





**AN ACT TO *AMEND* SUBSECTIONS (c), (d) AND (e),
AND *ADD* NEW SUBSECTIONS (f) AND (g) TO, §3811

ANNOTATED; AND TO *ADD* NEW SUBSECTIONS (6)
AND (7) TO §3814 OF CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 8, TITLE
10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE
ESTABLISHMENT AND USE OF THE COMMUNITY
HEALTH CENTER REVOLVING FUND.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**
2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds
3 that our Community Health Centers have matured into full-service community
4 health centers which provide primary healthcare, acute outpatient healthcare, and

1 preventive health services to the community. Its health professionals provide a full
2 range of essential primary care services. Its target population consists of the low
3 income, uninsured, and medically underserved families and individuals, and now
4 extends services to individuals with insurance. A fee schedule has been approved
5 and adopted. This fee schedule gives discounts based on a formula using the
6 Federal Income Poverty Guidelines. Families who fall below the Federal Income
7 Poverty Guidelines *may* apply for subsidized medical services through the
8 Medically Indigent Program or other medically subsidized program.

9 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the fees implemented by the
10 Department are collected and deposited into the General Fund, and *not* into a
11 special bank account separately maintained and administered by the Department.
12 The growth and complexity of the Regional Community Health Centers require
13 that the bureaucracy for processing expenses should be done at the Regional
14 Community Health Center level. The respective Community Health Center
15 Council and the Administrator, Bureau of Primary Care Services, who is also the
16 Executive Director for both the Northern Regional Community Health Center
17 (NRCHC) and the Southern Regional Community Health Center (SRCHC) should
18 be authorized to open a checking account for the exclusive use by Community
19 Health Centers, and are to be responsible for approving the expenses charged
20 against the account.

21 It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to authorize the Community Health
22 Centers Administrator of the Department of Public Health and Human Services
23 and the respective Community Health Center Council to establish a checking
24 account for the purpose of complying with the enabling legislation.

25 **Section 2.** Subsections (c), (d) and (e) of §3811 of Chapter 3, Article 8,
26 Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, are *amended* to read:

1 “(c) Deposits. All monies collected for products and services
2 rendered at the community health centers *shall be* accounted for and
3 deposited into the Fund and available to pay for the expenses of the
4 community centers.

5 (d) Application. All monies deposited in the Fund *shall be*
6 available to be used to pay for the expenses of the community center
7 allowable by Federal regulations and guidelines as the non-Federal share of
8 project costs in accordance with the Department's grant from the U.S.
9 Department of Health and Human Services. The Fund may also be used for
10 the following expenses:

11 (1) payment(s) for contractual services;

12 (2) payment(s) for supplies;

13 (3) payment(s) for any other expenses, which if remains
14 unpaid may result in an emergency situation as approved by the Board
15 in a resolution;

16 (4) the Fund *shall be* reimbursed from other appropriated
17 fund sources for any expenditure made as a result of circumstances
18 outlined in Subsection (3) if the expenditure was budgeted from said
19 appropriated source; and

20 (5) board stipends, as provided by applicable law.

21 (e) Accounts Receivables. The Community Health Centers
22 Administrator, in consultation with the Council, is hereby authorized to
23 pursue accounts receivables payment in whatever manner allowable by law,
24 including contractual services for collection. The Community Health
25 Centers Administrator *shall* promulgate rules and regulations through the

1 Administrative Adjudication Law governing collection and reduction of
2 uncollectible accounts receivables.”

3 **Section 3.** New Subsections (f) and (g) are *added* to §3811 of Chapter 3,
4 Article 8, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

5 “(f) The Community Health Centers Administrator *shall* submit an
6 annual spending plan for the Fund in accordance with and at the same time
7 as the Bureau of Budget and Management Research budget call.

8 (g) No expenditures and encumbrances from the Fund *shall be*
9 made without appropriation by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.”

10 **Section 4.** New Subsections (6) and (7) are *added* to §3814 of Chapter 3,
11 Article 8, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

12 “(6) *Shall* approve by resolution all expenditures allowed in §3811
13 of this Chapter greater than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000);

14 (7) may approve by resolution a Memorandum of Understanding
15 between the Community Health Centers and the Department of Revenue and
16 Taxation to garnish income tax refunds of recipients of products and services
17 rendered by the Community Health Centers who have *not* fulfilled their
18 payment obligation for said products and services. The Board *shall* adopt a
19 policy to govern the referral of such tax refund garnishment requests to the
20 Department of Revenue and Taxation.”

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

**BILL NO. 280-30 (LS),
As Substituted by the Committee**

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Economic Development, Health & Human Services, & Judiciary, convened a public hearing on Thursday, February 11, 2010 at 1:30 PM in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of **BILL NO. 280-30 (LS) – “AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTIONS (a) (b) (c) (d) (e) AND TO ADD SUBSECTIONS (f) (g) AND (h) OF SECTION 3811 AND TO ADD SUBSECTIONS (6) AND (7) TO SECTION 3814 OF CHAPTER 3 OF ARTICLE 8 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT AND USE OF THE COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER REVOLVING FUND,”** sponsored by Senator Vicente C. Pangelinan.

Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via hand-delivery / fax / email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets, and was published on February 4, 2010 (5-Day Notice) in the Marianas Variety, and again on February 9, 2010 (48-Hour Notice) in the Marianas Variety.

Note: Due to the coinciding Legislative Session, Committee Members and Senators attended, left, and reentered the Public Hearing on a regular basis.

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 1:35 PM.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

CHAIRMAN FRANK B. AGUON, Jr., convened the public hearing and discussion on Bill No. 275-30 (LS) and **Bill No. 280-30 (LS)** at 3:24 PM, and, again explained that Senators and Committee members would be joining and leaving the hearing on a continuing basis due the Legislative Session running concurrently with the hearing.

Chairman Aguon stated his intention of hearing Bill No. 275 (LS) and Bill No. 280 (LS), concurrently, because of the relative complimentary nature of both bills as they both tried to address a particular requirement within the Department of Public Health and Social Services. Read the titles of both Bills. Chairman Aguon called the first panel to testify.

Linda De Norcey, Administrator of the Northern and Southern Region Community Health Centers. Submitted written testimony (attached), and provided oral testimony, **IN SUPPORT of Bill 275.** Explained current operations of the existing financial system, and the need to pay health professionals and vendors on a timely basis. Also explained the need to purchase pharmaceuticals in-bulk, in order to realize financial savings. Specified the need for language that clearly delineates a “separate bank account, apart and separate from the General Fund and other accounts”. Expressed her support, and addressed the issue of stipends for Board members.

Also stated her **SUPPORT** in her written testimony for the passage of **Bill No. 285-30 ()**, relative to stipends for members of the Community Health Center Advisory Council members. Recommended that “advisory Council” be amended to read “Board of Directors”.

NOTE: Did not testify or comment on Bill No. 280 (LS).

Daniel T. Perez, Board of Directors, Community Health Centers, provided oral testimony **IN SUPPORT of Bill 275**, and reiterated Linda De Norcey’s testimony and stated that funds are not available on a timely basis because of bureaucracy and the lengthy process of the documentation are not an excuse for the delay of the public health services. Stressed the need to get a separate bank account for Community Health Center funds. Also suggested that line #3 of Bill 285, on page 2, relative to “Advisory Council” be amended to read “Board of Directors”.

NOTE: Did not testify or comment on Bill No. 280 (LS).

Arthur San Agustin, Acting Director, Department of Public Health & Social Services, provided oral testimony **IN SUPPORT of Bill 275**, and thanked all the supporters of the Bill, and further stated that Bill is a response to a system that will allow us to have direct access funds and help sustain critical services.

NOTE: Did not testify or comment on Bill No. 280 (LS).

CHAIRMAN AGUON: Opened up questions from Senators.

SENATOR E.J. CALVO: Mentioned the good impression that the Northern Community Health Center has made; congratulated the good job of the Community Health Center staff; and, congratulated the author in allowing the resources to be allocated and under their control, so that they can do the best job possible. Stated his support.

CHAIRMAN AGUON called upon Senator Pangelinan, and again reiterated that Bill No. 275 [by F.B. Aguon, Jr.] and 280 [by V.C. Pangelinan] are being heard and considered concurrently, due to their similar natures.

SENATOR BEN PANGELINAN: The objective here is to insure the resources are available to the board to allocate for the efficient operation of the Community Health Centers. The Community Health Centers have put into place certain programs that require the timely meeting of obligations to continue those federal programs. And allowing the revenue generated to support those programs and the centers is the objective of both he and the Chairman, in terms in trying to find the proper and appropriate methodology and structure to have the Community Health Center and its board act in the best interests of the patients and the organization.

We'll work with the recommendation presented, put them in place, and try to get something going and passed.

SENATOR TELO TAITAGUE: Mentioned that her uncle Ben Meno spoke with her about Bill 275, and she stated that she is **IN SUPPORT of Bill 275.**

CHAIRMAN AGUON: Thanked the Senators and Mr. Perez, Ms. De Norcey and Mr. Agustin for testifying on Bill No. 275. There being no further testimony, Chairman **CONCLUDED THE PUBLIC HEARING ON BILL NO. 275 (LS), and BILL NO. 280 (LS)** at 3:59 P.M.

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

Bill No. 280 (LS), did **NOT** receive any written or oral testimony **IN SUPPORT or OPPOSED** to its passage.

Amendments Section 2 of Bill No. 280-30 (LS) relative to amending §3811(a) of Chapter 3, Article 8, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, was amended by the Committee by way of **DELETING** the proposed amendment to §3811(a) and §3811(b), and **DELETING** the proposed new §3811(h). These provisions were found to already be contained in substantive part in Bill No. 275-30 (LS), as Substituted.

No other substantive amendments, other than technical corrections, were made to the Bill 280-30 (LS). Proposed amendment of existing subsections and the addition of new subsections, of and to §3811, respectively, were divided into separate sections of the bill for technical clarity.

The Committee on Economic Development, Health & Human Services, and Judiciary hereby **reports out Bill No. 280-30 (LS), as Substituted by the Committee,** for consideration by the Legislature, with the recommendation **TO PASS** .



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

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*

finds that our Community Health Center's has matured into a full service
Community Health Center which provides primary healthcare, acute
outpatient healthcare, and preventive health services to the community. Its
health professionals provide a full range of essential primary care services.
Its target population consists of the low income, uninsured, and medically
underserved families, individuals and now extends services to individuals
with insurance. A Fee Schedule has been approved and adopted. This Fee
Schedule gives discounts based on a formula using the Federal Income
Poverty Guidelines. Families who fall below the Federal Income Poverty
Guidelines *shall* apply for subsidized medical services through the
Medically Indigent Program or other medically subsidized program.

1 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the Fees implemented by the
2 Department are collected and deposited into the General Fund and not into a

16 allowable by Federal regulations and guidelines as the non-Federal share of
17 project costs in accordance with the Department's grant from the U.S.
18 Department of Health and Human Services. The Fund may also be used for
19 the following expenses:

20 (1) payment(s) for contractual services;

21 (2) payment(s) for supplies;

22 (3) payment(s) for any other expenses which if remains unpaid
23 may result in an emergency situation as approved by the Board in a
24 resolution;

25 (4) the Fund shall be reimbursed from other appropriated fund
26 sources for any expenditure made as a result of circumstances outlined

1 subsection (3) if the expenditure was budgeted from said appropriated
2 source.

3 (5) board stipends.

4 (e) Accounts Receivables. The Community Health Centers
5 Administrator ~~Director~~, in consultation with the Council, is hereby
6 authorized to pursue accounts receivables payment in whatever manner
7 allowable by law, including contractual services for collection. The
8 Community Health Centers Administrator ~~Director~~ *shall* promulgate rules
9 and regulations through the Administrative Adjudication Law governing
10 collection and reduction of uncollectible accounts receivables.

11 (f) The Community Health Centers Administrator shall submit an
12 annual spending plan for the Fund in accordance with and at the same time
13 as the Bureau of Budget and Management Research budget call.

14 (g) No expenditures and encumbrances from the Fund shall be made
15 without appropriation by I Liheslaturan Guåhan.

16 (h) The Community Health Centers Administrator shall provide a
17 monthly financial report on the funds generated each month, within thirty
18 (30) days following the preceding month to I Maga'lahaen Guahan and the
19 Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan.”

20 **Section 3. Add subsection (6) and (7) to Section 3814.**

21 Subsection (6) and (7) of Section 3814 of Chapter 3 of Article 8 of the
22 Guam Code Annotated is added to read:

23 **“§ 3814. Duties of Council.**

24 (6) Shall approve by resolution all expenditures allowed in this
25 Chapter in Section 3811 greater than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000);

26 (7) May approve by resolution a Memorandum of Understanding
27 between the Community Health Centers and the Department of Revenue and

1 Taxation to garnish income tax refunds of recipients of products and services
2 rendered by the Community Health Centers which have not fulfilled their
3 payment obligation for said products and services. The Board shall adopt a
4 policy to govern the referral of such tax refund garnishment requests to the
5 Department of Revenue and Taxation."
