

**AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER  
AIRPORT POLICE RESERVE PROGRAM WITHIN  
THE A. B. WON PAT INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT  
AUTHORITY POLICE, BY *ADDING* A NEW §1112.3 TO  
CHAPTER 1, TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.**

1           **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2           **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.**    *I Liheslaturan*

3    *Guåhan* finds that the A. B. Won Pat International Airport Authority desires

4    to establish a Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve program within the

5    Airport Police. The purpose of the program is to augment the regular police

6    and security forces during emergencies. Collateral benefits of a Civilian

1 Volunteer Airport Police Reserve include the creation of a pool of  
2 candidates from which to draw to fill vacancies for police and security.  
3 Also, members of the volunteer program would have the opportunity to  
4 experience and decide whether police work would be their career choice.

5 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* believes that the Guam Police Civilian  
6 Volunteer Reserve Program, as an established program, would serve as a  
7 sound model with which to start the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police  
8 Reserve Program. It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to  
9 establish a Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve Program within the  
10 Airport Police, by adding a new §1112.3 to Chapter 1, Title 12, Guam Code  
11 Annotated.

12 **Section 2.** A new §1112.3 is *added* to Chapter 1, of Title 12, Guam  
13 Code Annotated, to read:

14 **“§1112.3. Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve.**

15 There is hereby created within the Airport Police the Civilian  
16 Volunteer Airport Police Reserve, which shall be headed by the Chief  
17 of Airport Police, hereinafter referred to as the Chief. The Chief,  
18 subject to the advice and control of the Airport Executive Manager,  
19 *shall* be responsible for carrying out the purpose of this Chapter, and  
20 *shall* have such additional duties and responsibilities as are authorized  
21 herein, or as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors.

22 (a) **Functions and Duties.** The general functions and duties  
23 of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve *shall* be to provide  
24 backup manpower for the suppression of crime, preservation of law  
25 and order, and to assist in emergencies. The Chief, with the  
26 concurrence of the Executive Manager, *shall* formulate a program  
27 whereby the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve *shall* adhere to

1 the functions and duties herein prescribed. From time to time, the  
2 Chief *shall* review and revise the functions and duties of the Civilian  
3 Volunteer Airport Police Reserve to insure an amicable discharge of  
4 responsibilities and duties, recognizing the fact that their roles are the  
5 extension of the duties of the regular Airport Police personnel.

6 (b) **Recruitment.** The Chief of the Airport Police *shall*  
7 recruit, on an entirely voluntary basis, local residents who desire to  
8 make available their services to assist the Guam Airport Authority  
9 emergency functions. The Chief of Airport Police *shall* further  
10 promulgate rules and regulations regarding the age, health and other  
11 requirements for recruitment purposes, in concurrence with the  
12 Executive Manager.

13 (c) **Training, Equipping and Maintenance of Records.**  
14 The Chief of Airport Police *shall* devise a program whereby the police  
15 divisions of the Airport will provide the members of the Civilian  
16 Volunteer Airport Police Reserve training in crime prevention control,  
17 and operational techniques and procedures for natural and man-made  
18 emergencies. The Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve *shall*  
19 maintain a roster of volunteers who have received the training, and *no*  
20 volunteer may remain in the Reserve if he or she is unable to keep up  
21 with or otherwise absorb the training. Additionally, basic supplies  
22 and equipment *shall* be provided by the Airport to assure the constant  
23 operability of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve,  
24 including a continuing program for replacement.

25 (d) **Volunteer: Authority.** Whenever the police unit of the  
26 Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve, and the members thereof  
27 are rendering assistance to the police or firemen, as the case may be,

1 such volunteers *shall* have the same powers, duties, rights (including  
2 coverage under the Worker’s Compensation Act), privileges and  
3 immunities as if they were paid, full-time members of the Airport,  
4 *except* that they *shall* earn recruitment credit for services performed as  
5 volunteers.

6 (e) **Same: Allowance.** Each member of the Civilian  
7 Volunteer Airport Police Reserve who successfully completes  
8 probationary requirements as established by the Chief of Airport  
9 Police, and who contributes a minimum of forty-two (42) hours or  
10 more per month, *shall* receive an allowance of Two Hundred Fifty  
11 Dollars (\$250.00) per month, to defray the cost of maintenance of  
12 equipment and uniforms. The Airport *shall* identify funds for  
13 appropriation to satisfy the intent of this Section.

14 (f) **Same: Eligibility and Oath.** *No* person shall be a  
15 volunteer member of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve  
16 established under this Chapter who advocates a change by force or  
17 violence in the constitutional form of the Government of the United  
18 States or in this Territory or the overthrow of any government in the  
19 United States by force, or who has been convicted of or is under  
20 indictment or information charging any subversive act against the  
21 United States. Every volunteer *shall*, entering upon his duties, take an  
22 oath, in writing, before a person authorized to administer oaths in this  
23 Territory, which oath *shall* be substantially as follows:

24 “I \_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly swear (or  
25 affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of  
26 the United States and the laws of the territory of Guam,  
27 against all enemies, foreign or domestic; that I will bear

1 true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this  
2 obligation freely, without any mental reservation or  
3 purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully  
4 discharge the duties upon which I am about to enter and I  
5 do further swear (or affirm) that I do not advocate, nor  
6 am I a member of any political party or organization that  
7 advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United  
8 States or of this Territory by force or violence; and that  
9 during such time as I am a member of the Civilian  
10 Volunteer Airport Police Reserve I will not advocate nor  
11 become a member of any political party or organization  
12 that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the  
13 United States or of this Territory by force or violence.”

14 (g) **Rules and Regulations: Recommendations.** The Chief  
15 of Airport Police is authorized and empowered to recommend to the  
16 Executive Manager for issuance as Airport orders the making,  
17 amendment and recession of such orders, rules and regulations as may  
18 be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Chapter.”

**COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST**

**I. OVERVIEW**

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement, & Senior Citizens convened the public hearing on March 4, 2010 at 10:10am in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 330-30 (COR) – “An act to establish a Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program within the Guam Airport Authority Airport Police, by adding a new section 1112.3 to Chapter 1, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated,” sponsored by Senator Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr.

## II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES

**Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr. called the Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement, and Senior Citizens to order at 10:10am**, he greets everyone present for the public hearing. As author of the bill, he gives a brief presentation and background information.

The chairman stated that this bill is to establish the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve program at the Airport. This bill was introduced at the request of the Chief of the Airport Police. The purpose of the reserve program is to augment the regular force and the security force during emergencies, and any other time the force experiences manpower shortage due to leave. There are also collateral benefits of a volunteer reserve program in that it includes a creation of a pool of candidates to fill vacancies, and to decide whether police work would be their career choice. A member of the reserve program usually graduates into a regular full time employment with the force. At the same time, members of the program get to try it out, and if they really don't like it, they have the option to leave.

This proposed program is modeled after the Guam Police Department's program. GPD's program has refined the process through the years. This program is strictly on a volunteer basis, but their duties and functions are listed in the bill, so that primarily they will be like "back-up" officers or partners to senior officers. Generally, the function of the volunteer will be ordinary routine patrol, give citation, enforcement of the parking lot, etc., however, the volunteers can get into specialized duties, but it all depends on the policy. There will be recruitment, training, and equipment for the volunteers. They will be covered under the workman's compensation act even though they are not getting paid. Volunteers are entitled to a monthly stipend of \$250. Volunteers have to work not less than 42 hours a month, to be entitled to the \$250. Chairman Palacios then recognizes the Airport Chief of Police, Mr. Robert Camacho to present his testimony.

**Mr. Robert D. Camacho, Chief of the Guam Airport Police, oral and written testimony, in support.** Mr. Camacho read directly from his written testimony. He states, that he is here today along with many of the uniformed officers from the Guam Airport Police to support a bill that would greatly enhance our mission to protect and serve our travelers, GIAA employees, tenants and the community as a whole. As law enforcement officers, we play an important role in ensuring our island is safe from acts of terrorism both foreign and domestic, thereby creating an environment where many tourists will feel safe and secure as they come to our island.

We currently have a total of 74 personnel, 72 of which are uniformed officers. A civilian volunteer reserve police force will provide additional law enforcement support to cover almost 2000 acres of airport property. With the ongoing international threat, we will possibly see our officers who also serve in the Army Reserve and National Guard, continue to be deployed to Iraq, Afghanistan, the

Horn of Africa, and the Philippines, for several months at a time, affecting our ability to administer our critical mission and respond to crisis.

The military buildup is expected to stimulate our local economy. At the same time, we can also logically surmise that there will be increased demand to handle the enormous influx of air travelers by the military, their families, contractors, and a host of new and emerging companies. One very important aspect to note, that as we discuss and finalize this bill, that you consider authorizing the airport to create an "Airport Police Fund" specifically for the airport police reserve stipends, its equipment and training program. We hope that you can consider allowing a certain portion of our traffic citations and fines to help supplement and fund this program. It would be very disappointing to see a program unfulfilled simply due to lack of inadequate and sufficient funding. *(Please see written testimony attached.)*

**Chairman Palacios** stated for the record that 14 people signed up in support of the bill but declined to give oral or written testimony. He then addressed the GIAA police department and stated that what is similar to the Guam Police Revolving Fund may be established similar to GIAA Police Service Fund. He then stated that he can model the GIAA Police Service Fund after the Guam Police Revolving Fund but at a later date.

This bill would establish the program but the implementation would depend on the GIAA Board of Directors. They are the policy makers of the airport and they set the rules and regulations of the Airport, and the authority of the Chief in determining his or her powers. This is how the autonomous agencies function.

If you look at the hours that these volunteers will give, this revenue will come back to the Airport Police because 90% of the budget goes into paying personnel salaries. If you can get free labor, you will be getting a tremendous benefit and a cost savings to the department. If an incoming airport police officer is getting a bit more than minimum wage, then it will help the department with financing. If a member of the program works 42 hours or more per month they will be entitled to \$250 a month to defray the cost of maintenance of their equipment and uniforms. The Airport shall identify funds for appropriation to satisfy the intent that is saying that you don't come to us for funding, it's up to you to go and lobby for your funds as it always is, and you know the process at that point.

**Mr. Robert Camacho** stated that instead of stating 42 hours, it could be 40 hours. This is the reason why it may be more lucrative or by prorating a volunteer's time on duty. If you perform so many hours, you get a certain amount of money for that month to give them incentive.

**Chairman Palacios** stated that he doesn't know why people don't show up to volunteer. If people worked 42 hours, it won't be difficult to get. If we lessen this, we might weaken the program. If someone were to work less than 30 hours, and the next month they meet the 42 hours, then there is

no discipline involved. I found out that the practice is that people who are not performing, they would be suspended. The appropriate discipline process is, instead of putting this person on suspension, to place them on the demerit system. The idea is not have that officer lose those hours that he earned. If we go with the prorated issue, it may be a labor issue because how can you calculate \$250.00 divided by 42 hours? I would think that this policy must be consistent with the program instead of calculating this by the hour. There may be a problem with this rule. These volunteers should not be treated as a back up because a police reserve is excited to come to work. Give them something interesting and not just staying in menial assignments. I saw this happening at the Guam Police Department and people were not motivated to come to work. Don't mistreat these volunteers because they will not be motivated.

**Cpt. Tim Santos, GPD Police Reserve Program, oral testimony, in support.** Cpt. Tim Santos stated that GPD supports this program because it has brought tremendous help to the department. GIAA Police, in their area of jurisdiction, they are able to produce programs to reduce traffic fatality and speed related incidents, and proactive activities. These reservists could come in, be trained and they can be proud of their training. The comments about our struggles of the GPD program are evident and this is why we are trying to revamp the program. We would like to state that GPD is available to the Airport Police. We would like to render support.

**Chairman Palacios** stated, Chief, you can now work closely with the GPD, Cpt. Tim is in charge of the Guam Police Reserve Program because he is here to support you. Now, you will have to convince the Airport Board for funding, and that the investment that you put in will yield a big benefit to the manpower. If you can get some of these volunteers at the airport, this will bring tremendous savings to the airport. If you need me to testify before the board, I can go in and testify as a private citizen and state my experience with the GPD reserve program and how I envision a volunteer force.

**Chairman Palacios** concluded the hearing and requested that written testimony be submitted up to March 10th. He adjourned the hearing at 10:45am.

### III. WRITTEN TESTIMONIES

**Mr. Robert D. Camacho, Chief of the Guam Airport Police, written testimony in support of the bill was received on March 4, 2010 via hand delivery.** Chief Camacho's written testimony is appended to this report, please see attached.

**Mr. Andrew S. Leon Guerrero, Acting Director, Governor's Highway Safety Representative, Office of Highway Safety, Department of Public Works, In Support, Written Testimony received on March 9, 2010.**

Mr. Leon Guerrero states: Our support towards the establishment of Airport's Civilian Volunteer Program congregates with the upcoming Military Build-up and the impact on Guam's highway

road expansion that is expected to infiltrate the motorists continued access along Airport's roadways to avoid traffic congestion along Guam's major roadways. In addition, and as required, there exists the Quitclaim Deed between the Federal Highway Administration and the Government of Guam, to construct and expand the Tiyan Parkway to a four lane road with a 45MPH speed requirement. Thus, it foresees as an increase of traffic and a need for additional manpower to offset and the intent to encourage volunteers to contribute their services to reduce traffic incidences within Airport's roadway jurisdiction. With the increase and an incentive of this program, it demonstrates an important and significant part of Airport Police's efforts to protect and save lives of the island community. The high rise of enforcement is expected and is paramount to improving the quality of saving lives. Allowing the Airport Police to pursue this program and bring in citizens together with their law enforcement to deter and reduce highway crashes overall makes our roadways safer. *(Please see written testimony attached.)*

#### **IV. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement, & Senior Citizens finds that Bill No. 330-30 (COR) intends to establish a Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program within the Guam Airport Authority Airport Police by adding a new §1112.3 to Chapter 1, Title 12 Guam Code Annotated. The purpose of the program is to augment the regular police and security forces during emergencies. There are two collateral benefits of the program, (i) creating a pool of candidates from which management can identify to fill vacancies for police and security; and (ii) members of the volunteer program would have the opportunity to experience and decide whether police work would be their career choice.

The bill also provides that the Chief of the Airport Police, subject to the advice and control of the Airport Executive Manager, shall be responsible for carrying out the purpose of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve, and shall have additional duties and responsibilities as authorized or as prescribed by the Board of Directors. The bill would allow monthly stipend of \$250.00 to each member of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve who successfully completes probationary requirements as established by the Chief, and who contributes a minimum of 42 hours or more per month.

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement, & Senior Citizens hereby reports out **Bill No. 330-30 (COR) as introduced** with the recommendation **TO PASS**.

1           **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2           **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that  
3 the Guam Airport Authority (GAA) desires to establish a Civilian Volunteer Police  
4 Reserve program within the Airport Police. The purpose of the program is to augment  
5 the regular police and security forces during emergencies. Collateral benefits of a  
6 Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve include the creation of a pool of candidates from  
7 which to draw to fill vacancies for police and security. Also, members of the volunteer  
8 program would have the opportunity to experience and decide whether police work  
9 would be their career choice.

10           *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* believes that the Guam Police Civilian Volunteer Reserve  
11 Program, as an established program would serve as a sound model with which to start the  
12 Airport Civilian Volunteer Reserve Program. It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan*  
13 *Guåhan* to establish a Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program within the GAA  
14 Airport Police, by adding a new §1112.3 to Chapter 1, Title 12 Guam Code Annotated.

15           **Section 2.** A new §1112.3 is *added* to Chapter 1, 12GCA to read:

1           “§1112.3. **Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve.** There is hereby created  
2 within the Airport Police the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve, which shall be  
3 headed by the Chief of Police, herein after referred to as the Chief. The Chief, subject to  
4 advice and control of the Airport Executive Manager shall be responsible for carrying out  
5 the purpose of this Chapter, and shall have such additional duties and responsibilities as  
6 are authorized herein, or as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors.

7           (a) **Functions and Duties.** The general functions and duties of the Civilian  
8 Volunteer Airport Police Reserve shall be to provide backup manpower for the  
9 suppression of crime, preservation of law and order, and to assist in emergencies. The  
10 Chief, with the concurrence of the Executive Manager, shall formulate a program  
11 whereby the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve shall adhere to the functions and  
12 duties herein prescribed. From time to time the Chief shall review and revise the  
13 functions and duties of Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve to insure an amicable  
14 discharge of responsibilities and duties knowing the fact that their roles are the extension  
15 of duties of the regular Airport Police personnel.

16           (b) **Recruitment.** The Chief of the Airport Police shall recruit on an entirely  
17 voluntary basis, local residents who desire to make available their services to assist the  
18 Guam Airport Authority emergency functions. The Chief of Police shall further  
19 promulgate rules and regulations regarding the age, health and other requirements for  
20 recruitment purposes, in concurrence with the Executive Manager.

21           (c) **Training, Equipping and Maintenance of Records.** The Chief of Police  
22 shall devise a program whereby the police divisions of the Airport provide the members  
23 of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve training in crime prevention control, and

1 operational techniques and procedures for natural and man-made emergencies. The  
2 Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve shall maintain a roster of volunteers who have  
3 received the training and no volunteer may remain in the Reserve if he or she is unable to  
4 keep up with or otherwise absorb the training. Additionally, basic supplies and  
5 equipment shall be provided by the Airport to assure a constant and operability of the  
6 Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve, including a continuing program for  
7 replacement.

8 (d) **Volunteer: Authority.** Whenever the police unit of the Civilian Volunteer  
9 Airport Police Reserve, and the members thereof are rendering assistance to the police or  
10 fireman, as the case may be, such volunteers shall have the same powers, duties, rights  
11 (including coverage under the Worker's Compensation Act), privileges and immunities,  
12 as if they were paid, full-time members of the Airport, except that they shall earn  
13 recruitment credit for services performed as volunteers.

14 (e) **Same: Allowance.** Each member of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police  
15 Reserve who successfully completes probationary requirements as established by the  
16 Chief of Police, and who contributes a minimum of forty-two hours or more per month,  
17 shall receive an allowance of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per month, to defray  
18 the cost of maintenance of their equipment and uniforms. The Airport shall identify  
19 funds for appropriation to satisfy the intent of the Section.

20 (f) **Same: Eligibility and Oath.** No person shall be a volunteer member of the  
21 Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve established under this Chapter who advocates  
22 a change by force or violence in the constitutional form of the Government of the United  
23 States or in this Territory or the overthrow of any government in the United States by

1 force, or who has been convicted of or is under indictment or information charging any  
2 subversive act against the United States. Every volunteer shall, entering upon his duties,  
3 take an oath, in writing, before a person authorized to administer oaths in this Territory,  
4 which oath shall be substantially as follows:

5 "I \_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will  
6 support and defend the Constitution of the United States and the laws of the  
7 territory of Guam, against all enemies, foreign or domestic; that I will bear  
8 true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any  
9 mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully  
10 discharge the duties upon which I am about to enter and I do further swear (or  
11 affirm) that I do not advocate, nor am I a member of any political party or  
12 organization that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States  
13 or of this Territory by force or violence; and that during such time as I am a  
14 member of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve I will not advocate nor  
15 become a member of any political party or organization that advocates the  
16 overthrow of the Government of the United States or of this Territory by force or  
17 violence."

18 **(g) Rules and Regulations: Recommendations.** The Chief of Police is  
19 authorized and empowered to recommend to the Executive Manager for issuance as  
20 Airport orders the making, amendment and recession of such orders, rules and regulations  
21 as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Chapter."

### **TESTIMONY ON BILL 330-30**

GOOD MORNING HONORABLE SENATORS .....MY NAME IS ROBERT CAMACHO, CHIEF OF AIRPORT POLICE.

I WOULD LIKE TO BEGIN BY THANKING YOU FOR GIVING US THIS GREAT OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK TO YOU IN SUPPORT OF BILL 330-30.

I AM HERE TODAY ALONG WITH MANY OF OUR UNIFORMED OFFICERS FROM GUAM AIRPORT POLICE TO SUPPORT A BILL THAT WOULD GREATLY ENHANCE OUR MISSION TO PROTECT AND SERVE OUR TRAVELERS, GIAA EMPLOYEES, TENANTS AND THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE.

AS LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, WE PLAY AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN ENSURING OUR ISLAND IS SAFE FROM ACTS OF TERRORISM BOTH FOREIGN AND DOMESTIC. IN SO DOING, WE ALSO HELP TO CREATE AN ENVIRONMENT WHERE ABOUT A MILLION TOURISTS EACH YEAR WILL FEEL SAFE AND SECURE AS THEY COME TO PARTAKE AND ENJOY OUR ISLAND CULTURE AND ITS PEOPLE. THUS, WE PLAY A SIGNIFICANT PART IN GROWING GUAM'S ECONOMY.

WE CURRENTLY HAVE A TOTAL OF 74 PERSONNEL. 72 OF WHICH ARE UNIFORMED OFFICERS. A CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER RESERVE POLICE FORCE WILL PROVIDE ADDITIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT TO COVER ALMOST 2000 ACRES OF AIRPORT PROPERTY.

OUR DUTIES ARE NOT CONFINED TO THE AIRPORT TERMINAL ALONE. WE RESPOND TO MANY AREAS WITHIN THE JURISDICTION AND BOUNDARIES OF THE AIRPORT. ASIDE FROM NORMAL ROUTINE PATROLS AND INVESTIGATIONS, WE HELP SUPPORT GPD BY RESPONDING TO NUMEROUS JFK INCIDENTS. WE ARE INVOLVED IN A FEDERAL PROGRAM TO ENFORCE TRAFFIC LAWS, SEATBELT SAFETY AND DUI CHECKPOINTS FOR ROAD NETWORKS ADJACENT TO THE AIRPORT. THE NEW PROPOSED PARKWAY WILL ALSO BE ADDED TO OUR HOST OF RESPONSIBILITIES ADDING TO OUR ALREADY STRAINED RESOURCES. AS WE CONTINUE TO EXPAND THE AIRPORT CARGO AND SUPPORT FACILITIES, SO TOO MUST OUR PERSONNEL RESOURCES EXPAND TO MEET SECURITY DEMANDS.

THE GLOBAL WAR ON TERRORISM IS AN EFFORT THAT WILL PRESUMABLY CONTINUE FOR AN UNDETERMINED TIME. THEREFORE, WE MUST SAFEGUARD OUR AIRPORT FOR THIS EVER-PRESENT THREAT. WITH ELEVATED LEVELS OF SECURITY, THERE IS A CORRESPONDING NEED TO

MAN SPECIFIC AREAS WITH A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF PERSONNEL. WE MUST ENSURE THAT WE ARE PREPARED AND REQUIREMENTS ARE MET WHENEVER THAT THREAT LEVEL RISES THROUGH HOMELAND OR TSA. AN ACTIVE RESERVE PROGRAM WILL HELP FULFILL THAT REQUIREMENT.

WITH THIS ONGOING INTERNATIONAL THREAT, WE WILL POSSIBLY SEE OUR OFFICERS WHO ALSO SERVE IN THE ARMY RESERVES AND NATIONAL GUARD, CONTINUE TO BE DEPLOYED TO IRAQ, AFGANISTAN, THE HORN OF AFRICA AND THE PHILIPPINES, FOR SEVERAL MONTHS AT A TIME. AGAIN, AFFECTING OUR ABILITY TO HANDLE OUR CRITICAL MISSION AND RESPOND TO CRISIS.

THE MILITARY BUILDUP IS EXPECTED TO STIMULATE OR LOCAL ECONOMY. AT THE SAME TIME, WE CAN ALSO LOGICALLY SURMISE THAT THERE WILL BE INCREASED DEMAND TO HANDLE THE ENORMOUS INFLUX OF AIR TRAVELERS BY THE MILITARY, THEIR FAMILIES, CONTRACTORS AND A HOST OF NEW AND EMERGING COMPANIES.

THIS RESERVE PROGRAM WILL ALSO HELP TO IMPROVE MORALE BY ALLOWING OFFICERS TO TAKE THEIR MUCH DESERVED LEAVE. FOR MANY YEARS, THAT HAS OFTEN TAKEN A BACKSEAT TO MISSION REQUIREMENTS. IT WILL ALSO ALLOW TIME TO FULFILL TRAINING MANDATES THAT HAS BEEN QUITE CHALLENGING TO MEET WHEN THERE IS A SHORTAGE OF PERSONNEL. CONTINUOUS AND EFFECTIVE TRAINING IS ESSENTIAL WHEN IT COMES TO SAFETY AND SECURITY.

ONE VERY IMPORTANT ASPECT TO NOTE, THAT AS WE DISCUSS AND FINALIZE THIS BILL, THAT YOU CONSIDER AUTHORIZING THE AIRPORT TO CREATE AN "AIRPORT POLICE FUND" SPECIFICALLY FOR THE AIRPORT POLICE RESERVE STIPENDS, ITS EQUIPMENT AND TRAINING PROGRAM. WE HOPE THAT YOU CAN CONSIDER ALLOWING A CERTAIN PORTION OF OUR TRAFFIC CITATIONS AND FINES TO HELP SUPPLEMENT AND FUND THIS PROGRAM. IT WOULD BE VERY DISAPPOINTING TO SEE A PROGRAM UNFULFILLED SIMPLY DUE TO LACK OF ADEQUATE AND SUFFICIENT FUNDING.

IN CONCLUSION, I BELIEVE THAT BILL 330-30 ESTABLISHING THE POLICE RESERVE WILL BE TAKING AN EFFECTIVE AND PROACTIVE APPROACH TO MANY OF THE SECURITY CONCERNS OF THE AIRPORT. THIS PROGRAM HAS BEEN LONG AWAITED. SO THEREFORE, WE THE AIRPORT POLICE ASK FOR YOUR FULL SUPPORT IN THIS WORTHWHILE AND MUCH NEEDED PROGRAM.

Good morning Honorable Senator Palacios, and Honorable Committee Members:

The Department of Public Works – Office of Highway Safety, herein submit their written testimony in support of the “Establishing a Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program within the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam (GLAA) Airport Police.

As the Governor’s Highway Safety Representative for Guam, the Department of Public Works – Office of Highway Safety functions relates to all highway safety standards established by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and the Department of Transportation, to influence public and private agencies and departments through constant increase of public awareness and enforcement activities, and reiterating the importance of highway safety programs by reducing traffic crashes, deaths, injuries and property damage resulting in Guam’s public roadways.

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

## RAMIFICATIONS/IMPLICATIONS/ISSUES/HIGHLIGHTS:

1. Bill intends to establish a Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program within the Guam Airport Authority Airport Police by adding a new §1112.3 to Chapter 1, Title 12 Guam Code Annotated.
2. Bill intends for the Chief of the Airport Police, subject to the advice and control of the Airport Executive Manager, shall be responsible for carrying out the purpose of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve and shall have additional duties and responsibilities as authorized within this section or as prescribed by the Board of Directors.
3. Bill shall provide backup manpower for the suppression of crime, preservation of law and order, and to assist in emergencies.
4. Bill would require a \$250.00 stipend to Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve who successfully completes probationary requirements as established by the Chief.
5. Bill would require the volunteer to take an oath, in writing, before a person authorized to administer oaths in this Territory.
6. Bill would require the Chief of Police to recommend to the Executive Manager for issuance as Airport orders the making, amendment and recession of such order, rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Chapter.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that  
3 the Guam Airport Authority (GAA) desires to establish a Civilian Volunteer Police  
4 Reserve program within the Airport Police. The purpose of the program is to augment  
5 the regular police and security forces during emergencies. Collateral benefits of a  
6 Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve include the creation of a pool of candidates from  
7 which to draw to fill vacancies for police and security. Also, members of the volunteer  
8 program would have the opportunity to experience and decide whether police work  
9 would be their career choice.

10 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* believes that the Guam Police Civilian Volunteer Reserve  
11 Program, as an established program would serve as a sound model with which to start the  
12 Airport Civilian Volunteer Reserve Program. It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan*  
13 *Guåhan* to establish a Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program within the GAA  
14 Airport Police, by adding a new §1112.3 to Chapter 1, Title 12 Guam Code Annotated.

15 **Section 2.** A new §1112.3 is *added* to Chapter 1, 12GCA to read:

1           “§1112.3. **Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve.** There is hereby created  
2 within the Airport Police the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve, which shall be  
3 headed by the Chief of Police, herein after referred to as the Chief. The Chief, subject to  
4 advice and control of the Airport Executive Manager shall be responsible for carrying out  
5 the purpose of this Chapter, and shall have such additional duties and responsibilities as  
6 are authorized herein, or as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors.

7           (a) **Functions and Duties.** The general functions and duties of the Civilian  
8 Volunteer Airport Police Reserve shall be to provide backup manpower for the  
9 suppression of crime, preservation of law and order, and to assist in emergencies. The  
10 Chief, with the concurrence of the Executive Manager, shall formulate a program  
11 whereby the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve shall adhere to the functions and  
12 duties herein prescribed. From time to time the Chief shall review and revise the  
13 functions and duties of Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve to insure an amicable  
14 discharge of responsibilities and duties knowing the fact that their roles are the extension  
15 of duties of the regular Airport Police personnel.

16           (b) **Recruitment.** The Chief of the Airport Police shall recruit on an entirely  
17 voluntary basis, local residents who desire to make available their services to assist the  
18 Guam Airport Authority emergency functions. The Chief of Police shall further  
19 promulgate rules and regulations regarding the age, health and other requirements for  
20 recruitment purposes, in concurrence with the Executive Manager.

21           (c) **Training, Equipping and Maintenance of Records.** The Chief of Police  
22 shall devise a program whereby the police divisions of the Airport provide the members  
23 of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve training in crime prevention control, and

1 operational techniques and procedures for natural and man-made emergencies. The  
2 Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve shall maintain a roster of volunteers who have  
3 received the training and no volunteer may remain in the Reserve if he or she is unable to  
4 keep up with or otherwise absorb the training. Additionally, basic supplies and  
5 equipment shall be provided by the Airport to assure a constant and operability of the  
6 Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve, including a continuing program for  
7 replacement.

8 (d) **Volunteer: Authority.** Whenever the police unit of the Civilian Volunteer  
9 Airport Police Reserve, and the members thereof are rendering assistance to the police or  
10 fireman, as the case may be, such volunteers shall have the same powers, duties, rights  
11 (including coverage under the Worker's Compensation Act), privileges and immunities,  
12 as if they were paid, full-time members of the Airport, except that they shall earn  
13 recruitment credit for services performed as volunteers.

14 (e) **Same: Allowance.** Each member of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police  
15 Reserve who successfully completes probationary requirements as established by the  
16 Chief of Police, and who contributes a minimum of forty-two hours or more per month,  
17 shall receive an allowance of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per month, to defray  
18 the cost of maintenance of their equipment and uniforms. The Airport shall identify  
19 funds for appropriation to satisfy the intent of the Section.

20 (f) **Same: Eligibility and Oath.** No person shall be a volunteer member of the  
21 Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve established under this Chapter who advocates  
22 a change by force or violence in the constitutional form of the Government of the United  
23 States or in this Territory or the overthrow of any government in the United States by

1 force, or who has been convicted of or is under indictment or information charging any  
2 subversive act against the United States. Every volunteer shall, entering upon his duties,  
3 take an oath, in writing, before a person authorized to administer oaths in this Territory,  
4 which oath shall be substantially as follows:

5 "I \_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will  
6 support and defend the Constitution of the United States and the laws of the  
7 territory of Guam, against all enemies, foreign or domestic; that I will bear  
8 true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any  
9 mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully  
10 discharge the duties upon which I am about to enter and I do further swear (or  
11 affirm) that I do not advocate, nor am I a member of any political party or  
12 organization that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States  
13 or of this Territory by force or violence; and that during such time as I am a  
14 member of the Civilian Volunteer Airport Police Reserve I will not advocate nor  
15 become a member of any political party or organization that advocates the  
16 overthrow of the Government of the United States or of this Territory by force or  
17 violence."

18 **(g) Rules and Regulations: Recommendations.** The Chief of Police is  
19 authorized and empowered to recommend to the Executive Manager for issuance as  
20 Airport orders the making, amendment and recession of such orders, rules and regulations  
21 as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Chapter."
