

**AN ACT TO APPROVE THE CHILD SUPPORT
GUIDELINES, SUBMITTED TO *I LIHESLATURAN
GUÅHAN* BY THE CHILD SUPPORT GUIDELINES
REVIEW COMMISSION PURSUANT TO PUBLIC LAW 28-
63 AND PUBLIC LAW 28-68.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Statement, Findings and Intent.** Public Law 28-
3 63, Section 4 and Public Law 28-68, Chapter IV, Section 95, established the Child
4 Support Guidelines Review Commission (Commission), and mandated the
5 Commission to review and make recommendations to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*
6 regarding enactment of the Child Support Guidelines. The Commission submitted
7 to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* on February 2, 2009, the proposed guidelines for

1 consideration and approval, which incorporated several substantive changes. The
2 Commission recommends that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* approve the guidelines.

3 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the current Child Support Guidelines were
4 last updated in 1996. Current law (Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 34,
5 §34118) requires that they be reviewed and updated every four (4) years. Time is
6 of the essence in adopting the proposed guidelines.

7 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that during the last twenty-four (24) months,
8 the Commission met and held sixteen (16) public meetings, the last of which was
9 held at the Office of the Attorney General (Pedro’s Plaza, first floor) on January
10 27, 2009. All public meetings were conducted pursuant to the “Open Government
11 Law.”

12 With the submission of the new guidelines, it is, therefore, the intent of *I*
13 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* to consider and approve the guidelines.

14 **Section 2.** The proposed Child Support Guidelines submitted to *I*
15 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* on February 2, 2009, by the Attorney General and Deputy
16 Attorney General of the Child Support Enforcement Division of Guam and
17 attached as **APPENDIX I** to this Act are hereby approved.

18 **Section 3.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule *or* regulation
19 the implementation of the updated Child Support Guidelines *shall* become
20 effective on the 1st day of May 2009.

21 **Section 4.** §34118(f) of Chapter 34, Article 1, of Title 5, Guam Code
22 Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

23 “(f) Either parent of a child for whom child support has been
24 previously ordered *may* petition the Superior Court of Guam, Judicial Hearings
25 Division *or* the Child Support Enforcement Division *not more than* once every
26 three (3) years for review and adjustment of the child support order *without having*
27 to show a change of circumstances. Either parent may petition the Superior Court

1 of Guam, Judicial Hearings Division *or* the Child Support Enforcement Division
2 for review and adjustment of the child support order more than once in any three
3 (3) year period *if* the second *or* a subsequent request is supported by proof of a
4 substantial *or* material change of circumstances. For the purposes of child support,
5 substantial *or* material change in circumstances is defined as an increase *or*
6 decrease in one (1) parent's salary which results in an increase *or* decrease between
7 the old child support amount and the new child support amount by at least ten
8 percent (10%) for a period of six (6) months. *If* the custodial parent is receiving *or*
9 has received assistance from a government program funded by Title IV, Part A of
10 the Social Security Act, the Child Support Enforcement Division *shall* review
11 every three (3) years from the effective date of the Order, and, *if* appropriate, *shall*
12 file in Superior Court either a motion *or* stipulation to adjust the order. Regardless
13 of whether the custodial parent is receiving *or* has received public assistance, the
14 Child Support Enforcement Division *shall* review every three (3) years from the
15 effective date of the Order, and, *if* warranted, *shall* file in Superior Court a motion
16 *or* stipulation to adjust an order by applying the Child Support Enforcement
17 Division guidelines *or* by applying a Cost of Living Adjustment to the order. The
18 Child Support Enforcement Division may use automated methods to identify
19 orders to review and adjust pursuant hereto.”

§1201. Explanation. The law provides that the Attorney General shall adopt, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, Child Support Guidelines, a schedule of normal child support payments to be paid by a non-custodial parent to a custodial parent. [5 GCA §34118]

The law has also created an expedited judicial process agency within the Superior Court of Guam designated as the Judicial Hearings Division. This administrative agency has concurrent jurisdiction with the Superior Court over child support matters. Therefore, all references in the guidelines to court hearings include administrative hearings, all references to court orders include administrative orders, and all references to judges include administrative hearings officers. [19 GCA §5501, et seq]

While Guam's Child Support Guidelines are based on an Income Share Model developed by the Child Support Guidelines project of the National Center for State Courts, and the model is predicated on the concept that the child should receive the same proportion of parental income that he or she would have received had the parents lived together, we acknowledge the need for a schedule indicating the fair and reasonable amount of child support to be paid based on the income of the parties.

The Child Support Enforcement Division has, with the help of Policy Studies Inc., Denver Colorado, worked on developing a Schedule, as required by 5 GCA §34118, to show the fair and reasonable amount of child support to be paid based on the income of the parties.

Exhibit A, attached hereto, is the Updated Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligations. This is intended to serve as a base, and not as a ceiling or cap. These figures are intended to operate as a rebuttable presumption in computing child support under the Child Support Guidelines.

§1202. Introduction. (a) Purposes.

(1) To establish a standard of support for children consistent with the reasonable needs of children and the ability of parents to pay;

(2) To make child support awards consistent for persons in similar circumstances;

(3) To give parents and courts guidance in establishing child support orders and to promote settlements;

(4) To comply with federal law (42 U.S.C. Section 651 et. seq., 45 C.F.R. Section 302.56);

(5) To comply with local law (5 GCA §34118).

(b) Premises.

(1) These guidelines apply to all children, whether born in or out of wedlock.

(2) The child support award should permit the children the standard of living which as closely as possible approximates the one they would have had if the family remained together, recognizing the cost of maintaining two households.

(3) The child support obligation has priority over all other financial obligations.

(4) The fact that a custodial parent receives child support does not mean that he or she may not also be entitled to spousal maintenance.

(5) The obligation to support other children may be taken into account by the court, but shall not necessarily entitle the paying parent to a reduction of support, proportionate or otherwise. See 19 GAR §1203(b)(3).

(c) **Presumption.**

(1) **Guidelines:** In any action to establish or modify child support, whether temporary or permanent, the child support guidelines shall be used in the establishment or modification of the amount of child support.

Courts may deviate from the guidelines where its application would be inequitable. In such cases, the court shall enter appropriate written or specific findings on the record.

(2) **Needs:** The guidelines presume that the cost to provide for the average needs of children are as listed in the attached Schedule. Should a custodial parent request child support in excess of the presumed average needs for the child, direct evidence must be presented at the time of hearing to prove that the actual needs of the child are in excess of the presumed average needs of the child in order to overcome the presumption. (For example, where the parents' combined adjusted monthly gross income is \$4,000, the cost to provide for the average needs of one child according to the table is \$746 per month. Should the custodial parent seek a child support award of more than \$ 746 per month, he/she must provide evidence of the child's actual needs in excess of \$746 per month.)

§1203. How to Use the Guidelines in Sole Physical Custody Situations. (a) The gross income of the parties shall be determined, as follows:

(1) Gross income includes income from any source, and may include, but is not limited to, income from salaries, wages, commissions, bonuses, dividends, severance pay, pensions, interest, trust income, annuities, capital gains, social security benefits, gifts, prizes, worker's compensation benefits, spousal maintenance received, disability benefits, rental income, retirement plans, pensions and basic and variable allowances for housing and subsistence from military pay and benefits including but not limited to basic allowance for housing (BAH), basic allowance for subsistence (BAS), basic allowance for quarters (BAQ), specialty & proficiency pay, war-zone allowance, hazardous duty, and any other entitlements reflected in the monthly leave and earnings statement (LES), such as the cost-of-living allowance (COLA) for those in high cost areas and other allowances. If the servicemember does not receive BAH or BAQ because he/she lives on base, then the value of that free housing is imputed to his/her income using the military pay charts available on the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) website.

(2) Gross income does not include benefits received from means-tested public assistance programs including, but not limited to, temporary assistance to needy families (TANF), supplemental security income (SSI), food stamps, general assistance, or sums received as child support.

(3) For income from self-employment, rent, royalties, proprietorship of a business, or joint ownership of a partnership or closely held corporation, gross income means gross receipts, minus ordinary and necessary expenses required to produce income. "Ordinary and necessary expenses" does not include amounts determined by the court to be inappropriate for determining gross income for purposes of child support.

(4) Expense reimbursements or benefits received by a parent in the course of employment or self-employment or operation of a business shall be counted as income if they are significant and reduce personal living expenses, regardless if they are taxable as income.

(5) If a parent is unemployed or working below full earning capacity, the court may consider the reasons. If earnings are reduced as a matter of choice and not for reasonable cause, such as caring for children, the court may attribute income to the parent up to his or her earning capacity.

(6) The court may take into account the benefits a noncustodial parent derives from remarriage, expense-sharing, or other source towards allocation of self support or other applicable costs.

(b) The gross income shall be adjusted as follows:

(1) Each parent shall be entitled to deduct \$775 from gross income for "self-support". The basic gross income need is based on the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Poverty Guidelines (2004) for the 48 contiguous states and District of Columbia.

(2) Spousal maintenance and court-ordered child support of other children, actually paid, shall be deducted from the gross income of the payor. "Other children" means children who are not the subject of this particular child support determination. (As stated in §1202(b)(5), support of other children, and children to whom the noncustodial parent owes a legal obligation of support may be considered.)

(3) The court has discretion to credit to the appropriate parent, a maximum of \$50 per child for other natural children in the parent's home. However, this credit shall not be routinely given.

(4) The cost of medical insurance coverage for the children shall be deducted from the gross income of a parent paying the insurance premium. This amount shall be calculated on a per capita basis. Reimbursement for health insurance premiums may be awarded to the appropriate parent in

place of a gross income deduction.

(c) The adjusted gross income of the parents shall be determined as follows:

Adjusted Gross Income is gross income minus the allowed adjustments. Once the Adjusted Gross Income for each parent is established, these amounts shall be added together and the result is the Combined Adjusted Gross Income.

(d) The basic child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

The Combined Adjusted Gross Income figure shall be located on the Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligation, matching it to the column for the number of children involved and multiplying it by the corresponding percentage from the Schedule. The answer is the Basic Child Support Obligation. If the primary obligation of the non-custodial parent is less than \$50 per child per month, a minimum child support award of \$50 per child per month shall be ordered.

(e) The total child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

To the basic obligation, any of the following may be added by the court:

- (1) **Child Care Costs:** Child care expenses appropriate to the parent's financial abilities and to the lifestyle of the children had the family remained intact;
- (2) **Education Expenses:** Any reasonable and necessary expenses for attending private or special schools or necessary expenses to meet particular educational needs of a child when such expenses are incurred by agreement of both parents or ordered by the court;
- (3) **Older Child Adjustment:** The average expenditures for children over age twelve (12) exceed the average expenditures for all children by approximately ten percent (10%). Therefore, the court may increase child support for an older child by an amount up to ten percent (10%) of the support shown on the Schedule.

The net figure derived from adding any of these allowable sums to the Basic Child Support Obligation is the total Child Support Obligation.

(f) Each parent's proportionate share of the Total Child Support Obligation shall be determined as follows:

The Total Child Support Obligation shall be divided between the parents in proportion to their Adjusted Gross Incomes. The obligation of each parent is computed by multiplying each parent's percentage of his/her Combined Adjusted Gross Income by the Total Child Support Obligation. The custodial parent shall be presumed to spend his or her share on the children.

(g) The child support award shall be determined as follows:

The court shall order the non-custodial parent to pay child support in an amount equal to his or her proportionate share of the Total Child Support Obligation.

(h) **EXAMPLE:** One child, age 15: Combined Adjusted Gross Income is \$1,000. The father's Adjusted Gross Income is \$600. Divide the father's Adjusted Gross Income by the Combined Adjusted Income. The result is the father's share of the Combined Adjusted Gross Income.

Thus: \$600 divided by \$1,000 = 60%. The father's share would be 60%. The mother's share would be 40%. On the Schedule, the Basic Child Support Obligation for Combined Adjusted Gross Income of \$1,000 for One Child is \$230. To this the judge adds \$23 because the child is over twelve (12) years old (approximately 10% in this example). The total Child Support Obligation is \$253.

The father's share is 60% of \$253, or \$151.80. The mother's share is 40% of \$253, or \$101.20. Custody is awarded to the mother.

The Child Support Award is that the father pay the mother \$151.80 per month.

The value of the mother's contribution is \$101.20, and she is presumed to spend it directly on the child.

(i) If the non-custodial parent's income is unknown, a temporary child support award shall be set at \$150 per month per child and the Worksheet for Child Support Amount need not be filled out. When both parent's incomes are known the temporary child support amount will be adjusted accordingly using the procedures described in the Child Support Guidelines.

(j) **Visitation.** The court may consider the costs of visitation and may allocate such costs between the parents in proportion to their ability to pay.

(k) **Abatement.** When the non-custodial parent is directly providing for the children's needs for an extended period of time, such as on a long visit,

the court may order a reduction of child support paid to the custodial parent.

§1204. How to Use the Guidelines in Shared Physical Custody Situations.

(1) A parent has shared physical custody (or shared custody) of children for purposes of this guidelines if the children reside with that parent for a period specified in writing in the custody order of at least 40 percent, but no more than 60 percent, of the year, regardless of the status of legal custody.

(2) The child support order must state that failure to exercise sufficient physical custody to qualify for shared physical custody under this rule is grounds for modification of the child support order. Denial of visitation by the custodial parent is not cause to increase child support.

(3) Because shared physical custody presumes that certain basic expenses for the children will be duplicated, an adjustment for shared physical custody is made by multiplying the basic child support obligation by one and fifty hundredths (1.50) or one hundred fifty percent (150%).

(4) Section 1203 (a) through (d) shall apply in shared physical custody situations.

(5) The basic child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

Each parent's Adjusted Gross Income is divided by the Combined Adjusted Gross Income to get the percentage share of income of each parent.

The Combined Adjusted Monthly Gross Income figure shall be located on the Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligation, matching it to the column for the number of children involved. Take the amount of the Basic Child Support Obligation and multiply it by 1.5 to determine the Shared Physical Care Support Obligation.

Multiply the Shared Physical Care Support Obligation by the percentage share of income of each parent. This is each parent's portion of Shared Physical Care Support Obligation.

Determine the number of overnights with each parent (this answer must total 365). Take the number of overnights with each parent and divide by 365 to determine the percentage of time with each parent. If the overnights with either parent is less than 146, use Worksheet A for sole custody situations.

Take each parent's portion of Shared Physical Care Support Obligation and multiply it by the percentage of time of the other parent to get the Support Obligation for Time with Other Parent.

(6) The total child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

To the Support Obligation for Time with Other Parent, any of the following necessary expenses may be added by the court: child care costs, extra education expenses, and older child adjustment (see Section 1203(e)(1) through (3)).

Add the Total Necessary Expenses for Each Parent. Then add both parents' Total Necessary Expenses to get the Combined Necessary Expenses. Each parent's share of Necessary Expenses is determined by multiplying the Combined Necessary Expenses by each parent's Percentage Share of Income.

To determine whether expenses paid by either parent is in excess of their fair share, subtract Each Parent's Share of Necessary Expenses from the Total Necessary Expenses for that parent. If the number is negative, enter zero. To determine Each Parent's Adjusted Support Obligation, subtract the Expenses Paid in Excess of Fair Share from the Support Obligation for Time With Other Parent.

The Recommended Child Support Order is determined by subtracting the lesser amount from the greater amount of Each Parent's Adjusted Support Obligation and enter result under greater amount.

§1205. Gifts in lieu of money. The child support award is to be paid in money. Gifts of clothing, supplies, etc. in lieu of money are not to be offset against the support award, except by court order.

§1206. Medical Insurance. An order for child support shall assign responsibility for providing medical insurance for the children who are the subject of the support award. The court shall specify the percentage of uninsured medical expenses for the children which each parent shall pay. The apportionment shall reflect the parent's respective ability to pay.

§1207. Review and Adjustment (Modification). Review and adjustment may be initiated by the Office of the Attorney General, Child Support Enforcement Division when:

- (1) there is no provision for health insurance in the order;
- (2) in TANF cases, thirty-six (36) months after establishment of the order, or most recent review; or

(3) in Non-TANF cases, thirty-six (36) months after establishment of the order, or most recent review, or when requested by either parent.

§1208. Judge's findings. The court shall make findings in the record as to: adjusted monthly gross income, basic child support obligation, total child support obligation, each parent's proportionate share of the total child support obligation, the child support award and medical support.

§1209. Adoption of Guidelines, Effect on Modifications. The adoption of these guidelines cannot, by itself, be the sole basis for a request for a modification of an existing child support order.

§1210. Effective date. Effective _____, all child support awards shall be made pursuant to these guidelines, whether they be original awards or modifications of pre-existing awards.





I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement, & Senior Citizens convened the public hearing on March 4, 2009 and on March 12, 2009. Hearing began on March 4, 2009 at 1:35pm and at 9:30am on March 12, 2009 on Bill No. 63 (COR). Notices of the public hearing held on March 4, 2009 were disseminated to all local media outlets via facsimile (fax) and electronic mail (email) on February 24 and on February 26, 2009. Notices of the public hearing held on March 12, 2009 were disseminated to all local media outlets via facsimile (fax) and electronic mail (email) on March 4, 2009 and news print on March 10, 2009, pursuant to the requirements of the Open Government Law. Notice of the hearing was also posted on the Guam Legislature's website.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr. called the Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement, and Senior Citizens to order at 1:35pm on March 4, 2009 and at 9:35am on March 12, welcomed and introduced senators present.

On March 4, 2009 Chairman Palacios recognized the Child Support Guidelines Review Commission. Chairman Palacios gave a brief presentation of the bill. The Child Support Guidelines Review Commission submitted these revisions to the Legislature and recommended that the Guidelines be passed. The last update was in 1996 and there is a need to follow the Federal time-table as required by law. The Review Commission met and had 16 public meetings which were held at the Attorney General's Office. The reason for the continuation of the public hearing on March 12, 2009 was to provide an opportunity to attorneys who could not attend the March 4, 2009 public hearing due to an annual meeting for attorneys of Guam.

On March 12, 2009 Chairman Palacios recognized the Child Support Guidelines Review Commission and asked that a brief presentation be made by the Commission. He stated that this public hearing will be more comprehensive than the last public hearing since most of the Commission members and attorneys were present to testify.

Chairman Palacios called those who are present to testify on March 4, 2009.

Attorney Barbara P. Cepeda, AG's Office Deputy Attorney General and Chair for Child Support Guidelines Review Commission IN FAVOR of Bill 63. Mrs. Cepeda stated that in 2004, when the first proposed guidelines were presented to the Legislature it was disapproved and a "Review Board Commission" was tasked to review the guidelines and to make recommendations for the Legislature. Eight (8) people who compose the review board began to meet in 2007. In total, they had about sixteen (16) public meetings and based upon their research and review, the new proposed guidelines submitted to the 30th Guam Legislature are the findings of the review commission who recommend its approval.

As required by Federal laws, the Territory of Guam needs to update the guidelines every four (4) years in order to reflect the trends of the costs associated in the raising of a child. The last time that these guidelines were reviewed was in 1996.

Mrs. Cepeda highlighted several proposed changes and offered insight into these changes.

1) The section of "Self Support Reserve" is the amount that is subtracted from a parent's paycheck. The self support reserve is for each parent/guardian. The commission proposes a change from seven hundred and ten dollars (\$710.00) to seven hundred and seventy-five dollars (\$775.00) per month as a reserve for the child. This self support reserve was researched in other jurisdictions and in other U.S. territories in order to see what other jurisdictions were doing and

if it was necessary to reflect today's costs associated with supporting a child. This proposed change is around the average in most jurisdictions.

2) The section of "Joint Physical Custody" must be defined. For example, at least 40-50% of the time, a child would fit within the definitions of "joint custody." Since a child is within this category, the commission instituted calculations of up to one hundred and fifty percent (150%). In a joint custody situation, there are two households. Instead of only one household, there are two houses to provide for the child. If it costs \$100.00 for a single home, it would cost them \$150.00 in a joint custody situation. The commission recommended that parents/guardians have a separate work sheet for situations that use joint custody to which the Commission has created.

3) The sections concerning "Definition of Gross Income for persons in the military" arise when determining what is considered income? If deployment is eighteen (18) months, there is an understanding of retroactive pay. The commission decided to expand the definition to include "other entitlements" for extra income.

4) The section concerning schedules arose and the commission recommended raising the schedule to fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00). The current guidelines have a cap up to seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) for husband and wife. What the commission recommended was to raise it to a bigger mark in terms of income. If they make more than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) a month, then there are greater brackets that include this schedule and eliminates guessing what the real income is for both husband and wife.

5) The commission recommends a "Review Adjustment" to every three (3) years so that a child's support order can be reviewed. The commission's recommendations ask that the Legislature define "substantial or material change" which would be made upon the recommendation of both parties. Substantial or material change can mean anything at this point.

Chairman Palacios requested to Mrs. Cepeda if the commission can do a further study on this issue and give recommendations to the Legislature with regards to "substantial or material change."

6) The commission recommends that the language of the "effective date" needs to be changed to reflect the actual date when guidelines are enacted into law.

7) The commission also needs clarification with regards to the "Guam Administration Rules" when a parent's income is unknown. The commission recommends a "temporary child support" in the amount of \$150.00. This administrative rule is not presently in the guidelines and should read: "One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) per month per child."

8) Another section that needs clarification is the definition of "Gross Income for Self-Employed Individuals." The commission recommends that it is best to leave this interpretation to the Tribunal and the Courts to interpret this definition.

9) The commission also recommends that the minimum child support per child is set at fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month per child. This amount is at the national average and has been researched in other jurisdictions. If a person is unemployed, it would still be set for fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month per child. The court will have to mandate that this person do an employment search during periods of unemployment in order to support the child with today's living standards.

10) The commission also would like the Legislature to define the "reasonable cost of insurance." The current calculations that the Child Support Office uses is a five percent (5%) of health income based on salary. The commission decided to leave it to the courts to interpret this section because, by law, parents must have insurance for their children.

Mr. Joseph Diaz, DPHSS, member of the Child Support Review Commission, IN FAVOR of Bill 63 Mr. Diaz stated that the commission met diligently and worked hard in order to benefit the children because the cost of living and raising a child on Guam has increased significantly. He is in support of Bill 63 and recommends its approval.

Chairman Palacios requested that Mrs. Cepeda and Mr. Diaz be present for the follow up hearing on March 12, 2009 at 9:30am.

Chairman Palacios then allowed Senators to give comments and/or questions.

Senator Frank Aguon Jr. stated that based on the submission of these guidelines, did the Child Support Commission proceed with the use of the Triple A process? The reason why he asked this question was based on this timeline, the Commission and the Legislature is back to the same place similar to the last Legislature. 1995 and 2009 reflect a 13 years lapse in approving these guidelines. Why has there been a lapse in time? We need to incorporate a memorandum of understanding that indicates flexibility with reviewing the guidelines so that we do not short change a child.

Senator Aguon also asked Mrs. Cepeda and Mr. Diaz several questions with regards to increasing the rate from seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7500.00) to fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00)? Why is fifty dollars (\$50.00) considered the minimum? Why is there a status quo instead of increasing the minimum amount? Why did the commission leave it up to the courts to determine the costs associated with health insurance? Why didn't the Commission recommend a minimum threshold? Is healthcare a requirement from both parents with regards to child support?

Mrs. Cepeda responded that the Commission did not follow the Triple A process in having public hearings and instead chose to have sixteen (16) public meetings to discuss how to proceed with the review. She didn't know the reasons for the lapse in time, but understands that the guidelines require a review every four (4) years. In terms of the change from seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) to fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00), Mrs. Cepeda mentioned that in order to create a greater bracket for individuals who make more than fifteen

thousand dollars (\$15,000.00), it was necessary to increase this amount to reflect larger income salaries.

With regards to the minimum child support of fifty dollars (\$50.00), this amount was researched in other jurisdictions and the commission found that this was the national average in mostly all states and territories.

With regards to insurance, Mrs. Cepeda commented that if one parent offers insurance, the child support money decreases and is adjusted based upon salary and type of insurance.

Chairman Palacios mentioned that the Commission did not want to adopt the public hearing style, but instead had a public meeting which was an independent decision by the body.

Senator Espaldon questioned, "Is health insurance an offset for child support and do you find that the cost of a child's insurance may be more than a parent's income?" If there is an offset, how do you come to terms with feeding the child or giving them healthcare? Senator reserved further questioning for the next public hearing on March 12, 2009.

Mrs. Cepeda responded that whoever is providing the insurance, it will offset the child support obligation by giving the parent credit.

Senator Judy T. Won Pat stated that she will save her comments for the next public hearing on March 12, 2009.

Chairman Palacios concluded the hearing on March 4, 2009 and requested that written testimony be submitted within the next ten (10) days. He recessed the public hearing at 2:25pm and will reconvene on Thursday, March 13, 2009 at 9:30am.

PUBLIC HEARING: March 12, 2009

Chairman Palacios called those who are present to testify on March 12, 2009. Chairman Palacios called on the Chair of the Commission to make a brief presentation of the Bill.

Mrs. Barbara P. Cepeda, AG's Office, Child Support Review Commission Chair

Mrs. Cepeda highlighted her comments at the last public hearing and gave a brief presentation of the substantive changes.

Chairman Palacios raised the issue concerning substantial and material change in income. He asked how does one determine this with regards to those who are on section eight (8) money? Is there a minimum for these individuals? Could this be compared with the Federal Standard in order to offer the child a minimum daily allowance, like three dollars?

Attorney Kathy Maher, Guam Legal Services, Oral Testimony, IN FAVOR

There was an issue with the minimum of \$50.00, it was asked and debated within the Review Board. They asked Federal Representatives who recommended that the Commission keep it at fifty dollars (\$50.00). It was a fair amount and acts as a place holder for collection services. In the overall sum of these guidelines, the Government of Guam is getting the benefit from the Federal Government, yet children are caught in between when a parent doesn't want to pay for the child support.

Senator Rector commented "Is there a system in place to track collection?"

Mrs. Cepeda responded that the Child Support Office has an agreement with Public Health in terms of tracking the collection.

Senator Rector indicated that when he was looking through these numbers, it seems to him that poor kids are going to end up with nothing. Sixty-five percent (65%) of people on Guam receive food stamps. How do the poor kids fair when most of these children are on the welfare system? The way our system works is that our children are born in poor families and will be subsidized by the middle class while those who are born in the well off families will be well off. The cycle of poverty continues and we never solve the problem of inequity. How much is in your overall budget?

Mrs. Cepeda responded that they have a scale and a schedule in order to meet the needs of the child and these guidelines are put into place so that the courts can have some standard. The annual budget is set at three million dollars (3) where two million is subsidized by the Federal Government while the other million is given by the Government of Guam.

Dr. Gerhard Schwab, UOG Department of Social Services, Guam Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers, Oral Testimony, IN FAVOR

The development of these guidelines illustrates the diversity and complexity of what is happening here on Guam. It illustrates the impossibility to regulate the diverse situations of the people. Government must have the flexibility in order to meet the changing needs of our island's people and their standard of living. These guidelines indicate how to put on a band-aid. The situations of the children of Guam are diverse. We as a society have failed to raise the kids; however, these guidelines are the best as to what they can be in order to raise a child. Dr. Schwab supports the adoption of these guidelines because they will ultimately help in the raising of a child on Guam. He encourages that we must all help in developing a better economical system to raise a child, such as health care, etc. The guidelines are the best we can give to children today.

Attorney Jeff Cook, Cunliffe and Cook Law Offices, Representing the Guam Bar Association, IN FAVOR

The guidelines are set up to solve the problem between a man and wife who have the responsibility of raising the child and not solving the problems of poverty on the island. Public assistance is not considered income. The guidelines are set up to find how much a parent is responsible for in raising a child. The issue that Senator Rector raises is not necessarily about the Child Support Guidelines. The other side to these guidelines is to reimburse the Government of Guam. If one parent has a job, these guidelines are meant to help the Government determine

what the minimum and maximum support is for both parents. It is also set up to reimburse the Government for services rendered in order to help support this child.

He echoes Dr. Schwab's statements. The Commission has done the extensive work in crunching the numbers. The numbers that they have worked on is based on the numbers thirteen (13) years ago. The changes are substantial and share the philosophical concerns of Senator Rector in that the guidelines are meant to take care of the issue of raising a child from both parents/guardians. There are many people who come to child support that state that they don't have a job. There is a fundamental problem with our current situation and it is up to the Legislature to create those jobs or find alternatives for these individuals. Federal laws state that we must have a review of these guidelines every four (4) years. He also stated that the reason for the many changes is meeting the signs of the times of our economy. The final call is from the judge and the courts to determine the appropriate amount of support. If there is some deviation from the guidelines, it is meant to give people a standard for child support.

Senator Rector commented that public assistance is not considered within the schedule. U.S. Citizens have it better than those from other Micronesian islands who do not qualify for food stamps. We as a society have the responsibility to raise a child. Out of curiosity, Senator Rector asked, "what is the case load for the Child Support Office today?"

Mrs. Cepeda responded that they have about eighteen thousand (18,000) cases which is about twenty five percent (25%) of Guam kids who are on Child Support. They have about nine thousand (9,000) open cases and about five thousand (5,000) who are not paying or receiving child support. Overall, the Child Support Office employs about fifty (50) workers. Most of the subsidy for her office, roughly sixty-six percent (66%) are federally funded.

Chairman Palacios asked Mrs. Cepeda, "how long have you been with the office and how long have these guidelines been updated?"

Mrs. Cepeda responded that she has been with the office since 2003 and that there were two attempts to update it. In 2004, the guidelines were rejected by the Legislature.

Chairman Palacios asked, "What are the implications for not reviewing and implementing these guidelines? What does it mean if we do not update it?"

Mrs. Cepeda responded that if we don't update it, the Federal government may not award the Government of Guam their annual grant until these guidelines are adopted.

Chairman Palacios stated that the Legislature has to update the guidelines and improve it to reflect contemporary practices and procedures as compared with other jurisdictions and the Legislature must adopt these guidelines in order for the Government of Guam to remain in good standing with Federal law.

Senator Rector commended the commission in their time and efforts in researching and reviewing the Child Support Guidelines. He stated that people don't realize how much hard work goes into this review and stated that our children deserve more than what they are getting now. Since we haven't updated these guidelines since 1996, we have to have ensure a yearly auto update to reflect the figures of today. Every year, these scales must be updated automatically so that we ensure that our children get the best.

Senator Palacios recommended that other people in the commission be in charge of researching this mechanism. He also commented about the Substantial and material Change being an amendment on the floor at the next Legislative Session which is set for March 30 to April 3, 2009. Before this date, he requested that the Commission give some recommendation with regards to the section concerning substantial and material change. Would it be set to ten percent or fifteen percent (10% or 15%) every three (3) months and when do we make it retroactive? Can we consider the implication of changing the computer programming? When should the Legislature change the effective date? If this is to be adopted on May 1st, 2009, it does not fulfill the sixty (60) day requirements under the law.

Mrs. Cepeda responded that a company in Denver Colorado crunches the numbers for most of the jurisdictions. This person was in charge of crunching the numbers. In terms of the material or substantial change, they recommend every 6 months and at twenty (20%). The commission recommends that the effective date for implementation should be May 1, 2009.

Mr. Cook commented that when these guidelines go into effect on May 1, 2009, it will be for new cases and not old cases. It does not mean that on May 1st, all 9,000 cases will have to pay a larger fee. What this means is that on May 1st, all new cases and those being reviewed will follow these new guidelines and schedules. However, the language must change because of retroactive powers that may exist in the cases being tried around this time.

Chairman Palacios concluded the hearing on March 12, 2009 at 10:35am.

III. WRITTEN TESTIMONIES

No written testimony received within the ten (10) day period after the public hearing.

IV. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement, & Senior Citizens finds that Bill No. 63 (COR) intends to update the Child Support Guidelines of 1996 which is to be reviewed and updated every four (4) years and has been submitted to *I Liheslatura* by the Child Support Guidelines Review Commission who recommend approval. The Bill incorporates substantive changes to the 1996 guidelines and shall become effective into law on May 1st, 2009.

Accordingly, the Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement, & Senior Citizens to which **Bill No. 63 (COR)** was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to *I Mina'Trenta na Liheslaturan Guåhan* **TO PASS** Bill No. 63 (COR) "An act to approve/disapprove the proposed Child Support Guidelines submitted to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* by the Child Support Guidelines Review Commission pursuant to Public Law 28-63 And Public Law 28-68."

ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT
ON THE PROPOSED UPDATE OF THE
GUAM CHILD SUPPORT GUIDELINES

NOTE: These rules are exempt from an Economic Impact Statement because the Office of the Attorney General is mandated by law to promulgate the Guam Child Support Guidelines regardless of their economic impact.

1. **THE PURPOSE AND NEED FOR THE CHILD SUPPORT GUIDELINES**

Title 5 G.C.A. § 34103.1 authorizes the Child Support Enforcement Division to implement programs under Title IV-D of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation act of 1996. The Attorney General is mandated to adopt child support guidelines pursuant to 5 G.C.A. § 34118 and to update them every two (2) years. There does not appear to be any risk or cost to the Government of Guam associated with the updating of the child support guidelines.

2. **THE FINANCIAL IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED RULE OR REGULATION UPON PERSONS AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSED RULE OR REGULATION AND UPON THE PEOPLE AND THE ECONOMY OF GUAM**

The Updated Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligation is intended to bring the child support amounts in line with the current cost of supporting children on Guam. The minimum support obligation of \$50 remains the same. The worksheet increases the allowance for self-support from \$710.00 to \$775.00. Unlike the previous guidelines, the updated version gives a reduction to parents who have significant visitation time with their children. From 128 to 147 days of visitation reduces child support 15%, 148-166 days reduces child support 20%, and 167 or more days but less than equal custody reduces child support 25%. In addition the guidelines do not apply to joint custody situations. Depending on the income of the parents and the amount of visitation, child support is adjusted up or down accordingly. The overall impact of the proposed guidelines cannot be determined.

3. **ANY POTENTIAL INCREASE OR DECREASE IN THE COST OF LIVING ON GUAM, OR ANY SPECIFIC INCREASE OR DECREASE IN THE PRICE OR AVAILABILITY OF ANY GOODS OR SERVICE ON GUAM ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE PROPOSED RULE OR REGULATION**

The propose update of the child support guidelines do not appear to have a potential impact on the cost of living on Guam except to insure that the child support amounts awarded are in line with the current cost of living.

4. **ANY DIRECT OR INDIRECT IMPACT UPON EMPLOYMENT ON GUAM OR ANY INCREASE OR DECREASE IN THE AVAILABILITY OF A PARTICULAR JOB OR JOBS, OR JOBS IN GENERAL, ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE PROPOSED RULE OR REGULATION**

It would not appear that the revision of the child support guidelines would have any impact on the availability of jobs on Guam.

5. **ANY INCREASE OR DECREASE IN THE COST OF DOING BUSINESS AS AN ENTERPRISE OR INDUSTRY ON GUAM, OR ANY INCREASE OR DECREASE IN DOING BUSINESS IN GENERAL, WHICH IS ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE PROPOSED RULE OR REGULATION**

It is not anticipated that the child support guidelines would have any impact on the cost of doing business on Guam or affect any particular industry.

6. **ANY ADVERSE OR BENEFICIAL ECONOMIC IMPACT WHICH IS ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE PROPOSED RULE OR REGULATION**

The only economic impact that is anticipated is that the child support guidelines are more in line with current economic conditions on Guam and the current cost of raising children. The impact the guidelines will have on child support can only be determined on a case-by-case basis depending on the income of the parties and the amount of visitation each parent has. The overall amount of child support may increase which will have a beneficial impact on the health and welfare of the children of Guam.

Pursuant to 45 C.F.R. 302.56 and 5 G.C.A. § 34118(a), the Attorney General is mandated to adopt child support guidelines and to update them every four (4) years.

2. **THE FINANCIAL IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED RULE OR REGULATION UPON PERSONS OR CORPORATE ENTITIES DIRECTLY AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSED RULE OR REGULATION, AND UPON THE PEOPLE AND THE ECONOMY OF GUAM**

The proposed update of the child support guidelines and Updated Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligation is intended to bring the child support amounts in line with the current cost of supporting children on Guam. The minimum child support obligation of \$50 per month per child remains the same. The worksheet increases the allowance for self-support for both custodial and non-custodial parents from \$710 to \$775 based on 2004 poverty level. Unlike the previous guidelines, the updated version defines "joint physical custody" and a separate worksheet was created for joint physical custody cases. Depending on the incomes of the custodial and non-custodial parents, some child support obligations will increase, while other obligations may decrease or remain the same, as a result of the proposed guidelines. Most areas of the updated Schedule are greater than the existing Schedule, but some areas are lesser than the existing Schedule, and still in some areas, almost equal to the existing Schedule.

3. **ANY POTENTIAL INCREASE OR DECREASE IN THE COST OF LIVING ON GUAM, OR ANY SPECIFIC INCREASE OR DECREASE IN THE PRICE OR AVAILABILITY OF ANY GOOD OR SERVICE ON GUAM DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE PROPOSED RULE OR REGULATION**

The child support guidelines will only affect those persons who receive or pay child support. It does not affect people who have no child support issues. Depending on the incomes of the custodial and non-custodial parents, some child support obligations will increase, while other obligations may decrease or remain the same, as a result of the proposed guidelines. The proposed update of the child support guidelines do not appear to have a potential impact on the cost of living on Guam or on the price or availability of any good or service, except to ensure that the child support amounts awarded are in line with the current cost of living and that fair and reasonable child support amounts are ordered.

§1201. Explanation. The law provides that the Attorney General shall adopt, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, Child Support Guidelines, a schedule of normal child support payments to be paid by a non-custodial parent to a custodial parent. [5 GCA §34118]

The law has also created an expedited judicial process agency within the Superior Court of Guam designated as the Judicial Hearings Division. This administrative agency has concurrent jurisdiction with the Superior Court over child support matters. Therefore, all references in the guidelines to court hearings include administrative hearings, all references to court orders include administrative orders, and all references to judges include administrative hearings officers. [19 GCA §5501, et seq]

While Guam's Child Support Guidelines are based on an Income Share Model developed by the Child Support Guidelines project of the National Center for State Courts, and the model is predicated on the concept that the child should receive the same proportion of parental income that he or she would have received had the parents lived together, we acknowledge the need for a schedule indicating the fair and reasonable amount of child support to be paid based on the income of the parties.

The Child Support Enforcement Division has, with the help of Policy Studies Inc., Denver Colorado, worked on developing a Schedule, as required by 5 GCA §34118, to show the fair and reasonable amount of child support to be paid based on the income of the parties.

Exhibit A, attached hereto, is the Updated Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligations. This is intended to serve as a base, and not as a ceiling or cap. These figures are intended to operate as a rebuttable presumption in computing child support under the Child Support Guidelines.

§1202. Introduction. (a) Purposes.

(1) To establish a standard of support for children consistent with the reasonable needs of children and the ability of parents to pay;

(2) To make child support awards consistent for persons in similar circumstances;

(3) To give parents and courts guidance in establishing child support orders and to promote settlements;

(4) To comply with federal law (42 U.S.C. Section 651 et. seq., 45 C.F.R. Section 302.56);

(5) To comply with local law (5 GCA §34118).

(b) Premises.

(1) These guidelines apply to all children, whether born in or out of wedlock.

(2) The child support award should permit the children the standard of living which as closely as possible approximates the one they would have had if the family remained together, recognizing the cost of maintaining two households.

(3) The child support obligation has priority over all other financial obligations.

(4) The fact that a custodial parent receives child support does not mean that he or she may not also be entitled to spousal maintenance.

(5) The obligation to support other children may be taken into account by the court, but shall not necessarily entitle the paying parent to a reduction of support, proportionate or otherwise. See 19 GAR §1203(b)(3).

(c) Presumption.

(1) Guidelines: In any action to establish or modify child support, whether temporary or permanent, the child support guidelines shall be used in the establishment or modification of the amount of child support.

Courts may deviate from the guidelines where its application would be inequitable. In such cases, the court shall enter appropriate written or specific findings on the record.

(2) Needs: The guidelines presume that the cost to provide for the average needs of children are as listed in the attached Schedule. Should a custodial parent request child support in excess of the presumed average needs for the child, direct evidence must be presented at the time of hearing to prove that the actual needs of the child are in excess of the presumed average needs of the child in order to overcome the presumption. (For example, where the parents' combined adjusted monthly gross income is \$4,000, the cost to provide for the average needs of one child according to the table is \$746 per month. Should the custodial parent seek a child support award of more than \$ 746 per month, he/she must provide evidence of the child's actual needs in excess of \$746 per month.)

§1203. How to Use the Guidelines in Sole Physical Custody Situations. (a) The gross income of the parties shall be determined, as follows:

(1) Gross income includes income from any source, and may include, but is not limited to, income from salaries, wages, commissions, bonuses, dividends, severance pay, pensions, interest, trust income, annuities, capital gains, social security benefits, gifts, prizes, worker's compensation benefits, spousal maintenance received, disability benefits, rental income, retirement plans, pensions and basic and variable allowances for housing and subsistence from military pay and benefits including but not limited to basic allowance for housing (BAH), basic allowance for subsistence (BAS), basic allowance for quarters (BAQ), uniform allowance, war-zone allowance, hazardous duty, and any other entitlements from the leave and earnings statement (LES), such as the cost-of-living allowance (COLA) for those in high cost areas and other allowances. If the servicemember does not receive BAH or BAQ because he/she lives on base, then the value of that free housing is imputed to his/her income using the military pay charts available on the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) website.

(2) Gross income does not include benefits received from means-tested public assistance programs including, but not limited to, temporary assistance to needy families (TANF), supplemental security income (SSI), food stamps, general assistance, or sums received as child support.

(3) For income from self-employment, rent, royalties, proprietorship of a business, or joint ownership of a partnership or closely held corporation, gross income means gross receipts, minus ordinary and necessary expenses required to produce income. "Ordinary and necessary expenses" does not include amounts determined by the court to be inappropriate for determining gross income for purposes of child support.

(4) Expense reimbursements or benefits received by a parent in the course of employment or self-employment or operation of a business shall be counted as income if they are significant and reduce personal living expenses, regardless if they are taxable as income.

(5) If a parent is unemployed or working below full earning capacity, the court may consider the reasons. If earnings are reduced as a matter of choice and not for reasonable cause, such as caring for children, the court may attribute income to the parent up to his or her earning capacity.

(6) The court may take into account the benefits a parent derives from remarriage, expense-sharing, or other source.

(b) The gross income shall be adjusted as follows:

(1) Each parent shall be entitled to deduct \$775 from gross income for "self-support". The basic gross income need is based on the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Poverty Guidelines (2004) for the 48 contiguous states and District of Columbia.

(2) Spousal maintenance and court-ordered child support of other children, actually paid, shall be deducted from the gross income of the payor. "Other children" means children who are not the subject of this particular child support determination. (As stated in §1202(b)(5), support of other children, and children to whom the noncustodial parent owes a legal obligation of support may be considered.)

(3) The court has discretion to credit to the appropriate parent, a maximum of \$50 per child for other natural children in the parent's home. However, this credit shall not be routinely given.

(4) The cost of medical insurance coverage for the children shall be deducted from the gross income of a parent paying the insurance premium. This amount shall be calculated on a per capita basis. Reimbursement for health insurance premiums may be awarded to the appropriate parent in place of a gross income deduction.

(c) The adjusted gross income of the parents shall be determined as follows:

Adjusted Gross Income is gross income minus the allowed adjustments. Once the Adjusted Gross Income for each parent is established, these amounts shall be added together and the result is the Combined Adjusted Gross Income.

(d) The basic child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

The Combined Adjusted Gross Income figure shall be located on the Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligation, matching it to the column for the number of children involved and multiplying it by the corresponding percentage from the Schedule. The answer is the Basic Child Support Obligation. If the primary obligation of the non-custodial parent is less than \$50 per child per month, a minimum child support award of \$50 per child per month shall be ordered.

(e) The total child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

To the basic obligation, any of the following may be added by the court:

- (1) **Child Care Costs:** Child care expenses appropriate to the parent's financial abilities and to the lifestyle of the children had the family remained intact;
- (2) **Education Expenses:** Any reasonable and necessary expenses for attending private or special schools or necessary expenses to meet particular educational needs of a child when such expenses are incurred by agreement of both parents or ordered by the court;
- (3) **Older Child Adjustment:** The average expenditures for children over age twelve (12) exceed the average expenditures for all children by approximately ten percent (10%). Therefore, the court may increase child support for an older child by an amount up to ten percent (10%) of the support shown on the Schedule.

The net figure derived from adding any of these allowable sums to the Basic Child Support Obligation is the total Child Support Obligation.

(f) Each parent's proportionate share of the Total Child Support Obligation shall be determined as follows:

The Total Child Support Obligation shall be divided between the parents in proportion to their Adjusted Gross Incomes. The obligation of each parent is computed by multiplying each parent's percentage of his/her Combined Adjusted Gross Income by the Total Child Support Obligation. The custodial parent shall be presumed to spend his or her share on the children.

(g) The child support award shall be determined as follows:

The court shall order the non-custodial parent to pay child support in an amount equal to his or her proportionate share of the Total Child Support Obligation.

(h) **EXAMPLE:** One child, age 15: Combined Adjusted Gross Income is \$1,000. The father's Adjusted Gross Income is \$600. Divide the father's Adjusted Gross Income by the Combined Adjusted Income. The result is the father's share of the Combined Adjusted Gross Income.

Thus: $\$600 \text{ divided by } \$1,000 = 60\%$. The father's share would be 60%. The mother's share would be 40%. On the Schedule, the Basic Child Support Obligation for Combined Adjusted Gross Income of \$1,000 for One Child is \$230. To this the judge adds \$23 because the child is over twelve (12) years old (approximately 10% in this example). The total Child Support Obligation is \$253.

The father's share is 60% of \$253, or \$151.80. The mother's share is 40% of \$253, or \$101.20. Custody is awarded to the mother.

The Child Support Award is that the father pay the mother \$151.80 per month.

The value of the mother's contribution is \$101.20, and she is presumed to spend it directly on the child.

(i) If the non-custodial parent's income is unknown, a temporary child support award shall be set at \$150 per month per child and the Worksheet for Child Support Amount need not be filled out. When both parent's incomes are known the temporary child support amount will be adjusted accordingly using the procedures described in the Child Support Guidelines.

(j) **Visitation.** The court may consider the costs of visitation and may allocate such costs between the parents in proportion to their ability to pay.

(k) **Abatement.** When the non-custodial parent is directly providing for the children's needs for an extended period of time, such as on a long visit, the court may order a reduction of child support paid to the custodial parent.

§1204. How to Use the Guidelines in Shared Physical Custody Situations.

(1) A parent has shared physical custody (or shared custody) of children for purposes of this guidelines if the children reside with that parent for a period specified in writing in the custody order of at least 40 percent, but no more than 60 percent, of the year, regardless of the status of legal custody.

(2) The child support order must state that failure to exercise sufficient physical custody to qualify for shared physical custody under this rule is grounds for modification of the child support order. Denial of visitation by the custodial parent is not cause to increase child support.

(3) Because shared physical custody presumes that certain basic expenses for the children will be duplicated, an adjustment for shared physical custody is made by multiplying the basic child support obligation by one and fifty hundredths (1.50) or one hundred fifty percent (150%).

(4) Section 1203 (a) through (d) shall apply in shared physical custody situations.

(5) The basic child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

Each parent's Adjusted Gross Income is divided by the Combined Adjusted Gross Income to get the percentage share of income of each parent.

The Combined Adjusted Monthly Gross Income figure shall be located on the Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligation, matching it to the column for the number of children involved. Take the amount of the Basic Child Support Obligation and multiply it by 1.5 to determine the Shared Physical Care Support Obligation.

Multiply the Shared Physical Care Support Obligation by the percentage share of income of each parent. This is each parent's portion of Shared Physical Care Support Obligation.

Determine the number of overnights with each parent (this answer must total 365). Take the number of overnights with each parent and divide by 365 to determine the percentage of time with each parent. If the overnights with either parent is less than 146, use Worksheet A for sole custody situations.

Take each parent's portion of Shared Physical Care Support Obligation and multiply it by the percentage of time of the other parent to get the Support Obligation for Time with Other Parent.

(6) The total child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

To the Support Obligation for Time with Other Parent, any of the following necessary expenses may be added by the court: child care costs, extra education expenses, and older child adjustment (see Section 1203(e)(1) through (3)).

Add the Total Necessary Expenses for Each Parent. Then add both parents' Total Necessary Expenses to get the Combined Necessary Expenses. Each parent's share of Necessary Expenses is determined by multiplying the Combined Necessary Expenses by each parent's Percentage Share of Income.

To determine whether expenses paid by either parent is in excess of their fair share, subtract Each Parent's Share of Necessary Expenses from the Total Necessary Expenses for that parent. If the number is negative, enter zero. To determine Each Parent's Adjusted Support Obligation, subtract the Expenses Paid in Excess of Fair Share from the Support Obligation for Time With Other Parent.

The Recommended Child Support Order is determined by subtracting the lesser amount from the greater amount of Each Parent's Adjusted Support Obligation and enter result under greater amount.

§1205. Gifts in lieu of money. The child support award is to be paid in money. Gifts of clothing, supplies, etc. in lieu of money are not to be offset against the support award, except by court order.

§1206. Medical Insurance. An order for child support shall assign responsibility for providing medical insurance for the children who are the subject of the support award. The court shall specify the percentage of uninsured medical expenses for the children which each parent shall pay. The apportionment shall reflect the parent's respective ability to pay.

§1207. Review and Adjustment (Modification). Review and adjustment may be initiated by the Office of the Attorney General, Child Support Enforcement Division when:

- (1) there is no provision for health insurance in the order;
- (2) in TANF cases, thirty-six (36) months after establishment of the order, or most recent review; or
- (3) in Non-TANF cases, thirty-six (36) months after establishment of the order, or most recent review, or when requested by either parent.

§1208. Judge's findings. The court shall make findings in the record

as to: adjusted monthly gross income, basic child support obligation, total child support obligation, each parent's proportionate share of the total child support obligation, the child support award and medical support.

§1209. Adoption of Guidelines, Effect on Modifications. The adoption of these guidelines cannot, by itself, be the sole basis for a request for a modification of an existing child support order.

§1210. Effective date. Effective _____, all child support awards shall be made pursuant to these guidelines, whether they be original awards or modifications of pre-existing awards.

The instructions are numbered to match the numbers on the worksheet. The number in brackets after the instructions tells you where to look in the guidelines for this item.

BASIC INFORMATION

- (1) If you are providing this information to establish a child support amount, fill in the name of the persons shown as the plaintiff(s) on the original petition filed in the case.
- (2) Fill in the name of the person shown as the defendant on the original petition in the case.
- (3) If you have an order establishing support, fill in the case number of that order. If you do not yet have an order establishing a support obligation, leave this item blank.
- (4) Mark the appropriate box to indicate whether you are the mother or father of the children for whom child support is requested.

MONTHLY GROSS INCOME

- (5) Fill in the amount of your gross income each month. Also fill in the total monthly gross income for the other parent, to the best of your knowledge. If a parent is unemployed or underemployed, include an estimate of what you think that parent would be earning if he or she worked at full earning capacity. [19 GAR §1203(a)(1)]

- (10) For each parent, add the amounts for numbers 5(a), 6, 7, 8, and 9. Put the total amount of those items for each parent on this line.
- (11) For each parent, subtract the number on line 10 from the number on line 5. Write the result on this line. This is the Adjusted Monthly Gross Income for each parent.

COMBINED ADJUSTED MONTHLY GROSS INCOME

- (12) Add the two numbers on line 11 together (the one for the Father and the one for the Mother). This total is the Combined Adjusted Monthly Gross Income.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

1 **Section 1. Legislative Statement, Findings and Intent.** Public Law 28-63, Section 4
2 and Public Law 28-68, Chapter IV, Section 95, established the Child Support Guidelines
3 Review Commission (Commission), and mandated the Commission to review and make
4 recommendations to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* regarding enactment of the Child support
5 Guidelines. The Commission submitted to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* on February 2, 2009, the
6 proposed guidelines for consideration and approval, which incorporated several
7 substantive changes. The Commission recommends that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* approve the
8 guidelines.

9 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the current Child Support Guidelines were last
10 updated in 1996. Current law (Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 34, Section 34118)
11 requires that they be reviewed and updated every four (4) years. Time, is of the essence in
12 adopting the proposed guidelines.

13 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that during the last 24 months, the Commission met and
14 held 16 public meetings, the last of which was held at the Office of the Attorney General

1 (Pedro's Plaza, first floor) on January 27, 2009. All public meetings were conducted
2 pursuant to the "Open Government Law."

3 With the submission of the new guidelines, it is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan*
4 *Guåhan* to consider and approve/or disapprove the guidelines.

5 **Section 2.** The proposed Child Support Guidelines submitted to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*
6 on February 2, 2009, by the Attorney General and Deputy Attorney General of the Child
7 Support Enforcement Division of Guam and attached as **APPENDIX I** to this Act are
8 hereby approved/disapproved.

9 **Section 3.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule or regulation the

§1201. Explanation. The law provides that the Attorney General shall adopt, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, Child Support Guidelines, a schedule of normal child support payments to be paid by a non-custodial parent to a custodial parent. [5 GCA §34118]

The law has also created an expedited judicial process agency within the Superior Court of Guam designated as the Judicial Hearings Division. This administrative agency has concurrent jurisdiction with the Superior Court over child support matters. Therefore, all references in the guidelines to court hearings include administrative hearings, all references to court orders include administrative orders, and all references to judges include administrative hearings officers. [19 GCA §5501, et seq]

While Guam's Child Support Guidelines are based on an Income Share Model developed by the Child Support Guidelines project of the National Center for State Courts, and the model is predicated on the concept that the child should receive the same proportion of parental income that he or she would have received had the parents lived together, we acknowledge the need for a schedule indicating the fair and reasonable amount of child support to be paid based on the income of the parties.

The Child Support Enforcement Division has, with the help of Policy Studies Inc., Denver Colorado, worked on developing a Schedule, as required by 5 GCA §34118, to show the fair and reasonable amount of child support to be paid based on the income of the parties.

Exhibit A, attached hereto, is the Updated Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligations. This is intended to serve as a base, and not as a ceiling or cap. These figures are intended to operate as a rebuttable presumption in computing child support under the Child Support Guidelines.

§1202. Introduction. (a) Purposes.

(1) To establish a standard of support for children consistent with the reasonable needs of children and the ability of parents to pay;

(2) To make child support awards consistent for persons in similar circumstances;

(3) To give parents and courts guidance in establishing child support orders and to promote settlements;

(4) To comply with federal law (42 U.S.C. Section 651 et. seq., 45 C.F.R. Section 302.56);

(5) To comply with local law (5 GCA §34118).

(b) Premises.

(1) These guidelines apply to all children, whether born in or out of wedlock.

(2) The child support award should permit the children the standard of living which as closely as possible approximates the one they would have had if the family remained together, recognizing the cost of maintaining two households.

(3) The child support obligation has priority over all other financial obligations.

(4) The fact that a custodial parent receives child support does not mean that he or she may not also be entitled to spousal maintenance.

(5) The obligation to support other children may be taken into account by the court, but shall not necessarily entitle the paying parent to a reduction of support, proportionate or otherwise. See 19 GAR §1203(b)(3).

(c) Presumption.

(1) **Guidelines:** In any action to establish or modify child support, whether temporary or permanent, the child support guidelines shall be used in the establishment or modification of the amount of child support.

Courts may deviate from the guidelines where its application would be inequitable. In such cases, the court shall enter appropriate written or specific findings on the record.

(2) **Needs:** The guidelines presume that the cost to provide for the average needs of children are as listed in the attached Schedule. Should a custodial parent request child support in excess of the presumed average needs for the child, direct evidence must be presented at the time of hearing to prove that the actual needs of the child are in excess of the presumed average needs of the child in order to overcome the presumption. (For example, where the parents' combined adjusted monthly gross income is \$4,000, the cost to provide for the average needs of one child according to the table is \$746 per month. Should the custodial parent seek a child support award of more than \$ 746 per month, he/she must provide evidence of the child's actual needs in excess of \$746 per month.)

§1203. How to Use the Guidelines in Sole Physical Custody Situations. (a) The gross income of the parties shall be determined, as follows:

(1) Gross income includes income from any source, and may include, but is not limited to, income from salaries, wages, commissions, bonuses, dividends, severance pay, pensions, interest, trust income, annuities, capital gains, social security benefits, gifts, prizes, worker's compensation benefits, spousal maintenance received, disability benefits, rental income, retirement plans, pensions and basic and variable allowances for housing and subsistence from military pay and benefits including but not limited to basic allowance for housing (BAH), basic allowance for subsistence (BAS), basic allowance for quarters (BAQ), uniform allowance, war-zone allowance, hazardous duty, and any other entitlements from the leave and earnings statement (LES), such as the cost-of-living allowance (COLA) for those in high cost areas and other allowances. If the servicemember does not receive BAH or BAQ because he/she lives on base, then the value of that free housing is imputed to his/her income using the military pay charts available on the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) website.

(2) Gross income does not include benefits received from means-tested public assistance programs including, but not limited to, temporary assistance to needy families (TANF), supplemental security income (SSI), food stamps, general assistance, or sums received as child support.

(3) For income from self-employment, rent, royalties, proprietorship of a business, or joint ownership of a partnership or closely held corporation, gross income means gross receipts, minus ordinary and necessary expenses required to produce income. "Ordinary and necessary expenses" does not include amounts determined by the court to be inappropriate for determining gross income for purposes of child support.

(4) Expense reimbursements or benefits received by a parent in the course of employment or self-employment or operation of a business shall be counted as income if they are significant and reduce personal living expenses, regardless if they are taxable as income.

(5) If a parent is unemployed or working below full earning capacity, the court may consider the reasons. If earnings are reduced as a matter of choice and not for reasonable cause, such as caring for children, the court may attribute income to the parent up to his or her earning capacity.

(6) The court may take into account the benefits a parent derives from remarriage, expense-sharing, or other source.

(b) The gross income shall be adjusted as follows:

(1) Each parent shall be entitled to deduct \$775 from gross income for "self-support". The basic gross income need is based on the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Poverty Guidelines (2004) for the 48 contiguous states and District of Columbia.

(2) Spousal maintenance and court-ordered child support of other children, actually paid, shall be deducted from the gross income of the payor. "Other children" means children who are not the subject of this particular child support determination. (As stated in §1202(b)(5), support of other children, and children to whom the noncustodial parent owes a legal obligation of support may be considered.)

(3) The court has discretion to credit to the appropriate parent, a maximum of \$50 per child for other natural children in the parent's home. However, this credit shall not be routinely given.

(4) The cost of medical insurance coverage for the children shall be deducted from the gross income of a parent paying the insurance premium. This amount shall be calculated on a per capita basis. Reimbursement for health insurance premiums may be awarded to the appropriate parent in place of a gross income deduction.

(c) The adjusted gross income of the parents shall be determined as follows:

Adjusted Gross Income is gross income minus the allowed adjustments. Once the Adjusted Gross Income for each parent is established, these amounts shall be added together and the result is the Combined Adjusted Gross Income.

(d) The basic child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

The Combined Adjusted Gross Income figure shall be located on the Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligation, matching it to the column for the number of children involved and multiplying it by the corresponding percentage from the Schedule. The answer is the Basic Child Support Obligation. If the primary obligation of the non-custodial parent is less than \$50 per child per month, a minimum child support award of \$50 per child per month shall be ordered.

(e) The total child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

To the basic obligation, any of the following may be added by the court:

- (1) **Child Care Costs:** Child care expenses appropriate to the parent's financial abilities and to the lifestyle of the children had the family remained intact;
- (2) **Education Expenses:** Any reasonable and necessary expenses for attending private or special schools or necessary expenses to meet particular educational needs of a child when such expenses are incurred by agreement of both parents or ordered by the court;
- (3) **Older Child Adjustment:** The average expenditures for children over age twelve (12) exceed the average expenditures for all children by approximately ten percent (10%). Therefore, the court may increase child support for an older child by an amount up to ten percent (10%) of the support shown on the Schedule.

The net figure derived from adding any of these allowable sums to the Basic Child Support Obligation is the total Child Support Obligation.

(f) Each parent's proportionate share of the Total Child Support Obligation shall be determined as follows:

The Total Child Support Obligation shall be divided between the parents in proportion to their Adjusted Gross Incomes. The obligation of each parent is computed by multiplying each parent's percentage of his/her Combined Adjusted Gross Income by the Total Child Support Obligation. The custodial parent shall be presumed to spend his or her share on the children.

(g) The child support award shall be determined as follows:

The court shall order the non-custodial parent to pay child support in an amount equal to his or her proportionate share of the Total Child Support Obligation.

(h) **EXAMPLE:** One child, age 15: Combined Adjusted Gross Income is \$1,000. The father's Adjusted Gross Income is \$600. Divide the father's Adjusted Gross Income by the Combined Adjusted Income. The result is the father's share of the Combined Adjusted Gross Income.

Thus: $\$600 \text{ divided by } \$1,000 = 60\%$. The father's share would be 60%. The mother's share would be 40%. On the Schedule, the Basic Child Support Obligation for Combined Adjusted Gross Income of \$1,000 for One Child is \$230. To this the judge adds \$23 because the child is over twelve (12) years old (approximately 10% in this example). The total Child Support Obligation is \$253.

The father's share is 60% of \$253, or \$151.80. The mother's share is 40% of \$253, or \$101.20. Custody is awarded to the mother.

The Child Support Award is that the father pay the mother \$151.80 per month.

The value of the mother's contribution is \$101.20, and she is presumed to spend it directly on the child.

(i) If the non-custodial parent's income is unknown, a temporary child support award shall be set at \$150 per month per child and the Worksheet for Child Support Amount need not be filled out. When both parent's incomes are known the temporary child support amount will be adjusted accordingly using the procedures described in the Child Support Guidelines.

(j) **Visitation.** The court may consider the costs of visitation and may allocate such costs between the parents in proportion to their ability to pay.

(k) **Abatement.** When the non-custodial parent is directly providing for the children's needs for an extended period of time, such as on a long visit, the court may order a reduction of child support paid to the custodial parent.

§1204. How to Use the Guidelines in Shared Physical Custody Situations.

(1) A parent has shared physical custody (or shared custody) of children for purposes of this guidelines if the children reside with that parent for a period specified in writing in the custody order of at least 40 percent, but no more than 60 percent, of the year, regardless of the status of legal custody.

(2) The child support order must state that failure to exercise sufficient physical custody to qualify for shared physical custody under this rule is grounds for modification of the child support order. Denial of visitation by the custodial parent is not cause to increase child support.

(3) Because shared physical custody presumes that certain basic expenses for the children will be duplicated, an adjustment for shared physical custody is made by multiplying the basic child support obligation by one and fifty hundredths (1.50) or one hundred fifty percent (150%).

(4) Section 1203 (a) through (d) shall apply in shared physical custody situations.

(5) The basic child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

Each parent's Adjusted Gross Income is divided by the Combined Adjusted Gross Income to get the percentage share of income of each parent.

The Combined Adjusted Monthly Gross Income figure shall be located on the Schedule of Basic Child Support Obligation, matching it to the column for the number of children involved. Take the amount of the Basic Child Support Obligation and multiply it by 1.5 to determine the Shared Physical Care Support Obligation.

Multiply the Shared Physical Care Support Obligation by the percentage share of income of each parent. This is each parent's portion of Shared Physical Care Support Obligation.

Determine the number of overnights with each parent (this answer must total 365). Take the number of overnights with each parent and divide by 365 to determine the percentage of time with each parent. If the overnights with either parent is less than 146, use Worksheet A for sole custody situations.

Take each parent's portion of Shared Physical Care Support Obligation and multiply it by the percentage of time of the other parent to get the Support Obligation for Time with Other Parent.

(6) The total child support obligation shall be determined as follows:

To the Support Obligation for Time with Other Parent, any of the following necessary expenses may be added by the court: child care costs, extra education expenses, and older child adjustment (see Section 1203(e)(1) through (3)).

Add the Total Necessary Expenses for Each Parent. Then add both parents' Total Necessary Expenses to get the Combined Necessary Expenses. Each parent's share of Necessary Expenses is determined by multiplying the Combined Necessary Expenses by each parent's Percentage Share of Income.

To determine whether expenses paid by either parent is in excess of their fair share, subtract Each Parent's Share of Necessary Expenses from the Total Necessary Expenses for that parent. If the number is negative, enter zero. To determine Each Parent's Adjusted Support Obligation, subtract the Expenses Paid in Excess of Fair Share from the Support Obligation for Time With Other Parent.

The Recommended Child Support Order is determined by subtracting the lesser amount from the greater amount of Each Parent's Adjusted Support Obligation and enter result under greater amount.

§1205. Gifts in lieu of money. The child support award is to be paid in money. Gifts of clothing, supplies, etc. in lieu of money are not to be offset against the support award, except by court order.

§1206. Medical Insurance. An order for child support shall assign responsibility for providing medical insurance for the children who are the subject of the support award. The court shall specify the percentage of uninsured medical expenses for the children which each parent shall pay. The apportionment shall reflect the parent's respective ability to pay.

§1207. Review and Adjustment (Modification). Review and adjustment may be initiated by the Office of the Attorney General, Child Support Enforcement Division when:

- (1) there is no provision for health insurance in the order;
- (2) in TANF cases, thirty-six (36) months after establishment of the order, or most recent review; or
- (3) in Non-TANF cases, thirty-six (36) months after establishment of the order, or most recent review, or when requested by either parent.

§1208. Judge's findings. The court shall make findings in the record

as to: adjusted monthly gross income, basic child support obligation, total child support obligation, each parent's proportionate share of the total child support obligation, the child support award and medical support.

§1209. Adoption of Guidelines, Effect on Modifications. The adoption of these guidelines cannot, by itself, be the sole basis for a request for a modification of an existing child support order.

§1210. Effective date. Effective _____, all child support awards shall be made pursuant to these guidelines, whether they be original awards or modifications of pre-existing awards.
