

Steffy to serve as a 'Member' to the Department of Parks and Recreation Commission.

The Virtual Public Hearing was called to order at 5:23 pm, on the nomination of Robert J. Steffy.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., COMMITTEE CHAIR: *Hafa Adai todos hamyo*, thank you for your participation in today's virtual public hearing. The Committee convenes this virtual public hearing on Heritage and the Arts, Parks, Guam Products, Hagatna Revitalization, Self-Determination, and Regional Affairs. For the record, in accordance with the open government law, public hearing notices were given to all Senators, stakeholders, and in all main media broadcasting outlets. The first notice was sent out on Friday, November 20th, 2020, and again on Monday, November 23rd, 2020. The second notice was sent on Sunday, November 29th, 2020. The virtual public hearing notice is also posted at the Guam Legislature's website at www.guamlegislature.org. Today is Tuesday, December 1st. The time is 5:23 pm. This virtual confirmation hearing is now called to order. *Si Yu'os mã'ase* for your virtual attendance at this evening's hearing.

On the agenda for this evening's virtual confirmation hearing is the appointment of Robert J. Steffy to serve as a member of the Department of Parks and Recreation Commission. The Committee

will receive oral testimony for *I Maga' āga's* nominee at this hearing. For the public viewing benefit, the Committee will continue to accept written testimony that will be made a part of today's public hearing record.

Joining me today, we have Minority Leader Senator Telo Taitague. We're very appreciative of being here. We also have the Director, Mr. Roque Alcantara, and Deputy Director Victor Villagomez, of the Department of Parks and Recreation. Thank you to both of you for attending as well.

I want to set up some general rules of conduct for those that are virtually participating in today's virtual hearing. The hearing's conduct shall be as follows: participants must abide by rules of conduct and quality assurance standards, including broadcasting from a quiet room with little to no interruptions. The use of virtual backgrounds is not permitted. All participants must broadcast from a place with adequate lighting, specifically to ensure that a participant's face is not backlit but visible at all times. When speaking, please ensure that you are unmuted, then speak clearly into your microphone. I will moderate this hearing by recognizing each participant before presenting their oral testimony. Before speaking, please clearly state your name and title for record-keeping purposes. The order of questioning will begin with the panel of senators who are present. That may just be the Minority Leader and me, which is very good. We're both attentive people. Each panel member will be allowed to pose one question. They then are allowed to ask a further question in a subsequent round if that is found necessary. Oral testimonies received shall be kept to the substance of the issues on the agenda. The personal inference as to the character of a nominee, Senator, or any individual testifying is not permitted. Any violation of this general rule of conduct will result in removing that person from this virtual public hearing by the host. I ask that all participants keep their comments or testimony to within 5 minutes. Although, we have a little flexibility since we're a small cozy group. Now, let me move forward on this virtual public hearing.

Hafa Adai. A board or Commission member's work involves much volunteer time and commitment and provides an important link between the public and agency, the Legislature, and the Governor. Each board is unique in its purpose, mission, and role. Members must be familiar with their boards governing statutes and other authorizing directives to understand the board's framework. I want to call upon Mr. Robert J Steffy to provide his testimony to serve as a member of the Department of Parks and Recreation Commission. Then testimonies will be received from individuals confirmed to participate in his nomination. As I mentioned before, I'm acknowledging and appreciative of the Department of Parks and Recreation Director and the Deputy Director of that same Department for being here. We know that they have a full set of obligations, and we appreciate that they made the time to participate in today's virtual public hearing. I will also

recognize Mr. Robert Steffy to provide his testimony and general comments to the Committee and the panel. Then, we will move on to the Director, who will also be giving testimony. Mr. Steffy, you may begin with your name and your title.

ROBERT J. STEFFY, NOMINEE: Thank you, Madam Chair and Senator Taitague. My name is Robert Steffy. I am a 47-year resident of Piti. My wife is Rlene Santos Steffy, and we have five children. I arrived on Guam in 1974 and have spent most of my adult life here. During the forty-seven years. I have been involved in sports, first as an athlete and then as a sports administrator. My commitment to sports is also demonstrated by my family's active involvement in basketball, swimming, golf, track and field, tennis, and softball. At the Guerrero softball field at tryouts for the Bank of Guam co-ed softball team, I met Rlene. She was trying out for second base, and I was trying out for the pitching position.

Our children and eldest of our eight grandchildren are athletes and have represented Guam in the Local, Regional, International, and World competitions. Our youngest, Spencer, carries a club, not a bat, but brings home championship trophies. Our granddaughters Madison and Sidney Packbier compete in local, regional, and International Sports. Maddie was named the 2020 female Shieh Su Ying Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Our daughter Tara was GNOC's Female Scholar-Athlete in 1995 after graduation from high school. I share this to show that the Steffy's are a sports-minded athletic family.

Regarding my sport administrative positions, I am and have been the Secretary-General and Treasurer of the Guam National Olympic Committee since 2000. I'm president of the Guam Amateur Softball Association since 1981. President of the Guam Major League since 2007. and former president and current vice president of the Baseball Confederation of Oceania. Founding president and current vice president of the Oceania Softball Confederation. I was a member and chairman of the Parks and Recreation Commission during the Guterrez and Felix Camacho administrations. These are trying times, and I want to assist the new administrator of the Department of Parks and Recreation. I met Roque Alcantara over forty years ago. We've played together on championship softball teams. We've worked together on the softball tournaments during the 1994 Micronesian Games and the 1999 South Pacific Games held on Guam.

Roque Alcantara and I had worked together on Guam Major League Seasons when he was the league Commissioner. Roque and I recently worked as tournament officials in January of this year when Guam hosted and won the 15 and under Oceania Baseball Tournament. The victory earned Guam a spot in the World Baseball Softball Confederation Classic, which includes the top 12 and 15 and under teams in the world.

As a member of the Parks and Recreation Commission, I will help develop policies and strengthen relationships with other government agencies and private sector entities to make our Parks and Recreation facilities places that people go to and be healthy and stay fit. The baseball relationship between the Department of Parks and Recreation has resulted in Guam being ranked 43 globally, which is the highest of Guam's Federation. I included bringing up other matters, but they have been addressed by Bill 295-35 COR and Bill 426-35 COR, which I fully support. Thank you, Senators, for your favorable consideration of this appointment.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., COMMITTEE CHAIR: *Si Yu'os ma'ase'* for your testimony Mr. Steffy. Yes, it was very good outlining your experience here and your family's experience and your breath of familiarity with our Island, our facilities at DPR, and so forth. As you probably know, it's a huge mandate, which we'll talk about a little bit more in a minute. Let me turn this over to Director Alcantara to provide testimony if he should so choose.

ROQUE ALCANTARA, DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION DIRECTOR:

Good evening. Madam Chair Senator Kelly Marsh and Senator Telo Taitague. My name is Roque Anderson Alcantara, Director of Parks and Rec. I am here in support of the nomination of Bob Steffy as a Commission member of the Department of Parks and Recreation. I have known Bob for over 45 years. We played softball on the same team for more than a decade. He was a pitcher and a great one. He limits hitters from hitting the ball to third base, which is where I play. Bob is also the president of the Guam Major League. The league with exceptional baseball players that can compete with any team in the United States. I have the pleasure of working with Bob as a Commissioner of the Guam Major League until now, the present time. Guam Major League has been in existence since 1974 and hoping to have a season opener early this coming year. Bob is a good man with intelligence. I support his nomination as a Commission member and know that you will help DPR with any issues. He has a lot of experience in the DPR Commission, holding positions as chairman and vice-chairman. He also is a professional CPA and should be a plus for the Department for accountability of funds.

I look forward to working with Mr. Steffy for the betterment of Parks and Recreation. Thank you.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., COMMITTEE CHAIR: *Si Yu'os ma'ase'* Director. That was a very good testimony. All the things you highlight are things that we like to hear, especially on that CPA note and accountability. I think both the Minority Leader and I are pleased to have that additional accountability. That's so important. I want to go over a few things, and then I'll open it up to the Minority Leader if she has a question.

It is just as I was saying that the mandate is very large, and to be quite honest, I've thought about the Department of Parks and Rec quite a lot over the last two years. About what makes the most sense for the Department. That's something I think that the board and the Director came to continue to do. I think if you know if it's set up like it used to be. We're trying to get it back to how it used to be with a full-time Recreation administrator, which has just been hired, and a full-time Parks administrator. I've even thought that a grounds administrator or cemetery/grounds administrator because that

The cemetery has been added on, is maybe something to consider because there's a lot of work over the entire Island, and as I read in the newspaper the other day, Including Cocos Island. So with that, you know, it also has these recreational facilities, the swimming pool, the Paseo Stadium and these other parts of its mandate. So again, it's rather large, and I want to point out that I do commend the administration for making sure that a board has indeed gotten into place and You know it became functional quite a while back because I believe it was six years that it didn't have a functioning board. We can see that maybe without that guidance and activity that there are things that we're now trying to pull back together. I think that that was something that was missing for a real long time.

I'm glad that the boards in place. As I mentioned before to the board members, I'm pleased with the selection because they are people who use our Parks. They use our Waters by paddling in them, or they use our facilities such as Mr. Steffy here right with his great familiarity with our baseball stadium. So forth, I think that's going to be a real Plus and calling upon our board, and I have this vision for how we're going to go forward. I think some of what we need to do is re-evaluate. Our Parks aren't used in the same ways as they used to be necessary. I think getting together and doing some of this re-visioning is good for the long-term, not immediately, maybe necessarily. Still, I think it's going to be an important part of just refiguring out how everything fits back together and serves the community and gets the community is involved in very active ways. My one question before I give it over to the Minority Leader would be what Mr. Steffy has. Maybe if he thought along with these ways; if he's had some thoughts about the vision or perhaps a new refined direction or perhaps just the most significant need that he's observed over the years for the parks, and maybe something he might focus on early on.

ROBERT J. STEFFY, NOMINEE: Senator, one of the issues that I've discussed with Roque already, and you know when I came to Guam Parks and Recreation had 200 employees now they have less than 40. When I got here, Parks and Recreation were in charge of the Veterans Cemetery, and you know, we passed the other Cemetery every day on our way to Agana. I was

involved with Jack Jones when GCC when there were some funding and GCC, built a wall around that Cemetery.

I'm certainly familiar with the issues. You know, one of your bills that allows for the revolving fund to be re-enacted, I think, is going to be very beneficial to the Department. The funds generated by the Parks and the funds generated by Paseo should stay with those facilities and not go to the general fund where they're lost. You know, when I got to Guam, just the sale of the Billboards at Paseo Stadium generated about \$60,000 a year. The prior administrations didn't want to release the ability for the baseball Federation to sell the Billboards. Roque and I have talked about that. I mean, I think there are ways to generate funds for the sporting facilities. I believe there are ways to generate funds for the parks. One of the things that I think maybe possible is that the Guam National Olympic Committee has 26 active federations. I think some of these federations would be in positions to adopt parks. Roque and I have talked about the baseball Federation assuming Paseo's responsibility.

The biggest problem with that is The cost of the utilities; if there would be some way that we could do it, you know, we would have the ability to maintain that whole facility. It's the utility cost that generates the problem. Another problem for the Department is the pools, and Rick Blas has contacted FINA, the International Swimming Federation, to see if there's any grant money available to assist in the development of a new pool. I understand the governor has suggested that the pool be built at the Northern Sports Complex. Still, there's a lack of funding and what we're trying to do at the Olympic Committee level is to see if there's any funding generally possible from FINA. We, the Olympic Committee, has been working with DOE on the training of umpires and coaches for high school sports. The idea being that these are the people that are going to be participating in calling games at Paseo.

I think that you know, one of the initiatives that we started earlier this year was to train umpires and officials for DOE. The superintendent suggested that we do something like that, and we had a program set up within a week, and we trained 15 new coaches and six new umpires. I think Roque is the right guy to have there with his background. He's got a master's degree and in management. If anything, he's probably overqualified for the position, but I think you know, he and I get along very well. We've been friends for over 40 years.

I look forward to getting back into the Commission, and you know, I mean, I don't think that if the bills you're proposing pass. I believe the Department will be able to generate some real revenue that can be used at the park level and the recreation level.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., COMMITTEE CHAIR: Excellent.

You know your amount of experience both specifically with the Department of Parks and Recreation, with our Sports community. Just with our community in general, that will bring so much experience and skills that we need. We need somebody who's a go-getter, and yeah, I keep telling people don't say anything that will scare away our Director. He's been shaping up quite a lot. As you mentioned, there used to be 200 people there, and now he's trying to make do with 40.

We have to be really creative, and we were really hoping that this was the year that we were going to increase the budget, and then this fiscal crisis happened, but it was in the works. And so we still have to make do with our old budget. But anything we can do to generate revenue is, of course, going to help. We want to safeguard that I know I've talked a long time, and the Minority Leader has been patient, but please Minority Leader if you have a question for Mr. Steffy.

SENATOR TELO TAITAGUE: Thank you, Madam Chair. Thank you for the opportunity. Before I start, I'd like to congratulate Roque. Congratulations on your confirmation. We confirmed you today at the Legislature. Congratulation as the Director.

ROQUE ALCANTARA, DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION DIRECTOR:

Thank you very much, Senator.

SENATOR TELO TAITAGUE: Not that you had anything to worry about. Not at all. You know, you hit something on the nail Robert when you mentioned you have a good relationship with the Director, which is important to the foundation. You know, starting out as friends is important. You get along, and that's very important. You might not agree or agree, but at least you have that friendship that will keep you together and keep you working together because there is a lot of work to be done over there. And now that you're retired out of sports, you know, a couple of years ago not doing any sports. I don't know about golf. But now you have an opportunity to keep that Legacy. Not only what you've done but your family and now your grandchildren and providing a place for them to work out and play; play softball, to play baseball, to play golf. You know to go to the beaches and the parks, and practice your skills there.

Now I greatly appreciate you stepping up. I call you the money man because I know you have an accounting degree. If there's any way to find some money, I'm pretty sure you'll be the person to find it and find ways of making money for the agency. Thank you, Robert. I know you can do other things, but I'm glad you're here at Parks and Rec. There is one thing I do have a question, but maybe it might go to the Director of not quite sure but the SHPO. Parks and Rec overseas,

you know the restrooms of facilities Etc down the line, but does the board also oversee SHPO on Department

ROQUE ALCANTARA, DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION DIRECTOR:

No. They have a different board.

SENATOR TELO TAITAGUE: Okay. Oh, they have another board? Okay, so you have two boards all managed over at Parks and Rec, then the Parks and Rec board and the SHPO board. Okay. Well, I'm excited for you and excited about the agency having you onboard, Robert. Thank you again for stepping up to the plate, and my door is always open. If there's anything you'd like to discuss or Implement some legislation that would help Parks back. Roque already knows that, and Mr. Villagomez knows that my door is always open. So thank you so much. Thank you, Madam Chair.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., COMMITTEE CHAIR: *Si Yu'os mǎ'ase'* Minority Leader. And yes, you know, I used to sit on that board. I know it very well. It's the Historic Preservation Review Board, and it oversees most of the historic preservation office and preservation trust is kind of in that way. Yes, so I think we've covered just kind of the breadth of things, and I know as Mr. Steffy should this nomination go forward and be confirmed. Mr. Alcantara, the Director, will continue to have these conversations about the breadth of what is going at the Department of Parks and Recreation. One of the things we had yesterday was a lot of the Sea Shore Protection Plan being put together. There is the Territorial Sea Shore Park that DPR oversees as well, and there is a board, which is the GLUC, and a couple of other members that comprise that board, but that will be a two-year project. And so I'm sure that time they will be reaching out to the Department of Parks and Recreation itself. So there are just elements. Like that, and as I said, you know, I'm open, and it sounds like the Minority Leader is available as well, you know, as you sit and go through this, it's true.

The Department has changed its changed from 200 people to about 40. It's changed from having DOC be able to help, and then we get situations like this. DOC cannot help with maintenance, and as you mentioned, the recreation fund hasn't been performing as it has in the past. These are things that we would be willing to listen to if they are seen as needs for re-visioning or reshaping the Department in some way. There may be some best practices, models out there I've read about somewhere. They get real strong Community involvement. That's a real long-term process. So, please continue to look at those things. I know both of you are movers and shakers; you make things happen. You have real strong skill sets in administration and Leadership and can make things happen even if the landscape is complex and multifaceted. I think those app facets will

benefit where we're at right now as we try to build this Department back up. Was there any last question or comment you wanted to have Minority Leader before I close?

Okay, yes, so you definitely have my support of Mr. Steffy. I really think that this nomination will go through pretty easily, and that will have you onboard very shortly. Our next session is just next week because we're trying to beat the Christmas rush so you may be appointed and confirmed sooner rather than later. It may just be a couple of weeks before per year. Get your confirmation in, so I think that will be a good thing for the Department

ROBERT J. STEFFY, NOMINEE: Senator. I want to make one more comment? You know, I wanted to point out that before Roque came on board, Victor assisted us for the last two years. You know, we've hosted international baseball tournaments every year. I wanted to mention that Victor has assisted us for the last two years. Since then, you know, we're the second-ranked team in Oceania behind Australia. We're ahead of New Zealand. New Zealand is who we beat in the tournament in January. Being ranked as high as we are is a direct result of Parks and Recreation's assistance with the facilities' use. Again, we worked very well together, Roque, you know, baseball softball player. I never played baseball when I was growing up in Hawaii. I paddled canoes. I didn't play baseball. When I got to go on, I started playing softball, and it's about the time I met him.

I look forward to very good things coming. I know three of the people on the Commission right now. They're involved with sports with the Olympic Committee. I think the partnership and Roque I have talked about this even before the nomination my you know, I was nominated by the governor to get GNOC more involved with different sports. I think baseball is as tight as we can be with Parks and Recreation now; it's time to get the other sports involved. And you know, one of them, for instance, is paddling. I think they would be a prime person to adopt Matopang Park, you know, I don't know if they have or not, but I think we can twist their arm a little bit because they use that facility. I believe other federations could do the same thing. I know what Roque's problem is his monetary problems. He is familiar with the GNOC board; he's familiar with Vic. We've always lived here. I haven't lived here as long as they have, but you know almost 50 years. That's not bad. I'm not going anywhere. Thank you, senators, and thank you, Roque and Vic.

SENATOR KELLY MARSH (TAITANO), PH.D., COMMITTEE CHAIR: Thank you for those additional comments. Yes, you know, I used to write for a real long time political review for Guam every year. Still, I always made it a little bit more comprehensive to capture our community. I always make sure to have a section there about sports because we do we rank very highly of quite often in National competitions and Pacific competitions and Regional competitions and so forth,

so it's something for us to be proud of. We need to do our part as a government through partnerships and ways to ensure that we're providing as much support as possible for these budding athletes. I appreciate your thinking on that as well. So with that, I'll go ahead and close out this virtual hearing. The Committee will continue to receive written testimonies for the next few days.
