AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SUBSECTION (g), AND TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (h) OF §3811, ARTICLE 8, CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO RESTORING **CENTER COUNCIL'S COMMUNITY** HEALTH AUTHORIZATION TO ACCESS AND EXPEND FUNDS COMMUNITY FROM THE HEALTH CENTER REVOLVING AND TO **ENSURING** FUND, REQUIRING ACCOUNTABILITY \mathbf{BY} **MONTHLY** FINANCIAL REPORTS AND AN ANNUAL AUDIT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent: It was the intent of Public Law 30-106 and Public Law 30-108 to protect the Community Health Center Revolving Fund (Fund) for the exclusive purpose of funding the operations of the Community Health Centers of the Department of Public Health & Social Services, as deemed appropriate by the Community Health Center Council. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that Subsection (g) of §3811, Article 8, Chapter 3, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, inadvertently inhibits the ability of the Community Health Center Council to directly access and expend funds necessary for the operations of the Community Health Centers. This statutory constraint is found to be impeding the timely payment of vendors and other debt service obligations, and thereby reducing the quality and quantity of services being offered and/or provided. It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to restore the Council's access to the Fund by repealing and reenacting Subsection (g) of §3811, Title 10, Guam Code Annotaated.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds, however, that while a certain discretionary flexibility is appropriate in the management of the Fund, it is nonetheless necessary to ensure that all activities relative to the Fund remain transparent and subject to public scrutiny and accountability. It is, therefore, the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to provide for mandatory monthly reporting, as well as the inclusion of the Fund in the annual government of Guam audit and report.

- **Section 2.** Subsection (g) of §3811, Article 8, Chapter 3, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is *repealed and reenacted* to read:

Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of on BILL NO. 410-30 (COR) - AN ACT TO RESTORE THE COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER COUNCIL'S AUTHORIZATION TO ACCESS AND EXPEND FUNDS FROM THE COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER REVOLVING FUND; BY REPEALING SUBSECTION (g) OF §3811, ART. 8, CH. 3, 10 GCA; AND, TO ENSURE ACCOUNTABILITY BY REQUIRING MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORTS AND AN ANNUAL AUDIT; Sponsored by Frank B. Aguon, Jr.

The public hearing on agenda item Bill No. 413-30 (COR) was Called-to-Order at 09:55 A.M.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION.

CHAIRMAN FRANK B. AGUON, JR., convened the Public Hearing on Bill No. 410-30 (COR). Chairman F.B. Aguon, Jr., primary sponsor, explained the purpose of Bill No. 413-30 (COR).

Chairman: Called the first panel to testify.

Linda Unpingco-Denorcey, M.P.H., Executive Director, Guam Community HealthCenters: Submitted written testimony (attached) and oral testimony IN SUPPORT of Bill No. 410-30 (COR). Stated that the bill would reinstate a previously existing authorization for the Community Health Center Council to directly manage and expend funds from the Community Health Center Revolving Fund. The authority for the Council to directly manage the fund was inadvertently removed by Section 3 of P.L. 30-108 on February 28, 2010.

She further stated that the Council is fully willing to adhere to the provisions which mandate monthly reporting and annual audits as provided for in Sections 3 & 4 of the bill, so as to assure transparent accountability.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: Pointed out that there are other special revolving funds which require legislative authorization, by appropriation, in order for the funds to be expended.

Ms. Unpingco-Denorcey, responded that the funds in the account are federal funds provided pursuant to criteria agreed to between her program as a *Federally Qualified Health Center* and the federal government.

Mr. Daniel T. Perez, Chairman, Community Health Center Council: Provided oral testimony IN SUPPORT of Bill NO. 410-30 (COR). Agreed with the written and oral testimony presented by Ms. Unpingco-Denorcey.

Mr. Vicente "Ben" Meno, Member, Community Health Council: Provided oral testimony IN SUPPORT of Bill No. 410-30 (COR). Also stressed the need for the timely payment of venders and service providers.

Chairman: There being no further testimony, or questions by Senators, Chairman Aguon adjourned the public hearing on Bill No. 410-30 (COR).

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS



WRITTEN TESTIMONY FOR BILL NO. 410-30

Good Morning Senator Frank Aguon Jr. and Senator Ben Pangelinan. My name is Linda Unpingco-DeNorcey and I am the Executive Director of the Northern and Southern Region Community Health Centers. As you know, the mission of the Guam Community Health Centers is to increase access to primary health care and preventive services and to reduce health disparities among the medically underserved population.

The Northern and Southern Region Community Health Centers are Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) that are mandated to collect revenues from third party payors (i.e., private insurance indemnities), Medicare, Medicaid, and self-pay patients so that the revenues or program income monies generated are to be used exclusively for the operation of the Guam Community Health Centers. This federal mandate is duly recognized by the Guam legislators through several public laws such as Public Law 24-248: "The Community Health Center Act of 1998" and Public Law 30-108. Public Law 24-248 Section 3811 Community Health Center Revolving Fund stipulates: "there is hereby established a Community Health Center Revolving Fund to be maintained and administered by the Director of the Department. All monies collected by the Department for medical services rendered at the community health centers shall be deposited into the Fund and applied to the expenses of the community centers allowable by Federal regulations and guidelines as the non-Federal share of the project costs in accordance with the Department's grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services."

Additionally, Public Law 30-108 stipulates: "the Community Health Center Council and the Administrator of the Bureau of Primary Care Services, who is also the Executive Director for both Northern and Southern Regional Community Health Centers should be authorized to open a checking account for the exclusive use by Community Health Centers and are to be responsible for approving the expenses charged against the account." Moreover, this law stipulates on Section 3, Subsection (g): "no expenditures and encumbrances from the Fund shall be made without appropriation by I Liheslaturan Guahan."

Bill No. 410-30 proposes to restore the CHC Council's access to the Program Income Fund by repealing Subsection (g) of 3811, Article 8, Chapter 3, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, which states: "no expenditures and encumbrances from the Fund shall be made without appropriation by I Liheslaturan Guahan."

I am in favor of Bill No. 410-30, which states: "Subsection (g) of 3811, Article 8 Chapter 3, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated is repealed. Repealing this subsection would keep the Guam Community Health Centers in compliance with Federal program requirements. The Federal law mandates that all Federally Qualified Health Centers have a governing body (i.e., CHC Board of Directors), which also has a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization status. This governing body has fiduciary responsibilities over the CHCs as evident by the Articles of Incorporation and CHC Inc. Bylaws. The Guam CHCs have adhered to this federal requirement as evident by the establishment and registration of its Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws with the U.S. Internal Revenue Services and the Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation (see attachments). The governing body approves the CHC annual budget as well as expenditures and encumbrances for personnel, travel, contractual services, supplies, equipment, and capital outlay.

Since the CHCs are collecting revenues for medical, laboratory, and pharmacy services, these revenues belong to the Guam Community Health Centers and 100% of the money collected are to be used exclusively for the CHCs' operation as mandated by the Federal and local laws. Moreover, Program Income revenues are coming from third party payors (i.e., private insurance indemnities), Medicaid, Medicare, and Self-pay patients, and the I Liheslaturan Guahan cannot appropriate such fund as this also violates federal guidelines. The CHC Executive Director (also called the Administrator of the Bureau of Primary Care Services) and the CHC Board of Directors are the ones responsible in managing the CHCs' program income revenues. Additionally, program income revenues are not derived from the local government (i.e., local taxes and/or taxes from alcohol/tobacco) so the I Liheslaturan Guahan should not even be appropriating funds that do not belong to them !!!!

However, if the I Liheslaturan Guahan appropriates Program Income fund, this would not only violate Federal laws, but would also have a detrimental effect in jeopardizing current federal funding as well as disqualifying the Guam CHCs in applying for future federal grants from Health Resources and Services Administration, thus weakening its financial viability. The latter would adversely impact the local government in that more local revenues would be needed to subsidize the loss of federal funds.

In view of the above, I humbly request for the Guam Legislators to support Bill No. 410-30, which repeals Subsection (g) of 3811, Article 8, Chapter 3, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated.

With your favorable support of Bill No. 410-30, the Guam CHCs can adhere to Federal program guidelines and requirements mandated by Federally Qualified Health Centers and allow the Guam CHC Board and the CHC Executive Director to directly access and expend program income funds for the operation of the Guam CHCs. By doing so, the CHCs can operate more effectively and efficiently in paying vendors and all debt obligations in a timely manner, which would positively improve the quality of health care services as well as its financial sustenance.



Enclosed please find Bill No. 693 (COR), "AN ACT TO ADD ARTICLE 8 TO CHAPTER 3, DIVISION 1, PART 1 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS, INCLUDING URGENT CARE SERVICES, IN THE NORTHERN AND SOUTHERN REGIONS PLUS OTHER REGIONS, AND TO CITE THE ACT AS, "THE COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS ACT OF 1998", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-248.

This legislation creates statutory authority for the Department of Public Health and Social Services to create community health centers in the Northern, Central, and Southern regions, as well as other regions as designated by the Director. At this time, community health centers are established by Executive Order.

The legislation states that the community health centers are to be supervised by the Chief Public Health Officer of the Division of Public Health operating through a "Bureau of Primary Care Services" to provide a community health center program. The services to be provided are those wherein the private clinics are unable to meet the demand or the service is unavailable in the areas of pediatric care, prenatal care, infectious disease care, urgent care and other areas, as designated by the Director of Public Health. The urgent care services shall initially be provided 5 days a week,

g) Page 10, line 25, needs to clarify what provision of "this Act" is repealed upon submittal of fee schedules according to the Administrative Adjudication Law. If the sentence "The Department is hereby authorized to implement a fee schedule" is to be repealed upon a later occurrence (submission of a fee schedule), this needs to be so stated.

AN ACT TO ADD ARTICLE 8 TO CHAPTER 3, DIVISION 1, PART 1 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS, INCLUDING URGENT CARE SERVICES, IN THE NORTHERN AND SOUTHERN REGIONS PLUS OTHER REGIONS, AND TO CITE THE ACT AS, "THE COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS ACT OF 1998."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

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2 Section 1. Legislative Findings. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the Southern Region Community Health Center ('SRCHC') was created to put 3 into operation clinical medical services serving the southern region of Guam 4 5 and assign such authority and responsibility to the Department of Public Health and Social Services; and that the Northern Region Community Health 6 Center ('NRCHC'), serving the northern region of Guam, was likewise later 7 established. Furthermore, I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the primary goal of 8 9 establishing community health centers is to reach out and provide quality primary comprehensive health care services to the residents of Guam who 10 11 may find it not only inconvenient to obtain needed health-care services from the Central, main DPH&SS, Clinic but also may not afford the needed medical 12 13 service closest to them.

Moreso, during the latest legislative oversight hearing on the Department of Public Health and Social Services, key issues and concerns disclosed:

- (1) that the Board of Directors of SRCHC has not been reconstituted and is not functioning at present;
- (2) that both SRCHC and NRCHC lack certain essential services, i.e., pharmacy, laboratory and radiology (Pharmacy is only provided for Southern by the Central on a part-time three (3) days a week basis, and Northern not having any.);
- (3) that NRCHC does not generate any revenue and has an acute problem in its ventilation or air-conditioning;

(4) that the Fees Schedule in effect is antiquated and is not regularly updated;

- (5) that in the absence of a business office, or equivalent, SRCHC's billing and accounts receivable, including those owed by Health Maintenance Organizations ("HMO's") and health insurance providers are apparently not well-managed, as may be evidenced by the growing and aging uncollected accounts;
- (6) that in the absence of a regular governing body (Board of Directors) as provided for in the By-Laws of SRCHC, essentially no input from the community is provided to the Health Services Administrator of the Bureau's over SRCHC operation (The Health Services Administrator of the Bureau is likewise expected to do the same to the other existing regional community health centers.); and
- (7) the absence of enacted legislation for DPHSS to charge for services rendered by the Community Health Centers is subject to legal challenge which the present vested authority solely depends on an executive order. I Liheslaturan Guahan also finds that a specific provision in the Guam Code Annotated would provide the much needed remedial actions to put the operation and maintenance of Guam's regional community health centers in an ongoing, continuing and progress-oriented business concern.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to provide permanent guidelines to govern the creation, operation and maintenance of Guam's community health centers for the purpose of providing basic quality health care to the

Section 3801. Legislative Intent and Purpose. It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to provide permanent guidelines to govern the creation, operation and maintenance of Guam's community health centers for the purpose of providing basic quality health care to the people of Guam in a joint partnership between government agencies and/or private entities.

Section 3802. Title. This Act shall be known as, 'The Community Health Centers Act of 1998.'

Section 3803. Program. There is hereby established within the Department of Public Health and Social Services ('Department') Bureau of Primary Care Services ('Bureau') a Community Health Center Program ('Program') to be administered on a collateral duty basis by the Health Services Administrator of the Bureau. The Program shall cover three (3) regions of Guam (Northern, Central and Southern) plus other designated area established by the Director.

Section 3804. Personnel. There shall be assigned sufficient number of administrative personnel, as may be determined by the Director of the Department, to provide staff assistance on a full-time basis to the Division head and ensure that the general duties assigned to the Division are adequately administered.

Section 3805. General Duties. The general duties of the Bureau for the Program are:

(i) to perform other duties as may be assigned by the Director of the Department.

Section 3806. Federal Grants. The Bureau shall comply with all Federal requirements and procedures necessary for the administration of grant programs. The Director shall have the authority to apply for Federal Grants.

Section 3807. Authority to Set Fees. The Director is authorized to establish fees for health care services in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law and as may be required to qualify for grant programs. The fees shall not be deterrent to receiving health care. The fees shall be no less than the Medicare Regional Fees established under Title XVIII of the Social Security Act.

Section 3808. Establishment of Regional Community Health Centers. The following Regional Community Health Centers established in the past by virtue of Executive Orders specifically issued for the purpose shall hereafter be governed by the provisions of this Act:

- (a) the Southern Regional Community Health Center ('SRCHC'), located in the village of Inarajan, which is tasked to provide quality comprehensive primary health care services to the residents of the Southern villages of Guam;
- (b) the Northern Regional Community Health Center ('NRCHC'), located in the Village of Dededo, which is tasked to provide quality comprehensive primary health care services to the residents of the Northern villages of Guam; and

care providers to provide such service. The urgent care service must be adequate to meet the following medical care:

- (a) conditions that are non-emergency in nature (Emergency conditions are those illness that may result in the loss of life or limb if not treated immediately.);
- (b) services are competent to manage and treat patients of all ages;
- (c) the facility shall have at least basic pharmacy, radiology, laboratory and patient transport to move cases that require a higher level of patient care management;
- (d) the facility shall be certifiable by either the Joint Commission of Accreditation of Health Organization or Health Care Financing Administration, or equivalent certifying health care organization acceptable by the Health Planning Council of the Division of Health Planning of DISID; and
- (e) the urgent care service shall consider initially opening at least five (5) days a week between the hours of 6:00 p.m., to 11:00 p.m., and extend the hours and/or days as the demand arises and availability of resources. The Director shall evaluate at least annually the service hours and/or days and make necessary adjustment based on the community needs and availability of resources in consultation with the Council.

Section 3811. Revolving Fund. (a) Community Health Center Revolving Fund. There is hereby established a Community

be repealed upon subsequent submission and approval of the fee schedule through the Administrative Adjudication Law. The fee schedule must give discounts accordingly to the Federal Income Poverty Guideline.

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Individuals or families whose income falls below the Federal poverty guidelines shall apply for subsidized medical services through the Medically Indigent Program or other medically subsidized program.

Advisory Council on Community Health Section 3813. shall be Centers. (a) Council Established. There within the Bureau an Advisory Council on Community Health Centers ("Council") to serve in an advisory capacity for each Region. Council shall consist of seven (7) members appointed by I Maga'lahen Guahan. Members of the Council shall include a Village Mayor from the Region of the Community Health Center and one (1) of the Municipal Planning Council member from the Region, other than the Mayor or the Mayor's staff, which shall serve their term as long as they are serving in their respective positions. The other members of the Council shall serve for four (4) years; provided that, of the members first appointed two (2) shall serve for two (2) years and three (3) shall serve for four (4) years.

(b) Officers; Meeting Requirements. The Council shall annually elect a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Recorder from among its membership. The Council shall meet at least quarterly at such time and place as the Chairperson may designate. Meetings shall be well publicized and shall be open to the public. The Director or the Division Head, or both, shall be present on all Council meetings.

Section 3815. Repeal. Executive Order Nos. 70-25 and 86-05 pertaining to the Southern Regional Community Health Center are hereby repealed.

Section 3816. Effective Date. The provisions contained in this Act shall take effect upon enactment.

Section 3817. Severability. If any of the provisions of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance are held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of this Act, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable."

ARTICLE II PRINCIPAL OFFICE

ARTICLE III BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1 GOVERNING BODY- The Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), a line agency of the government of Guam, in affiliation with the Guam CHC Board of Directors shall manage the programs and services of the Guam CHCs, as specified in the co-applicant agreement signed between the governing board (co-applicant) and the DPHSS (public entity).

ARTICLE IV BOARD MEMBERSHIP

- SECTION 2 FOUNDING MEMBERS The members of the corporation (the "Founding Members") shall be: Vicente Meno, Apolinar Bobadilla, Ignacio Cruz, Sonya Naputi, Daniel Perez, Benjamin Pablo, Carol Tayama, Nonito Blas, William Reyes, Louis Rama, Reynaldo Edrosa, and Melissa Savares.
- SECTION 3 SIZE OF BOARD The organizing Board will consist of a minimum of nine members and a maximum of 13 board members.
- SECTION 4 COMPOSITION The Board shall have the following composition:
 - (a) The CHC organization shall select 7 or more board members (51% or greater) and the Governor of Guam shall appoint no more than 6 board members (up to 49% of board composition).
 - (b) Fifty-one percent of board members shall be individuals who will be registered patients served by the health center.
 - (c) No more than 50% of the remaining members from the Board may be individuals who derive more than 10% of their income from the health care industry.
 - (d) The remaining members of the board (49% or less) must represent the area served by the health center and have expertise in community affairs, such as Federal, state, and local government; accounting; health administration; health professions, business finance, banking, legal affairs, trade unions, insurance and personnel management as well as social services such as religion, education, and welfare.
 - (e) No member of the Board shall be an employee of the health center, spouse, child, parent, brother, or sister by blood or marriage of such an employee.
 - (f) No member of the Board shall be a spouse, child, parent, brother, or sister by blood or marriage of another Board member.
- SECTION 5

TERM — Members shall be elected for a term of three years. The term of membership shall begin October 1 and expire on September 30, of the third year. Membership terms shall be staggered to provide election of one-third of the Board annually. A CHC Board Member may serve up to two consecutive terms of 3 years in duration and may return to the board after a one-year break. No board member including those who have been appointed by the Governor shall submit a courtesy letter of resignation every time a new governor has been elected. Additionally, the new governor cannot preclude the selection of health center board members, or require the dismissal of health center board members who are not endorsed by him.

SECTION 6 ELECTION TO BOARD MEMBERSHIP – The board shall be a self-perpetuating board. Health centers shall elect their peers and/or others to board positions. In the event of board vacancies, the health centers will establish a

- SECTION 2 SPECIAL MEETINGS- The President or other majority of the Board may call special meetings.
- SECTION 3 QUORUM- For all meetings, a quorum shall be constituted by a 50% plus one of the total board members, excluding vacancies.
- SECTION 4 VOTING- All questions at a meeting of the Board shall be decided by a majority vote of the members entitled to vote and present at the meeting. Each member shall be entitled to one vote. No proxy votes shall be allowed. Board members excused for good reason may submit votes in writing to the board.
- SECTION 5 COMPENSATION- All board members shall be compensated for attending board meetings at a rate of \$75 per meeting including special meetings (board members would only be compensated for 1 special meeting per month) subject to the availability of funds. Any change in compensation shall be determined by a majority vote.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS

- SECTION 1 OFFICERS- The officers of the Corporation shall consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and such other officers as determined by the Board.
- SECTION 2 NOMINATION OF OFFICERS- A slate of officers for the coming year shall be submitted by a nominating committee to the Board at the October meeting. Any nomination submitted must be with the consent of the nominee. Additional nominations may be made from the floor with the consent of the nominee.
- SECTION 3 TERM OF OFFICE- Officers shall be elected by members of the Board at the October meeting and installed as the first order of business to assume office for the remainder of the meeting. Term of office shall begin with the October meeting and shall be for one year. An officer who has completed three consecutive terms in the same office shall not be re-elected to that office for the ensuing year.
- SECTION 4 PRESIDENT- The President shall be selected from the Board and shall preside over all meetings of the Board. He or she shall be kept advised of the general affairs of the Corporation and ensure that all orders, resolutions and policies of the Board are carried into effect. He or she shall chair the Executive Committee and serve as ex-officio member of all other committees. He or she shall have the usual power and duties customarily vested in the office of the President of the Board. If for any reason it becomes necessary to replace the President prior to expiration of his/her office, the Vice-President shall fill the unexpired term, and the Board shall elect a new Vice-President.
- SECTION 5 VICE PRESIDENT- In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall perform duties of the President, and when so acting, shall have all the powers and be subject to the same restrictions as the President. The Vice-President shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned to him or her by the Board.

- (b) PERSONNEL- It shall be the duty of the Personnel Committee to recommend to the Board of Directors candidates for the position of Executive Director, medical providers, and other CHC staff and the selection process and approval will be followed as stipulated in the "Co-applicant Agreement".
- (c) FINANCE/FUNDRAISING- The Finance Committee shall include the Treasurer who shall be chairperson, and two additional members, other than ex-officio, non-voting members of the committee. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The Finance committee shall act as financial advisor to the Board in all financial affairs of the Corporation. The Committee shall be responsible for the review and recommendations to the Board of the annual operating budget as well as any special grants or contracts, or any other financial matter.
- (d) MEMBERSHIP/NOMINATING- The duties of the Membership/Nominating Committee shall be to secure nominees for Board membership. The Membership/Nominating Committee shall be responsible for presenting a slate of eligible consenting members to the Board.
- (e) QUALITY IMPROVEMENT- The Executive Director shall report all Quality Improvement activities such as chart review, peer review, patient satisfaction survey results, patient complaints, risk management, management information system, and clinical outcome measures to the board and solicit the board's feedback to further enhance quality assurance activities.
- (f) MARKETING COMMITTEE- The Marketing Committee shall consist of 2 members of the board and the Executive Director as an ex-officio. The committee is responsible for marketing CHC services and programs to increase utilization of the centers.

ARTICLE VIII RECORDS AND REPORTS

The Guam Community Health Centers, shall keep at its principal office the original copy of its articles and bylaws as amended to date, which articles and bylaws shall be open to inspection by the members at all reasonable times during office hours.

ARTICLE IX LIABILITY OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

SECTION 1 LIABILITY OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS – No Director or Officer of the corporation shall be liable for acts, defaults, or neglects of any other Director or Officer or any loss sustained by the corporation, unless the same resulted from willful misconduct or gross negligence of the Director or Officer sought to be charged with liability.





AN ACT TO RESTORE THE COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER COUNCIL'S AUTHORIZATION TO ACCESS AND EXPEND FUNDS FROM THE COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER REVOLVING FUND; BY REPEALING SUBSECTION (g) OF §3811, ART. 8, CH. 3, 10 GCA; AND, TO ENSURE ACCOUNTABILITY BY REQUIRING MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORTS AND AN ANNUAL AUDIT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Intent: It was the intent of Public Law 30-106 and Public Law 30-108 to protect the Community Health Center Revolving Fund for 3 4 the exclusive purpose of funding the operations of the Community Health Centers of the Department of Public Health & Social Services, as deemed appropriate by 5 the Community Health Center Council. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that 6 Subsection (g) of §3814, Article 8, Chapter 3, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, 7 inadvertently inhibits the ability of the Community Health Center Council to 8 directly access and expend funds necessary for the operations of the Community 9 Health Centers. This statutory constraint is found to be impeding the timely 10 payment of vendors and other debt service obligations, and thereby reducing the 11 quality and quantity of services being offered and/or provided. It is the intent of I 12 Liheslaturan Guahan to restore the Council's access to the Fund by repealing 13 14 Subsection (g) of §3811, 10 GCA.

1	I Liheslaturan Guahan finds, however, that while a certain discretionary
2	flexibility is appropriate in the management of the Fund, it is nonetheless necessary
3	to ensure that all activities relative to the Fund remain transparent and subject to
