AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION
TO THE COMMISSION ON
SELF-DETERMINATION FOR ITS
OPERATION FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR
1989 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2 Section 1. There is appropriated the sum of Five Hundred Seventy
3 Thousand Dollars (\$570,000) to the Guam Commission on
4 Self-Determination from the General Fund for Calendar Year 1989
5 operations, professional service contracts, travel and marketing campaign.
6 Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
7 Department of Public Works, the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000)
8 for the purpose of renovating and expanding the Commissioners Office

1 in the Municipality of Ordot-Chalan Pago.

2 Section 3. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is appropriated
3 from the General Fund to Department of Administration, into a special
4 account, for the purpose of paying backwages, and all related costs,
5 damages, and fees for three (3) former employees of the Guam Energy
6 Office.

7 Section 4. The sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) is hereby
8 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Land
9 Management for the purpose of hiring one additional full time employee
10 to transcribe the minutes of the Territorial Planning Commission for
11 Fiscal Year 1989 and for other functions. Until the position is filled
12 any lapses from this appropriation may be used to hire a contractor for
13 such transcriptions.

14 Section 5. The sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000) is
15 appropriated from the General Fund for the construction of a roof and
16 floor at the Agat Community Center courtyard.

17 Section 6. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Three Hundred
18 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000) from the Tourist Attraction Fund,
19 to the Yigo Municipal Planning Council for the construction of a multi-
20 purpose community center in the Municipality of Yigo.

21 Section 7. The Yigo Municipal Planning Council is hereby directed
22 to utilize the architectural and engineering plans for the Barrigada
23 Community Center to construct the Yigo Community Center, thereby
24 saving the government the additional expense of architectural and
25 engineering studies.

26 Section 8. The Commissioner of the Municipality of Yigo, with
27 the concurrence of the Yigo Municipal Planning Council, shall select

1 the appropriate government-owned site for the construction of the
2 multi-purpose community center.

3 Section 9. The Governor is authorized to sell Portion of Legaspi
4 Street, Lot 10, Block 25, New Agana, containing 232.511 square meters,
5 and Lot 30-1-2, Block 25, New Agana, containing 40.62 square meters,
6 to abutting property owner Oliva T. Cruz, at fair market value.

7 Section 10. House Lot numbers 18, 13, 12 and 230 in the municipality
8 of Agat (Old Agat) are hereby rezoned from R-2 to Commercial in
9 conformity with abutting lots.

10 Section 11. The Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to sell
11 Lot 5007-R6 situated in Harmon, Municipality of Dededo, containing
12 an area of 1,385 square meters to the abutting land owner, Island
13 Equipment, at fair market value.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE JOHN F. QUAN
MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR OCEAN
RESOURCE SCIENCE AND RESEARCH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Article 6 is added to 17GCA Chapter 15.

Article 6. John F. Quan Memorial Scholarship
for Ocean Resource Science and Research

§15601. Declaration of Public Policy

It is and shall be the policy of the government to advance the understanding of the vast ocean resources within Guam's Exclusive Economic Zone through support for the education of deserving Guam students in the scientific field of ocean resource studies.

§15602. Purpose

The Legislature establishes the John F. Quan Memorial Scholarship for Ocean Resource Science and Research in memoriam of the leadership of

The Honorable Senator John F. Quan, an advocate of ownership rights to the ocean resources in Guam's 200 mile Exclusive Economic Zone -- both in Guam and as a member of the Council of State Governments western Legislative Conference, Ocean Resources Committee.

The John F. Quan Memorial Scholarship for Ocean Resource Science and Research shall be given to deserving undergraduate and graduate students of Guam who are accepted into programs which will help to advance Guam's scientific understanding of its ocean resources; living and non-living; on and below the sea floor; and, the protection of Guam's Exclusive Economic Zone from external impediments which have the potential to threaten resources within Guam's waters.

§15603. Entitlement to Scholarship

The Board is authorized to approve one (1) scholarship per year for undergraduate studies or training, and one (1) scholarship per year for graduate studies or training, to qualified applicants who have been accepted or admitted into programs leading to a degree or professional certificate in the field of ocean resources scientific studies. The scholarships provided in this Article are subject to the following limitations:

(a) The applicant must be a bona fide resident of Guam and a U.S. citizen who has achieved at least a grade point average of 3.00 in his or her high school or undergraduate studies, or an irrevocable letter of acceptance from an accredited university, college or professional institute recognized in the fields of ocean resource science, or oceanography.

(b) The applicant must agree that after completion of the course of studies for which the scholarship was granted, he or she will

remain or return to Guam to work on Guam for one (1) year, for each twelve (12) credits that he or she earned.

(c) The applicant must present to the Board prior to the granting of the award, satisfactory proof that he has been admitted to an accredited university, college or professional institute as a full time student to pursue a program of study in ocean resource science, including studies in:

- (i) living resources;
- (ii) non-living resources such as hard seabed materials, thermal venting, precious minerals, submarine currents; and other non-living resources;
- (iii) ocean research technology; and
- (iv) pollutant mitigation technology.

(d) No scholarship shall be made under this Article unless the Board has made a written finding that the proposed award, in the specific area of study to be pursued by the applicant, is needed for the development of Guam's ocean resources in the future. The Board shall annually review the fields of study in which ocean resource science scholarships have been awarded, and shall establish a list of priorities for the respective fields of study prior to considering new scholarship applicants.

§15604. Benefits

Students entitled to the receipt of the John F. Quan Memorial Scholarship for Ocean Resource Science and Research pursuant to this Article shall receive the following benefits:

- (a) Payment of tuition, fees, and related field research costs for a period of not more than four (4) scholastic years;
- (b) An annual grant of not more than Two Thousand Five Hundred

Dollars (\$2,500) per year to be disbursed in accordance with regulations adopted by the Board. In no case shall the total amount awarded under this paragraph, to a single individual exceed the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000)

§15605 Promotion of Scholarship

The University of Guam shall make available as requested by the Guam Department of Education, human and technical resources as is appropriate to promote the interest of Guam students in the field of Ocean Resource Science and Research, and to promote a better understanding of the resources indigenous to Guam's Exclusive Economic Zone. The Board may submit an annual budget, and promotional proposal to the Legislature under scholarship funding requests, to enhance student awareness of Guam's ocean resources, and the availability of scholarship funding for Ocean Resource Science and Research.
