

Doc I guess you're going be bringing your instruments of you doing there your Commission meeting, because you're going to be, we have a speed reader, we got a lady from Merizo so you'll be looking at how long it took her to get up here and then we got the tax fraud saying hey let's make sure numbers match and we move on, you know the conversation I have to admit you know looking at every one of your nominee's background gosh, Triple J, Docomo like I said the doctors in the house I'm I feel very comfortable because he's going to be looking making sure, everything is right and then the tax fraud person will be saying to the two ladies hey slow it down let's go, this at a little bit of a calmer pace and I say this positively okay and I am going to be supporting you in your confirmation and I'll pass on now to Senator Terlaje and then Senator Lee will follow up.

Senator Régine Biscoe Lee: Yes Mr. Chair I was watching earlier and I want to thank you all I want to first thank our Maga Haga, I think that she has also done some good due diligence and selecting each and every one of you I had the privilege of knowing many of you in our community so I want to thank you for accepting the nomination and also thank your families for the service that you will be providing to our community if confirmed in this capacity I also want to thank our stakeholders for the community for testifying on their behalf it's really important for us to if we don't

know you to be able to get to know you that I have the benefit of knowing many of you in personal and professional roles I think I do want to give each of you nominees or an opportunity to present something to the committee and just think about it for a minute but if you could give an example of an ethical dilemma that you faced whether it's in your life or in your personal life and just tell us a little bit about how you were able to make a decision and resolve this particular issue or challenge and if you could just give us an example of that because I want to have a better idea of your thought process in terms of ethical dilemmas and how you're able to come to the decisions that you are and so if I could ask my good friend Miss Marilyn Borja to start us off because I know she's already ready already Marilyn

Marilyn R. Borja: It was good that I actually have the HR head here because the first thing that, I'm a person that you know immediately things come to mind and I thought I would be asked this question so as a CHamoru woman right and also on mother sometimes we, you know we give the benefit of the doubt sometimes and we try to you know find reasons you know to justify certain things but when you work for a firm with high ethical standards some things aren't just accepted so without going into too much obviously protecting confidentiality of a specific situation but although it broke my heart, I've had to sever employment with you know certain employee or employees for breaking code not necessarily a code but our rules that we have set forth and our policies and procedures and sometimes I think it hurts so much when they're very high producers so you know having to just be grounded in in the policies and procedures that we set forth and not compromising them also goes leaps and bounds for the message that you're showing other employees so that's the answer that comes to my mind right now I hope that answers your question.

Senator Régine Biscoe Lee: Excellent thank you very much Meg?

Margaret E.R. Tyquiengco: Thanks Senator Lee, I the only thing I'm going to use this example similar to Marilyn's whereas the General Manager of Xerox, I had hiring, firing power and there were more than one employee that I had to release from employment due to ethics we same thing we have very high standards at Xerox and basically somebody was abusing their expense reports and you know I had to release them the nice thing is that when you live work for large corporations especially the ethics are very cut and dry it's very easy to follow and I think that's one of the things about this board is having cut and dry policies that you can follow so there's not a lot of gray matter to wobble in between so normally I just follow that and I'm going to say if it's something that is not in a cut and dry manner like in a corporation I really have to say I normally take a pause really kind of get an idea of what might have happened what were their mindset why did they do this and you know normally even though it might be termination or payback or something like that I still want to listen and understand why it might have happened because that way then we can also change the rules and make sure that they're in writing so it doesn't happen again and everybody understands at the same time going forward you know lesson learned.

**Senator Régine Biscoe Lee:** Thank you so much Megan and I guess to your point you mentioned a lot of cut-and-dry policies and I think there are very clear-cut guidelines in the Guam law but you know should you all be confirmed we look forward to hearing feedback from you if you do encounter that gray area if there's a an area in the law that we need to tighten up please we need to have that feedback so that we can situations don't happen again.

Margaret E.R. Tyquiengco: And you know I'm not afraid of sharing my opinion.

Senator Régine Biscoe Lee: Yes, I do I do know that Hafa adai, Doc, good to see you.

Robert S. Jack: You too, Senator, I would echo what was what's been said and they're not too many I haven't faced too many ethical dilemmas because things are usually you know fairly clear-cut the dilemma is really in having to render that decision knowing that somebody's going to be suffering so I think compassion has to have a place when we're making decisions and it doesn't mean we make the wrong decision or do the wrong thing but in making the right decision if we can somehow offer solutions or steps to help the individual who was at the receiving end of a negative decision one example I'll share is a patient came in with a forum for DMV yet he didn't pass his driving test because his vision was just a little less than was required for him to get a license and I had I can sign a paper but I'm not going to go against the law or jeopardize lives by having somebody get a license in qualify but evening in telling him that we were able to come up with a solution for him because he's the sole breadwinner he's an elderly gentleman he's the one who takes his wife to doctors' appointments there is a need for this guy to drive so the solution was hey go to Motor Vehicle and have them do a road test because yeah there's a cut-off of 20/40 vision but 20/50 20/40 on the road you know I have to follow the guidelines but if he's a 20/50 I am sure that if he got a road test he'd be able to get his license as long as somebody can verify that this guy's safe on the road so I think at the end of the day you know most things are fairly clear-cut it's the it's the suffering that comes as a result of you having to make that decision that I think is hardest to deal with that's the dilemma.

Senator Régine Biscoe Lee: Thank you so much, Miss Camacho?

**Donnalynn C. Camacho:** So, with my work I'll sometimes, we get reports on employees that are doing something wrong or they're suspected of doing something wrong and so I know these people I work with them for years and it's a matter of separating how I feel for them personally versus what they did or didn't do and based on that I have to make the decision to file or to report them to federal law enforcement and yes I feel the compassion and how it affects them because sometimes they are release but at the end of the day everybody is responsible for their actions and they should stand by that.

**Senator Régine Biscoe Lee:** Thank you very much again thank you all so much in advance for your service I look forward to supporting all of these nominations based on your packets and your response today so again I just want to thank you for your time today and the time that you will spend in the future serving the people of Guam of this capacity.

Senator Jose "Pedo" T. Terlaje: I just want to add something too because that reminds me of our doctor, you're mentioning compassion and you know when I was in the police department right you know I have to get people violators on the road and sometimes you had that compassion and then I stopped you know a person driving like 50 60 miles an hour or 35 mile an hour zone and this person will come up to me and say hey you know I'm going on an emergency I said what kind of an emergency and I'm late for work so I said wow you know so sometimes you know like when I was going to college right you know I learned that and that sometimes most of the time reinforcement you know you don't reinforce by punishing people you know reinforcement you know to correct a mistake from a person sometimes you have to be compassionate and you just don't get down on the book and say hey you're fired you know you got to know the content you got to learn what the

consequences are going to be like if the person have a family you know you got to be compassionate but sometimes it depends on the type of violation the type of crime that type of mistake that this one person did and it's working environment thank you thank you doctor.

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: And nominees, I'm just going to read a subsection of the code prohibition from political activities I don't know if any of you read it yet members of the Ethics Commission is stabbed so I'll not take an active part and political management or any political campaigns during the term of office or employment I honestly look forward to the nominees because what I've heard today and what I've seen your packet it says a lot and it's going to be fun to watch the Commission when anybody wants to turn to you and play political games I just read it, you wash your hand you say I'm sorry wrong is wrong right it's right. You'll all be compassionate but they all have to face reality and I believe the four of you will be able to fulfill that tax fraud doctor to businesswoman from a list so look quick, stay cool you have a nice Drive all the way up for 25 years but I do look forward to all four of you actually being confirmed I will be submitting that recommendation and that would end this hearing for the four of you and we will take a break because we have one more nominee that requested that she'll show up she's running late she had to take care of something but for the rest of the folks that are here this will end the public hearing for the four of you and it is now 2:40 and the public hearing for, let me read the names miss Donna Lynn Camacho, Mr. Robert Jack, Margaret E.R. Tyquiengco and Marilyn Borja, the public hearing for your nominations have concluded at this time and I do look forward for your confirmation thank you for the people of Guam we will take a pause for about 15 minutes pending the arrival of Miss Shannon Borja or Murphy, Shannon Murphy and then we will continue thank you. Thank you there have been no one else to testify on hisbehalf, there being none this concludes this public hearing. The committee will continue to receive testimonies for the next few days.
