

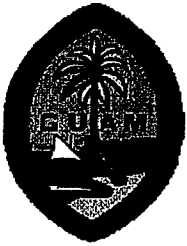

Summary of Testimony and Discussion

Vice Speaker Telena Nelson: Before we move forward, I don't anticipate anything happening in today's confirmation hearing, but in light of what has happened in the recent past, I want to just lay down some of the rules. I am requesting that those that are here to give testimony give their testimony in a professional manner. Please do not use profanity or address any of the members that are present within the hearing room. Please address the body. Also, refrain from obscene gestures and anything that can be viewed as perhaps criminal in accordance with current law.

Vice Speaker Telena Nelson: *see attached Opening Statement*

Zenon Belanger: My name is Zenon Belanger. I'm from the village of Mongmong, born and raised on Guam, grew up in Chalan Pago.

Zenon Belanger: *see attached Testimony*

Vice Speaker Telena Nelson: Thank you Mr. Belanger. I will now offer my colleagues if they have any questions.

Sen. Telo Taitague: Hafa Adai and thank you so much for stepping up to the plate. I know you're a busy man. I've known you and your wife for many years now and I've seen you at many different events and you're always there to be a part of the community, too, so my hat's off to you on that as well. As you know, there was a confirmation hearing for Dan Tydingco recently. Are you familiar with him? And how do you feel about his confirmation?

Zenon Belanger: I've never worked with Dan in the past. I've seen him in social circles and I know that he's worked with the various senators in the legislature, but I've never worked with him or had any social contact with him other than bumping into him in public. I can't respond or comment on his behavior.

Sen. Telo Taitague: Okay, well thank you so much, and I wish you the best of luck. I know you'll be a great plus to the airport board. Thank you.

Sen. Wil Castro: Thank You Madam Chair. Congratulations on your appointment. The full disclosure, Madam Chair. I've known Mr. Belanger for the good part of 25 years. He was associated with a project at the University of Guam while I was on the board and vice president with the student government at the time. He had a tremendous reputation both with the president at the time, the acting chair, and then the chairman. Then, later on as I progressed in this community, I had the privilege of serving with him. I still have that privilege of serving with him in the oldest CHamoru fraternal organization in the world, and that would be the Young Men's League of Guam. I want to just emphasize, for the record, typically you know the average person is not aware of your experiences, but you're a highly qualified, highly reputable professional in the engineering field and I think you'd be a tremendous asset to the airport. I congratulate you and I thank you, and I thank the administration for having the foresight to give you the opportunity to serve the community in this capacity. So, God bless you in your service and congratulations to you and your family. And by the way, although it has

nothing to do necessarily with your credentials, it has a lot to do with your character. You're an upstanding member of this community and I think my most recent reference would be the accomplishments of your son, who's attending Father Duenas Memorial High School and the JROTC program. Congratulations again and Godspeed.

Zenon Belanger: Thank you Senator Castro.

Sen. Therese Terlaje: Thank you Madam Chair. Thank You Mr. Belanger for accepting this nomination and being willing to serve on this board. There are some serious issues that are facing the airport right now and some of these, you know, they're similar to other issues that are faced by autonomous agencies. But first of all, may I ask, because in your testimony you had stated your experience and I think you sound perfectly qualified to sit on the board. You've got much experience working with the government; I think you know the government very well. Of course, you're an engineer. That's something that's going to be very useful to the board, but is there any issue with contracting? Is there going to be any issue with conflict of interests and pursuing business with the airport?

Zenon Belanger: On the fuel farm project that we have, we submitted the 100% design for the upgrade of the electrical system and the drainage system at the fuel farm, so we should be done with that hopefully in about two weeks, and then on the runway pavement design, that's a contract that we picked up over a year ago and the Phase One portion is supposed to finish by the end of April and the Phase Two portion is supposed to end by the end of May. It may slip into June. But other than that I have no other conflicts.

Sen. Therese Terlaje: Does this preclude you then from doing business, like you're currently involved in subcontracting or directly contracting with the airport?

Zenon Belanger: That's correct. My wife Debbie and I had issues with my going onto the airport board, because she's on the GCC board, and her tenure at the board has been over ten years at GCC. We have never applied for any RFPs or construction bidding there because of the potential for conflict. We take that very highly, so I looked at the opportunities of the airport and I said, well, I can put that aside and pursue other activities. There's a lot of work in the build-up. There's other governmental work that we can look at and go from there.

Sen. Therese Terlaje: All right, well, that's good, I think that's gonna be a very clear path then. Speaking of procurement at the airport, I'm sure you're aware of, it's been all over the news about procurement issues regarding the concession contracts, right? And so that's been tied up in court for a while, but in the decision, the judge specifically said that the board did not follow the criteria that was mandated by the legislature and we've also seen other boards who were advised by the Attorney General and those in other cases. They were advised by the Attorney General and yet, they acted in a manner that the Attorney General said would be contrary to law. And so, of course, we don't want the attorneys to be the one deciding policy, that's what the board members are supposed to do, but the attorneys are giving advice. And in particular, when the advice says something's legal or not legal, I guess I'm just wondering, what's your experience in dealing with boards and how are you going to be able to handle that when you know

these are very high stakes for contractors that are involved in these procurements. I imagine that there's a lot of pressure on board members that are dealing with these large amounts in procurement, for example, at the airport. I just wanted to ask you how do you feel about that? And do you have any insight of how to handle that in this type of situation? Sorry, and you're also coming into a board where there's many members who will be there from these past procurements, right, and so you're the new person coming in and either put in a position to be critical of their actions, or you know, do something different perhaps. I guess that's what I wanted to see, how you feel about that?

Zenon Belanger: From 1986 to 1991, I worked in the litigation field looking at construction projects that didn't pan out properly. We had two questions that we are always asked. I've traveled 40 weeks out of the year all over the U.S. looking at problem projects. The two questions were: why did it take so long? And the other question was: why did it cost so much? And with that, we looked at the ethics of what happened and it was through a lot of different types of contracts. We looked at nuclear power plants. We looked at levies that collapsed in the Sacramento Delta. We looked at hospitals and we looked at other projects. So, being familiar with the legality of things, I even learned that sometimes what looks proper on the surface may not be proper to even my client. Just as a short example, we had an expansion of a hospital and the hospital hired the top hospital contractor in Southern California. 18 months, 20 million dollars, to 31 months to 23 million dollars, so they were asking for an additional three million dollars and extended overhead. Everything looked good. I was working on the construction side for the hospital, not the damages side. On the damages side, the hospital hired all these surgeons and nurses and stuff, and they lost eight million dollars. So unfortunately for the contractor, he lost the three million that he spent for extended overhead, plus another four million dollars in fees or you know, the penalties, because of the hospital having to pay for their salaries and stuff. I'm aware of some of those issues and stuff, so it's difficult to just look at what's there and say, okay, what do we have? It's when it comes to looking at the legal side, the board may have an attorney on the board, but from time to time, we may have to seek additional counsel, just so that we can understand where we're at - whether we're following the rules and stuff. And if the AG gets involved, it's a matter of who's right or wrong. And I think the AG may be higher than the attorney at the airport, that's my understanding.

Sen. Therese Terlaje: It's been debated by different boards. They don't necessarily listen to the AG, but let me ask you something else. I read the transition report regarding the airport and they're making some recommendations regarding, of course: updating the master plan, finishing that construction that is over budget and over extended, and for the corridor, and other issues revolving around that. Apparently, because of its exceeded budget, its put off the other capital improvement projects at the airport. Now, it's going to be up to the board to find other ways to fund those or prioritize them. I just kind of review the news for the controversies over the airport in the last few years and one of them was about hiring a contractor who had been prosecuted or challenged in court regarding criminal complaints. He had actually been prosecuted and yet, he had been hired by the board as a consultant. We're not there during these transactions, but I guess that's the type of thing the public's looking at. And then the amount of money of the contract was the other item that was in the news. It's over a million dollars. But I'm also looking at things like when I first became a senator, people talked to me a lot about seemingly simple, compared to huge expansion projects,

but seemingly simple things about the airport that could be improved and made better for the people of Guam. For example, parking, the parking rates were going up at the time and they couldn't see any reason for that. It was the government's land, the government's everything, that really built the airport up and yet when you lease out this parking structure to the private contractor, they make profit, the airport makes money, and the people of Guam just keep paying and paying over and over. That's one example where that small change has made a big impact to how we greet people at the airport, how we say goodbye to people at the airport, and really, we pretty much drop them off now in order to avoid the cost or the hassle of getting into that parking. I'm just wondering if you have any ideas. And the bathrooms were the other biggest complaint. Tourists are seeing this. In addition to capital improvement projects, and I know that the bathrooms will be included in this third-floor corridor project - that's how it was explained to us, that it will also be addressed, so that's good. I'm trying to show examples of things that the people of Guam continued to pay for at the airport, despite the airport being an autonomous agency and supposedly raising its money. People of Guam are paying for customs to rent space at the airport and I just want to know how you feel about those? Or if you have any other ideas where the airport could make some changes that would really make it more user friendly for the people of Guam. That still does not sit well with me. We all know customs is integral if we're going to have tourism, if we're going to have import/export. We need customs, and the fact that customs is proposing to raise their fees to charge all of us more, just so that they can pay off their space at the airport. I'm just wondering if you have any ideas that you might be able to flush out with the board to help us in this regard?

Zenon Belanger: The unspoken word is there's been a lot of issues because of 9/11 and the third floor corridor work is part of that. And so, because of the 9/11 issues, the airport has to be self-sustaining. That means power, that means water, that means all the different utilities – and they're not at the moment. It's a balance on: how do you handle that? Because we are a small island, and we may not be able to be totally self-sustaining at the airport, so it's a balance on how do you handle that? Part of the other issue is they continue to truck the fuel from the fuel farm over to the airplanes and it may be better to have a pipeline that goes there and it will save on any future accidents, and it's probably easier. It may cost some money but the issues on parking and the bathrooms, my understanding is there's a vendor that cleans the airport and they clean the bathrooms. There is a lot of traffic there. I've seen the bathrooms at times very clean, and at times when there's a lot of traffic, where it needs to be cleaned. And the parking issue, I agree with you that the rates are quite high and sometimes it prevents all of us from seeing our seeing our loved ones depart. Those are issues that I may have to look at and get more familiar with before I can comment on how we can handle that, but I'll take your ideas.

Sen. Therese Terlaje: I appreciate that. I'm just asking if you could, while you're on the board, think of it from all of the regular people of Guam, regular users' perspective also. That's what we want to be able to do at the airport, right? We want to be able to greet people. We want to drop them off. We want to say goodbye and we want to feel like this airport is working for all of us. Si Yu'os ma'ase' again for your service on this board.

Zenon Belanger: As an engineer, we always ask people around us and people that are in the industry: how can we always improve? So, what you mentioned are some of the

things that we can improve on, and I'll continue to ask those questions as I serve on the board or even after I'm not on the board, because it does help improve our island.

Sen. Therese Terlaje: Yes, thank you. Thank you Madam Chair.

Vice Speaker Telena Nelson: I'd like to thank you Mr. Belanger for accepting this nomination. I, too, share the same sentiments as Senator Terlaje. If you're there for 15 minutes, you have to pay two dollars. If you're there for 30 minutes, you have to pay four, and so you know, really, the people are expecting a service to be at least reasonable. Perhaps the first 30 minutes is free, and it used to be that way, but now they're charging you for every minute you spend and many times, maybe some of us is just a quick drop-off or a quick pickup, and we're not even there for 15 minutes. And so, I hope that as a member of the board, if you are confirmed, that you look into these things that may be minimal, but it impacts our island a great deal. It impacts everyone. Also, I am perhaps comforted that you have experience with engineering and litigation issues as far as construction, because being the oversight chair for the airport and - this is fairly new to me - and discussions on the concession era agreements, and also the third-floor corridor delays, which is costing the government more than multimillion dollars. I think we need someone with the courage and also the expertise to say this is right or this is wrong. And so, I hope that you fight for what is right, and even if it's probably a little bit difficult, and perhaps there's something else that the people of Guam are not seeing. Customs and Quarantine, when I was first a senator, was my oversight agency, and I didn't agree with the exuberant cost of rent that they were paying. It was over two million dollars and essentially, the airport cannot function without Customs and Quarantine. If Customs and Quarantine were to leave, the airport would not be able to receive passengers, and so I hope that can be revisited. I'm sure that there are ways that we can also ensure that they get the money that they have earned through the passenger fee and not have it funneled through the Guam International Airport Authority, so they can take up what is due to them off the top, but allow the Guam Customs and Quarantine to manage their own funding resource. So, thank you also for this service. It's truly a service, especially with your expertise, Guam is getting a good deal for you, too, as a nominee with your expertise, so I thank you for being open to stepping up.

Zenon Belanger: One of the things that we tried to do in our business is before we start fighting, we start talking and we communicate to try to determine what's the fight about and 90 percent of the time, we realize that sometimes it's a legal issue, sometimes it really is a problem. Now, if it is a problem, then how do we get around it? How do we solve that problem? And with all the professionals and the people that are there, we should be able to tackle these issues and take care of them. I've had legal issues were I looked at the owner of a construction company; he had me out there on Easter Sunday. We're walking across the villages: Sammy how do we take care of this issue? And he goes: I can move my superintendent, but can you give me two weeks? Because our other project is starting in two weeks and we won't have any more issues on this project. I said, I'll give you two weeks, that's all we had to talk about. Problem over, took ten minutes. But prior to that, it was like bang, bang, bang, every day for about a month. So sometimes, it's just a matter of finding out which button to press. And once we get there, most of the problems are solved and it's all through communications.

Vice Speaker Telena Nelson: All right, thank you very much sir. And I'd also like to thank your wife and your family for their support in this, for you. I understand it will impact some of your business aspects. I thank you for that sacrifice. The people of Guam thank you. It is now 2:31 p.m. We are still receiving testimony for the next 10 days. This confirmation hearing is adjourned. Thank you. God bless.
