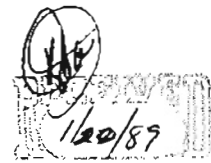



AN ACT TO RENAME THE GUAM
INTERNATIONAL AIR TERMINAL THE
"ANTONIO B. WON PAT GUAM
INTERNATIONAL AIR TERMINAL," TO

GUAM REAL PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN
WEST ACRES SUBDIVISION, TRACT 170,
DEDEDO, GUAM, TO ADJUST AND
STANDARDIZE SALARIES OF GOVERNMENT
OF GUAM ATTORNEYS, TO ADJUST VARIOUS
SALARIES OF VARIOUS GOVERNMENT OF
GUAM AGENCIES, TO MODIFY
REQUIREMENTS FOR COSMETOLOGIST
LICENSES FOR CERTAIN PURVEYORS OF
COSMETICS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2 Section 1. The Guam International Air Terminal shall hereafter be
3 known as the "Antonio B. Won Pat Guam International Air Terminal."

1 Section 2. Any provision in the laws of Guam referring to the Guam
2 International Air Terminal is hereby amended to read the "Antonio B. Won
3 Pat Guam International Air Terminal."

4 Section 3. The Governor of Guam, the Executive Manager and the
5 Board of Directors of the Guam Airport Authority shall cause to be erected
6 appropriate nameplates or signs renaming the Guam International Air
7 Terminal the "Antonio B. Won Pat Guam International Air Terminal."
8 At such ceremony as the Governor, the Executive Manager and the Board of
9 Directors of the Guam Airport Authority deem appropriate, the "Antonio B.
10 Won Pat Guam International Air Terminal" shall be officially named and a
11 plaque bearing the name, picture and brief history of the contributions of
12 the late Honorable Antonio B. Won Pat, Congressman from Guam, shall be
13 affixed at a suitable spot within the terminal building.

14 Section 4. The Governor is authorized to sell eleven (11) government
15 of Guam lots located within the West Acres Subdivision, Tract 170,
16 Municipality of Dededo. The lots shall be sold to the following
17 tenants/applicants, and the sale price shall not exceed Two Thousand Five
18 Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) per lot:

16 Section 5. The Director of Land Management and the Attorney General
17 shall take all necessary action to effectuate the land sales authorized by
18 Section 4 of this Act. The Governor of Guam shall execute all documents
19 and instruments necessary to carry out the provisions of Section 4. The
20 provisions of Section 3 of P.L. 12-61, as amended, shall not apply to the
21 land sales authorized by Section 4.

22 Section 6. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule or
23 regulation to the contrary, the sales authorized in Section 4 are approved
24 by the Legislature.

25 Section 7. Section 6208.1 of Chapter 6, Title 4, Guam Code
26 Annotated, is repealed and reenacted to read:

27 "Section 6208.1. Recruitment of Assistant Attorneys General.
28 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Attorney General may
29 hire Assistant Attorneys General necessary for the operation of the
30 department. Attorneys shall be hired for an initial two-year
31 probationary period in the unclassified service, which shall by the
32 term of the appointment expire two years from the date of the
33 appointment if not sooner terminated by the appointing authority.
34 Attorneys reappointed after completion of their probationary period
35 shall be employed in the unclassified service as provided under Section
36 4102(16) of Chapter 4 of this Title and may be removed only for

1 cause. Attorneys presently in the classified service shall remain
2 classified."

3 Section 8. Section 6208 of Chapter 6, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated,
4 is repealed and reenacted to read:

5 "Section 6208. It is the intent of the Legislature that all
6 full-time attorneys working for the government of Guam, its agencies
7 and instrumentalities (including autonomous agencies and
8 instrumentalities), the Superior Court and the Public Defender Service
9 Corporation be paid according to the following schedule in order to
10 make the pay received by full-time attorneys working for different
11 departments and agencies more or less uniform. Therefore, all
12 full-time attorneys now working for or later hired after the effective
13 date of this section by the government of Guam, its agencies and
14 instrumentalities (including autonomous agencies and instrumentalities),
15 the Superior Court, and the Public Defender Service Corporation
16 including classified, unclassified, and contract hire shall be paid
17 according to the following schedule.

18 In implementing this schedule, no attorney working for the
19 government of Guam on the effective date of this section shall have his
20 or her salary reduced by this schedule below that which each attorney
21 would have had pursuant to full implementation of Option I of the pay
22 scale recommended by the Guam Civil Service Commission in its report
23 dated October 31, 1985, as later corrected by the Civil Service
24 Commission. If the recommendations of said Option I be higher than
25 the salary proposed by this schedule, then the incumbent shall receive
26 the higher of the two amounts. All full-time contract attorneys now
27 working for the government of Guam on the effective date of this
28 section shall receive the contract compensation or be paid according to
29 the following schedule, whichever is higher.

30 Government of Guam attorneys include those working full-time for
31 autonomous agencies of the government of Guam.

32 The pay scale shall be:

1 (a) ATTORNEY I

2 An attorney with zero to three years experience as an attorney,
3 working under the supervision of a senior attorney or judge. The pay
4 scale and steps shall be as follows:

21 A senior attorney with over five years and less than eight years
22 experience as an attorney, working with minimal supervision, who may
23 supervise and direct other attorneys. The hiring authority may allow up to
24 two years of attorney experience credit or seniority credit for special
25 skills, training, or excellence as an attorney. The pay scale and steps
26 shall be as follows:

5 In the case of attorneys working for the government of Guam as of the
6 effective date of this section, any government of Guam service as an
7 attorney shall be counted as experience as an Attorney IV for purpose of
8 computing step levels for Attorney IV.

9 (d) ATTORNEY IV

10 A senior attorney with over eight years as an attorney, working with
11 minimal supervision, with possible supervisory duties over other attorneys.
12 The hiring authority may allow up to three years of attorney experience
13 credit or seniority credit for special skills, trial experience, training, or
14 excellence as an attorney. The pay scale and steps shall be as follows:

1 Any attorney who has sixteen years or more of total government
2 of Guam service as attorney, and who has reached the level of
3 Attorney IV, Step 9, shall thereafter receive a step pay increase of
4 \$1,000 for each full year of service as a government of Guam attorney
5 over sixteen years.

6 In the case of attorneys working for the government of Guam as
7 of the effective date of this section, any government of Guam service
8 as an attorney shall be counted as experience as an Attorney IV for
9 purposes of computing step levels.

10 The salary schedules contained in subsections (a) through (d),
11 above, may be modified upwards from time to time by the Civil Service
12 Commission pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Act without
13 further legislation.

14 Any attorney holding the position of Attorney General, Deputy
15 Attorney General, Public Defender, or Deputy Public Defender shall
16 earn the salary set by law for that position, or Five Hundred Dollars
17 (\$500) plus the salary he or she would earn as a government attorney,
18 according to the above schedule, with maximum additional credit for
19 seniority and experience as allowed above to maximize his or her
20 salary, whichever is higher."

21 Section 9. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the following
22 positions at the Department of Revenue and Taxation are reclassified as
23 follows:

26 Section 10. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a Firefighter in
27 the Guam Fire Department who performs work as an Emergency Medical
28 Technician-Ambulance (EMT-A) and is a certified EMT-A shall be entitled to
29 differential pay calculated at the rate of his or her regular wage plus
30 fifteen percent (15%) for all periods he or she is assigned as an EMT-A and
31 is a certified EMT-A.

1 Section 11. The following reassignment of pay ranges in the office of
2 the Attorney General is made for the following positions:

18 Section 12. Funds may be transferred by the Governor pursuant to
19 his transfer authority from any department funded by appropriation from
20 the General Fund of the government of Guam to pay for all raises for any
21 autonomous agencies or instrumentalities as were mandated by this Act, by
22 Public Law 19-32, or otherwise mandated by any law enacted by the 19th
23 Guam Legislature, and any retroactive payments of pay raises paid during
24 Fiscal Year 1988 shall be reimbursed by transfer of funds from General
25 Fund Appropriations to the agency or instrumentality which made the
26 retroactive pay raise pursuant to the transfer authority herein.

27 Section 13. The Reevaluation Study of the Department of Education
28 Administrators' positions approved by the Civil Service Commission on
29 October 11, 1988, shall be implemented to be effective October 1, 1986.
30 The Department of Education is hereby authorized and directed to assign
31 each administrator to the range and step as approved in the Civil Service
32 Commission study or to a step in the appropriate range which would provide
33 for a seven percent (7%) increase over the administrator's October 1, 1986
34 salary, whichever is greater.

Section 14. Section 16409 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 16409. Exempt practices. This Chapter does not
prohibit any practice within its scope in cases of emergency, nor does
it prohibit the domestic administration of any practice without
compensation, nor the administration outside of a licensed school of
cosmetology or cosmetological establishment when necessary because of
the illness or other physical incapacitation of the recipient of the
service, and when performed by a licensee hired for the purpose from
a licensed cosmetological establishment, nor the recommendation,
demonstration or administration of cosmetics without separate

1 compensation incidental to the recommendation, demonstration or sale of
2 cosmetic and any such act shall not be considered the practice of
3 cosmetology."

4 Section 15. Subsection (1) of Subparagraph B of Section 6206, Title
5 4, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended to add the following salaries to
6 those therein:

9 This section shall be effective retroactively to December 20, 1988. No other
10 salaries contained in said subsection shall be affected by this amendment.

11 Section 16. The Civil Service Commission shall evaluate each position
12 in all departments funded by the General Fund, including but not limited to
13 the Commissioners' Council, the various municipal Commissioners' offices,
14 the General Services Administration of the Department of Administration,
15 the Office of the Governor, and Government House, and in all autonomous
16 agencies, for which an increase in salary did not occur as a result of
17 implementation of the Classification and Pay Maintenance Review Task Force
18 Phase I Report dated November 7, 1985. All such evaluations shall be
19 completed no later than sixty days after the effective date of this Act.
20 The Guam Economic Development Authority, the Guam Housing and Urban
21 Renewal Authority, the Guam Power Authority, the University of Guam, and
22 the Port Authority of Guam and all other autonomous agencies or
23 instrumentalities of the government of Guam shall adopt equivalent salaries
24 to the Option I schedule for their positions if the Option I equivalent is
25 greater than an existing salary. Each position's new salary or existing
26 salary shall be effective retroactively to October 1, 1987.

27 Section 17. Subparagraph A of §6206, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated,
28 is amended by adding the following positions:

Notification letters were sent to the Governor; the Attorney General; Mrs. Judy Won Pat Borja and family of the late Congressman Antonio Won Pat; Mr. Leo Slotnick, Chairman of the Board of the Directors of the Guam Airport Authority; Mr. Jesus Q. Torres, General Manager of the Guam Airport Authority; the President of the Commissioner's Council; and the President of the Chamber of Commerce. [Attachment 4]

TESTIMONY

Testimony was received from Mr. Dale Willoughby [Attachment 5].

Mr. Willoughby testified against Bill No. 470 stating that "Guam is a key island in the Western Pacific ... but its location is not known by such people ... for years ... travel agents representing the airlines have struggled to acquaint their customers with the exact location of Guam International Air Terminal ... and will put the travel agents 'back to square one.'" In addition, he told the

Committee to consider the great amount of printing it would take the travel agents representing the airlines to accommodate the proposed change of name and unnecessary cost to reflect the intent of Bill 470.

Mr. Willoughby suggested to the Committee that the present Route 8, running from Agana through Maite and Barrigada, be renamed the "Won Pat Boulevard" to remind local residents and visitors of this noteworthy achievement of the late Congressman. In closing, Mr. Willoughby recommended that the Committee consider his testimony and possibly rewrite Bill No. 470.

The Committee also received written testimony Ms. Rosie C. Wilson supported by 75 signatures of Guamanians in San Diego, California [Attachment 6] and 27 signatures from the Guamanian Society of Orange County in California [Attachment 7] supporting the intent of Bill No. 470.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee on General Governmental Operations, to which was referred Bill No. 470, finds that:

1. Antonio B. Won Pat was born in the village of Sumay, Guam on December 10, 1908. In 1939, he married the former Ana Salas Perez and they have eight children. Mr. Won Pat passed away in Maryland on May 1, 1987.
2. Antonio B. Won Pat, Guam Statesman, is a person who rightly deserves to be honored by the people of Guam. He started his career in public service in 1936 when he was elected to the Guam Congress and served as a member until the outbreak of World War II.
3. In 1948, Mr. Won Pat reentered politics and was subsequently re-elected Speaker of the House of Assembly. He served as Speaker of the First, Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, and Seventh Guam Legislatures. On March 15, 1965, Antonio B. Won Pat was elected Guam's first Washington Representative and was re-elected to a second term in 1968, and after the enactment of U.S. Public Law 92-71 by Congress, became the first delegate from Guam to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1973 until 1984.
4. Congressman Antonio B. Won Pat was the first territorial delegate to head a subcommittee in the House of Representatives serving as Chairman of the Insular Affairs Subcommittee of the House Interior and Insular Affairs Committee.

5. Congressman Won Pat has a long and distinguished record of service and accomplishments, and has been instrumental in the passage of the Guam Rehabilitation Act; Elective Governorship Act allowing local selection of the Governor to replace appointed military Governors; Non-Voting Delegate Act; University of Guam Land Grant Act; and other numerous measures including statutory authority to pursue Guam's Land Claims case; the Submerged Land Act; the homeporting of various naval vessels; legislation including Federal aid for highways and airports; water and sewage funding; educational television and appointment of numerous Guamanians to military academies.
6. On May 7, 1987, Congressman Won Pat was nominated to the Guam Onra and was designated a permanent Ambassador-at-large by the Eighteenth Guam Legislature. Therefore, as one of the principal architects of the Organic Act of Guam and all subsequent amendments thereto until 1984, the Committee recommends that Bill 470 be passed by the Legislature.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION(S)

The Committee on General Governmental Operations, to which was referred Bill No. 470, "An act to name the Guam International Air Terminal, the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport," has had the same under consideration, and now wishes to report back the same with the recommendation to do pass.

TESTIMONY AGAINST BILL NO. 470, etc. on 24 Sept 87

My name is Dale Willoughby, and I live at #186-A Route 8, Barrigada; I am a registered voter and a resident of Guam for a bit more than two and one half years though I visited Guam in 1939 (48 years ago) and again in 1941, and many times since while in the military.

I am here to testify AGAINST Bill No 470 "An act to name Guam International Air Terminal" the "Antonio B. Won Pat International Air Terminal" and to vote FOR the passage of Bills No. 477, 478, 479 and 480.

Guam is a key island in the Western Pacific, blessed with a beautiful and efficient airport for air travelers, but its location is not well known by such people. For years, since the end of World War II, travel agents representing the airlines have struggled to acquaint their customers with the exact location of Guam International Air Terminal. The abbreviation of "GUM" was printed in hundreds of thousands of air schedules throughout the world and is now firmly implanted in their routing schedules. Now this Committee desires to change the name and will put the travel agents "back to square one". Consider the great amount of printing necessary to accommodate the proposed change of name and the unnecessary cost to reflect the intent of Bill 470.

Bills 477, 478, 479 and 480 do not have a far reaching effect and so I concur with the author(s) of these bills to appropriately rename the beach and facilities to perpetuate the names of these local statesmen and other notables.

However, let's keep Guam International Air Terminal intact as I believe to change it will have a decided "rippling effect" of confusion and uncertainty for those who travel and those who offer travel services on the International scene.

I would like to suggest that the Present Route 8, running from Agaña through Maite and Barrigada be renamed "WON PAT BOULEVARD" thus daily reminding local residents of his noteworthy achievements during his lifetime for the people of Guam.

Boulevard' thus daily reminding local residents and visitors of this noteworthy achievements during his lifetime for the people of Guam. I therefore recommend that the Committee consider my testimony and possibly rewrite Bill No. 470. Thank you very much for this opportunity to present my views."

Chairman: "Thank you very much, Captain, it is certainly an honor meeting you. Once again, thank you for your testimony.
