AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A CONTINUING
STATUTE FOR THE OPERATIONS OF THE
GOVERNMENT OF GUAM.

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2 Section 1. Continuing Appropriation and authorization to spend. The
3 Government of Guam may spend money and encumber funds at the rate of
4 not more than 1.7 times the amount of money spent or obligated for the
5 operations (and not for capital improvements or equipment) during
6 September 1987 for the operations of the Executive Branch of the
7 government for the period from October 1, 1987 until November 15, 1987, or
8 until an annual budget for Fiscal Year 1988 is enacted into law, whichever
9 is sooner, as continuing appropriations from the same funds, and in the
10 same categories as for fiscal year 1987.
11 Section 2. Continuing Appropriation and authorization to spend. The

1 Superior Court of Guam may spend money and encumber funds at the rate
2 of not more than 1.7 times the amount of money spent or obligated for the
3 operations (and not for capital improvements or equipment) during
4 September 1987 for the operations of the Judicial Branch of the government
5 for the period from October 1, 1987 until November 15, 1987, or until an
6 annual budget for Fiscal Year 1988 is enacted into law, whichever is
7 sooner, as continuing appropriations from the same funds, and in the same
8 categories as for fiscal year 1987.

9 Section 3. Continuing Appropriation and authorization to spend. The
10 Guam Visitors Bureau may spend money and encumber funds at the rate of
11 not more than 1.7 times the amount of money spent or obligated for the
12 operations (and not for capital improvements or equipment) during
13 September 1987 for the operations of the Guam Visitors Bureau for the
14 period from October 1, 1987 until November 15, 1987, or until an annual
15 budget for Fiscal Year 1988 is enacted into law, whichever is sooner, as
16 continuing appropriations from the same funds, and in the same categories
17 as for fiscal year 1987.

18 Section 4. Continuing Appropriation and authorization to spend. The
19 University of Guam may spend money and encumber funds at the rate of not
20 more than 1.7 times the amount of money spent or obligated for the
21 operations (and not for capital improvements or equipment) during
22 September 1987 for the operations of the University of Guam for the period
23 from October 1, 1987 until November 15, 1987, or until an annual budget
24 for Fiscal Year 1988 is enacted into law, whichever is sooner, as continuing
25 appropriations from the same funds, and in the same categories as for fiscal
26 year 1987.

27 Section 5: Continuing Appropriation and authorization to spend. The
28 Public Defender Service Corporation may spend money and encumber funds
29 at the rate of not more than 1.7 times the amount of money spent or
30 obligated for the operations (and not for capital improvements or equipment)
31 during September 1987 for the operations of the Public Defender Service
32 Corporation for the period from October 1, 1987 until November 15, 1987,
33 or until an annual budget for Fiscal Year 1988 is enacted into law,

1 whichever is sooner, as continuing appropriations from the same funds, and
2 in the same categories as for fiscal year 1987.

3 Section 6. Continuing Appropriation and authorization to spend. The
4 Guam Educational Telecommunications Corporation may spend money and
5 encumber funds at the rate of not more than 1.7 times the amount of money
6 spent or obligated for the operations (and not for capital improvements or
7 equipment) during September 1987 for the operations of the Guam
8 Educational Telecommunications Corporation for the period from October 1,
9 1987 until November 15, 1987, or until an annual budget for Fiscal Year
10 1988 is enacted into law, whichever is sooner, as continuing appropriations
11 from the same funds, and in the same categories as for fiscal year 1987.

12 Section 7. Hiring Freeze. No position now vacant nor any position
13 which becomes vacant may be filled by the Executive or Judicial Branches
14 of Government or by Guam Visitors Bureau or University of Guam or Public
15 Defender Service Corporation or Guam Educational Telecommunications
16 Corporation until such time as a budget is passed for the government of
17 Guam for Fiscal Year 1988. No promotions may be implemented within the
18 Executive or Judicial branches of the government of Guam or Guam Visitors
19 Bureau or University of Guam or Public Defender Service Corporation or
20 Guam Educational Telecommunications Corporation until such time as a
21 budget is passed for the government of Guam for Fiscal Year 1988.

22 Section 8. No employee or retiree of the government of Guam, its
23 agencies or instrumentalities (including autonomous agencies and
24 instrumentalities) may suffer a pay or annuity decrease during the period
25 of this interim budget.

26 Section 9. (a) Because Article 1 and Article 7 of the Draft
27 Commonwealth Act were not approved at the election held August 8, 1987,
28 pursuant to Subsection (c) of Section 2 of P.L. 18-33 the Commission shall
29 prepare new Articles 1 and 7 on the same subject for election to be held on
30 Saturday, November 7, 1987.

31 (b) The sum of Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000) is
32 appropriated from the General Fund to the Commission on
33 Self-Determination to fund the education campaign for the second vote

1 on subject matter of Article 1 and Article 7 of the Draft Commonwealth
2 Act.

3 (c) The form of the second ballot shall be determined by the
4 Election Commission. The Commission on Self-Determination shall
5 provide the ballot summaries. The Commission on Self-Determination
6 shall use its own discretion in determining the content and duration of
7 the education campaign. The provisions of 3 GCA Chapter 17 shall not
8 apply to the second vote on the Draft Commonwealth Act Articles.

9 (d) The questions on the ballot shall be voted on Section by
10 Section for each article for as many Sections as are within each Article
11 and shall read as the following examples:

12 "Do you approve of Section 1 of Article 1? _____
13 (Summary) Yes No"

14 "Do you approve of Section 1 of Article 7? _____
15 (Summary) Yes No"

16 (e) Notwithstanding the provisions of 3 GCA Subsection 13104
17 regarding time of holding an election to fill a vacancy, in the interest
18 of efficiency and expediency, the special election to fill the Legislative
19 vacancy which occurred August 16, 1987, will be held by the Guam
20 Election Commission in concert with the second vote on the Draft
21 Commonwealth Act Section on Saturday, November 7, 1987.

22 (f) The sum of One Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$110,000) is
23 appropriated from the General Fund to the Election Commission for the
24 election scheduled on November 7, 1987, and for related matters.

25 Section 10. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Fiscal Year
26 1988 Budget shall address the issues involved in the implementation of any
27 Option I pay increases and employees shall be entitled to implementation of
28 whatever increases may be approved for them in the Fiscal Year 1988
29 Budget, retroactive to October 1, 1987.

30 Section 11. The sum of Eight Hundred Two Thousand Three Hundred
31 Dollars (\$802,300) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Retirement
32 Fund to provide for the continued implementation of the \$100 annuity
33 benefits, the \$700 supplemental annuity benefits, the \$838 annuity, the

1 Governors' and Lt. Governors' pension, and retirees' group insurance
2 premiums, for the first 45 days of Fiscal Year 1988.

3 Section 12. If this Act becomes law, schools shall open and all other
4 governmental operations shall continue operations at normal levels.

5 Section 13. This Act shall be effective immediately upon the signature
6 of the Governor.
