START OF PATRICIA L. KRISE NOMINATION HEARING

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: *Håfa adai yan manana si Yu'os.* We will now begin the confirmation hearing after a short recess that we had of *I Maga'håga's* nominee Patricia L. Krise to serve as a member on the Board of Directors for the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency, otherwise known as CAHA. To restate the Committee's general housekeeping rules the conduct of this public hearing shall be as follows. Those testifying will be recognized in the order of those that have signed in. Written testimony may be read. Lengthy written testimony should be summarized to about five minutes. Written testimonies shall be submitted to the Committee. Please provide our legislative staff with your written testimony for photocopying. Testimony shall be confined to the substance. Persons will be allowed to provide oral testimony only once you were done, please remain at the table so that the members of the panel are able to request for additional comments or convey comments on your testimony when you speak. Please make sure that the microphone is on and that you speak into the microphone. Please state your name for the record the record. Looking at who has signed up we have Patricia Krise who has is ready to be seated. Excuse me, a ready to provide testimony. We have a Dr. Krise who is here in support and we have Miss Jackie Balbas, who is the acting head of CAHA and so we'll go ahead and ask those that are going to be providing testimony to go ahead and sit at the table and then Mrs. Krise will have you testify last. We'll go ahead and start with the acting head of CAHA and Dr. Krise. So very good. Since Dr. Krise signed in as the second person if we can go ahead and have you begin with your testimony.

MR. THOMAS W. KRISE, PH.D.: Thank you Madam Chair. I was just here as president of the University of Guam as well as husband of the nominee. Just wanting to say how important I think CAHA is to all aspects of the University's mission as well as all of the interests of culture and arts and humanities in Guam and in the wider region as well. So I think in many ways CAHA is an example for the whole region for how to manage our arts and humanities activities and I just wanted to say that that I think that Patty Krise's experience in these fields as well as an active member of a number of different communities is very good for bringing kind of a public view to arts and humanities programming and thinking about ways to support it better with interactions with organizations like the University of Guam so I'm very much in support. Thank you Madam Chair.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse for that testimony and you bring up a very good point about us being situated within a wider region. And so that is something I think that CAHA has done well over the years but can continue to build on so si Yu'os ma'åse for bringing some of those points to the forefront. And then we'll also hear from the acting head of CAHA Miss Balbas.

MS. JAQUELINE BALBAS: Buenas Madam Chair. Thank you for the opportunity to sit before you in support of Mrs. Krise nomination to the CAHA board. Although I don't know Mrs. Krise, I know that since the short time that she's been in Guam she's immersed herself into the community. I know that she's a member of the Guam Symphony Society, which CAHA has supported for many years. And what I really wanted to say is with her business background and the fact that she's traveled quite extensively. I think she can bring something new to the CAHA board. I would like to see maybe initiatives that would support the artists. Maybe some sort of

cottage industry or maybe a way to give them more training and education. To give them... to help make their art form a livelihood because many times artisans are only focused on the creative aspect of their art and they don't... not necessarily have the time or the desire to put all the effort into making it a profitable business. So I think with Mrs. Krise's experience. And like I said, she's going to bring a totally new perspective to the CAHA board. I'm here in support of her nomination. Thank you.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse for that and now let's go ahead and listen to the nominee herself.

MS. PATRICIA L. KRISE: Thank you, Jackie and Tom *buenas yan håfa adai*, Madam Chair. I'd like to go ahead and read my testimony. I'm honored and humbled to be considered to serve on the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities, Board of Directors. My application provided a brief summary of my work and volunteer service for the past three decades. In January of this year I retired after 28 years with Ford Motor Company and our financial services division, Ford Motor Credit. As a CAHA board member I hope to share my marketing and financial expertise as well as a consumer's interest in the arts and humanities. For the past 20 years I've been fortunate enough to attend and participate in many higher education arts and humanities events. I have seen firsthand the impact arts and humanities can have on an individual and an organization. I hope as a board member I can assist in preserving, advocating and promoting the arts and humanities in Guam. I look forward to collaborating with fellow board members and giving back to this island we all love. I respectfully submit this testimony to the Committee. *Si Yu'os ma'åse*.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse for that and I do want to mention...and I meant to mention it. When Dr. Krise was providing his testimony that we very much appreciate the University of Guam's working with the Department of Parks and Recreation which we had to earlier nomination hearings for board members but we appreciate the University of Guam being very supportive of the idea of adopting a park and we're still in communication about that. So, thank you very much for that. And then I thank you Mrs. Krise for your testimony as well. So, with the different testimonies and was looking at your background I think people have highlighted very well, yourself included, that you bring a lot of potential to the table that you have these skills in marketing and finance and very much part of what CAHA does is needing to support the arts, needing to support the artists and help showcase

them in a variety of ways. Both for themselves as artists for us as the greater community and then as you mentioned us as consumers of art as welL. I think if we're looking at all of those aspects which some of your background can help us do. I think that's a very positive benefit that you can be bringing. and some of what stood out to me in this mentioning of you having traveled quite a bit.

Also being a person who enjoys traveling and getting to experience other places in other cultures and environments. I think that is something that's very beneficial and one of the things that's just more recently come to mind, with some of these thoughts for CAHA, is maybe there's a potential to have more art in our public spaces. We've been seeing these wonderful murals going out but as we go through many parts of our region and elsewhere, art is really out there in the public spaces. Sculpture, having exhibits... now it's a little trickier for us to have exhibits out in the open and at night, but you know we can we can figure out ways to make it work and make sure everything is safe guarded as welL.

But I think there's a lot of potential in that and maybe with that marketing background you can be thinking about some of those ways that getting the art out there for the community to really be inspired by and appreciate in all sorts of places and ways that we haven't done before. There's always room for growth. So that could be something exciting.

As Miss Balbas mentioned the potential for continuing to build up our cottage industry of our local artists as entrepreneurs. That is something that is so important for us as a community to have that available. But then also was we're looking to diversify the economy. They really bring a lot of potential with them. Things that visitors are seeking when they come here. Our tourists, our visitor industry, is one of our largest industries so if we're really continuing to build that up in ways that make sense for them. I think that provides a lot of potential for us and then it's money that's in our economy that stays and circulates amongst us because it's at that real grassroots leveL.

So, I'm sure you understand that much more than I having that Finance background, but that could be again another really positive benefit that you're bringing along with us... You're bringing to us... Excuse me.

As Dr. Krise mentioned, us being part of this region, I think that there is definitely potential for us to be continuing to build up in the ways that we connect with cultural entities in other islands. And because we have community members from those different islands and CAHA is here, it's here to showcase and support Chamorro artists, but also all artists and members of the community. And so there may be potential in continuing to build up the very fine set of programs that they have running already. Again, there's always room for continued refinement and growth in those areas. Did you yourself have some particular focus that you're interested in?

MS. PATRICIA L. KRISE: I really think that the points you made were excellent in terms of this cottage industry and really promoting the artists we have on the island. I've had a chance to do a couple of events here locally when Rick Castro opened up his new display exhibit space. You know, they had a nice reception and a lot of people coming and actually most of the art had already been sold in the first couple of hours he'd been open. I think there's this demand for local art. Not just from people who live in Guam but I think all of our visitors.

As you mentioned if there's a way to display in more public spaces, I think that would be... that would be great. I think that's an opportunity that we could help market and would look forward to collaborating with the board members and doing. There's just so much rich, cultural heritage here that we need to share all over. Not just in Guam but all over the region as well and I just think there's so many opportunities.

Probably about a month ago we went to a UOG book launch that was "13 months in Malesso". It was a children's book and there are two great local artists. The woman who wrote the book and then the illustrator, also a woman from Guam. And in she had her prints on display and it was just a fantastic community event. There must have been probably 25 or 30 kids with parents and grandparents and I just think doing more of that and just getting that out into the community and getting young people involved. I think like you said, there's just so much more that can be done. There's so much potential and I think brainstorming and talking about it with the community. I think there's a lot we can do.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse for that and you bring forward many good points. I unfortunately missed the opening of that exhibit and I'm very saddened by it. But I still have the goal of getting down there. Although, apparently maybe now many of the pieces of art may not be there since it was so successful.

Recognizing the rich cultural heritage that is here. We're constantly looking for ways to showcase that. It does many wonderful things for us to remember that we're in an indigenous homeland. That there are four thousand years of history and culture to be showcasing. Historic sites, cultural sites but all of the traditions that have been part of that culture for a long time as well.

Just the diversity some of what you spoke to of what we have available to us and that will continue to grow and expand. Where maybe people think of Arts in a very narrow way. Maybe they're thinking about the murals the paintings and so forth. But as you mentioned, you know, these children's books that are coming out, the art that is accompanying them. Those are also forms of art, you know. There are literary arts, we have performing artists and so I think the more that we're continuing to recognize that as a community and the more that we have board members and then acting director that understand those things. The more that we're all going to benefit from it. And it does it makes all of our lives richer. Which is the whole point of what arts is supposed to be doing for us. It's making our lives richer. It's providing us this stronger self-sense of self. And then as I had mentioned in one of the earlier nomination hearings, that stronger sense of self. You know, it may seem like something that's not very important but it's one of the most important things for dealing with some of our social issues. I mean, we can tackle certain things like our social issues or even some of the crime that we're dealing with now through the arts and through providing that sense of self. Through providing opportunities as you mentioned to our youth or others to get involved in the arts.

Those are some of the strongest tools that we have for helping them pick these positive paths. Because they have that rootedness in who they are and where they are. So some of the things that you mentioned are very exciting I think and just speak to that continued growth of CAHA which as a community we want to support and also see in those variety of ways. Do you see that there might be any potential conflicts by serving on the board?

MS. PATRICIA L. KRISE: I don't foresee any. Certainly, if something came up I would recuse myself from any decision if there was a conflict. I don't foresee any. Jackie might know a little bit better with all of her experience, but I would certainly back out of something if there was a conflict.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse for that. It's important to know that the board members are cognizant that there might be conflicts that come up and how to respond if that indeed is the case. And then another thing that's really important with our board members and the members of the legislature. It's really important for them to hear is that you understand the time commitment and how important it is for us to be able to have a board that does meet regularly and does make quorum and then therefore is able to do its work. Some of what this board has is... well they have a lot of... a lot of work involved. They're part of the Festival of Pacific Arts. They're part of the art programs. They're part of understanding our region and how to build up our artists but also our community. But then also they do things like they approve of or, as Senator Terlaje said earlier, hire the president of the Department of Chamorro Affairs or maybe in this case... I'm in my mind I'm having to separate... now that they've been separated out. Maybe I'm getting that confused but anyway the board have a lot of responsibilities. So all that being said I've taken the very long way to ask you about your understanding the time commitment and the importance of making quorum and whether you feel like you can make those commitments.

MS. PATRICIA L. KRISE: Yes, and I'm looking forward to becoming even more engaged in the community. So, I don't foresee any problems meeting the commitment that comes with this important role.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Si Yu'os ma'åse I see. I'm so glad that your answer would much more, much more straightforward than my very long-winded roundabout way of getting to the question that I meant to ask. So, with that I don't believe that there are any other testimonies or statements that anybody wanted to make.

MS. PATRICIA L. KRISE: I believe there was a written testimony that was submitted. I don't know if you receive that. If not, I'll drop it off when I leave... from Gillette Leon Guerrero.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: Oh, yes, that's true. And I'm glad that you mentioned that I did read through her testimony and again for those that will be reading through the Committee report it's important to note that Gillette Leon Guerrero who was... who has been part of these sort of realms of our community for a very long time... for decades. She provides her support. She also highlights your marketing and finance background.

That you are very interested in committed to giving back to the community that you are part of and issues like that. So, we're very pleased to receive her testimony. Her long standing in the community and her support of you means a lot to us.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., CHAIR: So with that being said, I just want to remind people that we will be continuing to receive testimonies over the next few days to please address your written testimony to the Committee on Heritage and the Arts, Parks, Guam Products, Hagåtña Revitalization, Self Determination, and Regional Affairs and submitted via email to office.senatorkelly@guamlegislature.org. or to my office located at the second floor of the Guam building. So, this will conclude the confirmation hearing of Patricia L. Krise to serve as a member on the Board of Directors Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency, otherwise known as CAHA. *Si Yu'os ma'åse* for your attendance this morning and for your participation in today's confirmation hearings. Today's public hearing has now ended. I am quite pleased to say that we have stayed on track all morning. The time is now 9:58. Have a good day.
