My name is Kathleen T. Tolosa and I am currently serving as the President of the Micronesian Youth Services Network Board of Directors as well as a youth advocate. I'm writing in support of Mrs. Sarah Thomas-Nededog's appointment to Guam Memorial Hospital Board.

I have known Mrs. Thomas-Nededog for half of my life, 16 years in total. I know her as a champion of the community, great leader and my Mentor.

I first met Mrs. Thomas-Nededog in a not-so-ideal situation. I was a youth who sought shelter at Sanctuary, Incorporated where she served as the Executive Director. During my stay at their Transitional Living Program for 18 months, I was provided the resources and skills to increase my chances of succeeding even though statistics said I would play part in the cycle of abuse. While there, I learned entrepreneurship, life skills and self-sufficiency. The impact that Sanctuary had in my life under the leadership of Mrs. Thomas-Nededog is immeasurable. Dear Chair Terlaje:

I come before you humbly this morning to provide testimony on my appointment to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) Board of Trustees.

I have had the honor to work in the field of human services for 42 years. In my various roles, I have worked and managed positions in the nonprofit sector and the local government. I have also worked in partnership with the federal government, having personally managed millions of dollars of federal funds over the years in program areas including with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the U.S. Department of Justice. I currently manage a regional organization which is part of an international nonprofit organization that focuses on supporting the most vulnerable populations in our islands. I am a trainer, educator and an advocate for good policy and exemplary practice.

Working with individuals and groups of people who are marginalized, disenfranchised or who are at risk of homelessness, poverty or victims of abuse and neglect have been my life's work. I graduated from the University of Guam with a Bachelor's degree in Sociology and Psychology and a Master's in Public Administration. I have completed all my dissertation for my doctorate in human services from Capella University and continue to be a lifelong learner to keep up with the state of the art of social services practice. I have managed programs and organizations at the Department of Public Health and Social Services, the Guam Mental Health and Substance Abuse Agency, and at Sanctuary, Inc. and at Servicio Para I Man'amko, Gov Guam Association of Retired Persons. Through these experiences, I believe I have learned much about the daily life's struggles or our people and have gained great insights to working with youth, senior citizens, persons with disabilities, veterans, and the homeless. Each day as I continue on in my work with some of the most awesome social workers, program administrators and advocates, I feel even more honored to have this unique experience to help when often times, for some of our people, there seems as there is no light at the end of the tunnel.

In the last two decades I led the successful attainment of accreditation for the only nonprofits in the region who hold this status with CARF, an international accrediting authority. I am passionate and believe that accreditation is the way forward for nonprofit and governmental entities as it marks the achievement of the highest standards of service to those the organization serves.

Throughout my career, I have also served on nonprofit boards and government councils, task forces and board. Currently, I am the Chair for Payuta, Inc., the umbrella organization of NGOs on Guam. I also chair the Board of Directors for the Pacific Islands Association of Non-Governmental Organizations (PIANGO) of which our offices are located in Suva, Fiji. PIANGO is comprised of regional leaders of nonprofits from the 24 countries of the pacific. Guam sits proudly as one of the members in this distinguished and passionate board of pacific islanders dedicated to uplifting the standards and services to our island people. For over 11 years, I served on the Territorial Parole Board where we met at least two to three times a month for 8-10 hour days reviewing and discussing applications for parole, and for commutation requests. I have also sat on other regional boards representing Guam such as the Western States Youth Services Network Board of

Directors advocating for national attention for greater federal attention for youth programs. In the mid 2000's I was active in the Civilian Military Task Force's Sub Committee on health and Human Services. I remain on the Homeless Coalition developing strategies to prevent homeless and reduce the numbers of our people who flee to our streets for refuge. Most recently, I assisted the Archbishop Byrnes in putting together policies and procedures to support and protect children and vulnerable adults.

When I was advised of my appointment to the GMHA Board of Trustees, I was initially in awe, wondering how I could be of service to the Governor and to the hospital. As I thought more deeply about this position and talking to friends and colleagues, one thing became glaringly clear to me – this is the hospital of the people, our people, and my people. This is where our people go when they are sick and when they need help at a very desperate time in their life. The families that accompany the ill, pray for the best care possible for them, hoping and praying that whatever illness has befallen the patient, will be eased, cured, treated and with love and care. I realized then that my presence on this board of the people's hospital was my next journey and my next mission.

What I believe to be my priorities should I be confirmed for this leadership position are:

- 1) Sustaining and maintaining accreditation with the Joint Commission
- 2) Rectifying any disclosed problems and avoiding repeat noncompliance issues
- 3) Working in partnerships with other health organizations on Guam, the region of Micronesia and the Pacific, and with the federal government and counterparts nationally to develop strategies for progressive and feasible ways to improve and expand services to those who come to GMH for help.
- 4) Identifying and promoting ways to better ensure the stability of the people's hospital financially and programmatically.
- 5) Supporting good leadership and stewardship of resources of the hospital; and
- 6) Advocating for policy and practice that are appropriate, necessary and result in the optimum level of services with advisement to our Governor, Legislature, partners, and the federal movement.

the first nominee that we had this morning on for the board. I just wanted that to be clear so you're very aware that what you are accepting, with that responsibilities but please proceed when you're ready we'd like to hear from you.

Sarah M. Thomas-Nededog:

Thank you madam chair I had the opportunity as well to take a look at the responsibilities that were outlined in the hospital's mandate as well as take a look at a couple of other relative documents so I appreciate you bringing that up good morning madam Chair Terlaje, senators Sabina Perez, Will Castro, Kelly Marsh Taitano, and Régine Biscoe Lee.

Please see attached testimony.

Chairperson Therese Terlaje:

Si Yu'os ma'ůse', Sarah and all of you who are here to support Sarah. I really want to thank you for accepting this nomination it seems that you have a wealth of knowledge. I mean it doesn't seem we know that you have a wealth, decades, of knowledge and in leadership experience in the social services in community development in health and youth services accreditation and I personally know you as a person who is able to get community buy-in from across all aspects of our community and I think that's going to really help the hospital if you can bring that. I mean, we all want to help the hospital sometimes we're not all sure exactly what is the way, but I think bring the entire community, Sarah, and lead the way of how all of us can help the hospital. I'm going to ask you just a few questions that I've asked the others if you don't mind. First of all, do you have any continuing business interests that may be a conflict?

Sarah M. Thomas-Nededog:

No, I do not.

Chairperson Therese Terlaje:

I know you're still busy with all these other commitments, how would you rate your ability to attend meetings and to participate in the committee's that the board might ask you to serve on.

Sarah M. Thomas-Nededog:

I will definitely make this priority. I do not have any memberships to any other boards. I have not had one for a while on a government board and I do sit on the nonprofit to nonprofit boards, but I'm feel comfortable that I'm able to balance my schedules and make this a priority. This is a very important board and I understand that, and I will certainly do everything I can to make every meeting.



Chairperson Therese Terlaje:

Alright it seems that you've given us a concrete list of priorities so maybe the other questions I don't need to specifically ask you because you have stated in your priorities that these are also your priorities so I want to thank you for that and for being very concrete about that and just encourage you and wish you the best in this endeavor. I'd like to now open it to Senator Perez if you have any questions.

Senator Sabina Perez:

Hafa adai Ms. Nededog I just appreciate that the depth and breadth of your experience and you've seen things from as a social worker to a policy analyst and the government and now in the nonprofit sector. So, it is, I think being on the board you provide that perspective and also the ability to work collaboratively and maybe be the glue to the board with your skills, interpersonal skills. So, yeah, I think you'll be a great. You'll be a great addition to this board I guess one of the questions that I have is you know, we talked about procurement issues, and do you see your position in the nonprofit sector, how do you see procurement issues being addressed as in the nonprofit sector and working for being a part of the board?

Sarah M. Thomas-Nededog:

Okay, I'm not quite sure that I understand the question but if the question is what the process is or how do nonprofits generally respond to procurement or how would this be aligned with the hospital what.

Senator Sabina Perez:

Yes, I guess the question is how you would align in the hospital.

Sarah Thomas Nededog:

Okay well I would think and if I am confirmed as a board member that the hospital would follow all proper procurement processes and that would be a responsibility board to ensure that they do. If at any time there is a non-profit who may come, who may respond to a request for quote or be involved in some way with the hospital's procurement process, if I'm involved with that nonprofit because there's a lot of nonprofits that may not be members of *Payu-ta* and WestCare Pacific Islands, which I work with. I don't see that we would respond to a hospital procurement request. But if there is one or if there's any other business that would come before me that I believe there would be a conflict of interest in any way, I think it's really important to be transparent and to protect the credibility of the governor, of the hospital. So, I don't foresee that there would be but in the event that there would be an entity that would come forward that I have some involvement in I would disclose that or even discuss that with legal counsel if

it's really a conflict of interest that I need to recuse myself thank you for the good question.

Senator Sabina Perez:

Thank you so much. I've no further questions but thank you.

Chairperson Therese Terlaje:

Thank You senator Perez senator Castro.

Senator William Castro:

Just a short commentary. Man, I'm sure I've known soon-to-be Dr. Nededog since the days of Dr. David Simmons whose time in the late 90's in short summary highly qualified accomplished no-nonsense straight shooter. I wish you the best and you have my vote of confidence.

Sarah M. Thomas-Nededog:

Thank You Senator Castro.

Chairperson Therese Terlaje:

Thank You Senator. Senator Marsh Taitano.

Senator Kelly G. Marsh (Taitano), PhD.:

Hafa adai yan manana si yu'os. It's a pleasure to see you here today Sarah. We've known each other since back in the day when we both grew up on the streets of Dededo so that has always been a special memory to me as I've seen you just go out there and just really serve the community and succeed. I always got a small amount of pleasure somehow of being able to say that I knew you like back when so that's wonderful and because of that I said I've seen you serve the community over the decades and have been so proud of the many things that you've done where you truly do. I mean you don't just say these things but you've worked with the marginalized the disenfranchised, the veterans, the homeless and you just don't make yourself aware of them and their issues but you've put yourself out there like wholeheartedly heart and soul and you've rolled up your sleeves and you've just tried to figure out the ways to best serve them and do the hard work to try to take care of them and bring them back into the folds of society as has been mentioned your master's degree. So it's not just the going out there in serving which are great accomplishments and so admirable of themselves but you've also taken the time to go and get the education your master's degree in administration and nonprofit management, sociology, psychology, all of those tools that have armed you and served as also well and of course in the roles that you are in now, just have created that great network of understanding with our nonprofits that are out there also likewise serving our



community and in various ways that perhaps governmental agencies have not been able to do or need partners that are out there working alongside them with the social workers and other. So, in those features, those traits that you have, I see the many things that you can be bringing to the board and that are so necessary and I don't know that there's been a person with quite your background that served on the board. So, I'm really looking forward to the difference that you can be making we have sort of unique situations where we have indigenous communities there are the indigenous Chamorro, of course, but we have many other indigenous peoples that are here from other places in Micronesia the rest of the Pacific Southeast Asia and along with that are the regional cultures that can make such a different landscape for the healthcare system there are socio-economic and cultural issues that come along with our situation in the community. And, as I mentioned they impact the way that our healthcare system interacts with our community and the way that it needs to respond to our community some of what come up and I've had to deal with this as I had applied to go to school in Australia I was treated very differently to a lot of other applicants because of our health situations in Micronesia. I had to send them x-rays screens of my lungs and things like this that if I was coming out of somewhere in the mainland I wouldn't have had to do but it's because of some of what we deal with here we have high rates of TB (tuberculosis) and TB carriers in our region. We've had people that have had incurable types of TB that have exposed some of our community members and we actually have leprosy in our region. So, issues like that maybe many other regions don't have to deal with and I know that you're very familiar with those kind of issues and have that combination of understanding the socio economics the cultural the indigenous community and the types of health care issues that come with it. I also think that you bring with you understanding the changing health services landscape. I've been paying attention to you and you even more so than me has just seen the way that hospitals around the world are now working to really incorporate nonprofits because they are an important and integral part of our community health care. I've seen that traditional forms of health care are now being able to be part of the hospital system we've seen in Australia that the aboriginals are now able to administer some of their traditional health care in the hospitals and it's so reassuring to hear that you have the experience with the accreditation processes that's something that as I mentioned before is continual, it never goes away. We have to stay on top of our accreditation game because it's about continuing to improve ourselves that's what they want to see in accreditation and it's important especially because we're in the region that we are that we do so in a way that takes into real consideration our real community issues and ways that we can be improving them and definitely. I know you to be a person that does not run away from problems a community any community always has issues its contending with and the true marker of a community and its members is the way that it handles them. You are a person who rolls up your sleeves and looks those problems right in the eye and tries to figure out how to how to solve them. So, that's so needed. So, obviously with

everything that I've said, you have my full support for your nomination. *Si Yu'os ma'åse'* for accepting it.

Sarah M. Thomas-Nededog:

Thank you, senator.

Chairperson Therese Terlaje:

Thank You senator. Senator Lee.

Senator Régine Biscoe Lee:

Thank you very much madam chair. I will disclose for the record that I've known this wonderful woman sitting in front of us for my entire life. She, as she said, she's a social worker and I'm a daughter of the social worker so I grew up around auntie Sarah and I'm very grateful for her work in the past few decades but also for accepting the governor's nomination, for not running away from our problems but running towards them and trying to assist us in helping to solve them. I have great confidence that you will bring all of your wealth of knowledge but also your network to bear for the people of Guam in this role and so because I know you so well and I know that you have very high standards and expectations for me. I also have very high standards and expectations for you so I have a few questions for you and I wanted to give you an opportunity to talk a little bit about some of the conversations over the last few years at APIL, where you've attended, and I know that the idea of a possible solution in terms of regional health insurance has come up in several conversations. I just wanted to have you give you an opportunity to talk a little bit about that and how that could be a potential solution not just for a GMH but for our entire region.

Sarah M. Thomas-Nededog:

Thank You senator. I appreciate that your acknowledgment of our work over the years with the association of Pacific Island Legislators. At one time I was the Central Secretariat and have continued to be participatory in their board meetings and in their General Assembly as *Payu-ta* is a sister organization of APIL. Then most recently Micronesian Youth Services Networker which I was also co-founder, so I appreciate the openness of our legislators throughout the Pacific in listening to what has been brought forward from nonprofits and youth service advocates relative to some of the discussion. I mean really, I don't think there's been a time in probably the last 20-some years that I've been at APIL meetings that they haven't talked about healthcare issue. I mean and it just seems like as many times and as many resolutions that have been passed there's still so much work that needs to be done and part of it perhaps might be that once those resolutions are passed at APIL the expectation is that all the respective policy makers come home and introduce all these legislations, right, and so some of that has been done some of it has

not one of the, I think one area, of within our region that has passed legislation for universal health care which has been one of the things that have been brought up year after year. It's been the Republic of Palau and with Guam I think were, you know, I say this all the time Guam is an anomaly because you know we are very much a part of the United States but we are Pacific Islanders so our hearts and the strategies that we always look to must also encompass and embrace that of our Micronesia brothers and sisters and perhaps even to the greater Pacific. So, we're always looking at ways and means to develop strategies and to come up with resolutions for healthcare that also respond and resolve, and it makes all the sense in the world because we have on our island. Some of the most progressive healthcare services, it may not be everything but, it's perceived in our region as being the most progressive and therefore a lot of people will come to us to be responsive and as you said Senator Lee that the idea of regional healthcare the ideas of universal healthcare have been brought up in APIL and I think there we need to constantly revisit. If I am confirmed to the Guam Memorial Hospital Board, you can be assured that I'm going to be sitting in on those meetings as well as those of MIF, which is the Micronesian Island forum, which is comprised of our governors and presidents of Micronesia because I think it's really important to have that tie-in. We must be together as best possible we have some differences in our political relationships with the United States and other superpowers but I think there's more that brings us together that we need to find those commonalities and embrace them and particularly at the hospital we will see the diversity of patients that come to us and I think it's important for the hospital to be culturally competent and to also be very aware of what the political social and economic issues are and particularly for the board and to have great sensitivity to that. As you as you said very eloquently, we need to forge those partnerships because that's the way we need to go, we can't do this by ourselves and we're very much involved with consumers that come to us from all over not just Micronesia but Asia as well. So, what is it that we can do to have those entities contribute to the expansion and improvement of our hospital, our people's hospital, our public hospital and what is it that we can do at the same time to ensure that we're being responsive to their needs.

Senator Régine Biscoe Lee:

Thank you very much Sarah. One last kind of point that I wanted to make and hopefully you'll be able to give us another very thoughtful response. You mentioned partnerships and you were here not too long ago presenting some of the feedback and the resolutions from the *Payu-ta* conference and you had brought up this very poignant idea and discussed with us the United Nations Sustainability Development Goals and one of those is partnerships and so I just wanted to give you an opportunity, I know that many of my colleagues are taking a look at the SDGs and figuring out how we can incorporate those into our legislation and our strategy going forward because it really touches on every aspect of our lives and to ensure that we're developing sustainable communities and

strong institutions that we're working to reduce inequality but also here in terms of the good health and well-being of our community. So, I just wanted to give you an opportunity to expand on the SDGs as well.

Sarah M. Thomas-Nededog:

Thank you, Senator Lee. I want to say, I'm trying to think of the year, was in 2015 the United Nations passed at the short title of agenda 2030. Basically agenda 2030 is about, is crafting specific strategies to address issues around the world relative to poverty education sanitation and health care and all of those fundamental services that our people need to be healthy, safe, and progressive. There are actually 16 of those strategies in agenda 2030 that embrace what I've shared with you in terms of fundamental needs of our people and then SDG or Sustainable Development Goals seventeen (17) is partnerships. This partnership calls for not only a relationship internally but regionally and really globally. So, it starts with relationships between for example, relationships between government and the nonprofit organizations and with the business sector and with regions and sub-regions. You know, I love that the United Nations sees this and that's because really in their quest to bring us all together. They have not done so well in previous incentives or initiatives. So, the agenda 2030 is kind of a refined strategy and it says that we cannot accomplish anything by ourselves. Government can't do it by ourselves. Nonprofits can't do it by themselves. Countries can't do it by their selves. Islands can't do it by themselves. As we've already spoke earlier, we see the relationship between what's going on here on Guam with our sub region and our region. I think it's critical for us to be very aware and familiar with agenda 2030. I appreciate Senator Lee bringing this up because we are under the United States when we go before the United Nations. However, we don't know exactly how the United States has factored Guam into this bigger plan. So, it's really awesome that through *Payu-ta* and through other relationships. We have with the Pacific Islands Guam, is being embraced from that angle as well so they want to know, everyone wants to know what we are going to do relative to these Sustainable Development Goals. We have seen most recently Senator Kalani English from the state of Hawaii who's very involved in the Pacific and with the APIL and the other regional entities he has come forward and said Hawaii is going to do it you know if the United States chooses to do it and how they choose to do it, that's all good but, the state of Hawaii is going to focus on the Sustainable Development Goals and I think it was an invitation and a go pass for all other entities to say we can do this on our own just to make sure that how we respond to these sustainable development goals is relevant and meaningful to Guam because if someone else is going to speak for us and may not get there right. This is also my hope that the Guam legislature does take a look at the SDGs and formulates its own plan and I will assure you that I will be here for you to provide any kind of consult or any support that I could possibly give you to move

towards this direction. I thank you for bringing that up so, absolutely right and APIL, I think is going to meet in June so if you want to start getting together on this let's do it.

Senator Régine Biscoe Lee:

Let's do it. Thank you so much Sarah. Also, I just want to thank you in advance for your support and oversight over our GMH leadership. I know that we're all looking forward to supporting them and then helping them as they move forward, and you mentioned moving us all forward in a healthy, safe, and progressive way so I certainly look forward to doing that and I wholeheartedly support your nomination *Si Yu'os ma'âse'*.

Sarah M. Thomas-Nededog:

Thank You, senator Lee.

Chairperson Therese Terlaje:

Thank You Senator. Again, Sarah, thank you again for accepting this nomination I want for the record to note that there are other people who have signed up in support including Benita Manglona, Lillian Posadas, Yvonne Naputi, Christina Cruz, Sam Elitico, Aja Ramos, Clifford MT Nededog, Si Yu'os ma'åse' all of you for being here. We also have received written testimony from Cathy Llarmo and Kathleen Tolosa in support. I want to especially thank the administrators from GMH the administrator Lillian Posadas and the CFO Benita Manglona for your support of the nominees this morning and for your attendance and thank you again.
