



1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslatura Guåhan* finds
3 that it is appropriate to recognize that the Guam National Guard has successfully
4 recruited and substantially expanded in the past decade, and that the Guam Air
5 National Guard is poised to expand with a new flying mission in the future, and
6 that the rank of the Adjutant General and the Assistant Adjutant General for Air
7 should be adjusted in accordance with their increased supervisory responsibilities.

8 **Section 2.** §63201(b) of Chapter 63, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is
9 hereby *amended* to read as follows:

10 “(b) be promoted in the Guam Army or Air National Guard, as
11 appropriate, at the discretion of the Commander-in-Chief, to a grade *not to*
12 *exceed* Lieutenant General; and *shall* serve *only* so long as federally
13 recognized in such grade.”

14 **Section 3.** §63203(b) and (c) of Chapter 63, Title 10, Guam Code
15 Annotated, are hereby *amended* to read as follows:

16 “(b) Be qualified for immediate federal recognition as a colonel; and
17 (c) Be promoted to a rank *not* to exceed Brigadier General at the
18 discretion of *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* as Commander-in-Chief of the Guam
19 National Guard, and perform such military duties as the Commander of the
20 Guam Air National Guard, under the direction of the Adjutant General, and
21 *shall* perform all such military duties as may be required of him by the
22 Adjutant General.”

23 **Section 4. Severability Clause.** *If* any provisions of this Act or its
24 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law,
25 such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which
26 can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end
27 the provisions of this Act are severable.

REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 155-30(COR)

I. Overview

A Public Hearing on Bill No. 155-30(COR) was held on Thursday, October 15, 2009. Proceedings began at approximately 3pm to receive testimony on Bill No. 155-30(COR). Notice of the hearing was disseminated to all local media outlets via electronic format beginning on Oct. 6, 2009. II. Summary of Testimony and Discussion

Opening statement - Sen. Frank B. Aguon, Jr.

Sen. Judi P. Guthertz, Committee chairperson invited Sen. Frank B. Aguon, Jr., the primary author of Bill 155-30(COR) to present an overview of the measure. Sen. Aguon stated that the measure would allow for several changes to the structure of the top level of the Guam National Guard. The author stated the first intent was to allow for continuity of leadership by allowing the Territory's Adjutant General to stay beyond federal recognition and serve at the pleasure of the Governor. As well, the measure would pave the way for the an ever expanding Guam National Guard – Air Force and Army – by setting in place a Lieutenant Colonel position and an Assistant Adjutant General for the Air Guard in accordance with their increased supervisory responsibilities.



Col. Diron J. Cruz

Col. Cruz is the Chief of Joint Staffs for the Guam National Guard. He stated he was in support of the measure. He stated that the measure will help to properly structure the Guam Guard for future growth.

Col. David B. Riano

Col. Riano is a Judge Staff Advocate for the Guam National Guard. Col. Riano stated he supported the measure and noted that the promotion of the TAG is in line with the shift in the top Level of the National Guard Bureau.

Lt. Col. Tim Puzan

Lt. Col. Puzan is the Director of Staff for the Guam National Guard. He stated that he was in support of the measure and provided written testimony.

Chief Master Sergeant John M. Quinata

Chief Master Sergeant Quinata stated that he was in support of the measure and provided written testimony.

Providing written testimony only:

Col. James J. Montague

Col. Montague submitted written testimony in support of the measure.

Lt. Col. Johnny S. Lizama

Lt. Col. Lizama submitted written testimony in support of the measure.



III. Findings and Recommendations

Bill 155-30(COR) as introduced would allow for several changes to the structure of the top level of the Guam National Guard. First, the measure seeks to allow for continuity of leadership by allowing the Territory's Adjutant General (TAG) to stay beyond federal recognition and serve at the pleasure of the Governor. Second, the measure will authorize the rank of Lieutenant General from the current authorized rank of Major General for the TAG and third, Bill 155-30(COR) would pave the way for the an ever expanding Guam National Guard - Air Force and Army - by setting in place the position of Assistant Adjutant General for the Air Guard in accordance with their increased supervisory responsibilities.

After duly considering the testimony provided, concerns of Senators present at the hearing, Committee research and feedback from various sources, the Committee proffered a substitute version of the measure. The Bill as substituted removes the provision in "Section 2," that provides for the ability of a TAG to stay beyond the federally recognized age requirement of separation. During the hearing, there were more questions than answers regarding the role of a civilian TAG recognized only by our local government. Advice from the panel in support of the legislation regarding a TAG serving beyond the federally recognized Age separation requirement in Section 2, was ambiguous at best.

The Committee finds that the remainder of the legislation helps to provide for the future growth and readiness of the Guam National Guard.

Based on a survey of preferred action by this body, the Committee on the Guam Military Buildup and Homeland Security hereby report out Bill No. 155 (COR): "An act relative to recognizing the growth and expansion of the Guam National Guard in recent years in its contributions to the national defense of our nation and in support of our island, through ensuring that the qualifications and duties of the Adjutant General, and the Assistant Adjutant General for the Guam Air National Guard properly reflect such growth and impending future military national guard initiatives; through amending §63201(a), §63201(b), §63203(b), and §63203(c) of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated," as substituted by the Committee," with the recommendation **To Pass.**

6 recognize that the Guam National Guard has successfully recruited and

9 the rank of the Adjutant General and the Assistant Adjutant General for Air
10 should be adjusted in accordance with their increased supervisory
11 responsibilities. In addition, I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that an

1 incumbent Adjutant General, who has served in said position for an extended
2 period of time and who has previously been confirmed by I Liheslaturan
3 Guahan, should not be restricted from continuous service as the Adjutant
4 General of the Guam National Guard if it is the desire of the Commander in
5 Chief to retain such individual and if federal recognition status is no longer
6 granted to said individual due to retirement age restrictions.

7 **Section 2. Adjutant General of the Guam National Guard.**

8 Subsections §63201(a) and §63201(b) of Chapter 63, Title 10, Guam Code

8 “(b) Be qualified for immediate Federal recognition as a colonel ~~or~~
9 ~~lieutenant colonel~~, and shall serve only so long as Federally recognized in
10 such grade; and

11 (c) Be promoted to a rank not to exceed Brigadier General at the
12 discretion of I Maga’lahen Guåhan as Commander-in-Chief of the Guam
13 National Guard, and perform such military duties as the Commander of the
14 Guam Air National Guard, under the direction of the Adjutant General, and
15 shall perform all such military duties as may be required of him by the
16 Adjutant General under his supervision and control.”

17 **Section 4. Severability Clause.**

22 of this Act are severable.

TESTIMONY ON BILL 155-30
RELATIVE TO THE GUAM NATIONAL GUARD
FROM LIEUTENANT COLONEL TIM PUZAN

Good afternoon Senators of the 30th Guam Legislature. It's a pleasure and an honor to join you today to provide my testimony in support of Bill 155-30. I am Lt Col Tim Puzan, Director of Air Staff for the Guam National Guard. I have been a resident of Guam for 27 years, having come to Guam as active duty Air Force, and then staying on after my enlistment as a member of the Guam Air National Guard. I have been in the service since I was 17 years old, and have spent most of my time in service as a member of the Guam Air National Guard.

When I joined the Air Guard, we had about 45 personnel assigned to the Civil Engineering Flight. The highest grade officer at that time was lieutenant colonel, the grade I now hold. We have increased our manning ten-fold since then, and have taken on missions beyond the civil engineers, growing into a REDHORSE Squadron, and adding a Security Forces Squadron and a Force Support Squadron. Although the highest grade officer has increased to Colonel, this increase does not nearly match what we need at our size. The Guam Air National Guard needs a Brigadier General to carry its future growth initiatives and to have a seat at the table with the movers and shakers of the National Guard. The National Guard Bureau has a star reserved for Guam, the last of the 54 states and territories without a General Officer Assistant Adjutant General. This is an essential next step for the Guam Air National Guard, and is but awaiting the successful passage of this legislation to make it happen.

I am also in support of increasing the rank of the Adjutant General to Lieutenant General, and also for allowing a sitting Governor to extend the tenure of his Adjutant General beyond federally recognized tenure. I see both of these as advantageous to our Commander In Chief.

It is likely that in the foreseeable future, the Adjutants General of all the states and territories may be authorized a federally recognized grade of lieutenant general. With the recent increase in grade for the Chief of the National Guard Bureau to the rank of General (4-star), it is likely that the increases will be seen at the state level. Passing this legislation will allow for that eventuality.

Allowing an Adjutant General to remain beyond federal recognition will give the Commander In Chief the flexibility to keep an Adjutant General in position while that Commander In Chief remains in office. The bill does not require this, but I firmly believe that providing the Governor with the flexibility to do so, should he or she desire, is a positive option.

In closing, I urge you to support for Bill 155-30. Passage of this bill will add to the ability of the Guam Air National Guard to move forward with future growth and become a more valuable resource for the people of Guam. I thank you for this opportunity to testify before you today.

TESTIMONY ON BILL 155-30
RELATIVE TO THE GUAM NATIONAL GUARD
FROM COLONEL JAMES J. MONTAGUE

I am in full support for GUANG Assistant Adjutant General Position upgrading from Colonel to Brigadier General in Guam's state law. This comes from my perspective as a Group Commander, Director of Staff and senior Air Guard Commander.

It is important to look at the organization's present growth:

- GUANG has doubled size in eight years from 232 to 550 assigned personnel
- Rank increases across the board; 8 years ago we had one E-9, one O6 and now we have 2 Colonel positions, 3 Chief Master Sergeants, 7 Senior Master Sergeants, and 5 Lieutenant Colonels.
- Added two more new missions - 8 years ago we had Civil Engineers, Services and Air Base Group management. Today we have Security Forces, Red Horse, Force Support Squadron, Air Base Group and Joint Forces Head Quarters
- Resulting growth added 2 new commanders to a total of five with no growth senior leadership rank
- Added 29 KC-135 Maintainers and one Pilot to support the "Magna Carta" agreement signed by the PACAF/CC, AMC/CC, ANG Director, GU-TAG, HI-TAG, AK-TAG. Currently on track to receive the first tanker in FY11

More importantly is to look at the organization's anticipated future growth:

- Working on Global Hawk; 50-75 personnel in support of Global Hawk mission on Andersen AFB in the areas of Aircraft Maintenance, Pilots and Communications
- In the process of adding a 17-personnel Heavy Weapons Squad in the Security Force Squadron
- Red Horse is exploring the possibility of picking up the AF Reserve piece which would double its current size to 240 plus
- Forward Support Squadron is pursuing growth in manning from 52 to 75 personnel
- Exploring a Combat Communication Flight association with Andersen AFB

In closing, I am compelled to state that since our inception in 1981, GUANG has slowly evolved and with this evolution comes growth and great increases in new roles, missions, and responsibilities. GUANG has also met or exceeded the challenges and will continue to do so in the future, however, being the only state or territory without a one-star (General Officer) billet to represent the unit at the highest level, we have been left out of discussions and negotiations at the very senior level of military decision making. This handicapping condition has led to a lot of missed opportunities and "Johnny come lately's".

“The GO only” meeting has left us sitting outside the hallways waiting to see what new missions may be coming our way. Establishing a General Officer position within the GUANG will allow us access to top level military discussions and decisions that affect your unit members, island and nation. I am in full support of the passage of Bill 155-30.

I appreciate the opportunity to voice my opinion on this proposal to authorize a Guam Air National Guard, Brigadier General, Assistant Adjutant General-Air position. This organization has evolved over the years to its current mature state. As your Guam Air National Guard; we are there for local and national emergencies. This is our uniqueness from the other reserve components. We are there for our island and/or nation.

The time is right for the Guam Air National Guard to be authorized an Assistant Adjutant General-Air with the authorized rank of Brigadier General, state and federally recognized. We are at the table in mission negotiation with our counterparts from other state and territories but we are not of equal rank, despite having the same mission sets. For those looking at the organization from outside looking in there is no real difference. But that is only at face value, when the door closes for executive session, we are told to “shut-up and color” or asked to leave the room and the real negotiation begins.

We as an organization perform over 45k workdays a year for the last several years. This averages out to approximately 100 workdays per traditional guard member. This makes us one of the busiest ANG units in the nations. We are at the doorstep toward value-added mission sets in the region. To get beyond this doorstep we need the horsepower with a Brigadier General, Assistant Adjutant-Air. It is my opinion as the sitting Guam Air National Guard, Air Base Group Commander. I say this with over 32 years of total military service, also one who has recently deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

We are not asking anything more than any of other Air National Guard organization. We need this person to be federally and state recognized as a Brigadier General. This includes the prerequisites of satisfactorily completing Air War College, having command experience and being a resident of Guam. This should also be the task at hand for the sitting TAG and senior leadership to provide a mechanism to enable Guamanians to rise through the ranks. We can't do a simple requirement of conducting a Federal Recognition Board for our senior officers to be reviewed and recommended to the next rank, again because we do not have an authorized Brigadier General position sitting as the Assistant Adjutant General. We have to go outside the organization to carry-out this board, such as the Hawaii Air National Guard or the Alaska Air National Guard.

In the midst of military growth on Guam, our Guam Air National needs to stay abreast with this growth. We ask for your consideration and affirmative vote to authorize a Brigadier General, Assistant Adjutant General-Air and support of Bill 155-30.

Good afternoon Senators of the 30th Guam Legislature. It is certainly a pleasure to sit before you today on this side of the table to give you a brief testimony on Bill 155-30, relative to the growth of the Guam National Guard. I am Chief Master Sergeant John M. Quinata, 254th Security Forces Manager for 254th Security Forces Squadron of the Guam Air National Guard. I am here to offer testimony in support of Bill 155-30 and specifically on Subsection 63203(b) and 63203(c) of Chapter 63, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated. I have served 28 years of service to the United States and the Territory of Guam. My first 10 years as a active duty Airman with the U.S. Air Force and the next 18 years as an Airman with the Guam Air National Guard. I have seen and have been personally involved with the growth of the Guam Air National Guard. Let me give you a brief perspective as it relates to the growth. The Guam Air Guard was first started on July 21, 1981 (I consider this the birth) as the 254th Civil Engineer (CE) Flight with about 25 personnel. Since then it has taken the baby steps to grow as a unit. From this, the CE Flight transitioned to the 254th CE Squadron (I consider this the teething stage). Not so long after, the Guam Guard added another unit which was the 254th Air Base Group and the 254th Services Flight (crawling stage). Just recently the 254th Security Forces Squadron, 254th Force Support Squadron and the Joint Forces Headquarters were formed (walking stage). The Guam Air Guard has definitely doubled in size in the last eight years from 232 personnel to 550 assigned personnel. The future and growth of finally getting a flying unit are within our horizon. Providing the resource and tools such as the amendments to authorize the Assistant Adjutant General for the Guam Air National Guard the rank of Brigadier General as proposed in Bill 155-30 just makes sense, and strengthens this legislative body's commitment to our Guam Air Guardsmen and ultimately our people of Guam.

As some members of this legislative body have experience, being left out of some very critical meetings with the federal government as it relates to the military build-up is unconscionable. The Guam Air Guard feels the same pain. We too are left out of critical meetings that only General Officers attend. We are not requesting to be any different from other Air Guard units within the States and Territories. We are requesting for the same benefits as it relates to sitting on the same table and being a part of the discussion as oppose to being part of the audience with no voice. Being included to attend these important discussions is the vehicle to push future initiatives and strengthen the ones we have currently. However, at this time the Guam Air Guard has to take whatever opportunity is given for growth and build upon that. In closing, I along with the enlisted members of the Guam Air National Guard request and urge you to support for Bill 155-30. Passage of this bill will add to the resources and tools that the Guam Air

Guard needs to move current and future initiatives forward. Once again, thank you for this opportunity to testify before you today.







BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.

I Mina Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that it is appropriate to recognize that the Guam National Guard has successfully recruited and substantially expanded in the past decade, and that the Guam Air National Guard is poised to expand with a new flying mission in the future, and that the rank of the Adjutant General and the Assistant Adjutant General for Air should be adjusted in accordance with their increased supervisory responsibilities. In addition, I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that an

1 incumbent Adjutant General, who has served in said position for an extended
2 period of time and who has previously been confirmed by I Liheslaturan
3 Guahan, should not be restricted from continuous service as the Adjutant
4 General of the Guam National Guard if it is the desire of the Commander in
5 Chief to retain such individual and if federal recognition status is no longer
6 granted to said individual due to retirement age restrictions.

7 **Section 2. Adjutant General of the Guam National Guard.**

8 Subsections §63201(a) and §63201(b) of Chapter 63, Title 10, Guam Code
9 Annotated, are hereby amended to read as follows:

10 “(a) Be capable of being Federally recognized in accordance with
11 Federal law, and Army and Air Force regulations, as appropriate, in the grade
12 of at least Colonel at the time of appointment and the advice and consent of I
13 Liheslaturan Guahan. Any individual who is serving in the capacity as the
14 Adjutant General of the Guam National Guard, and who has been confirmed
15 by I Liheslaturan Guahan, shall not be required to relinquish said position
16 should federal recognition status no longer be granted as a result of
17 mandatory retirement age restrictions and should the Commander in Chief
18 desire to retain the service of such individual. The Commander in Chief, in
19 such instances, shall transmit in writing a notice of continuous service of the
20 incumbent Adjutant General beyond the term of federal recognition to the
21 Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guahan no later than ten (10) days from the date
22 federal recognition status is no longer applicable.

1 (b) Be promoted in the Guam Army or Air National Guard, as
2 appropriate, at the discretion of the Commander-in-Chief, to a grade not to
3 exceed Lieutenant Major General.”

4 **Section 3. Assistant Adjutant General for the Guam Air National**
5 **Guard.**

6 Subsection §63203(b) and §63203(c) of Chapter 63, Title 10, Guam Code
7 Annotated, are hereby amended to read as follows:

8 “(b) Be qualified for immediate Federal recognition as a colonel ~~or~~
9 ~~lieutenant colonel~~, and shall serve only so long as Federally recognized in
10 such grade; and

11 (c) Be promoted to a rank *not* to exceed Brigadier General at the
12 discretion of I Maga’lahen Guåhan as Commander-in-Chief of the Guam
13 National Guard, and perform such military duties as the Commander of the
14 Guam Air National Guard, under the direction of the Adjutant General, and
15 shall perform all such military duties as may be required of him by the
16 Adjutant General under his supervision and control.”

17 **Section 4. Severability Clause.**

18 *If* any provisions of this Act or its application to any person or
19 circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not*
20 affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect
21 without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions
22 of this Act are severable.
