

Subject: Personal Testimony – Nominee for the University of Guam Board of Regents

I am incredibly humbled and honored to sit before you today as a nominee for the University of Guam Board of Regents. Let me first begin by telling you a little about myself. I am the daughter of Kenny San Nicolas Leon Guerrero originally of Inarajan and Connie Jo Brennan Shinohara and Gil A. Shinohara of Barrigada Heights. I have blessed to be supported throughout my life by an incredibly large family, 34 to be exact - made up of 1 mom, 2 dads, 6 brothers, 2 sisters and 22 nieces and nephews – which are 22 reasons why I have a vested interest in sustaining and growing our local university.

I returned to Guam after I completed my undergraduate degree in 2002. If you recall, this just months before the Island was hit by Super Typhoon Pongsona. My mother at the time, was the Director of the Guam Recovery Office and was responsible for overseeing several FEMA funded projects. She helped direct the recovery efforts immediately following the storm which included establishing and managing the Island's 3 Disaster Recovery Centers. These centers housed multiple local and federal agencies who offered individual assistance to our island residents who were left devastated by Pongsona. I learned how our island recovers, picks up the pieces and what our government can do to support those efforts. More importantly I learned about the resilience of our people and how hard times really do bring out their true generosity. This was probably the first time I realized my passion for helping people.

In the years following, I began my career with the Government of Guam working multiple facets of our local emergency response system. Within 8 years, I worked on multiple federally declared disasters including Super Typhoon Pongsona, Typhoon Chata'an, Typhoon Paka and Tropical Storm Tingting. I was responsible for over \$92 million in public assistance projects for our island which included projects for Guam Waterworks Authority, Guam Public Schools System, Office of the Governor and the rebuilding of Government House.

In the transition of administrations my run with the Government of Guam came to an end and in 2011, after a short-lived retirement from government service, a job opportunity brought me to the Bank of Guam's 10^{th} floor. I remember interviewing with then President and CEO, Lou Leon Guerrero and having to admit that one - I was not a Bank of Guam customer and two - I knew nothing about banking. Her response was equal parts reassuring and inspiring - she told me, Lesley - I'm a nurse and if I can do it, so can you.

She was right. Today, I currently serve as the Vice President, Customer Experience Director for Bank of Guam where I have worked for the past 7.5 years. I oversee a dedicated team of 31 who make magic for our customers every day. Since joining the Bank Family in 2011, I think I have made a positive impact on both the people and business sides of the house – implementing the type of change that isn't just good for business but that's also good for our community.

One of the first tasks given to me was to outsource our phone calls. Efforts were already underway to outsource this service to a third-party partner. After researching the options and learning about the bank's operations, I decided to instead build our own contact center— this required upgrading our existing technology, introducing new systems of automation and up training the staff to prepare them for their new roles. Admittedly, this was not the cheapest or easiest choice. But today, I'll tell you it was the best choice. We now have the capability to track call types, monitor calls for quality and view our customer interactions no matter what branch or department they visit and in 2018 alone had customer service scores that surpassed industry averages by 11%.

Throughout the years I've been allowed the flexibility to be creative and run with my ideas with the goal of improving the service we offer our customers. In the past few years, I launched two strategic customer experiences initiatives – the first, the Familia Ambassador Program, our take on the concept of a universal associate - a move many within the industry have taken to elevate their customer experiences. The second was the establishment of the Customer Engagement Group, a program built on a renewed commitment to community and an opportunity to truly celebrate our customers.

In preparation for this role as Regent, I've read through the University's charter document, annual report but found particular interest in the Good to Great Implementation Plan. The road to Great envisioned under the leadership of Dr. Underwood who called for end of complacency – he said "Some believe that a few million dollars more in appropriations will solve most of our difficulties, and that we can continue to do what we have always done. This is simply not the case. If we avoid making decisions based on our institutional priorities, we will quickly become irrelevant. We must plan for our future."

Good to Great is that plan. A plan capable of yielding even greater opportunities for our students and for our island. Within G2G, Student Experience is highlighted as a key issue. After reading this section, I realized how I could add value as Regent. For the past seven years, I've devoted much of my banking career to understanding our customers. I studied industry trends, key performance indicators, customer satisfaction drivers across all various service industries. I believe my experience and understanding of how every aspect of an organization contributes to every customer's experience will bring a different perspective to this board.

Delivering great student experiences will require engagement at all levels, the journey our students live through from application to graduation is filled with highs and lows – our job should be to focus equally on both ends of the spectrum as our greatest failures often are the starting points for our biggest success. Together, I believe we can enhance the Triton experience, making it effortless, memorable and inspiring.

In January of 2014, I became a Triton and joined Cohort 11 better known as Co-HEART with 14 other strangers and embarked on what was one of the craziest, most rewarding times of our lives.

The real value in the program is in the people, the ones you experience it with and the professors and business partners that share their knowledge, experience and perspectives with you along the way. This is something that you don't get from an online program and I'm actually not sure something you get outside of UOG. This is part that makes us relevant. But these experiences must exist in every class, cohort and within each one of our schools.

I believe in change, the kind of change that is good for our people and their futures and I believe UOG is an integral part of driving that kind of change. To enlighten, to discover, to serve – this is the core of the University's mission and I'm committed to upholding that.

Thank you for this opportunity to give back to an organization that empowers and uplifts our people. I look forward to working with you to ensure the university receives the support it needs to continue its quest to be great. It is my hope that this testimony helped to illustrate my dedication, my drive to work hard and not settle for what's easy, my ability to seek out alternative solutions and the ability to balance traditional views with new purpose. Thank you for your time today, for the good work you do for all of us and for your partnership in ensuring the University's vision for the future becomes a reality for our island.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION


The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 2:04PM

Senator Amanda L Shelton: Dr. Enriquez we can start with you.

Senator Amanda L Shelton: Si Yu'os Ma'ase Dr. Enriquez, Mr. Kilayko

Mike Kilayko: "Good afternoon Ms. Secretary, I'm a small business owner and I am here to testify in support of the nomination of Lesley Leon Guerrero for regent at the University of Guam. I have Ms Leon Guerrero in a professional capacity for almost three years. We collaborate on an almost month to month basis for lighting projects from my company, QMS lighting and the Bank of Guam. You may be familiar with the Bank of Guam headquarters down the street being illuminated nightly specific colors to bring awareness to social programs. I want to point out this unique and unprecedented project was championed and largely executed by Ms. Leon Guerrero. Through the



involved in and she executed at the bank in her role as Vice President of Customer Experience at the Bank of Guam. We have worked on numerous events that are island wide like the IFIT run and the block party which benefit numerous non-profit organizations on island like Guam cancer care the American Cancer society. She fills a gap we desperately need, she looks at things from a perspective that unfortunately being an old man that I am, I don't look at anymore. And she'll be bringing to the board of regents that perspective. I look very forward to working with her, I have delayed appointments to my committees until she's on board, I have all kinds of things for her to do. So please consider her and thank you."

Senator Amanda L Shelton: Thank you very much Mr. Felix. Is there anyone else who wants to testify?

Maria Leon Guerrero: "Madam Senator thank you very much to allow me to testify on behalf of Lesley Leon Guerrero for the University of Guam Board of Regents. Occasionally in life, you run across a person who truly inspires you. Lesley Leon Guerrero is one of those people in my life. I first got to know Lesley when she joined the Bank of Guam in 2010 as our director of Customer Service. We teamed up to rebuild the Bank of Guam customer service center from the ground up. Including reimagining the people the process and the technology in order to accomplish strategic goals. For six month we were joined at the hip and I felt like Lesley and I were speaking the same language. She is a woman with a razor sharp intellect, passion for excellence and a vision for the future. We completed our project successfully and under Lesley's leadership, both the contact center and the banks over all customer service was dramatically improved. Lesley continues to play a key role in strategic initiatives. Quite frankly she is the employee every employer dreams of having. I thought I knew everything there was about Lesley until we attended the Dandor Leadershop Seminar along with 20 other individuals. This seminar tested our hearts and our minds and I discovered a side of Lesley I did not previously shown me, a side that was struggling with a debilitating physical condition that often shut her down robbing her of natural energy and zest for life. Senator Amanda L Shelton: Thank you very much, is there anyone else who wishes to testify? If not thank you to the panel and I'd now like to call up Lesley.

Lesley-Anne Leon Guerrero: [See written testimony]

Senator Amanda L Shelton: Thank you very much Lesley, I think from all the testimony I heard here today and knowing you personally of course, I have all the confidence that you will serve Guam well on the board so thank you very much for accepting the appointment and congratulations to you. I am very thankful to the governor for appointing you to the position. I'd like to thank all your family and supporters here in support of your nomination, I think it's also a testament that these people who are different parts of the community that support you. I just want to ask as a general question to board nominees, as an employee of the Bank of Guam, in your personal business or family, is there any conflict of interest that you forsee?

Lesley-Anne Leon Guerrero: No I don't see any conflict

Senator Amanda L Shelton: Recently UOG has faced issues with sexual harassment and changing it's policy, and the whole me too movement we're experiencing throughout the country, as you know sexual assault is not something that's foreign to us, UOG adopted a new sexual harassment policy in 2016 and I just want to reiterate to you the University needs to do more for victims of sexual assault, that our University has a moral obligation to ensure that all of the students there are protected and educated and go somewhere where they feel safe to fulfill their dreams of being educated and starting a career, that the University is a launching pad. What do you think can be done to prevent sexual assault on campus and within the University of Guam community so that we provide the students what necessary to thrive.

Lesley-Anne Leon Guerrero: "I think you mentioned partly what my answer will be and that's really awareness, the more aware that our students are and our faculty members are the more educated we are the more alert we are. One of the things we struggle with in the bank of Guam is the parking lot and we implement the buddy system. I remember when I was pursing my masters degree at UOG we would study rather late and we would park closer, we walked together and we used the buddy system. But aside form that and aside from using our own accountability for our own safety, I think just as many other programs can flourish through public-private sector partnerships I think there's a lot of non-profit organizations that offering awareness type programs that we can partner with for awareness at the University. I think it's talking about it and making sure everyone is aware about it at the university and then working together to fight it at the university and say no violence and sexual assault."

Senator Amanda L Shelton: "Thank you very much Lesley I look forward to moving your nomination on the floor."
