Dear Mr. Speaker:

I am returning herewith, Bill No. 11. Having evaluated the provision of this enactment, I have decided to allow it to pass into law without my signature.

The Lt. Governor and I respect the separation of powers, and the Legislature's status as a co-equal branch of Government, as well as your perogative to determine your operational requirements.

I am confident that this demonstrates the continuing spirit of cooperation that prevails between our two branches. We are mutually aware of the severe problem which face us in the months ahead and our need to work together to solve these grave concerns.

Among these concern we must address, are the Government deficit problem and the crying need to reorganize our government. I look forward to your continuing input and to working closely with the Legislature on these matter.

On a more technical note, we believe (and the Attorney General concurs) that section seven (7) in Bill No. 11 repeals the entire Section 8136 of 4 GCA. If that was not your intent, we offer the suggestions that you either re-enact Subsection (b) and (c) of 4 GCA Section 8136 or re-enact section seven (7) of Bill No. 11 to indicate that only subsection (a) of 4 GCA Section 8136 is ammended.

The Committee on Rules conducted a hearing on Bills 11 and 4 on January 15, 1987 at 8:45 a.m. in the Legislative Session Hall.

After adoption of the above-listed changes to the draft substitute bill under discussion by Committee on Rules, a substitute bill by Committee on Rules was adopted incorporating those changes and is attached with the caption "Substitute Committee on Rules".

The Committee on Rules also adopted a motion that a breakdown of the sums appropriated in Section 2 of the bill be attached to the Committee Report and are so attached. Additionally, the report of the Committee on Rules of the public hearing held on Bill No. 11 and Bill No. 4, held at 8:30 a.m. on Thursday, January 15, 1987 is attached to this report.

A motion was made, and with no objections was adopted, to place Bill 4, which is on the same subject as Bill 11, in the Inactive File. Copy of Bill 4 is also attached.

2. Section 4 and Section 5 of the draft substitute bill were deleted.
3. A new Section 4 was added to the bill indicating that the Committee on Rules shall reallocate funds appropriated to committees or members with the advance written consent of the members or committees and indicating also that no funds may be transferred without such consent.
4. A new Section 5 was added to the bill appropriating \$100,000.00 from the General Fund to the Commission on Self Determination for its duties as required by law.
5. A new Section 6 was added to the bill appropriating \$50,000.00 from the General Fund to the Guam Gaming Commission for its operational and personnel requirements until March 31, 1987. The Guam Gaming Commission is required to reimburse the General Fund when it receives expected revenues from Greyhound activities.
6. A new Section 7 was added to the bill amending 4 GCA §8136. Item (4) of Subsection (a) of that section was amended by adding the phrase "or lump sum annual payment" at the end of the section, so that the lump sum annual payments received by persons who are members of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund are considered non-base pay for purposes of making contributions to the fund.
7. Section 2 and Section 3 of the proposed Substitute Bill No. 11 under discussion remain the same in the final adopted version and are identical to Section 2 and Section 3 of the original Bill No. 11 introduced by the Committee on Rules.

COMMITTEE REPORT
COMMITTEE ON RULES
Bill 11 and Bill 4


The Committee on Rules of the 19th Guam Legislature met at 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 15, 1987 at the Session Hall. During the meeting, a draft substitute version of Bill No. 11 was taken up for purposes of discussion. The draft substitute bill differs from the original No. Bill 11 introduced by the Committee on Rules in the following manner:

1. In Section 1, the sum appropriated was changed from \$6,540,640.00 to \$7,049,140.00.
2. A new Section 5 was added appropriating \$96,550.00 from the General Fund for travel of the 19th Guam Legislature's members and staff and related expenses for negotiations and research related to the termination of the Power Pool Agreement.


During the discussion of the proposed substitute bill, the following changes were made to the proposed substitute bill:

1. In Section 1, at the end of that section, the last period was deleted and a comma inserted with the following phrase: "as follows:" and a breakdown of the allocation of the expenses of the 19th Guam Legislature was inserted to reflect how the appropriation in Section 1 is to be initially allocated by the Committee on Rules to the various categories of expenditures utilized by the Legislature. Also, Legal Counsel inserted the phrase "appropriated in this Section" to reflect the intent that the allocation in Section 1 is only for funds appropriated in Section 1.

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE
OPERATION OF THE FIRST SESSION OF THE
NINETEENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The sum of Six Million Five Hundred Forty Thousand Six
3 Hundred Forty Dollars (\$6,540,640.00) is appropriated from the General
4 Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund for the operations of the First
5 Regular Session of the Nineteenth Guam Legislature. The funds for the
6 operation of the Nineteenth Guam Legislature shall be allocated by the
7 Committee on Rules.

8 Section 2. The sum of Three Hundred Eighty-two Thousand Two
9 Hundred Dollars (\$382,200.00) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
10 Legislative Operations Fund for the provision of legislative office expenses,
11 including renovation, purchase of equipment and rental. The funds shall
12 be allocated by the Committee on Rules.

13 Section 3. The sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000) is
14 appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund to
15 provide improvements to the Legislature Building to raise health and safety
16 standards for the protection, health and welfare of the employees.

17 Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any
18 appropriation made available by law for the operations of the Eighteenth
19 Guam Legislature shall be available to the Nineteenth Guam Legislature and
20 may be expended to honor claims for payment.
