**Relative to commending and congratulating the Guam Marianas Training Center for providing the Health and Allied Education Career Programs.**

1        **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I**  
2        ***MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3        **WHEREAS,** in 1999, the Guam Marianas Training Center was  
4        established primarily as a business and a computer school. It was one of the  
5        first business schools that offered a Computer Literacy Program from ages 7

1 to 99. Courses offered other than Computer Literacy included Accounting  
2 and Bookkeeping, Paralegal and Office Technology; and

3       **WHEREAS**, in 2003, the Guam Marianas Training Center opened the  
4 first privately owned Health and Allied school. To date, the Guam Marianas  
5 Training Center is the only private institution authorized by the Guam Board  
6 of Nurse Examiners pursuant to the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act  
7 (OBRA) and Public Law 24-20 to offer classes in Certified Nursing Assistant  
8 (CNA); and

9       **WHEREAS**, in addition to direct enrollment, the Guam Marianas  
10 Training Center has performed training contracts with the government of  
11 Guam and non-profit organizations as follows: the American Red Cross  
12 (trained personnel in computer literacy and applications); *Guma Mami* (trained  
13 personnel and clients in Computer Literacy, Bookkeeping and Accounting);  
14 the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal, under the Family Self Sufficiency  
15 (FSS) program (trained and successfully employed clients); the Agency for  
16 Human Resources Development (Job Training/Work Experience Program);  
17 the Guam Marianas Collection Agency/Guam Marianas Training Center  
18 (Career Development Specialists); and

19       **WHEREAS**, these trainees have left to work for the government of  
20 Guam and the private sector weaned from the government subsidy program.  
21 This program facilitated the growth of Guam Marianas Management Services,  
22 Inc.; and

23       **WHEREAS**, in 2005, the Agency for Human Resources Development  
24 approved a contract with Guam Marianas Training Center to provide training

1 for agency clients in the Health and Allied programs. Successfully graduated  
2 as follows:


9 **WHEREAS**, ninety-nine percent (99%) of the trainees have successfully  
10 completed the program, which is now nationally certified; now, therefore, be

13 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the  
14 people of Guam, recognize the Guam Marianas Training Center as a true  
15 partner in workforce development and the important mission of the Guam  
16 Marianas Training Center, and acknowledges that its programs in Health and  
17 Allied, Accounting and Bookkeeping and Computer Literacy contribute to the  
18 well being of the people on Guam; and be it further

19 **RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na*  
20 *Liheslaturan Guåhan*, further recognizes that Guam Marianas Training Center  
21 is also an approved testing site in National Certification for the National  
22 Healthcareer Association (NHA), a benchmark in Healthcare Certification.  
23 Furthermore, the Guam Marianas Training Center is also a member in good  
24 standing with the Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE),  
25 the largest national education association in the nation; now, therefore, be it

1       **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Executive  
2 Committee certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption  
3 hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Guam  
4 Marianas Training Center; to the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam's  
5 Delegate to the United States Congress; and to the Honorable Felix P.  
6 Camacho, *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*.
