Hafa Adal Mr. Speaker:

Transmitted herein is Bill 580, which I am pleased to say I have signed into law, as Public Law 19-45.

This legislation is a most fitting tribute to our late friend and collegue, Doc Sanchez, and will present a very real and tangible opportunity for the career employees of the government to increase their skills for the benefit of the entire community.

In signing this measure into law, I am requesting that an amendment be offered early in the 20th Legislature. While we certainly will benefit from educational upgrading in public administration, there are other areas of study which should be included in this opportunity. Scholarships in the areas of accounting, marine biology, agriculture, and forestry, to name just a few, would greatly increase our ability to provide "home grown" talent in the management and development of our island.

In this regard, I am asking that the law be amended to include other areas of study which will benefit the employees in furthering their skills. As the law is written, this would not necessitate increasing the size of the scholarship program, just the scope, and would not increase the cost of the program.

I congratulate the 19th Guam Legislature on this most appropriate legislation, and look forward to the positive results, which will produce benefits for our entire community.

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE PEDRO "DOC" SANCHEZ SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM IN PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM FOR QUALIFIED CAREER EMPLOYEES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. The Organic Act of Guam and local law provides that the government of Guam shall establish a career service based on merit and adopt measures to promote morale, efficiency and integrity in the government service. The development and retention of a competent work force in supervisory and managerial ranks of the public service is a primary concern of the government. To attain this objective, it is necessary that career government personnel be provided with opportunities for professional growth and development. The purpose of this Act is to establish a government-wide scholarship program in public administration at the University of Guam. It shall be the aim of this program to support qualified career employees of all departments, agencies, offices, autonomous or semi-autonomous

instrumentalities of the government of Guam, who desire to take up undergraduate or graduate studies in public administration at the University of Guam.

No one person contributed more to the advancement of education on our island than the late Honorable Pedro "Doc" Sanchez. Senator Sanchez had a distinguished career as an educator and as a public administrator along with his other achievements in the private sector. The Legislature finds it a fitting memorial to him to name this scholarship program in his honor as a continuing tribute to his numerous, noteworthy contributions on this Territory.

Section 2. Scope of the Program. The Pedro "Doc" Sanchez Scholarship Program in Public Administration shall be available to all classified government employees who belong to the career service of the government of Guam, who desire undergraduate or graduate studies in public administration, subject to the conditions established in Sections 3 through 5 of this Act.

Section 3. Number of Scholarships an Agency my Sponsor. Each department, agency, office and autonomous or semi-autonomous instrumentality of the Government of Guam and the Judicial Branch may grant one scholarship for every ten career employees in its agency at any one time for each academic year at the University of Guam.

Section 4. Selection of Scholarship Recipients Through Interviews and Competitive Examinations. (a) The Director of Administration or his designee and the Dean of the College of Business and Public Administration at the University of Guam or his faculty designee shall conduct joint interviews and competitive examinations each semester for the purpose of selecting scholarships recipients under this program. The passing of such interviews and competitive examinations shall be considered valid only for the academic year it is taken and may not be availed of for future scholarship grants. The Director of Administration and the University of Guam shall jointly prescribe

qualifications for admission to the scholarship program.

- (b) Applicants from the departments, agencies, offices and autonomous or semi-autonomous instrumentalities of the Government of Guam shall be interviewed and take the competitive examinations at a time and place designated by the Department of Administration and the University of Guam.
- (c) In instances where the number of nominees of the Judicial Branch, a department, agency, office, autonomous or semi-autonomous instrumentality of the Government of Guam who passed the interviews and competitive examinations exceeded its scholarship slots which are available pursuant to Section 3 of this Act, candidates of that agency who obtained the higher interview and examination ratings shall be preferred over those with lower ratings.
- Section 5. Responsibility of Agency. (a) The Judicial Branch, department, agency, office or autonomous or semi-autonomous instrumentality of the Government of Guam concerned shall pay the grantees¹ tuition, fees and books as billed by the University of Guam.
- (b) Each department, agency, office and autonomous or semi-autonomous instrumentality of the Government of Guam and the Judicial Branch shall allow scholarship recipients the time needed to attend the day or night classes required for completion of the undergraduate or graduate degree in Public Administration, provided, however, that the recipients enter into a written agreement with the agency head to make up for any hours missed at work through terms of mutual agreement. In the case of graduate students, the agency shall allow full-time study leave in the last semester of the MPS degree for Special Project or thesis writing. No overtime pay shall be given at any time.
- Section 6. Responsibility of the Scholarship Recipient. (a) The scholarship grantee shall enroll for an undergraduate or graduate degree in

Public Administration within two weeks (2) after passing the required interview and competitive examinations developed and conducted jointly by the Department of Administration, Government of Guam, and the University of Guam. Failure to do so shall be automatic forfeiture of the scholarship.

- (b) Each scholarship grantee shall enroll for not less than nine (9) academic units and not more than eighteen (18) academic units per regular semester at the University of Guam during the period of his or her study grant. In no case, however, shall scholarship grantee be allowed more than five (5) consecutive years, from the date of original enrollment, to finish the undergraduate degree in Public Administration (BSPA), or more than three (3) consecutive years, from the date of original enrollment, to finish the graduate degree in Public Administration (M.P.A.).
- (c) Each scholarship grantee shall be required to submit semesteral progress reports on his or her studies accompanied by a certified grade report to the head of the agency in which he or she is employed and to the Department of Administration, Government of Guam. This report shall contain information on: (1) the subjects enrolled which satisfy undergraduate or graduate degree requirements in Public Administration at the University of subjects completed with the corresponding grades and weights Guam; (2) in academic units at the end of every semester; and (3) other matters pertinent of the scholarship which shall be required from time to time by the agency head and the Department of Administration, Government of Guam. Failure of a scholarship recipient to obtain passing marks in any one subject at the end of each semester shall be automatically dropped from the scholarship grant, provided, however, that in justifiable circumstances approved only by the Dean, College of Business and Public Administration, University of Guam, the recipient may be given conditional approval to retake the course in the next regular semester immediately following the period for which a

failing grade was issued.

- (d) Upon termination of the scholarship, the grantee shall be required to render services in a department, agency, office, autonomous or semi-autonomous instrumentality or branch of the Government of Guam for a period of two (2) years for every academic year of scholarship received by him or her, unless he or she shall prefer to reimburse to the Government of Guam all the expenses paid by the latter in connection with such study grant.
- (e) Upon the successful completion of the Scholarship Program in Public Administration, as evidenced with the awarding of an undergraduate or graduate degree in Public Administration by the University of Guam, the grantee shall receive a one-step merit pay raise from the department, agency, office, autonomous or semi-autonomous instrumentality of the Government of Guam or the Judicial Branch in which he or she is employed effective on the pay period immediately following graduation.
- Section 7. Funding for the Scholarship Program in Public Administration. The heads of all departments, agencies, offices, autonomous or semi-autonomous instrumentalities of the Government of Guam and the Judicial Branch shall extend full support and complete assistance for the Scholarship Program in Public Administration mandated by this Act by budgeting for Scholarship funds to support scholarship grantees from their respective agencies in the annual fiscal year budget requests of their respective agencies beginning in Fiscal Year 1990.
