### First COVID reinfection documented in Hong Kong, researchers say

(The Washington Post) - A Hong Kong man who was initially infected with COVID-19 in April and made a full recovery was reinfected more than four months later after a trip abroad, researchers reported Monday.

The pre-print study, by a team at the University of Hong Kong and accepted for publication by the international medical journal Clinical Infectious Diseases, purports to be "the world's first documentation" of a patient who recovered from COVID-19 becoming reinfected. Researchers sequenced the genome of his first and second infections to show the virus strains were different, suggesting he had been reinfected.

The findings, which have not been peer-reviewed, have potential implications for vaccine use, as well as policies based around the concept of herd immunity that presume those who recover from the virus are unlikely to be reinfected. While there have been many anecdotal reports of reinfection, until now, they have not been confirmed and it remains unknown how often they might occur.

The fact that the man had no symptoms the second time suggests his immune system protected him from disease, although it did not stop the reinfection.

## Merkel: Russia must investigate suspected poisoning of Navalny

BERLIN (Reuters) - German Chancellor Angela Merkel on Monday called on Russia to investigate the suspected poisoning of Russian opposition figure Alexei Navalny and hold the perpetrators accountable after doctors found indications of a toxic substance in his body.

A critic of Russian President Vladimir Putin, Navalny last week collapsed on a plane after drinking tea while on his way to campaign in Siberia. He was flown to Germany for treatment on Saturday.

The Kremlin has said it was unclear what caused Navalny to fall ill and that initial tests did not show he was poisoned, as his aides charged.

But German doctors treating Navalny at a Berlin hospital said on Monday that medical examinations indicated poisoning with some kind of cholinesterase inhibitor, although the specific substance is not yet known.

"In light of the prominent role played by Mr. Navalny in the political opposition in Russia, the authorities there are now urgently called upon to investigate this crime to the last detail - and do so in full transparency," Merkel said in a joint statement with Foreign Minister Heiko Maas.

"Those responsible must be identified and held accountable," Merkel

#### 'Clinical findings indicate poisoning'

Berlin's Charite hospital said a team of doctors there had examined him in detail after his arrival. "Clinical findings indicate poisoning with a substance from the group of cholinesterase inhibitors," the hospital said in a statement.

"The specific substance involved remains unknown, and a further series of comprehensive testing has been initiated."

Russian health officials contradicted the German diagnosis, saying Navalny had tested negative for cholinesterase inhibitors when he was hospitalized in Omsk last week.

Navalny showed no signs of having been poisoned when he was admitted to the clinic and tests were carried out on him to check for a wide range of substances, including inhibitors, the health ministry in Omsk said in a statement.

### **Canadian Conservatives** choose O'Toole to lead fight against Trudeau

TORONTO - With the possibility of a federal election looming, Canada's Conservatives have chosen a lawyer and military veteran who promised to repeal the carbon tax and "stand up to cancel culture" to lead them against the Liberal government of Prime Minister Justin Trudeau.

Erin O'Toole, 46, won the Conservative Party leadership election with 57% of the vote in the third round early Monday. It was an upset over Peter MacKay, a 54-year-old lawyer who spent nearly a decade in Prime Minister Stephen Harper's cabinet and entered the race as the front-runner.

O'Toole takes over the party at a critical time in Canada, with more than 9,000 people dead from

the novel coronavirus, the country attempting to reverse a steep economic downturn and Trudeau's government reeling from an ethics controversy.

"Erin O'Toole is probably the most serious political challenge that Trudeau has faced since he took over the prime ministership," said Andrew McDougall, a political scientist at the University of Toronto. "He's got a lot on his plate, and O'Toole has an opportunity here, I think, to do some real damage to the Liberal brand."

## Vigilance group urges Legislature to act on lack of transparency

The Vigilance Committee is calling out Gov. Lou Leon Guerrero and Lt. Gov. Joshua Tenorio's administration for failing to document meetings of the Physicians Advisory Group.

The advisory group, as a body, and certain of its members, have helped shape the administration's decisions on COVID-19 restrictions.

The committee had sought records of the advisory group's meetings under the Freedom of Information Act and Guam's Sunshine Act. On Aug. 28, the governor's office stated no documents are available for release in connection with the request for

Members of the advisory group stated previously a decision was made early not to take minutes of meetings because the advisory group members are volunteers and are donating their time to the advisory group while spending time away from their practices as physicians.

Lee P. Webber president of the Vigilance Committee, stated, in part: "The governor's attack on transparency must be aborted now. We are calling on you, the senators of the 35th Liheslaturan Guåhan, to act with deliberate speed and bring transparency to our government."

The committee called on Guam senators to take action.

"The stated purpose of the Vigilance Committee is to seek compliance with the Open Government Law and the Sunshine Reform Act by public officials and government representatives; and to promote

ways to improve the dissemination and disclosure of information to the general public, including, but not limited to, the following: detecting violations; causing the enforcement thereof; and working on strengthening the laws of disclosure on all fronts." Webber stated.

The Vigilance Committee also pointed out that early in the pandemic, one of the first actions taken by the administration was "to gut the Open Government Law denying the right of the people and their ability to hold their government accountable."

The administration has stated only the required publication of meeting announcements was suspended because of social distancing requirements during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Now the governor has told us that the Physicians Advisory Council which exists to advise the governor on matters related to the spread of COVID-19 through coordination and expert advice is neither complying with the Open Government Law nor has it observed the rudimentary principles and requirements of every deliberative body," the committee stated.

The Vigilance Committee is a nonprofit organization dedicated to requiring compliance with the Open Government Law and the Sunshine Reform Act, according to Webber.

The administration was working on a response to the Vigilance Committee's press release but none was available as of press time.



## CHAPTER 80 GUAM ANCESTRAL LANDS COMMISSION

§ 80101.	Definitions.

### § 80101. Definitions.

Whenever used in this Chapter:

- (a) Ancestral Lands shall mean those lands owned privately by residents of Guam on or after January 1, 1930.
- (b) Ancestral Lands Title shall mean that right and interest entitling an owner or owner's descendants or heirs to the repossession of property taken by the United States of America or the government of Guam on or after January 1, 1930, having thereafter been declared excess or, where not declared excess, in exchange therefor.
- (c) Ancestral Property Right shall mean the right and interest that a private property owner has in relation to inherited land or lands possessed by private property owner's ancestor.
- (d) Ancestral Title Registry shall mean the registry into which is entered all information pertaining to ancestral land claimants who are granted land title, either by land exchange or land recovery, in exchange for the permanent extinguishment of all claims thereto.
- (e) Applicant shall mean any person or persons, legal entity or government, who files a claim in accordance with Chapter 80 of Title 21 of the Guam Code Annotated, and Articles 9 and 9A of Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated.

- (f) Claims Registry shall mean the registry into which is entered information based on a determination by the Commission that a valid basis exists for an ancestral title claim by an applicant.
- (g) Commission shall mean the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.
- (h) Conditional Awards Registry shall mean the registry into which is recorded information in relation to each determination made by the Commission with respect to an ancestral title and compensation application made by a claimant
- (i) Determination shall mean an administrative ruling by the Commission with respect to an applicant's request for an extinguishment of an ancestral claim.
- (j) Excess Lands Registry shall be a listing of all lands declared excess by the Federal government and acquired by the government of Guam on or after the effective date of this Act.
- (k) Just compensation for the purposes of Chapter 80 of Title 21 of the Guam Code Annotated, and Articles 9 and 9A of Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated, as amended, shall mean only land recovery or land exchange, and shall also mean any other form of compensation other than a specifically described available land.
- (l) Original land shall mean the actual specifically described land, in whole or in part, which was confiscated or condemned by the United States of America or the government of Guam on or after January 1, 1930, and have been thereafter declared excess to which a prior private ownership interest held by a resident of Guam on January 1, 1930 was previously attached.
- (m) Original landowners registry shall mean the registry into which information pertaining to all lands taken and the names of owners whose properties were confiscated or condemned on or after January 1, 1930.

(n) Replacement land shall mean land surplus to the Federal government or the government of Guam, and not in public benefit use, or needed for public benefit use, to which no private ownership interest was attached on January 1, 1930, and which may be used as a replacement for original lands confiscated or condemned by the United States government or the government of Guam.

## § 80102. Affirmation of and Authorization to Exercise a Fundamental Civil Right in Ancestral Real Property Also Known as Lands.

- (a) The responsibility of the government of Guam to enforce rights in private property, as a civil right, pursuant to the laws of the United States of America applicable to Guam and the Laws of Guam is hereby acknowledged and reaffirmed. The responsibility of the government of Guam to also enforce the entire community's rights in public property, as common property, is also hereby acknowledged and reaffirmed.
- (b) The government of Guam expects to eventually accept transfer of the ownership of lands to be disposed under 'The Guam Excess Lands Act' through the U. S. General Services Agency and as a result of decisions in 1993 and 1995 issued by the U.S. Base Realignment and Closure Commission, subject to certain specified encumbrances, including un-relinquished property rights retained either by the United States of America or other prior owners, with applicable judicial procedures available should disputes arise. However, it is recognized that a process does not now exist to recognize the ancestral land rights of landowners whose properties have not been declared surplus and may not ever be declared surplus by the military in the future. Likewise, the process established by Guam Public Law Number 22-145 for disposal of three thousand two hundred (3,200) acres of Guam excess lands does not apply to claimants whose claims are attached to excess land elsewhere.
- (c) *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* recognizes that the rights of landowners to full use and enjoyment of their private property was long deprived because of unsettled issues described in the foregoing § 80103 of this Chapter. Therefore, to restore the rights of

landowners to the use of their ancestral lands, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* through this Chapter hereby affirms and formally recognizes the 'Ancestral Property Right'; establishes an administrative process for the exercise of that right; and creates the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission and authorizes the Commission to administer the provisions of this Chapter in order that original landowners, their heirs and their descendants may expeditiously exercise all their fundamental civil rights in the property they own. The exercise of 'ancestral property right' claims shall be applicable to lands already declared excess by the Federal government and shall also be applicable to all future declaration of excess lands either by the United States Government or by the government of Guam.

#### § 80103. Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

- (a) There is within the government of Guam the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission to carry out the purposes of this Chapter.
  - (1) The Commission *shall* be composed of seven (7) members appointed by I Maga'låhen Guåhan, with the advice and consent of I Liheslatura (the Legislature).
    - (A) Commissioners *shall* be residents of Guam and descendants or heirs of ancestral land owners.
    - (B) Members *shall* serve terms of four (4) years; provided, however, that of the members first appointed under this statute, two (2) shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year, two (2) shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years, and three (3) shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years.
  - (2) The current appointed members of the GALC *shall* continue to serve until the end of their current appointed terms.
- (b) Vacancies. Vacancies in the membership of the Commission *shall* be filled by appointment by I Maga'låhen Guåhan in the same manner as initial appointments, as provided in Subsection (a) of this Section. Persons filling a vacancy must

undergo the Legislative confirmation process, and *shall* serve for the unexpired portion of the term.

- (c) Quorum. Four (4) Commissioners present *shall* constitute a quorum of the Commission for the conduct of administrative business. Five (5) Commissioners present *shall* constitute a quorum of the Commission to determine a land claim. A vote of a majority of the Commission members present *shall* be required for any action of the Commission.
- (d) Administration. The Commission *shall* adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct of its affairs. It *shall* elect a chairperson and vice chairperson from among the Commissioners, and may employ an executive director and such staff as is necessary to carry out the duties set forth in this Chapter.
- (e) Stipend. Each Commissioner *shall* receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for attendance of each meeting of the Commission; provided, that such compensation *shall* not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month.

#### § 80104. Powers and Duties of the Commission.

- (a) Commission to Establish Ancestral Lands Registries. The Commission is directed to establish and maintain five (5) separate registries for the purposes of recording accurate information in the settlement of ancestral claims, as set out in the Subsections below.
  - (1) Original Landowners Registry. The Original Landowners Registry is a listing of all lands taken under the names of owners of record at the time of taking whose properties were confiscated or condemned by the United States of America, or by the government of Guam on or after January 1, 1930, as well as other pertinent location and ownership information in relation to the property. The Original Landowners Registry shall be used for the purpose of confirming an applicant's property claim, for future

extinguishment upon receipt of just compensation, as defined by this Chapter.

- (2) Excess Lands Registry. The Excess Lands Registry is a listing of all lands that have been declared excess by the Federal government or the government of Guam, including all lands that may be declared excess in the future by the government of Guam. The Excess Lands Registry shall be used for the purpose of identifying a specified lot or lots of land with which the Commission may use as just compensation in extinguishing ancestral claims.
- (3) Claims Registry. The Claims Registry is a listing of all claims to ancestral title filed by applicants.
- (4) Conditional Awards Registry. The Conditional Awards Registry is a listing of conditional awards of just compensation.
- (5) Ancestral Title Registry. The Ancestral Title Registry is a listing of applicants granted land title in return for the surrender of all their ancestral property claims.
- (b) Duties of Commission. In establishing all five (5) registries established in this Section,
  - (1) the Commission or designated staff shall investigate, record, file, report and respond to requests by ancestral land claimants for remedy, including government of Guam, whose land was taken by the United States or by the government of Guam on or after January 1, 1930. Remedy includes just compensation, as defined in § 80101 of this Act, which for purposes of this Chapter is defined as limited to the return of land or access to landlocked lots across public lands, if public lands block access to private property.
  - (2) The Commission shall establish, in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law, written procedures for extinguishment of Claims, award of just compensation and recordation of Ancestral Land Title, as well as other rules and regulations required to administer this Chapter.

- (3) The Commission shall promulgate rules and regulations to administer the Commission's functions in a fair, just, economical and expedient way, and shall establish fees and specify materials reasonably required to accompany applications in order to extinguish a claim in favor of a just compensation award.
- (c) Four (4) Step Process for Extinguishment of Claims, Award of Just Compensation, and Recordation of Ancestral Land Title. The following four (4) step process shall be detailed within appropriate written procedures and rules and regulations to be prescribed by the Commission.
  - Step 1: Filing of Ancestral Claim Applicant in this first step submits an application to the Commission containing applicant's assertion that applicant and others, if any, hold ancestral title in relation to a specified lot of land by virtue of inheritance. Based upon the information provided, the Commission shall make a determination if in fact a valid basis for an ancestral title claim exists. The ancestral title claim shall then be entered in the Claims Registry. The Claims Registry shall contain the information required to be entered, as established by the Commission by rules and regulations. The Commission must accept an application for determination of claim, provided the following minimum information is given:
    - (1) date on which application was submitted to the Commission;
    - (2) whether the application was submitted to the Commission, or Commission's designee, and the name of the Commission or designee:
    - (3) name and address for service of notification to the person(s) who is the claimant (This is the person who shall be the registered ancestral title claimant.);
    - (4) the area of land covered by the claim, including property descriptions and maps;
    - (5) description of the persons who it is claimed hold the ancestral title; and

(6) other details about the claim as the Commission may deem appropriate.

The Claims Registry may be inspected by any member of the public during normal business hours. No part of the Claims Registry are to be kept confidential from the public.

The Commission must ensure that the Claims Registry is kept updated with details of any claims contained in applications given to the Commission, or of any application for amendments to a claim after a determination.

Step 2: Ancestral Title and Compensation Application. An applicant may exercise applicant's right to extinguish an ancestral claim by submitting an application to the Commission for a determination of a conditional title and compensation award. An applicant may submit an application in prescribed form for any of the following three (3) categories defined:

Category 1: Ancestral Title Determination – for a determination of ancestral title in relation to an area for which there is no approved determination of ancestral title:

Category 2: Compensation Application. This Chapter sets forth two (2) forms of compensation for future title claims which shall be either the return of original ancestral land, or just compensation, as defined in § 80101 of this Act, based upon mutually satisfactory negotiations between the government and the applicant. Before relinquishment of exchange land the Commission shall certify that the exchange lands show no history of ancestral ownership or ancestral ownership claim on or after January 1, 1930.

The Commission must accept an ancestral title and compensation application provided the following requirements are met by the claimants:

(1) that the kind of application falls within the three (3) categories defined above;

- (2) is in the prescribed form, as established by the Commission;
- (3) contains the information required and as prescribed in relation to the matters sought to be determined:
- (4) provide accompanying documents at the very minimum of which include:
  - (A) a sworn affidavit that the applicant:
  - (i) believes that ancestral title has not been extinguished in relation to any part of the land claimed; and
  - (ii) believes that all of the statements made in the application are true;
  - (B) a statement containing all information known to the applicant about interests in relation to any of the land or waters concerned that are held by persons other than as ancestral title holders;
  - (C) a description and map of the area over which the ancestral title is claimed;
    - (D) evidence of heirship;
  - (E) name and address of the person who is to be considered the claimant (The name of the person given under this item will become the registered ancestral title claimant.); and
- (5) all accompanying fees as prescribed by the Commission.
- Step 3: Conditional Award of Just Compensation. In awarding ancestral title and just compensation, the Commission shall issue a Certification of Award of Just Compensation on Condition of Extinguishment of Ancestral Title Claim. The Certification of Award of Just Compensation shall be entered into the Conditional Awards Registry. The Conditional Awards Registry shall contain as much of the information in relation to each determination as must be

entered into the Register, at a minimum of which shall consist of:

- (1) name of the Commission or designee that made the determination;
  - (2) date on which the determination was made;
- (3) area, location, and description of specific land covered by the determination;
  - (4) the matters determined; and
- (5) other details about the determination or decision as the Commission deems appropriate.

The Conditional Awards Registry shall be made available for the public's inspection during normal business hours.

- Step 4: Extinguishment of Ancestral Land Claim An ancestral land claimant is granted claimant's land title either by land exchange or land recovery on the condition that the ancestral title holder surrenders all rights and interests in relation to ancestral land claims thereby permanently extinguishing all rights, interests and claims to the claims. Upon the Commission's issuance of title by an award of just compensation and extinguishment of claims, the ancestral title holder's name is removed from the Conditional Awards Registry, and is entered into the Ancestral Lands Title Register by the Commission. The Commission shall prescribe the appropriate form to effectuate issuance of compensation and extinguishment of ancestral claim. The Commission shall ensure that the ancestral title holder is issued a suitable property conveyance deed in full satisfaction of ancestral title holder's ancestral title award. Once listed as ancestral title holder after acceptance of specifically described land, the holder and all of holder's heirs, successors and assigns, and those who may assert subsequent claims derived from the holder, are forever barred from reentry into the Claims Registry.
- (d) Director of Land Management to Reserve All Future Lands Received by Government of Guam Declared Excess for Entry into

Excess Lands Registry. For the purposes of administering this Section, the Director of Land Management is authorized and required to reserve all future lands received by the government of Guam declared excess, and ensure that all information pertaining to excess lands, both current and future, are sent to the Commission for entry into the Excess Lands Registry. The Commission shall maintain and give the public the right to review the Excess Lands Registry.

(e) Land Bank. The Commission shall take title, as Trustees, of former Spanish Crown Lands and other non-ancestral lands that are conveyed by the Federal government to the government of Guam after the effective date of this Act, on behalf of ancestral landowners who, by virtue of continued government or public benefit use cannot regain possession or title to their ancestral lands.

The Commission shall establish a Guam-based trust to administer all assets and revenues of the land bank of the aforementioned lands and manage the lands, and act as the developer of the lands, if necessary, to the highest and best use. The Commission shall establish rules and regulations pursuant to the Administration Adjudication Law for the Guam-based trust. The resulting income shall be used to provide just compensation for those dispossessed ancestral landowners.

- (f) Notification of Extinguishment of Ancestral Claims. The Commission shall ensure that all parties whose interests may be affected in the extinguishment of an ancestral claim are notified in writing, if at all possible, and through public notice in a Guam newspaper of general circulation.
- (g) Appeal Through Judicial Process. If disputes arise from an application which cannot be resolved by the Commission, then any of the opposing parties may invoke the judicial process at the party's expense.
- (h) Guam Ancestral Lands Commission Survey, Infrastructure, and Development Fund.
  - (1) The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission *shall* create a special fund called the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission Survey, Infrastructure, and Development Fund (Fund), which

shall be maintained separate and apart from any other funds, and shall not be subject to the transfer authority of I Maga'låhen Guåhan.

- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law requiring the deposit of proceeds to other funds, the Fund shall receive the net proceeds of all leases of Apra Harbor Reservation F-12 and Parcel N14-1 (the Polaris Point parcels) under the jurisdiction of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.
- (3) The Fund *shall* be used for the surveying and mapping, purchase and installation of infrastructure, including paved access roads and commercial development, of Guam Ancestral Lands Commission properties, and for the administrative, operational, and financial support of these efforts.
- (4) The Commission *shall* submit a report on a semiannual basis to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* of the revenues collected and expended from the Fund, and post the same on the website of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission. The Fund *shall* be subject to audit by the Guam Public Auditor.

# § 80105. Transfer of Property to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

(a) Except in such circumstances where existing roads or easements may have been transferred to the Department of Public Works, any properties conveyed to the jurisdiction of the Department of Public Works in the area of Tiyan, formerly known as Naval Air Station, Agana (Brewer Field), are transferred to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission and shall be deeded to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission upon the effective date of this Act. The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall dispose of properties transferred pursuant to this Act in a manner consistent

with and pursuant to the enabling legislation of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

- (b) Portions of Parcel 1 South of Route 18 and contiguous to the North of Apra Harbor Parcel 6, also abutting Marine Corps Drive on the east, specifically original Lots 159 and 159-1, all in the municipality of Piti. The property shall be transferred and shall be deeded to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Act. The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall within one hundred eighty (180) days dispose of the land parcels and lots transferred by this Act in a manner consistent with and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates. All pre-condemnation roads, easements and bull cart trails shall remain as easements for public access and utilities. The transferred property shall be zoned "A" Agricultural zone.
- (c) Portions of Parcel 1 South of Route 18 and contiguous to the North of Apra Harbor Parcel 6, also abutting Marine Corps Drive on the east, specifically original lot: No. 166, originally owned by the Estates of Jose C. Leon Guerrero; Joaquin C. Leon Guerrero; Gil C. Leon Guerrero; Antonio C. Leon Guerrero; Filomena C. Leon Guerrero; Wenceslao C. Leon Guerrero and William C. Leon Guerrero. The property shall be transferred and shall be deeded to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Act. The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall within one hundred eighty (180) days dispose of the land parcel and lot transferred by this Act in a manner consistent with and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates. All pre-condemnation roads, easements and bull cart trails shall remain as easements for public access and utilities. The transferred property shall be zoned "A" Agricultural zone.
- (d) Portions of Parcel 1 South of Route 18 and contiguous to the North of Apra Harbor Parcel 6, also abutting Marine Corps Drive on the east, specifically original lot: No. 135-1, originally owned by the Estate of Caridad Quitugua Hart, in the municipality of Piti. The property shall be transferred and shall be deeded to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Act. The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall within one hundred eighty (180) days dispose of the land parcel and lot transferred by this Act in a manner consistent with

and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates. All precondemnation roads, easements and bull cart trails shall remain as easements for public access and utilities. The transferred property shall be zoned "A" – Agricultural zone.

- (e) Portions of Parcel 1 South of Route 18 and contiguous to the North of Apra Harbor Parcel 6, also abutting Marine Corps Drive on the east, specifically original lot: No. 136-A PI, originally owned by the Estate of Juan San Nicolas Manibusan, in the municipality of Piti. The property shall be transferred and shall be deeded to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Act. The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall within one hundred eighty (180) days dispose of the land parcel and lot transferred by this Act in a manner consistent with and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates. All pre-condemnation roads, easements and bull cart trails shall remain as easements for public access and utilities. The transferred property shall be zoned "A" Agricultural zone.
- (f) Portions of Parcel 1 South of Route 18 and contiguous to the North of Apra Harbor Parcel 6, also abutting Marine Corps Drive on the east, specifically original lot: No. 136-A 2 PI, originally owned by the Estate of Caridad Quitugua Hart, in the municipality of Piti. The property shall be transferred and shall be deeded to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Act. The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall within one hundred eighty (180) days dispose of the land parcel and lot transferred by this Act in a manner consistent with and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates. All pre-condemnation roads, easements and bull cart trails shall remain as easements for public access and utilities. The transferred property shall be zoned "A" Agricultural zone.
- (g) Portions of Parcel 1 South of Route 18 and contiguous to the North of Apra Harbor Parcel 6, also abutting Marine Corps Drive on the east, specifically original lot: No. 128 PI, originally owned by the Estate of Tiburcio Ada Santos, in the municipality of Piti. The property shall be transferred and shall be deeded to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Act. The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall within one hundred eighty (180) days dispose of the land

parcel and lot transferred by this Act in a manner consistent with and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates. All precondemnation roads, easements and bull cart trails shall remain as easements for public access and utilities. The transferred property shall be zoned "A" – Agricultural zone.

- (h) GLUP Parcel 1AF, a portion of Andersen Air Force Base Communications Annex No. 2-AJKE, consisting of approximately 252.83 acres, and certain Federal surplus real property located in Barrigada, known as the NAVCAMS WESTPAC Parcel IN, consisting of approximately 61.45 acres shall be transferred and deeded to the Guam Ancestral Land Commission (GALC) within thirty (30) days of the enactment of this Act. The GALC shall dispose of the land parcels and lots transferred by this Act in a manner consistent with and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates.
- (i) Portions of Parcel 1 South of Route 18 and contiguous to the North of Apra Harbor Parcel 6, also abutting Marine Corps Drive on the east, specifically original lot: No. 127 PI, originally owned by the Estate of Maria Salas San Nicolas, Antonia Salas San Nicolas, Carlina San Nicolas Rapolla, Joaquin S. San Nicolas, Juan S. San Nicolas, Maria S.-CI# 8383, San Nicolas, Dolores Wusstig San Nicolas, Rosario San Nicolas Iriarte, Consolacion S. San Nicolas, Ignacia San Nicolas Aflleje, Dolores C. San Nicolas, and Ana San Nicolas Sanford, in the municipality of Piti. The property shall be transferred and shall be deeded to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Act. The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall within one hundred eighty (180) days dispose of the land parcel and lot transferred by this Act in a manner consistent with and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates. All pre-condemnation roads, easements and bull cart trails shall remain as easements for public access and utilities. The transferred property shall be zoned "A" – Agricultural zone.

#### § 80106. Comprehensive Zoning Plan.

- (a) A Provisional Commission for the Zoning of Ancestral Lands, hereinafter referred to as the "Provisional Commission", is established to include the Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, the Director of Land Management, the Administrator of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency, the Director of Agriculture and the Director of the Bureau of Statistics & Plans. The Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall serve as chairperson of the Provisional Commission. Members of the Provisional Commission shall assign employees from their respective departments to assist the Commission in its work.
- (b) The Provisional Commission shall complete a comprehensive zoning plan for all properties and parcels under the jurisdiction of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, including parcels that have been previously deeded to ancestral land claimants in accordance with the statutes, rules and regulations governing the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission but have not, as of the effective date of this Act, been zoned or rezoned by any means. If a parcel under the jurisdiction of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, including parcels that have been previously deeded to ancestral land claimants in accordance with the statutes, rules and regulations governing the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, has been previously zoned or rezoned by any means other than that mandated herein, said parcel shall not be rezoned by the comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this Section.
- (c) In formulating the comprehensive zoning plan, the Provisional Commission shall request and consider the opinions of all affected ancestral land claimants. The Provisional Commission shall conduct hearings and present a draft zoning plan to claimants before it adopts the plan.
- (d) The Provisional Commission shall approve the plan by the affirmative vote of at least three (3) of the five (5) members before transmittal to the Ancestral Lands Commission.

- (e) After the Provisional Commission approves the comprehensive zoning plan, it shall transmit the plan to the Ancestral Lands Commission, which shall approve the plan by a resolution signed by a majority of its members. The Ancestral Lands Commission shall attach this resolution to the plan and transmit the same to *I Maga'lahi*.
- (f) *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* shall approve the comprehensive zoning plan by a written memorandum which he shall attach to the plan and the approval resolution of the Ancestral Lands Commission and transmit the same to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.
- (g) The comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this Section shall be subject to the approval of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* in bill form.

Cruz</u> to serve as a <u>Member</u> of the <u>Guam Ancestral Lands Commission</u>, and whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by <u>I Maga' Hågan Guålian</u> on <u>July 20, 2020 to serve Four (4) years; March 27, 2020 to March 26, 2024;</u>
- Appointment packet forwarded to I Lilieslatura on <u>July 23, 2020</u>;
- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on <u>July 24, 2020.</u>

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was called to order at <u>6:15 p.m.</u> Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje presented the agenda items that would be heard during the hearing. The appointment of Maria G. Cruz to serve as a Member of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission was the second item on the agenda. Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje further stated the Guam Legislature's general rules of conduct for virtual hearings prior to proceeding with testimony.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> We'll now move to the next item on our agenda we have two appointments to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, and I'd like to recognize the presence of the Director of the Ancestral Lands Commission, Mr. John Burch. Thank you for being here.

First, we will hear the appointment of Maria G. Cruz, Appointee. She is a reappointment. She has served on this Commission before.

Before I open it up for the panel, I would like to read the Ancestral Lands Commission's mission. It has a huge mission but I'm just going to read excerpts from it to remind everyone of the type of position that we are holding a confirmation hearing for tonight.

The Ancestral Lands Commission is made up of ancestral landowners and they are to establish and maintain five (5) separate registries for the purposes of recording accurate information in the settlement of ancestral claims. One is the Original Landowner's Registry. This is a listing of all lands taken under the names of owners of record at the time of taking, whose properties were confiscated or condemned by the United States of America or by the government of Guam on or after January 1930, as well as other pertinent location and ownership information in relation to the property. The Original Landowners Registry shall be used for the purpose of confirming an applicant's property claim for future extinguishment upon receipt of just compensation as defined by this chapter.

The second registry that they have to compile is the Excess Lands Registry and that is a listing of all lands that have been declared excess by the federal government or the government of Guam; including all lands that may be declared excess in the future. This registry shall be used for the purpose of identifying a specified lot or lots of land with which the Commission may use as just compensation in extinguishing ancestral claims.

The third registry is a Claims Registry and that is a listing of all claims of ancestral title filed by applicants.

The fourth is a Conditional Awards Registry. It's a listing of awards of just compensation and the fifth is the Ancestral Title Registry. This is a listing of applicants granted land title in return for the surrender of all their ancestral property claims.

The Commission shall investigate, record, file, reports and respond to requests by ancestral land claimants for remedy; including the government of Guam whose land was taken by the United States or by the government of Guam on or after January 1930. Remedy includes just compensation which for purposes of this chapter, is defined as limited to the return of land or access to landlocked lots across public lands if the public lands block access to private property and second the Commission shall establish, according to the Administrative Adjudication Law, written procedures for extinguishment of claims, award of just compensation, and recordation of ancestral land title, as well as other rules.

So, the Ancestral Lands Commission again, has a similar purpose to the Chamorro Land Trust in that it too was established by the government of Guam to remedy a past injustice, which was land taking by the United States government or by the government of Guam. It was designed to return these lands to the ancestral landowners. This Commission has a tribunal like role. They have to investigate, research, and make findings as to claims; whose land it was, was land taken and who is entitled to it now, and then they actually will pass the title to those people.

So again, it takes a lot to work on this Commission. It takes a sense of justice. You have to stay focused on what you're there for. This is for ancestral landowners and not for the benefit of anyone else. We have a lot of landowners whose land has not been returned by the federal government.

So, this Commission has also been tasked to try to bring some type of justice to those landowners who have not yet, and it is looking likely may never see their lands returned. The government has tried to bring them justice as well by authorizing this Commission to try to find ways.

One example is the Tiyan landowners whose land was returned by the federal government yet kept by the government of Guam because it sits under the airport runways and the

airport facility. So those are the types of property we're talking about and that I feel are the biggest challenges facing this Commission right now.

I want to acknowledge that these ancestral lands law, of course comes on the back of return of excess lands and the fight for the return of excess lands.

Which again with these battles, we are sitting on the shoulders of people who have fought these battles for us like the late Angel Santos jumping over the fence and all I Nasion CHamoru, and Congressman Robert Underwood who had set up a process within the federal government and passed laws to ensure a process for ancestral land. He got his colleagues in the United States Congress to recognize the injustice and try to remedy that through these laws and through the return of excess land to Guam in an expedited fashion.

Many other of our leaders like Congressman Bordallo who was there when they did return certain pieces of excess land and the Ancestral Lands Commission, prior to today, who have worked diligently over the years and continued to compile lists of land that they believed excess, that should be returned.

When we were having discussions on the military buildup, the Department of Defense had agreed not to take any more land for this buildup, and that their use of the land would have a net neutral effect so they would not expand their footprint or their takings of land on Guam. At that time, they had promised to return excess land and so the Ancestral Lands Commission had made a list of lands that could be returned, and we still continue our efforts to get those lands returned.

Mrs. Cruz, my apologies for that long introduction but sometimes I like to remind new generations in case they're listening about what you've been through to get to this point. I know it's taken a lot of hard work by each of these Ancestral Land Commissioners. Mrs. Cruz we are on your appointment now. I will ask if there's anyone to testify on your behalf.

I'm sorry, I need to check with my staff. Staff if they can read the list of those who've signed up to testify on behalf of Mrs. Cruz or if we should start with Mrs. Cruz. Mr. Burch all right we'll begin with the Director Burch. You may begin.

<u>Acting Director John Burch</u>: Thank you Madam Chair. Madam Chair. I'll speak on behalf of both nominees of the Governor for Ancestral Lands Commission.

### **Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:**

Yes. Let me just say their names then. We are talking about Maria G. Cruz, Appointee and the second nominee, Jeffrey Rios. Okay, thank you Mr. Burch.

Acting Director John Burch: Okay thank you and good evening everyone, Madam Chair Terlaje, Vice Chair Perez, Senator Taitague and any other senators who may be present at this time. My name is John Burch and I am the Acting Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission. Thank you for this opportunity to testify in support of Governor Lou Leon Guerrero's nomination of both Mrs. Maria G Cruz to continue to serve on the Guam Ancestral Commission and to our newcomer, Mr. Jeffrey B. Rios, to serve on the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission. With the consent of the Guam Legislature, their appointments will help us to meet our mission of administering the Guam Ancestral Lands Act in order that ancestral land owners, their heirs, and descendants may expeditiously exercise all the fundamental civil rights in the property they own, to provide just compensation for dispossessed ancestral landowners and when appropriate, assists ancestral landowners in pursuit of just remedies.

I look forward to Mrs. Cruz's reappointment and Mr. Rios's appointment to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission and I thank them for agreeing to join us in this hard but rewarding work. Therefore, I humbly ask and request the legislature to move forward quickly in filling these Commission positions. Thank you.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you very much Director. All right, so we will begin with Mrs. Cruz. Did you want to say a few words?

**Senator Telo T. Taitague**: She's muted.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Can you hear me now?

Senator Telo T. Taitague: Okay, yes.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: I am honored to be asked by the Governor to continue as a member of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission. It's really very rewarding to be a member of this Commission. At every land signing ceremony when folks bring up the past

and what had happened to them, how their land was taken and now here they see it being returned, I find myself crying with them. It's really become emotional because we feel that it's a lot of work for the Commission but it's really rewarding. I've enjoyed my years of working with the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission. There's still much work to be done. Yes.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Well thank you very much for your work Mrs. Cruz. it looks like you've been a member of the Ancestral Lands Commission since 2002. Is that correct?

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: That's correct. I was also a follower of the late Angel Santos and that is why I was approached by the late Ed Benavente, because working for this commission, it's really not about the money. It's the involvement of being a part of the solution to what had happened to our people. So, you know, we've gone unpaid for our service for so many years and that didn't bother us. It was just a rewarding experience to work as a member of the Commission.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you. So, you were on the commission when Ed Benavente was the Director?

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Yes, I was.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> That's great. we miss those guys very much. They had a lot of vision and we're willing to work so very hard to get us to where we are today.

<u>Maria G. Cruz, Appointee</u>: Can I just tell you my story back when I was a land activist? I don't know if you remember *Familian Felisa*? I was part of that organization and that is why my heart in continuing to assist in the return of the land and I'm really dedicated to this Commission.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you and Thank you for your being an activist. I think this Ancestral Lands Commission and the return of excess land is because of activists like you and your families so *Si Yu'os ma'åse'*.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Thank you so much.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje</u>: So, I'm going to ask you a few questions for the record, if that's alright with you. First is, do you have any continuing business or other interests that may be a conflict with you performing your duties as a member of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission?

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: No. I don't. I do not.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> I see you were a former Assistant Administrator for GHURA.

<u>Maria G. Cruz, Appointee:</u> Yes, for Section 8 assistance. I was actually manager and then also doing the acting capacity for the Section 8 programs.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> In your role as a Commissioner in the past, what would you say has been your biggest challenge?

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Well, our biggest challenge I feel, as a team, is having stable staff. We just need to have more staff and in permanent positions. We have a lot of work to do such as you know continuing to lease out properties to generate income. We still have a balance or rather the remaining list of families that we have not given the land back to. We've tried a lot of the outreach methods. So, I think if we are still going to continue and then if we do not find these families then we're going to have to find out, "What now? What do you want to do with these properties? Do you want to keep it under our inventory and put it as a crown land?" It's something for the senators to consider.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> All right. I appreciate that. Yes, and I think it's worth one more try, at the very least, to find these families. So, we're going to work together with the commission to give it our all.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Right.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> I'm going to ask you something that I asked the other nominees a couple of weeks ago regarding an FY 2018 audit of the Ancestral Lands Commission by the Office of Public Accountability. Sorry, it was an FY19 audit and it says that FY 19 revenues were at six million (\$6,000,000) dollars, which was an increase from

FY18 due to the increase in base lease rental resulting from the settlement agreement with AT&T. This is one of the properties that the Ancestral Lands leases out. The audit reported an increase in expenditures by nine hundred thousand (\$900,000) dollars due mainly to the increase of seven hundred and twenty five thousand (\$725,000) dollars or a seven hundred and twelve (712%) percent increase in management fees incurred by the Ancestral Lands Commission for GEDA's services. GEDA's increased fees pertaining to AT&T lease payments amounted to \$4.9 million dollars. In the memorandum of agreement, GEDA retains a certain percentage of the rent collected as payment for lease management service. So, the audit states that the commission was to re evaluate GEDA's role, relative to its property management services on the leased properties. Have you participated in re evaluating GEDA's role in regard to this property or is this something that's on the agenda for the Ancestral Lands Commission?

<u>Maria G. Cruz, Appointee:</u> Right now, it's on the table. It's something we're taking a look at because we don't have the manpower. So, we need to take a look at what our staff is able to do so we can take some responsibilities of from GEDA. So that's on the table. it's one of the things that we're looking at. So, it's not completely off. It's just on a back burner per se.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Okay. I think that's very important because again, just for those who are watching, any income that the Commission receives could be part of this inventory that we can use to compensate those landowners who will not be getting their properties back. So, it's very important how we manage that and what the ultimate goal is. And, that we try to save costs wherever possible because it's a trust for other beneficiaries.

There was also a reported increase in salaries at that time of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars. I'm not going to elaborate on this, but I want you to be very aware of it because again, every dollar that is diverted from your inventory is something that cannot be used to bring justice to those landowners who cannot get their properties returned. I know that the budget for the Ancestral Lands Commission that we passed recently that is pending the Governor's action is very lean, maybe too lean. And, they are using some of your income from these leases for operations. So, I just want to press upon you to please be very active in scrutinizing the operations and the costs because again, this money is a trust and we want it for its intended beneficiaries.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: That will be included in our report and on you know our pending. We have a list of pending things that needs to be done and of course, the response to that audit. So, we need to address that.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Yes, I think so. And so, there is also some recent issues; disagreement with BBMR with the actions of the Commission and the legal opinion of the Assistant Attorney General, who advise that the Commission has authority to deposit funds from the AT&T leases and for operational purposes. I think we need to settle whether some of these funds are exempt from being used for operational purposes. Are you familiar with that opinion?

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: (inaudible) Okay.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje</u>: All right. Do you feel that as a Commissioner, that you are equipped to handle the controversies that come up? Because we're a very small community so, when controversy comes up between landowners or between those who are getting property back and those who are not getting property back do you feel like you're equipped to handle that type of pressure and that type of controversy?

<u>Maria G. Cruz, Appointee:</u> No. We do need more staff. Not too long ago, I think for the last budget, we did ask for and we did approve more positions so that we can better accommodate or better assist claimants with the submitting of documents or whatever they need that our staff is able to assist.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Okay. I understand and I hear that. I think my colleagues hear that too. They need more staff and I understand how you intend to use them, so I appreciate that. I'm going to open it up now to my Vice Chair Senator Perez.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:</u> Thank you, Madam Chair and good evening Mary Cruz.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Good evening Senator Perez.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez</u>: Thank you for accepting the nomination and thank you for all your service these past decade and plus. I think it must have been a great experience to work alongside the late Ed Benavente and many of our activists that really help found this very important Commission.

### Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Thank you.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina Perez:</u> I think the Chair covered a lot of the questions and I know she's in a way, very much an activist herself in this. But I'm wondering, in regard to excess lands have you heard anything about the potential of the federal government actually transferring some of the lands over to gov Guam?

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Well we do have. I need to check with our current Director for that list because I'm aware of some of the problems, not all of it and so I'm not too sure what happened to the list and then what the last progress is of properties being returned to Guam Ancestral Land. But I will make a follow up.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina Perez:</u> Great. So yes, that's important to know and also figure out if there are potential landowners that can receive this access back.

<u>Maria G. Cruz, Appointee:</u> I am aware that some of those are our landowners because they've approached us to make a follow up on what's happening on those unused lands.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina Perez:</u> In regard to federal excess lands is there any kind of due diligence done to ensure that the lands are toxin free or is there any procedures in place to ensure that the lands are toxin free?

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Well it is my understanding that before these lands are returned to Guam that they're supposed to be toxin free. Well that is really not correct because we've been finding problems later on which have to be addressed. So, like I said, it's my understanding that before it's returned its toxin free. So, before it's returned to the original landowners there really has not been a problem. It's only on those crown lands. I don't recall any of those being on original landowners that we returned.

But we are still keeping that in mind to make sure it's toxin free. But we really don't go out of our way to make sure of that. Like I said, it's only I think one or two areas that we found that had a problem, but these are properties that are returned to the original landowners. They are under our crown lands.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina Perez:</u> Okay and were you able to get some services to remediate it or did you have to [inaudible]?

<u>Maria G. Cruz, Appointee:</u> Yes, we had the services of the military. So that's still pending, and I think it's been over four years. So, they submit a report. They have a budget to clean it up. We do receive the yearly report if not quarterly, but we will make a follow up on those.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina Perez:</u> Okay, great are those documents available? Are they publicly available?

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Yes, they are. They should be.

Vice Chairperson Sabina Perez: Is it on the website?

<u>Maria G. Cruz, Appointee:</u> I don't think it's on the website, but I'll check with the staff. if you want that provided then check I'll check with staff.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina Perez</u>: I appreciate that. I have just one more question. So, with regard to trying to locate the landowners for the list of lands that are in your inventory, what do you think is the barrier to trying to locate the original landowners?

<u>Maria G. Cruz, Appointee:</u> I'm not too sure what the barriers are. I know that we've, according to staff asked the village mayors. Excuse me. With the newspaper, we spent a lot of money on posting because we want to make sure that we've done every effort to contact these families and we want to document that.

We really did try but I don't really know what else to do. Maybe there should be... we should think of creating a website for a list of owners or properties that are unclaimed and include that on our website. So, that's a thought.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina Perez</u>: Yes, I'm just thinking maybe a lot of them have moved off island and using the social media might be very helpful.

<u>Maria G. Cruz, Appointee</u>: I do know that we had somebody from the club in San Diego who provided a listing to the club members so that was also one of the outreaches that we had done.

<u>Vice Chairperson Sabina F. Perez:</u> Okay, great. Thank you so much Maria and thank you again for your hard work and perseverance through it all. *Si Yu'os ma'åse'*.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Thank you. Hagu lokkue' Senator.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Thank you Vice Chair Perez. Senator Shelton?

<u>Senator Amanda Shelton:</u> Thank you very much Madam Chair I'm really just here listening. I appreciate the testimony. I have no questions at this time, but I do very much thank you for your service and for answering the call to continue serving here.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** Senator Taitague?

<u>Senator Telo Taitague:</u> Thank you, Madam Chair. Hi Mary. I wanted to make sure I was here for you at your confirmation hearing. You've been with GALC for so long, so many years and dedicating yourself, your time to this board is commendable and deserves much respect. I thank you so much for your continued support and crossing your T's and dotting your I's down there. For anyone coming in new, the wealth of knowledge that you have is priceless, really priceless. You definitely have my support Mary and take care. Like our good Oversight Chair said, anytime you need us we're here. If there's anything you need to talk about or have some ideas, my door is always open. Thank you.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: I really appreciate that. Thank you.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> Ms. Cruz, thank you again for being here today. I know you weren't feeling well earlier and got your voice back so I'm so glad.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: That's a lot of hot tea and soup.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje</u>: I know that the Commission kind of lost all its members all of a sudden and so they really need you back. They need both of you to get back to work. So, I just wanted to, because we were talking about the net negative, about the land return or the land policy of the Department of Defense going forward and I wanted to just read an excerpt from this June 2017 report to Congress on the status of the net negative policy regarding Navy Acreage on Guam.

They reported that the following summary of land transfers are completed, in progress or projected and this includes:

Parcel behind south Finegayan housing; Route 1; Route 4; Tanguisson Power Plant; Harmon Substation Annex; Piti Power Plant and Substation; Apra Height Slot 402 1; Agana Power Plant and Substation; Army Corp of Engineer ORP Maui tunnel; Tamuning Route 1 behind old Telex; Parcel south of Camp Covington; Parcel Seven NCTS; NCTAMS beach lot adjacent to Tanguisson Power Plant; Hoover Park I think this is also called USO. Parcel C Marbo cave and the Marbo school site. So that was a report to Congress from the Department of the Navy in 2017.

And then in 2018, GEDA also wrote a report on the potentially releasable federal lands in November 2018 using this Navy's report from 2017. But they give credit to the Ancestral Lands Commission for helping them to compile this list of property that is, according to GEDA, requested for return to Gov Guam. So, it includes some of those from the list and I think you can tell some of those are not accomplished yet and we are still waiting and we are relying on your commissioners to also help us to advocate for the prompt and swift return as was envisioned, of those properties and more. So, there are more on the list of the requests, but I won't read it. I'll put it up on my website.

This is all from GEDA's documents but some of them overlap. There are other properties that GEDA has also requested to be returned and so I think those are still not returned obviously. But we still need to work together on that. So again, thank you Mrs. Cruz for accepting the reappointment to this Commission and for all the hours that you have put in already in serving the Ancestral Landowners and in serving the people of Guam in bringing justice. I know that there are some challenging times ahead of you because some of these decisions are not going to be easy. they're going to be very difficult. We can't bring full justice because we can't return all the lands so we're going to make some tough decisions and try to do something else that will bring at least a partial justice to these landowners. So, thank you again for your commitment.

Maria G. Cruz, Appointee: Thank you, Senator and all the Senators, thank you very much.

<u>Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:</u> We will now move on. The time is 6:55 p.m.

The public hearing was adjourned at <u>6:55</u> PM.

#### III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

- Maria G. Cruz has served as a commissioner on the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission since 2002 and has expressed desire to continue to serve as a member. She testified on the record to be free of any business or other conflicts that may prevent her from performing her duties as a member of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.
- Maria G. Cruz responded to questions from the Committee Chairperson and other Senators present with regard to the Commissions response to a Fiscal 2019 Audit conducted by the Office of Public Accountability, in particular, an increase in expenditures by \$902,000, due mainly to the increase in lease management fees paid the Guam Economic Development Authority incurred by the Commission and a reported increase in salaries by \$100,000. According to Ms. Cruz, the Commission will be reevaluating the role of GEDA relative to its property management services as well as other meeting to respond to other findings of the audit and expressed to the panel the challenges with Commission staffing support that need to be addressed and various outreach efforts of the Commission to make contact with potential landowners.
- At the request of the Committee Vice Chairperson, Ms. Cruz agreed to forward the annual/quarterly report submitted to the GALC from the Department of the Navy on the status of remediation of contaminated lands to be returned to the Government of Guam.
- The Committee finds that Maria G. Cruz, having served on the Commission for eighteen years, possesses valuable institutional knowledge and understanding of the issues that need to be addressed and processes that need to be improved to ensure that the Commission carries forward the mission it has been entrusted with and meets its legal mandates.

The <u>Committee on Health, Tourism, Historic Preservation, Land and Justice</u> hereby reports on the appointment of <u>Maria G. Cruz</u> to serve as a <u>Member</u> of the <u>Guam Ancestral Lands Commission</u>, with the recommendation <u>To Report Out Only</u>.
