



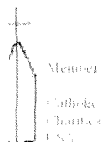

A Shelter Worker is on personal leave beginning December 31, 2012.

NUMBER OF CLIENTS

The count of the clients for this reporting quarter was three hundred six (306) adult and children who reside in the following Guma San Jose, Homeless Emergency Shelters.

B. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

October 9, 2012 Representatives from the University Of Guam Cooperative Extension Service Expanded Food & Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) held their last class for the clients. Certificates of completion were given.

October 11, 2012 Several clients attended a free parent workshop given by Department of Education Student Support Services Division Parent Family Community Outreach Program. Workshop was held at the Yigo gym.

Staff and a few clients attended the monthly CSS tent sales.

October 17, 2012 Department of Public Health and Social Service nurses, staff and along with three student nurses from the University Of Guam School Of Nursing conducted a immunization outreach for the children of GSJ. Outreach was held at GSJ lanai.

New Covenant Life Church sponsored their monthly dinners serving held at GSJ lanai.

The clients were transported to attend the monthly sponsored dinners by Saint John Episcopal Church. Serving held at their fellowship hall.

October 24, 2012 and November 13, 2012 Clients from the Men's Shelter assisted in planting in the garden, bush cut and cleaned the yard at the main shelter.

Kusinan Santa Barbara sponsored their monthly dinners serving held at their parish hall.

October 24, 2012 The Men Shelter Manager held a client meeting in Barrigada regarding rules and policy of the shelter.

October 29, 2012 and December 12, 2012 A client meeting was held by Acting Program Manager in Dededo regarding rules and policy of the shelter.

November 14-15, 20, 23, 27-30, 2012 and December 12, 15, 18 & 31, 2012 Clients from the Men's Shelter were at CSS main office to assist Support Service Division in bush cutting, cleaning and yard work.

November 16, 2012 Island Telephone Directory sponsored a dinner serving held at CSS main conference room.

November 22, 2012 Guadalupe Buckley, along with friends from Andersen Air Force Base sponsored a Thanksgiving luncheon serving held at GSJ lanai.

November 25, 2012 Guam Spirit Lions Club sponsored a dinner serving held at GSJ lanai.

November 26, 2012 Elizabeth Ignacio from DPHSS/BOSSA monitored both shelters.

December 17, 2012 Okkodo High School Business Class Students/Service Learning Representatives sponsored a luncheon and provided entertainment for the clients and staff of GSJ. The activity was held at Okkodo High School.

December 18, 2012 GTA TeleGuam employees presented a variety of toys to the children of GSJ.

December 19, 2012 Okkodo High School Business Class Students/Service Learning Representatives presented gifts to GSJ children, provided light refreshments and sang Christmas songs. The activity was held at Okkodo High School.

December 20, 2012 Saint Thomas Aquinas School sponsored a dinner serving held at GSJ lanai.

December 24, 2012 Two Agency for Human Resources Development (AHRD) winter session trainees was stationed at the Dededo shelter.

December 29, 2012 Taitingfong family sponsored a dinner and gave gifts to the children. Serving held at GSJ lanai.

CONFERENCE AND/OR TRAINING

October 1, 2012 Caseworker attended a presentation by Greg Borja of the Veterans Affairs Office. Presentation was held at CSS conference room.

On October 3, 2012 two trained Shelter Workers completed input of client data for FY 2012 for the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) with Salvation Army.

October 5, 2012 Caseworker attended the last training given by the University Of Guam School Of Social Work Professors on various topics of social work. Certificates of completion were given.

October 13, 2012 Acting Program Manager Jacinta Perez attended the Early Childhood Conference for Parents & Child Care Providers: Supporting Language Development for All Young Children, Birth to 8 Years. Conference was held at Westin Guam Resort & Spa.

October 19, 2012 Both Acting Program Manager and Men's Shelter Manager attended the Culture & Learning Forum: Enriching and Contextualizing Teaching and Learning in Pacific Island settings to Improve Achievement. Forum was held at Outrigger Resort Guam.

October 27, 2012 Five Shelter Workers attended the pesticide training held at CSS main conference room. Training was conducted by Mr. Benny San Nicolas of ECOLAB.

October 27, 2012 Acting Program Manager attended a conference on the Series 1 Living with Auto Immune Disease held at the Guam Marriot Resort and Spa.

November 10, 2012 Acting Program Manager participated in the Healthy Mommy, Healthy Baby outreach sponsored by Department of Public Health and Social Service held at Micronesia Mall.

November 17, 2012 Six GSI staff attended the pesticide training given by Mr. Benny San Nicolas of ECOLAB. Training was held at CSS main conference room.

December 5, 2012 A Shelter Worker attended the Pesticide training held at CSS conference room. The training was given by Benny San Nicolas of ECOLAB.
Update: All GSI staff are trained and certified.

December 6, 2012 Acting Program Manager and Men's Shelter Manager attended the Department of Public Health Non Communicable Disease meeting held at the Marriot Hotel in Tumon.

C. SERVICES PROVIDED

Fifty-six (56) cases or one hundred fifteen (115) individuals were provided with four thousand nine hundred twenty-eight (4928) meals. Eighty-two (82) cases or one hundred sixty-nine (169) individuals were provided with seven hundred twenty-eight (728) transportation services. The clients made a total of one thousand five hundred ten (1510) phone calls.

These transportation services were provided to and from the office/shelter, job sites, job search, job interviews, Catholic Social Service Office, home search, workshops, sponsored dinners, Salvation Army, Mayor's Office, Superior Court, Guam Public Guardian, DPHSS, GMHA, DMHSA, AHRD, DOE, DISID, GHURA, super markets, etc.

Follow ups were made to GHURA, Salvation Army on applications for housing assistance. Follow ups were made on applications submitted to various employers for employment via phone calls and transporting clients to the job sites.

D. ACCOMPLISHMENT

Twenty-six (26) cases or eighty-six (86) individuals were able to rent on their own or find a place with family or friends. Of the twenty-six (26) cases:

Twenty-one (21) cases or seventy-three (73) individuals found a place with family and or friends.

Two (02) cases or ten (10) individuals were able to rent on their own.

Two (02) cases or two (02) individuals relocated off island.

One (01) case or one (01) individual was approved by Salvation Army Emergency Solution Grant Program for rental assistance.

E. PROGRAM FUNCTIONS

Main Shelter at 117Catalina Lane, Dededo

Client

A Chamorro couple was housed on October 4, 2012. The female was also pregnant due to deliver in late October. Both are unemployed, however they receive public benefits. Prior to entry, the couple was living in the pavilions by the Tamuning mayor's office for several weeks. Family members were unable to assist them with shelter. They are on the waiting list for GHURA. On October 19, 2012 she gave birth to a healthy baby boy. Friends have been assisting them with donations to help with their needs. The male individual is currently looking for employment and shelter. The family moved out on December 3, 2012.

A 29 year old Caucasian single woman was housed as an emergency for 24 hours on November 27, 2012. Guam Airport Police referred the individual to GSJ. She had been on island for a little over a week from New York. She was hired to work at a club in Tumon. However, she had trouble with the management and her roommates were also stealing from her. She became stressed to a point where she wasn't sleeping and eating well. Prior to coming into the shelter she was at GMH because she fell and hit her head at her apartment. The individual has been in contact with her boyfriend in New York in hopes to purchase a plane ticket back. GSJ provided meals and the use of the computer to contact her boyfriend and family. On November 28, 2012 she retrieved her belongings at GSJ and informed the staff she will be heading back to New York.

Eviction

A family of three was housed on October 4, 2012. The male individual is employed full time at a construction company. The family was referred to Salvation Army for possible rental assistance. They also receive public benefits. During their time at GSJ, problems had arised with the couple constantly

arguing. On October 24, 2012 during the early morning hours, the staff on duty called the police. The female individual stated that she was threaten and slapped by her common law. A call was made to Alee Shelter where the woman was admitted, however, returned to GSJ later in the day to continue her term. The male individual was evicted on October 24, 2012.

Update: The female individual was evicted on November 7, 2012 for no call no show for more than two consecutive nights.

A family of seven were housed on October 8, 2012, however were evicted on October 11, 2012 for no call no show. The family never returned.

A family of three were housed on October 25, 2012, however were evicted on October 29, 2012 for no call no show. The family never returned.

A Chuukese single mother of three on their second term with GSJ was evicted on November 13, 2012 for non compliance of house rules and policy and no call no show for more than two consecutive nights.

A single Chamorro woman on her second term with GSJ was evicted on November 13, 2012 for no call no show for more than two consecutive nights.

A single Chamorro female was housed on November 6, 2012 was evicted on December 20, 2012 for alcohol intoxication.

A Chamorro family of seven was housed on November 13, 2012 was evicted on December 23, 2012 for non compliance to house rules and policy. Prior, the Acting Program Manager spoke to the female head of household regarding previous incidences of non compliance.

A couple of Caucasian and Chamorro decent was housed on December 24, 2012 was evicted on December 26, 2012 for two consecutive days no call no show.

Re Housing

Four (04) cases or thirteen (13) individuals reapplied and were housed during the reporting quarter.

Program Needs/Discrepancies

A new washing machine and two new refrigerators were purchased for the reporting quarter. The new refrigerators are to replace the current ones which are leaking and have problems with temperature.

October 5, 2012 plumbers from Guam Plumbing cleared a clogged pipe that was causing a back up in the kitchen sink on the right wing of the building.

October 9, 2012 workers from J.C. Reyes Construction began working on the left wing kitchen counters and both ADA restrooms.

New and recurring leaks and water bubbles have been spotted in several parts of the facility's ceilings. This was due to the heavy rains. The building contractor Arvin Builders and GHURA were contacted regarding the matter and awaiting their response.

Update: October 12, 2012 contractors assessed the damages. October 20, 21 & 27, 2012 contractors came to work on repairing the roof and ceiling.

October 17, 2012 Tanglao General Contractors assessed the office air conditioning units.

October 19, 2012 representative for Phoenix Pacific assessed the fire alarm panel.

November 7 & 8, 2012 Tanglao General Contractors assessed and cleaned the office air conditioning units.

November 16, 2012 Benny San Nicolas and Yuki Tsukahara from ECOLAB installed the dispenser for the cleaning solutions.

November 23, 2012 Support Service staff assessed the right wing kitchen faucet which is leaking. Update: On December 3, 2012 the kitchen faucet was replaced.

Men's Shelter at 119 Chapel Road, Barrigada

Client

A 51 year old Pohnpeian male is on his second term with GSJ. He does not receive food stamps therefore he is under GSJ meals program. He has been actively searching for employment. With the assistance of the Men's Shelter Manager, he was hired as a gas attendant for SHELL in early October. Currently he is saving his wages and searching for a place to rent. The individual moved out on December 15, 2012.

Eviction

A single 60 year old Caucasian male on his third term with GSJ was evicted on November 10, 2012 for alcohol. This individual had been evicted prior for alcohol intoxication.

A single 46 year old Chamorro male on his second term with GSJ was evicted on November 16, 2012 for no call no show for more than two consecutive nights.

A single 25 year old Chamorro male on his second term with GSJ was evicted on November 18, 2012 for belligerent attitude toward the staff. This individual had been warned of prior incidences.

A single 22 year old Chamorro male, also a DMHSA client, was evicted on November 29, 2012 for belligerent attitude toward the staff. This individual had been warned of prior incidences.

A single Filipino male was housed on November 20, 2012 was evicted on December 12, 2012 for consecutive two days no call no show.

A single Black male was housed on November 6, 2012 was evicted on December 10, 2012 for threatening another client.

A single Chamorro male was housed on November 15, 2012 was evicted on December 13, 2012 for two consecutive days no call no show.

Re Housing

Ten (10) cases or ten (10) individuals reapplied and were housed during the reporting quarter.

Program Needs/Discrepancies

October 6, 2012 Guam Plumbing repaired the broken water line after the meter connection.

Fire exit signs and smoke detectors need to be installed by Support Service Division staff. Guam Fire Department will conduct an inspection when installation is complete. This is currently pending for the reporting quarter.

November 17, 2012 Benny San Nicolas and Yuki Tsukahara from ECOLAB installed the dispenser for the cleaning solutions.

Screen doors in the front and back of the home needs replacement. Support Service was informed of the matter and is currently pending.

December 17, 2012 the circuit breaker that provides power to the office in the home went down. Support Service was informed and waiting for their response.

Company Van

Transportation service has been difficult for both shelters. The 2012 Dodge Caravan is wheel chair assessable, however, can only hold four non wheel chair passengers. The van is being utilized by both shelters. A van for the usage of the Men's Shelter is pending Executive Director's approval.

Update: November 28, 2012 Acting Program Manager and Men's Shelter Manager picked up a 2013 leased Nissan Quest van from Nissan Corp.

F. DONATION

G. CLIENT PROFILE

Case # 101324

A 63 year old Military Veteran was housed on October 8, 2012. He had been on Guam for two days staying at a motel in Tamuning. The individual came from the Philippines with no prior living arrangements and no family on island. He receives Social Security, has a pension from the military and was under GSJ meals program. Veteran Affairs Office was informed of client's status and a representative came down to meet with him. He was also referred to Case Management for additional services. However, on October 18, 2012 he departed Guam and returned to the Philippines.

Case # 111309

A single Korean woman was housed on November 9, 2012. She had been evicted by her friend. The individual is currently employed part time at a restaurant in Tumon and receives food stamps and Medicaid. While at GSJ, she was referred to Salvation Army for housing

assistance. They informed her that she will be assisted with 3 months of rent under the Emergency Solutions Grant Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program. She has been diligently following up with her GHURA housing applications and submitting the required documents. Currently, she is looking for a place to rent.

Case # 101328

A 62 year old single Chamorro female was housed on October 18, 2012. She is employed with Department of Labor Senior Citizen Employment Program (SCEP) and is detailed at Guam Energy Office. She receives public assistance. She had been homeless for several months. While at GSJ, she was referred to Salvation Army Emergency Solutions Grant Program for housing assistance. She was approved for assistance in November and began searching for a place to rent. On December 16, 2012 the individual moved into her own apartment in Tamuning.
