




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO POSTPONE THE VOTE ON THE PROPOSED  
CONSTITUTION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 15200.14 of the Government Code is  
3 repealed and reenacted to read:

4 "Section 15200.14. Referendum. The proposed Constitu-  
5 tion as so approved and modified by the Congress shall be  
6 submitted to the qualified voters of Guam for acceptance or  
7 rejection during an islandwide referendum to be held on  
8 August 4, 1979."

9 Section 2. Section 11 of Public Law 14-91 is hereby  
10 repealed and reenacted to read:

11 "Section 11. The sum of Sixty-Two Thousand Five  
12 Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$62,560.00) is appropriated from the  
13 General Fund to the Guam Constitutional Convention for the  
14 operation of the Convention, including the printing and  
15 publication of the official proceedings, records and  
16 documents of the Convention. All available balances from  
17 the appropriation made herein existing as of December 31,  
18 1978 is hereby returned to the General Fund."

1           Section 3. Section 3 of Public Law 14-84 is repealed and  
2 reenacted to read:

3           "Section 3. All properties not disposed of or supplies  
4 and materials not utilized by the Constitutional Convention  
5 as of December 31, 1979 shall be transferred to the Supply  
6 Management Division, Department of Administration, govern-  
7 ment of Guam, for re-issue to departments or agencies of  
8 government of Guam, as provided by procurement and supply  
9 regulations."

10          Section 4. The special local election for the purpose of  
11 electing one of those persons nominated in the special local  
12 Primary Election on June 2, 1979, to fill the vacancy in the  
13 Office of the Commissioner of Merizo shall be held simultaneously  
14 with the referendum on the proposed Guam Constitution, notwith-  
15 standing any provision of law, rule, regulation, executive order,  
16 proclamation or pronouncement to the contrary.

17          Section 5. For the purpose of conducting the special  
18 election for a vacancy in the office of the Commissioner of  
19 Merizo, Sections 2252 and 2509 of the Government Code are  
20 suspended for both the Primary and General Elections. In lieu  
21 of these sections, the Guam Election Commission shall establish  
22 procedures for manual tabulation of the vote.
