AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW ARTICLE 13 TO CHAPTER 15, AND TO *ADD* A NEW ARTICLE 7 TO CHAPTER 18, BOTH OF TITLE 17 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE DR. ANTONIO C. YAMASHITA TEACHER CORPS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that the Department of Education faces a shortage of teachers annually. I
- 4 Liheslatura recognizes that the Yamashita Teacher Corps was created to encourage
- 5 and produce the number of teachers necessary to educate our island's children. I
- 6 Liheslatura further recognizes that the impact on the fiscal budget due to the

current status of the national and world economy does not allow for a larger appropriation to the Yamashita Teacher Corps. Due to this realization, I Liheslatura finds that in order to provide the adequate benefits to all students and potential teachers within our public school system, program changes to the Yamashita Teacher Corps (YTC) need to be made. Currently, students under the YTC receive benefits of a full payment of tuition and fees for attendance at the University of Guam, a payment of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) for textbooks for each semester, and monthly stipend. Under the current YTC, there is an undergraduate program that seeks to produce teachers, and two (2) graduate programs, one seeking to establish a corps of principals and the other for counselors.

I Liheslatura finds that although principals and counselors are an essential part of any school system, the teacher shortage crisis is more critical and requires significant attention. It is the intent of I Liheslatura to delete the principal corps and the counselor corps under the YTC in order to focus funding toward producing teachers.

I Liheslatura further finds that in order to maximize benefits for more student scholarships, I Liheslatura intends to limit scholarship benefits to only full payment of tuition and fees and a credit of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) each semester for the purchase of textbooks. Based on the current total amount of student benefits for the four (4) year undergraduate program at the School of Education at the University of Guam compared to the total amount of proposed student benefits for the four (4) year undergraduate program at the School of Education at the University of Guam, there will be a total of one (1) extra scholarship for every one point six (1.6) students currently enrolled in the YTC undergraduate program. For every two (2) students currently enrolled in the YTC graduate program, one (1) new scholarship is available for the undergraduate

The passing of the oral interviews and the meeting of established

University of Guam entrance and academic requirements shall

constitute the primary criteria for selection of scholarship recipients.

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The Board may prescribe additional qualifications for admission to the scholarship programs.

(b) Applications for the Yamashita Teacher Corps scholarship programs *shall* be received by April 30 of every year and applicants *shall* be interviewed at a time and place designated by the Committee *prior* to June 30. Awards *shall* be granted *prior* to July 30 in a written notice to the selected applicant, and the applicant's school administrator, if applicable.

§151305. Academic Advisor and Program Contract. Each Yamashita Teacher Corps program scholarship recipient *shall* have an academic advisor who, with the student, *shall* develop a complete academic plan that would result in the granting of the applicable degree within the prescribed period of time. This plan *shall* be examined by the appropriate University official, as determined by the Board, and upon approval, *shall* constitute a contract between the student and the University.

§151306. Teacher Corps Scholarships. The Yamashita Teacher Corps *shall* consist of students who have declared their intention to become educators and who are enrolled in the teacher educational programs at the University of Guam and who have been duly accepted into the Yamashita Teacher Corps Scholarship Program. Scholarship and financial assistance may be awarded to eligible students who meet the following criteria:

- (a) are bona fide residents of Guam;
- (b) are citizens *or* permanent resident aliens of the United States;
- (c) are seniors *or* graduates of an accredited high school with a cumulative grade point average of *not less than* 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, *or* its equivalent;
- (d) have been admitted to the University of Guam in accordance with its admissions policies;

(e) maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better during the term of assistance under this program;

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(f) agree to practice education in a public school funded by the government of Guam in areas of need upon graduation and certification to practice on Guam. If no vacant teaching positions exist in such public schools in his or her area(s) of certification, a Teacher Corps graduate may teach in a private school on Guam towards meeting their Teacher Corps scholarship repayment The Guam Department of Education and the Guam obligations. Community College shall certify that no vacancies in the Teacher Corps graduates area(s) of certification exist *prior* to allowing private school employment. The required length of service to be rendered shall be for a period of one (1) year for every academic year of scholarship received by the recipient. For purposes of this Section, a year of service is equal to twelve (12) months. Only teaching service in public schools funded by the government of Guam and/or Guam private schools licensed by the government of Guam shall be credited for repayment of the Teacher Corps scholarship. Those Teacher Corps graduates who were allowed to teach in licensed private schools on Guam shall accept employment with the Guam Department of Education should a position in their area(s) of certification become available at the start of each semester until such time that their scholarship is repaid. The Guam Department of Education and the Guam Community College shall provide each eligible graduate a notice of available positions at least thirty (30) days prior to the required date of employment. The student further agrees that, in the event of refusal to fulfill this obligation, the student shall repay the

government of Guam an amount equal to the balance of the total monthly allowances paid to the student which have *not* already been satisfied through service or payment, including tuition, stipends and the actual cost to the government of textbooks and supplies. Any deferment of repayment through services *shall* conform to rules adopted by the Board; and

(g) have been recommended to the program by: (1) an educator, including a teacher/instructor, counselor *or* school administrator who worked in an educational institution at the time the applicant was a student in such educational institution; and (2) by any other individual other than a relative who can attest to the character of the applicant.

§151307. Same: Benefits.

- (1) Students entitled to scholarships pursuant to §151306 of this Article *shall* receive the following benefits:
 - (a) Payment of tuition and fees.
 - (b) An allowance of up to Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per regular semester, and up to One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per summer semester for textbooks.
- (2) As a condition for continuing full entitlement to the benefits provided in this Section, undergraduate recipients must maintain a full-time enrollment of twelve (12) semester credits minimum per semester, six (6) semester credits per summer semester, and good academic standing with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better. No student may receive benefits beyond the number of calendar years normally required to complete such student's program.
- (3) Employees of GDOE. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or administrative rules and regulations, school aides, library technicians, and

limited-term teachers with a bachelors degree or higher who are seeking teacher certification, and Chamorro language teachers whom do not have a bachelors degree, that are employed by the Guam Department of Education may qualify for financial assistance through the Guam Teacher Corps and may: (1) continue such employment while enrolled in the Guam Teacher Corps; and (2) enroll in the Guam Teacher Corps on a part-time basis. Other employees within the Guam Department of Education may qualify for assistance as provided by this Section; provided that such employees' actual job duties primarily deal with the instruction or supervision of students. A letter of recommendation from the applicant's supervisor attesting to the applicant's job duties shall be required.

§151308. Same: Those with *Prior* Baccalaureate Degree. The Board may award Teacher Corps scholarships to individuals possessing a baccalaureate degree in a course of study other than education for the purpose of meeting teacher certification requirements. Recipients granted awards under this provision shall *not* receive funding towards earning another baccalaureate or graduate degree. The scholarships awarded under this Section *shall* be based on the recruitment needs of the Guam Department of Education/Guam Community College and *shall* be limited to a period of time *not to exceed* two (2) years.

§151309. Same: For Specialist Teachers. The Educator Corps Council may award Teacher Corps scholarships beyond the four (4) year limitation of §151307 for individuals to seek graduate training, that may include a masters degree, for teaching specialties that require training beyond a baccalaureate degree. This Section *shall* apply *only* to specialist areas that require graduate training as a minimum requirement for certification and *shall not* be used for as a means for existing teachers to

meet promotional requirements. The scholarships awarded under this Section *shall* be based on the recruitment needs of the Guam Department of Education/Guam Community College and *shall* be limited to a period of time *not to exceed* two (2) years. The Board *may*, based on the needs of the Guam Department of Education *or* the Guam Community College for specialist teachers, authorize part-time scholarships *if* the prospective scholarship recipient is a teacher with the Guam Department of Education *or* the Guam Community College.

§151310. Same: For Non-education Majors. The Board may award Teacher Corps Scholarships to individuals majoring in a course of study other than education; provided, that such course of study meets the requirements for concentration and certification in a subject related to secondary education and that such individuals, in addition to courses required for their major, complete the minimum courses required for teacher certification in secondary education.

§151311. Same: Prioritization of Scholarships According to Teaching Needs. The Board *shall* prioritize the granting of Teacher Corps Scholarships according to the teaching needs (subject area) as identified by the Guam Department of Education and the Guam Community College.

§151312. Reporting Requirements. A report *shall* be submitted to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than* three (3) weeks after the start of each semester which, at the very least, *shall* contain the following information: the total number of Teacher Corps recipients for that semester, sorted by new and continuing recipients; the total number of Teacher Corps recipients that completed their degree program in the *prior* semester; the total amount expended for the *prior* semester for any activity related to the

Only teaching service in public schools funded by the government of Guam and/or Guam private schools licensed by the government of Guam shall be credited for repayment of the Teacher Corps scholarship. Those Teacher Corps graduates who were allowed to teach in licensed private schools on Guam shall accept employment with the Guam Department of Education should a position in their area(s) of certification become available at the start of each semester until such time that their scholarship is repaid. The Guam Department of Education and the Guam Community College shall provide each eligible graduate a notice of available position at least thirty (30) days prior to the required date of employment. The student further agrees that, in the event of refusal to fulfill this obligation, the student shall repay the government of Guam an amount equal to the balance of the total monthly allowances paid to the student which have not already been satisfied through service or

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payment, including tuition, stipends and the actual cost to the government of textbooks and supplies. Any deferment of repayment through services shall conform to rules adopted by the Board; and

(g) have been recommended to the program by: (1) an educator, including a teacher/instructor, counselor or school administrator who worked in an educational institution at the time the applicant was a student in such educational institution, and (2) by any other individual other than a relative who can attest to the character of the applicant.

undergraduate program that seeks to produce teachers, and two graduate programs, one seeking to establish a corps of principals and the other for counselors.

I Liheslatura finds that although principals and counselors are an essential part of any school system, the teacher shortage crisis is more critical and requires significant attention. It is the intent of *I Liheslatura* to delete the principal corps and the counselor corps under the YEC in order to focus funding toward producing teachers.

I Lilieslatura further finds that in order to maximize benefits for more student scholarships, I Lilieslatura intends to limit scholarship benefits to only full payment of tuition and fees and a credit of \$500 each semester for the purchase of textbooks. Based on the current total amount of student benefits for the four year undergraduate program at the School of Education at the University of Guam compared to the total amount of proposed student benefits for the four year undergraduate program at the School of Education at the University of Guam, there will be a total of one extra scholarship for every one point six students currently enrolled in the YEC undergraduate program. For every two students currently enrolled in the YEC graduate program, one new scholarship is available for the undergraduate program.

Dear Speaker Won Pat,

Generally, the Legislature has not changed the rules for either the Yamashita Educator Corps (YEC) or the scholarship programs for the past several years. That has allowed us to stabilize the rules and predict funding needs. However, this legislation attempts to rationalize the offering of teacher training scholarships and make them comparable to those of other programs, as well as move the program under the Student Financial Assistance Program (SFAP) umbrella. I support this and, therefore, will make specific suggestions on the details of this bill.

Page 7, line 12 mandates when funds should be released, i.e., prior to the beginning of a semester. Please note that funds can only be released if the money is appropriated and cash is released to the University. If there is no cash, then the funds cannot be released as the University's operating revenues may not be used to pay student financial assistance. My suggestion is to indicate "subject to the availability of funds" whenever such mandates are included.

Page 7, line 18: Should specify "cumulative grade point average" and not just grade point average, since there are differing ways of calculating an average. In each case in these bills, the term used should always be "cumulative grade point average."

Page 7, line 19 appears to allow more than four (4) years to complete a program. Was that the intention?

Page 8, line 4 the term "part time" should have a definition. I recommend that "part time undergraduate attendance" be defined as "less than a full load, i.e., less than 12 credit hours during the regular semesters and less than 7 credit hours during summet."

Page 8, line 10, Section 151308 is not clear on whether an award could be made for graduate study to meet teacher certification requirements. If that was the intention, it should be specific

and include or exclude the two possibilities, an undergraduate second baccalaureate or a graduate program leading to certification. Please note that the School of Education is proposing to offer a graduate program that may lead to certification. It is currently under discussion at the Faculty Senate and the Educator Certification Commission.

Page 8, line 16 is the "year" a calendar year or an academic year? My recommendation is to use a calendar year.

Finally, the Sunset Provision seems unclear to me, but I am unused to reading GCA language and assume it means there will be no more principal/counselor corps after this year and that the Yamashita Educator Corps awards would come under the SFAP rules from fall 2010.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this bill.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 2 that the Department of Education faces a shortage of teachers annually. I 3 Liheslatura recognizes that the Yamashita Educator Corps was created to 4 encourage and produce the number of teachers necessary to educate our 5 island's children. I Liheslatura further recognizes that the impact on the fiscal 6 budget due to the current status of the national and world economy does not allow for a larger appropriation to the Yamashita Educator Corps. Due to this 8 realization, I Liheslatura finds that in order to provide the adequate benefits to 9 all students and potential teachers within our public school system, program 10 changes to the Yamashita Educator Corps (YEC) need to be made. Currently, 11 students under the YEC receive benefits of a full payment of tuition and fees 12 for attendance at the University of Guam, a payment of \$250 for textbooks for 13 each semester, and monthly stipend. Under the current YEC, there is an 14

undergraduate program that seeks to produce teachers, and two graduate programs, one seeking to establish a corps of principals and the other for counselors.

I Liheslatura finds that although principals and counselors are an essential part of any school system, the teacher shortage crisis is more critical and requires significant attention. It is the intent of *I Liheslatura* to delete the principal corps and the counselor corps under the YEC in order to focus funding toward producing teachers.

I Liheslatura further finds that in order to maximize benefits for more student scholarships, I Liheslatura intends to limit scholarship benefits to only full payment of tuition and fees and a credit of \$500 each semester for the purchase of textbooks. Based on the current total amount of student benefits for the four year undergraduate program at the School of Education at the University of Guam compared to the total amount of proposed student benefits for the four year undergraduate program at the School of Education at the University of Guam, there will be a total of one extra scholarship for every one point six students currently enrolled in the YEC undergraduate program. For every two students currently enrolled in the YEC graduate program, one new scholarship is available for the undergraduate program.

Section 2. Community Service Requirements. Article 13 is hereby *added* to Chapter 15 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:

(a) There shall be annually established a Yamashita Teacher Corps Evaluation and Selection Committee ('the Committee') composed of the following:

- 4 (i) two (2) members of the Board of Regents of the University of Guam;
 - (ii) one (1) alumnus of the Teacher Corps undergraduate program selected by the University of Guam Alumni Association;
 - (iii) one (1) alumnus of the Counselor Corp or Principal Corp program selected by the University of Guam Alumni Association; and
 - (iv) one (1) faculty selected by the Dean of the School of Education.

The Committee shall conduct interviews annually for the purpose of selecting scholarships recipients under the programs listed within this Article. The passing of the oral interviews, the meeting of established University of Guam entrance and academic requirements shall constitute the primary criteria for selection of scholarship recipients. The Board may prescribe additional qualifications for admission to the scholarship programs.

(b) Applications for the Yamashita Educator Corps Scholarship programs shall be received by April 30 of every year and applicants shall be interviewed at a time and place designated by the Committee prior to June 30. Awards shall be granted prior to July 30 in a written notice to the selected applicant, and the applicant's school administrator, if applicable.

§ 151305. Academic Advisor and Program Contract.

Each Yamashita Educator Corps program scholarship recipient shall have an academic advisor who, with the student, shall develop a complete academic plan that would result in the granting of the applicable degree within the prescribed period of time. This plan shall be examined by the appropriate University official, as determined by the Board, and upon approval, shall constitute a contract between the student and the University.

§ 151306. Teacher Corps Scholarships.

The Yamashita Teacher Corps shall consist of students who have declared their intention to become educators and who are enrolled in the teacher educational programs at the University of Guam and who have been duly accepted into the Yamashita Teacher Corps Scholarship Program. Scholarship and financial assistance may be awarded to eligible students who meet the following criteria:

- (a) are bona fide residents of Guam;
- (b) are citizens or permanent resident aliens of the United States;
- (c) are seniors or graduates of an accredited high school with an overall grade point average of not less than 2.5 on a 4.0 scale;
- (d) have been admitted to the University of Guam in accordance to its admissions policies;
- (e) maintain an overall grade point average of 3.0 or better during the term of assistance under this program;
- (f) agree to practice education in a public school funded by the government of Guam in areas of need upon graduation and certification to practice on Guam (If no vacant teaching positions exist in such public schools in his or her area(s) of certification, a Teacher Corps graduate may teach in a private school on Guam towards meeting their Teacher

Corps scholarship repayment obligations. The Guam Department of Education and the Guam Community College shall certify that no vacancies in the Teacher Corps graduates area(s) of certification exist prior to allowing private school employment. The required length of service to be rendered shall be for a period of two (2) years for every academic year of scholarship received by the recipient. For purposes of this section, a year of service is equal to twelve (12) months. Only teaching service in public schools funded by the government of Guam and/or Guam private schools licensed by the government of Guam shall be credited for repayment of the Teacher Corps scholarship. Those Teacher Corps graduates who were allowed to teach in licensed private schools on Guam shall accept employment with the Guam Department of Education should a position in their area(s) of certification become available at the start of each semester until such time that their scholarship is repaid. The Guam Department of Education and the Guam Community College shall provide each eligible graduate a notice of available position at least thirty (30) days prior to the required date of employment. The student further agrees that, in the event of refusal to fulfill this obligation, the student shall repay the government of Guam an amount equal to the balance of the total monthly allowances paid to the student which have not already been satisfied through service or payment, including tuition, stipends and the actual cost to the government of textbooks and supplies. Any deferment of repayment through services shall conform to rules adopted by the Board; and

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(g) have been recommended to the program by: (1) an educator, including a teacher/instructor, counselor or school administrator who worked in an educational institution at the time the applicant was a student in such educational institution, and (2) by any other individual other than a relative who can attest to the character of the applicant.

§ 151307. Same: Benefits.

- (1) Students entitled to scholarships pursuant to §151306 of this Article shall receive the following benefits:
 - (a) Payment of tuition and fees.
 - (b) An allowance of up to Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per regular semester, and up to One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for the summer semester for textbooks to be disbursed prior to the first day of such semester.
- (2) As a condition for continuing full entitlement to the benefits provided in this Chapter, undergraduate recipients must maintain a full-time enrollment of twelve (12) semester credits minimum per semester, six (6) semester credits per summer semester, and good academic standing with a grade point average of 3.0 or better. No student may receive benefits beyond the number of calendar years normally required to complete such student's program.
- (3) Employees of GDOE. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, administrative rules and regulations, School Aides, Library Technicians, Limited-Term Teachers with a bachelors degree or higher who are seeking teacher certification, and Chamorro Language Teachers whom do not have a

bachelors degree, that are employed by the Guam Department of Education, may qualify for financial assistance through the Guam Teacher Corps and may: (1) continue such employment while enrolled in the Guam Teacher Corps; and (2) enroll in the Guam Teacher Corps on a part-time basis. Other employees within the Guam Department of Education may qualify for assistance as provided by this Section; provided that such employees' actual job duties primarily deal with the instruction or supervision of students. A letter of recommendation from the applicant's supervisor attesting to the applicant's job duties shall be required.

§ 151308. Same: Those With Prior Baccalaureate Degree.

The Board may award Teacher Corps scholarships to individuals possessing a baccalaureate degree in a course of study other than education for the purpose of meeting teacher certification requirements. The scholarships awarded under this Section shall be based on the recruitment needs of the Guam Department of Education/Guam Community College and shall be limited to a period of time not to exceed two (2) years.

§ 151309. Same: For Specialist Teachers.

The Educator Corps Council may award Teacher Corps scholarships beyond the four (4) year limitation of §151307 for individuals to seek graduate training, that may include a masters degree, for teaching specialties that require training beyond a baccalaureate degree. This Section shall apply only to specialist areas that require graduate training as a minimum requirement for certification and shall *not* be used for as a means for existing teachers to meet promotional requirements. The scholarships awarded under this Section

- shall be based on the recruitment needs of the Guam Department of
- 2 Education/Guam Community College and shall be limited to a period of time
- not to exceed two (2) years. The Board may, base on the needs of the Guam
- 4 Department of Education or the Guam Community College for specialist
- 5 teachers, authorize part-time scholarships if the prospective scholarship
- 6 recipient is a teacher with the Guam Department of Education or the Guam
- 7 Community College.

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8 § 151310. Same: For Non-education Majors.

The Board may award Teacher Corps Scholarships to individuals majoring in a course of study other than education; provided, that such course of study meets the requirements for concentration and certification in a subject related to secondary education and that such individuals, in addition to courses required for their major, complete the minimum courses required for teacher certification in secondary education.

§ 151311. Same: Prioritization of Scholarships According to Teaching Needs.

The Board shall prioritize the granting of Teacher Corps Scholarships according to the teaching needs (subject area) as identified by the Guam Department of Education and the Guam Community College."

Section 3. Sunset Provision. Article 7 is hereby *added* to Chapter 18 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:

21 "ARTICLE 7

SUNSET PROVISION

§18701. Sunset Provision of Scholarships Awarded Under this Chapter.

No new scholarships shall be awarded under the provisions of this

- Chapter after the Academic Year 2009-2010. Thereafter, Yamashita Educator
- 2 Corps Scholarships shall be awarded pursuant to the provisions under Article
- 3 13 of Chapter 15 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated."
