanding in the custom distinctively separate him among those in my generation – born in the 1980s.

Joe grew up, figuratively, in a world apart from me. While speaking English at home and school was the norm for my family and friends, Joe was raised in a home where Chamorro was the primary spoken language, and English was secondary. He was raised by wonderful grandparents, +Mr. Jose & +Mrs. Maria Mantanona, who instilled both the Chamorro lifestyle and customs that those in previous generations embraced and practiced, while those in my generation (many of us) both never grasped and now looking for every opportunity to learn.

My colleague, who is the same age as me, was taking a Chamorro language class and was tasked to deliver his speech in Chamorro. Because most of those my age know Joe's fluency in Chamorro, my colleague reached out to Joe to practice his speech and converse in the language orally. After, we all knew that my colleague needed more practice, but Joe, finding the good in all things, provided his recommendations for practice and gave him lots of encouragement. This is a perfect illustration of the leadership that Joe brings among my peers.

Joe became a *techa* – a Chamorro word, meaning one who leads prayer, at the age 14. Some 28 years later, Joe continues to *techa* for rosaries and novenas. Often times when glancing at him while praying, Joe is reciting his prayers with no book or paper, and singing the Chamorro hymns in memorization. With pure amazement and joy, people – both those my age and those in the older generations – are very much intrigued in his *techa* devotion. It is very much appealing to see a young person saying the rosary or novena in our language.

More recently, our friend started a devotion to Santa Marian Kamalen, Our Lady and patroness of the island – both a cultural and Roman Catholic affair for the community. Besides saying the novena in Chamorro, he shares what he knows about our customs. He once told us that being a techa – is an official role – and is a dedicated life of service and an assurance to lead prayers upon request. Just as tradition says, Joe is skilled as he able to keep his rhythm, while efficiently guiding others through a momentous prayerful experience. These are examples on how Joe leads us in the Chamorro teachings.

Although Joe's grandparents, +Mr & +Mrs. Mantanona have both died and whom I am sure he misses dearly, he continues to share what he has learned from them. He is compassionate about our culture. He is phenomenal in our language. He will be remarkable board advisor. But above all else, Joseph is simply my wonderful friend who is close to my heart.

Support of advisers for the Guam Museum, the Committee will receive oral testimony for I Maga'håga's nominee at this public hearing. For the viewing public's benefit, the Committee will

continue to accept written testimony that will be made a part of today's public hearing record. We do have several pieces of written testimony already.

Joining me this morning is the nominee, Mr. Joseph R. Meno himself. Si Yu'os ma'åse' for your attendance kind of bright and early this morning. Let's go ahead and move on to go over some of our general rules of conduct for those who are virtually participating in today's virtual hearing. The conduct of his hearing shall be as follows: All participants must abide by rules of conduct and quality assurance standards, including broadcasting from a quiet room with little to no interruptions. The use of virtual backgrounds is not permitted. All participants must broadcast from a room with adequate lighting specifically to ensure that a participant's face is not backlit but visible at all times when speaking.

When speaking, please ensure that you are unmuted and that you are speaking clearly into your microphone. I will moderate this hearing by recognizing each participant. Before presenting their oral testimony and before speaking, please clearly state your name and title for record-keeping purposes.

The order of questioning will begin with the panel of senators who are present. Each panel member will pose one question, and then as needed, we will move on to subsequent rounds. Oral testimonies received shall be kept to the substance of the issues on the agenda.

The personal inference as to the character of a nominee Senator or any individual testifying is not permitted. Any violation of this general rule of conduct will result in the removal of that person from this virtual public hearing by the host. I ask that all participants keep their comments or testimony to within five minutes. There's just two of us, so we have a little bit of flexibility.

The Guam Museum officially is named the "Senator Antonio "Tony" M. Palomo Guam and *Chamoru* Educational Facility," a public facility under the Department of *Chamoru* Affairs. Within the Department of *Chamoru* Affairs organization, a seven-member Advisory Board known as the Kosas Board of Advisors was established through Public Law 22-118 and placed into the Department of *Chamoru* Affairs through Public Law 25-69.

Kosas Board of Advisors is mandated to promote increased understanding of Guam's geology, biota, prehistory, history, and contemporary culture, overseeing the Museum and is the official repository and custodian of historical artifacts of Guam. Kosas is mandated to acquire, preserve, and make available for public viewing ancestral heritage and archival materials related to Guam's cultural, historical, and natural heritage. As a member of the Kosas Board of Advisors, board

members' work involves much volunteer time and commitment that provides an important link between the Museum, the public, the legislature, and the governor. The *Kosas* Board of Advisors is unique in its purpose, mission, and role. It is essential that members be familiar with their Board's governing statutes or other authorizing directives to understand its framework.

I want to call upon. Mr. Joseph R. Meno, Jr., to provide his testimony to serve as the public member to the *Kosas* Board of Advisors for the Guam Museum. Then perhaps, I will read portions of the submitted written testimonies. We received about four written testimonies in favor of Mr. Meno. I'd like to recognize. Mr. Joseph R. Meno, Jr., to provide his testimony and general comments to the Committee. If he could begin with stating his name and his position if there is a title to state. Mr. Meno, please unmute your microphone, and good morning.

JOSEPH R. MENO, JR., NOMINEE: Manana si Yu'os Senadora Marsh Taitano. Si Yu'os Ma'åse put este na chånsa. Maninetnon hit på 'go na ogga'an para bai hu testigon maisa hu para este na apuntu, gi i mangehilo' i faninadahen kosas Guåhan. Malago' yu' bei nå'i un dångkolo na si Yu'os Ma'åse para i Maga'håga-måmi as Lourdes Leon Guerrero, yan i Sigundo Maga'låhi as Joshua Tenorio, put este ma'apunta yu'. Si Yu'os Ma'åse nu i manggaikonfiansa nu Guahu, na bai fata'chungi este kapasidåt.

Good morning, Senator. Thank you very much for this opportunity to be here this morning. I would like to give thanks to our Governor Lourdes Leon Guerrero and you for this opportunity, as the appointee to this Board, their confidence in me to serve this Board.

Annai ma faisen yu', ma apunta yu' gi este kapasidåt, magof i korason-hu, bumanidosu yu' na taotao, sa' Chamoru yu', taotao Guåhan yu'. Trentai nuebi años yu' taotao Inalåhan na songsong. Magof yu' sa' este kinahulo'-hu, ma poksai ginen as nanå-hu biha yan tatå-hu bihu. Ma fa'nu'i yu', ma fa'nå'gue yu' i taimanu i pusision i taotao-ta, taotao Chamoru no? Pues, måtto på'go este na ora, i malago'-hu para bai nå'i tåtte para i tano'-hu, sa' ginen este hu. Magof hu na bai hu facho'chu'i este i manggehilo' i faninadahen kosas Guåhan, i kosas i tano' board. Sen magof yu' Senadora ni este na chånsa ya komo makonfitma yu' ginen i Trentai Singko na Liheslaturan Guåhan, espesiåtmente påra hågu gehilo' Senadora Marsh Taitano, un nå'i yu' nu este na chånsa para bai fata'chungi. Hu prometi hu na bai hu facho'chu'i yan bai hu dalalaki i pumalu na board members siha, ni' para ta prutehi, sa' meggai na biahi ta huhungok na ma såsangan na kumekemåtai osino måtai i kotturan Guåhan pat i lengguåhi. Ya gaige hu guini na ora para bei sangåni hao na lå'la'la' ha' i kotturå-ta, lå'la'la' ha' I lengguahi-ta Chamoru. Ya debi, ya impottånte na para ta difende este na kottura, sa' ginen i mañaina-ta no? Tåya' mås, ya mohon para håyi i manmamaila siha na henerasion – the upcoming generation – debi di para ta fa'nu'i

ya ta fa'nå'gue i taimanu hit na taotaogues i taotao Chamoru. Pues, un biahi ta'lo Senadora Marsh Taitano, un dångkolo na si Yu'os Ma'åse ni' maninetnon hit på'go na ogga'an para ta diskusa este na pusision. Si Yu'os Ma'åse.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse' for your testimony, and I am going to read a few excerpts from the testimony received. It's very important to hear this kind of written testimony that's in support. We want members who will be well-versed in the field they're representing, and I was very assured by the testimony.

I just want to mention that we've had discussions here and there throughout the last year or so. I've always come across to me your passion for the culture, for the language, for promoting it, and for safeguarding it, and for those who haven't necessarily looked at some of the terminologies. I want to mention that a little bit. What I'm discussing here is that there's protection, which of course is important. There's also this concept of safeguarding. Safeguarding is more comprehensive in a lot of ways. Throughout the time, I have felt that we've gotten to discuss these kinds of issues, and in reading through your testimony that you understand more of the holistic approach. It's really about safeguarding. It's promoting, maintaining, and figuring out all of these ways that go even beyond just protection. Like I said, I have felt that from you in our interactions. I do want to mention that I do have a little bit of connection with *Inalajan*. I was very pleased to see that you are from the village of *Inalajan*. I went to *Inalajan* Junior High when it was a Junior High back in the day. I think it was a pretty new school, actually. Then my uncle and aunt taught down at *Inalajan* for a period of time as well. It's always been a special village, not just to me but I think to the entire community. Precisely for some of the reasons you're nominated is because it's one of the villages recognized as this keeper of history and culture.

I remember Saina Judy Flores mentioning that she heard people singing Kantan Chamorita as she walked down the street when she was growing up. I think not many of us have an experience like that. It just speaks to some of the nuances that are part of daily life down at *Inalajan* or have been over time and the fact that *Gef Pågo* is there. It's a historic district. There are a lot of these indicators speaking to the fact that the people of *Inalajan* have grown up in many ways treasuring their history and culture and representing it. Sharing with the rest of the island, that's some of what came through in the testimony. It is that I think one of the most important things to me was hearing that you cared for your grandparents because that transmission is so important. We can learn a lot through books and through Academia and so forth. There's probably nothing stronger than hearing it from and seeing it being acted out by one's own parents and grandparents when it comes to culture and the language and lifeways.

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So, before I move onto other parts, can you speak to that, Mr. Meno? The relationship that you had with your grandparents? Did you ask them about culture and life-ways? You recognized any difference in learning to speak *Chamoru* as a first language and whether you find that has helped you? In, you know the work to do with saving the language and speaking it in a way that can also then be transmitted to others.

I'd like to give you a few minutes to speak about some of that and how that has informed you as somebody who could serve well on this Board.

JOSEPH R. MENO, JR., NOMINEE: Si Yu'os ma'åse' Senator. You know, as shared earlier, I was raised by my grandparents, my maternal grandparents. It became very natural for me. My grandfather rarely spoke English at home. He would always talk to us in *Chamoru*. It became very natural for me to start learning the language for me, you know, looking back because both my grandparents are both deceased. Now, my maternal grandparents, paternal grandparents, are still living...Carmen and Vicente Meno from *Inalåhan*.

I don't think I ever recalled asking them to teach me about culture. It just came naturally. I watched both grandparents in their daily lives and how they shared raising their children. It became very natural for me to learn the language and learn about the culture. I would oftentimes sit with my grandparents and speak to them about their experience in the war. They would share that and for me. That became very important for me to learn about who I am as a Chamoru. To learn about my culture, as you said. You know, the importance of protecting and defending our culture is who we are as a *Chamoru* people, and as you said earlier, we can study. They can provide so many books about what it means to be Chamoru. But I think for me the important part is how we live our lives as Chamoru people Hu sångan fine nina gi tinituhon, impottånte na para ta prutehi yan ta difende este na kottura. Para i manmamaila na henerasion no? The upcoming generation, it's very important for me. Ya hu cho'cho'gue todu i nina'siñå-hu i para bai hu prutehi ya para bai hu fa'nu'i ya u fa'nà'gue put i kotturan Guåhan yan i lengguahen Guåhan ni' taimanu ma fa'nu'i yu' ma na'i yu' ni' mañaina-hu. Gi i kinahulo'-hu hu hasso na si tata-hu bihu yan si nana-hu biha, tåya' ma chomma' yu' para bai tungo' i lengguahen Chamoru pat i kotturan Chamoru. My grandparents never, they always encouraged me to learn about our Chamoru culture and language. Hu hasso un biahi i tihå-hu, techa taotao Inalåhan i tihå-hu, nanan kilisyånu, ya ha faisen, kao malago' hao tumecha? I hinengge-ku umbre techa para famalao'an, tåya' nai hu li'e' techa para lalåhi. Lao ha faisen yu', ilek-ña, sigi mågi ya bai hu fa'nu'i hao håfa taimanu tumecha. Pues desde katotse åños yu' tumecha yu' para i kumunidåt no? At the age of 14, I became a techa or a prayer leader.

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At the age of 14, I became a Techa or a prayer leader, and it was by way of my aunt, who encouraged me to become a Techa. Growing up, I've never seen a male prayer leader. Growing up, it became very shocking for me when she asked me to tag along with her and learn the ways of Techa.

Pues på'go gaige hu gi kapasidåt-hu, hu sångan na trentai nuebi åños yu', ya anai hu hasso tåtte, na'manman, na'manman para Guahu, ya na'magof para Guahu sa' Chamoru yu'. Mås sensia hu para Guahu, an hu atan tåtte, i direksion, ginen i mañaina-hu. Sa' ma fa'nå'I yu' ya ma pula' i chalån-hu para bai hu tattiyi yan I håftaimanu i tiningo'-hu put Chamoru. Pues magåhet, hu nå'i sen dångkolo' na si Yu'os Ma'åse para todu i dos mañaina-hu, i difunto as Jose, i difunta as Maria Mantanoña. Yan si nanå-hu yan si tatå-hu, as Carmen and Vicente Meno. Hu nå'i sa' ginen siha muna'posipble este i kapasidåt-hu på'go. Ya håyi yu' na taotao. Na'magof yan hu sångan gi tinituhon na bumanidosu yu' nu este na rigålu.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse' for that and you know through the written testimony and through what you just shared those things that are very extraordinary. I think those aspects of yourself. They're exactly the kind of qualities that we need as a member of the Kosas Board of Advisors that helps guide the Museum in its activities. Also, on how the materials are displayed. These are all you know, they may seem very straightforward, but they're all very particular types of Arts. Really, you know, the types of activities can make a large difference in the way a museum conducts its outreach and so forth. So, we do need people who are well versed for us to grow up. In as much as possible, the culture, the language, and the lifeways itself; or who have studied them as some of the Board members have done. They've made it their academic career.

Having this mixture on the Board is important. I think so. I just want to mention we maybe won't have time to go through much of the testimony, but I just want to summarize it, and we've heard from Simeon Palomo, whose father the Museum is named after. I didn't say that quite well, but you know, the Museum is named after his father, and this is because again, as with your family, his family is known. As a product of that family, he is known for studying the culture and being these safeguards, these Defenders of the culture. So that came through very loud and clear of being a Techa at the age of 14.

I have to think that's unusual. It speaks to your extraordinary character, and people recognize that. The fact that you learned it through the family. It helps us understand the type of atmosphere you grew up with and the learning you did all along the way. If I just summarize the testimony, it's about the strength of your character and the commitment you have to the culture, the language,

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and commitment to it, but the true living of it. I've had to tell others before that I get very sad to talk about these things as I've gotten older. I think that those again are just so important. To study, it is one thing, but growing up in it is another important thing. But to have been known for all your adult life and for exuding it is another important quality.

I will move on to just a couple of quick questions. We just want to make sure that anybody who becomes a member of any Board, they understand the time commitment and dedicate themselves to it. We've had a problem over the years of people not being able to make the time and then not being able to make a quorum. Then the Board is not able to move forward. So, both the time commitment, if you're ready to dedicate yourself to that and understand it also if you see any conflict of interest. Something to do with family or something else that is considered a conflict of interest in any way if you will work towards recognizing that and been recusing yourself from those types of decisions. If you could just briefly speak to those Mr. Meno?

JOSEPH R. MENO, JR., NOMINEE: Si Yu'os Ma'åse Senadora, hunggan, hu gos komprende i che'cho' ni' para ta na'hålom gi este kapasidåt, no? Ya hunggan hu gos komprende Senadora, ya hu prometi komo un manå'i yu' nu este na chånsa para bai hålom gi este kapasidåt, bai hu prometi hu, na bai hu dalalaki i pumalu na board members ya bai hu facho'chu'i. Bula na cho'cho' para ta cho'gue, no? Espesiåtmente para i Guam Museum. Ya hunggan hu komprende, ilek-mu na komo guaha disinteresao, as of right now, nothing impedes me to be involved with this Board. I understand the involvement with a lot of time and work that will be put into this Board. Given a chance by this legislature, I will commit myself to this to this Board.

Ilek-hu gi tinituhon, magof i korason-hu annai ma apunta yu', sa' para Guahu impottånte este na kausa, This is very important to me. I hold this close to my heart the preservation of our culture and our language. Guaha un taotao, there is someone that's very close to me, our newly elected Mayor of Inarajan, and there's a saying that he said to us is that he wants to "give back to his community." That really stuck with me.

Para Guahu lokkue', i malago'-hu, para bai hu nå'i tåtte para i kumunidåt, espesiåtmente I tano'-hu. Para i kottura, para i lengguåhi. Para i pumalu siha gi este I manggaige gi board, manggehilo' i faninadahen kosas Guåhan, pues tåya' mås malago'-hu ki bai hu facho'chu'i este na kapasidåt.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse' for those reassurances and from everything that I've read in every encounter that we've had, that I've seen when you commit yourself to something, you carry it out to the fullest of your ability. People mentioned that over and over, that will be a great asset with all of your characteristics. The

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commitment as well will be a great asset to the Kosas Board. You do have my support. This is

why even though our session ends tomorrow, and we vote on the 17th, we are going to do our best

to get this Committee Report in so that we can hopefully confirm you on the 17th and you can

shore up in the new year with this new commitment for the people of Guam. So with that, and

those reassurances and testimony that will be attached to the Committee Report so that all Senators

can read through it in and everybody in the general public can read through it and see those same

assurances and support.

We've completed the discussions from the Committee and the panel. This concludes the

confirmation hearing from Mr. Joseph R. Meno, Jr., to serve as a Member (Public) to the Kosas

Board of Advisors, Guam Museum. The Committee will continue to receive written testimonies

for the next few days. Please address your written testimony to the Committee on Heritage and
