

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 406-30 (COR),

I. OVERVIEW: The Committee on Economic Development, Health & Human Services, and Judiciary conducted a public hearing on June 17, 2010. The Hearing convened at 5:30 PM in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of on Bill No. 406-30 (COR) — “An act to repeal §64.50 of Chapter 64 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated, and repeal and reenact Chapter 5 of Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, relative to restricting greyhound racing”, sponsored by Senator Thomas C. Ada.

Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via hand-delivery/fax and/or e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on June 9, 2010 (5-Day Notice), and again on June 14, 2010 (48-Hour Notice). Notices were published in the Marianas Variety on June 9, 2009, and in the Marianas Variety on June 14, 2010.

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 5:30 P.M.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION.

Cindy Bartels, President of Guam Animals In Need; submitted written testimony (attached), and provided oral testimony, **IN SUPPORT** of Bill No. 406-30 (COR).

Ms. Bartels states, Guam Animals In Need fully supports Bill 406. With the closure of the Guam Greyhound Racing track came the ensuing nightmare for the greyhounds of Guam. Having been raced their entire lives, when the end came - so did their usefulness to the track. She further states, “Instead of implementing a responsible and humane program to retire these dogs, a free-for-all giveaway program was chosen by Guam Greyhound Racetrack. The dogs were given away en masse - with no screening, no education regarding their needs, and no tracking or follow-up on the homes they were given. The result - greyhounds starving and near-

death were found on the streets, jungles, and villages of Guam. She states, "Guam Animals In Need rescued 200 of those Greyhounds and worked diligently both to find and recover them to good health. GAIN found them quality homes in Guam, Japan, Hawaii, and the US mainland with the assistance of the mainland Greyhound Rescue groups.

Ms. Bartels states, "We as a community can never let a tragedy of this nature happen again, and Bill 406 will assist in ensuring that it does not. At one point in the rescue effort, one of the ex-track employees sent us an email with a tally of the total dogs at the track. We never did find out what happened to the dogs outside of the 200 we recovered since Guam Greyhound Racetrack would not acknowledge this number or provide any additional information. We don't know if they were sent off island before the giveaway, or if they were part of the giveaway and died in the jungles. Their unknown fate haunts us to this day. Please pass Bill 406 without haste. Pass it to honor those dogs we could not find, pass it so that this type of tragedy will never happen on our island again."

Christine Dorchak, President, GREY2K USA; Submitted written testimony (attached), **IN SUPPORT** of Bill No. 406-30 (COR).

Ms. Dorchak states, on behalf of the largest greyhound protection organization in the United States, and urges Guam to pass Bill 406 to prohibit commercial greyhound racing on island. She states that the greyhound racing is a dying industry that is inherently cruel to dogs. "Today, thanks to the enactment of Sunshine laws in various states, track records are now public documents. In the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, a dog was injured every three to four days before racing was made illegal in that state. Colorado reported 2,600 injuries from 1993-2007. In New Hampshire, records showed that 1,200 injuries occurred from 2005-2008, the year in which dog racing finally ended in the Granite State. Reported injuries included broken bones, cardiac arrest, paralysis and seizures. The most frequent injuries are broken legs, but broken necks and crushed skulls are also reported each year. Some dogs die while racing, while others are put down because of the severity of their injuries, and/or because of their diminished value as races."

She further states that when not racing, greyhounds are kept confined in warehouse-style kennels, inside small, stacked cages which are too small to allow free movement. Other than the brief turn-out periods, greyhounds live "restricted for an average of twenty hours per day with little ability to interact with the handlers or one another."

She further states, "the decline of greyhound racing has been ongoing for years, and media outlets have long reported the spiraling collapse of this industry. According to the Association of Racing Commissioners International, an industry association, gambling on greyhounds declined by 42% from 2002-2007 in the United States. This includes both gambling on live greyhound racing and simulcast better, where betters wager remotely on dog races taking place elsewhere". Since 2001, twenty-five American tracks have shut down operations, cutting the industry in half. There now remain just twenty-three tracks in seven states."

She further states, "The territory of Guam has an opportunity to join this humane trend and make sure that the urgent situation which developed in late 2008 never occurs again. On behalf of 25,000 greyhound advocates nationwide, I urge you to support Senate Bill 406." (Attached "GREYHOUND RACING IS A DYING INDUSTRY" fact sheet.

Karyn Zoldan, Director, GREY2K USA; Submitted written testimony (attached), **IN SUPPORT** of Bill No. 406-30 (COR).

Ms. Zoldan quotes Mahatma Gandhi, stating, "The greatness of a nation and its moral progress can be judged by the way its animals are treated."

She further states, "as seen by the massive logistic and financial undertakings by GAIN and U.S. greyhound advocacy and adoption groups, the aftermath of an irresponsible dog track

closing is one of heartbreak and inhumane treatment. Saving these race dogs from hunger, cruelty and abandonment was an effort publicized around the world.” She further states, “I hope lawmakers will do the right thing and support Bill 406 to ensure that no greyhound can ever race again in Guam.”

Shirley Miller, Volunteer, Guam Animals In Need; Submitted written testimony (attached), **IN SUPPORT** of Bill No. 406-30 (COR).

Ms. Miller states in November 2008 when the Guam Greyhound Race Track closed, over 345 racing greyhounds were put at risk (reference to data sheet attached). From January 2009, until recently, 158 greyhounds were shipped to 49 states and Japan. Thirty-two greyhounds were adopted locally. There is no record of unsterilized, unvaccinated greyhounds that were given away. Hundreds of volunteers on both sides of the ocean contributed to the efforts to save the lives of 192 Guam greyhounds. Ms. Miller also provided: “Greyhound Chronicles” prepared by Dave Davis (attached), a spreadsheet indicating expenses related to the care of the greyhounds, and asked that Bill 406 be passed into law in order to join the long list of states that have already ended Greyhound racing.

Karen Johnson, Board Member, Guam Animals In Need; Provided oral testimony, **IN SUPPORT** of Bill No. 406-30 (COR).

Ms. Johnson states, that for years the racetrack was a problem because the Department of Revenue and Taxation (DRT), and no one other than DRT regulated it. She describes the poor sanitation conditions and housing at the racetrack were inhumane and insufficient. She states that she is proud of Bill 406, and that if passed, will prevent a great evil from being re-established on island.

Dave Davis, Volunteer, Guam Animals In Need; Submitted written testimony (attached), **IN SUPPORT** of Bill No. 406-30 (COR).

Mr. Davis states he supports Senator Ada’s Bill 406, a measure to ban dog racing and pari-mutuel wagering on dog racing in Guam. He states, “With passage of this bill into law Guam will join 42 of the 50 States in ending a practice that often results in death and serious injury for thousands of greyhounds annually, as well as the neglect and inhumane conditions under which many exist as they live out their caged lives.

Many of us are aware of the more public and publicized events that followed closure of Guam’s greyhound track in November 2008. There remain obscure and disturbing elements related to the track closure and Guam Greyhound in general – things about which we can speculate but never know for certain.

After nearly two months of evasion and obfuscation, the Guam Greyhound general manager provided GAIN with a kennel inventory as of 22 January 2009, listing a total of 191 greyhounds and their disposition.

The breakdown showed 101 as ‘local adoptions’– those they indiscriminately gave away in November and December 2008 --; 6 as employee adoptions; and 84 remaining at the track. He also listed 50 ‘reclaimed greyhounds’. Those were the ones rescued by GAIN to that point, many of which were literally at the brink of death from starvation, abuse, neglect and untreated medical and dental conditions. The “reclaimed” 50 included 17 at the GAIN shelter, 21 legitimately adopted through GAIN and 12 shipped to the mainland for adoption. Rescuers arrived too late for at least 4 animals.

That wasn’t the whole story, however. With the help of a Guam Greyhound employee GAIN had acquired a nine-page kennel inventory list that showed, by name and other unique and specific identifying information, as many as 384 greyhounds at the track as of April 2008. The

precise number was never known as one page of the inventory was missing. The likely total was extrapolated using the information available.

That leaves us with an estimated 193 animals unaccounted for – animals that apparently vanished between April 2008 and January 2009. We'll probably never know what happened to them, but none of the possibilities are pleasant to consider.

As of today, 19 months after the track closed, GAIN has rescued, rehabilitated and in most cases relocated more than 180 of the surviving greyhounds at a cost of more than \$140,000 donated by animal advocacy groups and individuals.

There's no disputing the fact that greyhound racing and the attendant danger to the animals is a cruel and barbaric practice. Public recognition of that, and adverse publicity and pressure from animal advocacy groups, has resulted in legislation to ban dog racing and wagering on dog racing across our nation and internationally.

This is an opportunity for Guam to follow the lead of enlightened and caring communities by making sure we must never again confront the horrific events of the past 19 months."

Tiffany DeSpain, Volunteer, Guam Animals In Need; Submitted written testimony (attached), **IN SUPPORT** of Bill No. 406-30 (COR).

Ms. DeSpain states she adopted two former greyhound racers from GAIN, and expresses gratitude to Senator Ada for introducing Bill 406 to ban dog racing and pari-mutuel wagering. She states, "my family and I are extremely disturbed by the conditions that they (greyhounds) had to endure, both at the track and with the individuals that initially took possession of them when the track gave the dogs away without basic screening for appropriate placing. She further states that she volunteer worked tirelessly to care for not only their usual workload of dogs and cats, but also more than a dozen greyhounds in the first wave of arrivals. She states that they (greyhounds) arrived severely malnourished, sick, injured and lacking basic socialization skills. She further states, "It is my prayer that Bill 406 will pass".

Dianne M. Strong, Ed.D., Volunteer, Guam Animals In Need; Submitted written (attached), and provided oral testimony, **IN SUPPORT** of Bill o. 406-30 (COR).

She states that she is in support of Bill 406 as a long-time member of Guam Animals In Need, and a former GAIN board member. She states that when the Guam Raceway Park closed in November 2008, more than 200 purebred greyhounds suffered from lack of food and medical care. She further states that at least four of these "docile and beautiful canines died from malnutrition and neglect, and many more came close to dying." She asks that Bill 406 be passed in order for Guam to join 42 states in America, which do not allow greyhound racing.

Rita Franquez, private citizen, village of Piti; Provided oral testimony **IN SUPPORT** of Bill No. 406-30 (COR).

Ms. Franquez states that she fully supports Bill 406. She refers to the closure of the racetrack, and the "indescribable" impacts to the greyhounds. She states that all senators should support this bill. She further stated her strong concern for the egregious conduct of those who engage in dog fighting – and that stronger statutory steps should also be taken against this type of cruelty to animals.

Artemio B. Ilagan, Director, Department of Revenue & Taxation; Submitted written testimony (attached), **IN SUPPORT** of Bill No.406-30 (COR).

Mr. Ilagan stated that "Guam Greyhound racing or any form of dog racing has lost appeal to both local and tourist population since 2008." Also informed the Committee that the final dog races were held in Guam last November 6, 2008.

Vice-Speaker Benjamin J. Cruz; Vice-Speaker Benjamin Cruz, stated that the one entity that really suffered after the closure of the racetrack was the reputation of Guam. While in Los Angeles, CA, media outlets commemorated the anniversary of rescue efforts of removing 200 greyhounds from Guam.

Chairman: There being no further testimony, or questions by Senators, Chairman Aguon adjourned the public hearing on Bill No. 406-30 (COR) at 6:35 P.M.

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Economic Development, Health and Human Services, and Judiciary, finds that there is **strong** community **support** for the passage of Bill No. 406-30 (COR). The Bill seeks to end canine racing on Guam, and thereby help prevent, the inhumane treatment of dogs on Guam within the dog racing industry - which is in decline nationwide. No testimony was received opposed to Bill No. 406-30 (COR).

A technical amendment was made to Section 2 of the Bill, so as to correctly reference the repealing of §64.50 of Article 2, Chapter 64, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated. No other substantive or technical amendments were made.

Dear Senator,

As a resident of the beautiful island of Guam and an animal lover who adopted two former greyhound racers from G.A.I.N, I would like to express my gratitude to you and your office for your important work on Bill 406 to ban dog racing and parimutuel wagering. While we love our dogs and are extremely grateful to the G.A.I.N. for providing us the opportunity to adopt, my family and are extremely disturbed by the conditions that they had to endure, both at the track and with the individuals that initially took possession of them when the track gave the dogs away without basic screening for appropriate placement.

I visited G.A.I.N on January 1, 2009 to find volunteers working tirelessly to care for not only their usual workload of dogs and cats but also more than a dozen greyhounds in the first wave of arrivals. The hounds came severely malnourished, sick, injured and lacking basic socialization skills. Flash and Dakota, the two hounds we took into our home, suffered from mange, tick and flea infestation, tooth rot, and a leg joint so badly injured that Dr. Malakooti described it as "pulverized," causing the dog to hobble on three legs. They were grossly underweight and fearful. It took months of training and care both at home and by Dr. Malakooti to fully recover from years of abuse and neglect. We feel it was well worth the time and expense to earn the love and trust of these amazing pooches but we hope that no dogs find themselves in those conditions ever again. Our greyhounds are docile, eager to please and fully compliant, traits that also make them easy victims for abuse.

Additionally, I would like to add my perspective as an owner of a greyhound rescued from an illegal track in China where we are currently stationed. The Chinese government has banned greyhounds in an attempt to control betting and associated illegal activity. This has pushed Chinese breeders underground, making the plight of Mainland greyhounds unimaginable. They lack adequate shelter during harsh summers and winters. There is no vet care. Animals that are considered useless are left to suffer, inhumanely put down or sold to a dog meat market, where they are beaten until dead to make the meat "rich with blood" and "more nutritious." The key to stopping abuse, both on Guam and elsewhere, is to stop the betting, making owning the dogs unattractive.

Please feel free to contact me should you have any questions. It is my prayer that Bill 406 will pass. Bless you for taking up this important work!

On behalf of the largest greyhound protection organization in the United States, I urge you to pass Senate Bill 406 to prohibit commercial greyhound racing on the island of Guam.

In the United States, greyhound racing is a dying industry that is inherently cruel to dogs. Today, thanks to the enactment of Sunshine laws in various states, track records are now public documents. In the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, a dog was injured every three to four days before racing was made illegal in that state. Colorado reported 2,600 injuries from 1993-2007. In New Hampshire, records showed that 1,200 injuries occurred from 2005 to 2008, the year in which dog racing finally ended in the Granite State. Reported injuries include broken bones, cardiac arrest, paralysis and seizures. The most frequent injuries are broken legs, but broken necks and crushed skulls are also reported each year. Some dogs die while racing, while others are put down because of the severity of their injuries, and/or because of their diminished value as racers.

When not racing, these gentle dogs are kept confined in warehouse-style kennels, inside small, stacked cages which are too small to allow free movement. Other than for brief turn-out periods, greyhounds live restricted for an average of twenty hours per day with little ability to interact with their handlers or one another. The average greyhound stands thirty inches at the shoulder, but a standard cage size in the United States is just 32" wide by 41" deep by 34" high. To put it simply, this is no way to treat a dog.

The decline of greyhound racing has been ongoing for years, and media outlets have long reported the spiraling collapse of this industry. According to the Association of Racing Commissioners International, an industry association, gambling on greyhounds declined by 42% from 2002-2007 in the United States. This includes both gambling on live greyhound racing and simulcast betting, where bettors wager remotely on dog races taking place elsewhere. Not only have humane concerns come to the forefront, but competition from other forms of gambling has forced tracks to close. Since 2001, twenty-five American tracks have shut down operations, cutting the industry in half. There now remain just twenty-three tracks in seven states.

As of 2010, dog racing is illegal in the majority of the United States. The Territory of Guam has an opportunity to join this humane trend and make sure that the urgent situation which developed in late 2008 never occurs again.

On behalf of 25,000 greyhound advocates nationwide, I urge you to support Senate Bill 406.

OVERVIEW


Greyhound racing is a dying industry. This decline is due to increased public awareness that dog racing is cruel and inhumane, in addition to competition from other forms of gambling.

BETWEEN 2002 AND 2007, GAMBLING ON DOG RACING DECLINED BY 42%

Between 2002 and 2007, the total amount gambled on greyhound racing nationwide declined by 42%.ⁱ This includes gambling on both live greyhound racing and simulcast gambling, where bettors wager remotely on dog races that take place elsewhere.

At the same time that overall gambling on dog racing is declining, a trend toward simulcast gambling continues. In 2007, more than two-thirds (67%) of all wagers on dog races were made by simulcast.ⁱⁱ

Similarly, state tax revenue from greyhound racing continues to drop. Between 2002 and 2007, state revenue declined by more than 44%, and by the end of this period represented only \$38 million nationwide.ⁱⁱⁱ This does not account for regulatory costs. When these costs are taken into consideration, it is likely that many states are losing money on commercial greyhound racing.



ACROSS THE COUNTRY, DOG TRACKS ARE CLOSING

Since 2001, 25 racetracks have closed for live greyhound racing from the West Coast to the East, North and South. As of May 2010, there are only 23 dog tracks remaining in seven states. Read more on our [state-by-state information page](#).

My name is Shirley Miller. I am a volunteer for Guam Animals In Need and from November 2008 until the last Greyhound leaves Guam, I will volunteer for the Guam Greyhound Rescue Group.

An ancient proverb states "...then God sent the Greyhound to live among man and to remember. And when the day comes, God will call the Greyhound to give testament, and God will pass judgment upon man."

In November 2008 when the Guam Greyhound Race Track closed, over 345 racing Greyhounds were put at risk. (a copy of the track listing is attached hereto). In a matter of days, these animals' lives changed from a daily racing routine to a nightmare struggle to survive.

The Guam Greyhound Rescue group was formed to rescue the Greyhounds that had been given away to island residents and subsequently abandoned. Luckier Greyhounds were kept at the track and eventually released to Guam Animals In Need for their shipment to forever homes.

Cindy Bartels contacted Mike and Denise Holdridge (who were vacationing in the states) to contact Greyhound rescue groups to seek their assistance.

Senator Judith Guthertz and Dave Davis were instrumental in ending the "greyhound giveaway program." John Mottern's photos of three Greyhounds tied to a truck initiated the meetings to formalize plans to ship the Greyhounds to rescue groups in the states. From January 2009 until recently, 158 Greyhounds were shipped to the 48 States, Hawaii and Japan. Thirty-two Greyhounds were adopted locally. There is no record of the unsterilized, unvaccinated Greyhounds that were given away.

I support Bill 406 banning greyhound racing and pari-mutuel wagering on Guam.

As a long-time member of Guam Animals In Need (GAIN), and a former GAIN board member, I support any measure that intends to **prevent cruelty to animals**.

When the Guam Raceway Park closed in November 2008, more than 200 pure-bred greyhounds suffered from lack of food and medical care.

At least four of these docile and beautiful canines died from malnutrition and neglect, and many more came close to dying.

As humans we can not perceive their level of suffering, but we could observe how their own sleek coats just hung over their emaciated skeletons, and how they lost the luster in their eyes.

Many Guam residents came to the rescue of these abandoned greyhounds, providing CPR along the side of the road, rushing them to veterinarians, fostering these beautiful animals until they were healthy enough to be adopted. Dave and Noni Davis made many 2 a.m. trips to the airport to transport these rescued greyhounds for flights to the mainland. Stateside greyhound rescue leagues stepped in and relocated these rescued greyhounds.

Please make sure our loving people of Guam never again have to witness such **cruel neglect** of these noble creatures.


Please bring to the Session floor a vote on this bill, so that Guam can join 42 states in America which ban greyhound racing.

Guam Animals In Need fully supports Bill 406! With the closure of the Guam Greyhound Racing track came the ensuing nightmare for the greyhounds of Guam. Having been raced their entire lives, when the end came - so did their usefulness to the track. Instead of implementing a responsible and humane program to retire these dogs, a free-for-all giveaway program was chosen by Guam Greyhound Racetrack. The dogs were given away en masse - with no screening, no education regarding their needs, and no tracking or follow-up on the homes they were given. The result - greyhounds starving and near-death were found on the streets, jungles, and villages of Guam. Guam Animals In Need rescued 200 of those Greyhounds and worked diligently both to find recover them to good health. GAIN found them quality homes in Guam, Japan, Hawaii, and the US mainland with the assistance of the mainland Greyhound Rescue groups. We as a community can never let a tragedy of this nature happen again, and Bill 406 will assist in ensuring that it does not. At one point in the rescue effort, one of the ex-track employees sent us an email with a tally of the total dogs at the track. We never did find out what happened to the dogs outside of the 200 we recovered as Guam Greyhound Racetrack would not acknowledge this number or provide any additional information. We don't know if they were sent off island before the giveaway, or if they were part of the giveaway and died in the jungles. Their unknown fate haunts us to this day Please pass Bill 406 without haste. Pass it to honor those dogs we could not find, pass it so that this type of tragedy will never happen on our island again.

When greyhound racing dogs are shipped to Guam from Australia, they are young and naive. The fast-racing dogs will spend the next seven years of their lives racing on the track.

When they are no longer young and quick, the end of their lives in Guam is

somewhere at the end of a boomer road, where they are deserted and will likely die from disease or starvation.

But a local woman is working quietly behind the scenes to bring temporary endings for some of these dogs. MacIvor, for the last two years, Patsy MacIvor said she has been working with the greyhound owners and trainers to find homes for the dogs where they will be cared for at the end of their racing days.

MacIvor, who works as a bartender, said she first became concerned about the dogs as a volunteer for the Yigo An-

imal Shelter.

"Every year and then I would see these poor dogs brought in," MacIvor said. "The pile have not been kind to them when they come out with them. They would be soaked with back worms, just in bad shape."

Though a hunting breed, greyhounds don't become good scavengers when deserted, she said. There are no reports of greyhounds becoming wild "boomer dogs" on the island.

Report: More needed to control snakes

Plan: Study recommends more funding to control spread of voracious reptile

WASHINGTON — Current safeguards to prevent the spread of the dreaded brown tree snake are inadequate, and federal funding to control the voracious reptile in the Pacific Islands should be dramatically increased, according to a draft



snake control plan released by the Department of Interior. The importance of a long-term, coordinated effort toward brown tree snake control cannot be overstated," the report by the House Snake Control Committee said. "Neither can the importance of beginning now."

The draft plan suggests steep funding increases for many existing snake control efforts, but more important, added funding for research to develop new controls and to study the snake's biology.

A five-year program would cost about \$20 million, including operational and research spending, compared to the \$396,000 the Interior Department

"They're docile," MacIvor said. "They've always depended on man. They're man-oriented. If you throw it out and it tries to fend for itself, but it doesn't know how ... they've been chasing that bunny around the track for seven years but they have never caught it."

Familiar presence

MacIvor, originally from Boston, began talking to greyhound owners and trainers finding homes for the dogs once they're retired from racing. Once "undercover," MacIvor is now a familiar presence at the dog kennels next to the Guam Greyhound Park.

Though the track has an adoption program, few people who go to the races make use of it, she said.

"Nobody knew about these dogs," MacIvor said. "They didn't know if they would be good pets."

It's not that the owners or trainers don't care, MacIvor said. But it becomes too expensive to keep caring for the dogs after

they've passed their racing prime. The dogs cost about \$1,400 each from Australian breeders, she said. Owners also have to pay for their feeding, care and kennels. On the mainland, greyhounds only race "five years tops," according to MacIvor. Greyhounds here commonly race for seven years because of the costs involved, she said.

"It's a business," MacIvor said. "But it doesn't have to be a dirty dog business."

She said she is not critical of dog racing.

"I've been brought up around racing horses and dogs. I love racing."

'Race their hearts out'

And greyhounds are a most unique breed. They are the most hard-working animals. They race their hearts out. They're athletes.

MacIvor said she carefully screens people interested in adopting the dogs. "You have to be very careful who you give them to," she said.

MacIvor said she gets no money for her efforts.

She said she is helped by GAIN (Guam Animals In Need), the public health department and the Ugo Animal Shelter.

TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF BILL 406

This is submitted in support of Senator Ada's Bill 406, a measure to ban dog racing and pari-mutual wagering on dog racing in Guam. With passage of this bill into law Guam will join 42 of the 50 States in ending a practice that often results in death and serious injury for thousands of greyhounds annually, as well as the neglect and inhumane conditions under which many exist as they live out their caged lives.

Many of us are aware of the more public and publicized events that followed closure of Guam's greyhound track in November 2008. There remain obscure and disturbing elements related to the track closure and Guam Greyhound in general – things about which we can speculate but never know for certain.

After nearly two months of evasion and obfuscation, the Guam Greyhound general manager provided GAIN with a kennel inventory as of 22 January 2009, listing a total of 191 greyhounds and their disposition.

The breakdown showed 101 as 'local adoptions' – those they indiscriminately gave away in November and December 2008 --; 6 as employee adoptions; and 84 remaining at the track. He also listed 50 'reclaimed greyhounds'. Those were the ones rescued by GAIN to that point, many of which were literally at the brink of death from starvation, abuse, neglect and untreated medical and dental conditions. The "reclaimed" 50 included 17 at the GAIN shelter, 21 legitimately adopted through GAIN and 12 shipped to the mainland for adoption. Rescuers arrived too late for at least 4 animals.

That wasn't the whole story, however. With the help of a Guam Greyhound employee GAIN had acquired a nine-page kennel inventory list that showed, by name and other unique and specific identifying information, as many as 384 greyhounds at the track as of April 2008. The precise number was never known as one page of the inventory was missing. The likely total was extrapolated using the information available.

That leaves us with an estimated 193 animals unaccounted for – animals that apparently vanished between April 2008 and January 2009. We'll probably never know what happened to them, but none of the possibilities are pleasant to consider.

As of today, 19 months after the track closed, GAIN has rescued, rehabilitated and in most cases relocated more than 180 of the surviving greyhounds at a cost of more than \$140,000 donated by animal advocacy groups and individuals.

There's no disputing the fact that greyhound racing and the attendant danger to the animals is a cruel and barbaric practice. Public recognition of that, and adverse publicity and pressure from animal advocacy groups, has resulted in legislation to ban dog racing and wagering on dog racing across our nation and internationally.

This is an opportunity for Guam to follow the lead of enlightened and caring communities by making sure we must never again confront the horrific events of the past 19 months.

Gov't urged to repair damaged Sugar Dock

SAIPAN -- The Pantalan Boys, a group of local residents who frequent the Sugar Dock area, are again reminding the government about the danger posed by the unrepaired portion of the dock.

Two years ago, after three children were reported to have been injured in the area, teams from Coastal Resources Management and the Department of Public Works demolished the dilapidated structure that was used as a diving plank by swimmers.

But up to now, said Jun Sablan, one of the Pantalan Boys, the government has not repaired the other dilapidated portion of the dock.

"It needs to be repaired because the foundation is now obsolete -- it was built during the Japanese era," he added.

He said the government will be liable if something happens to the people using the dock.

"We need a preventive measure," he added, as he strongly urged CRM and DPW to immediately repair the dock's damaged portion.

Juvenile center guard arrested for sexual abuse

SAIPAN – Federal agents arrested on Friday a Division of Youth Services jail guard on the charge of sexually abusing a juvenile at the Kagman detention center.

Tyron Farley Reyes Fitial, 24, was escorted by federal agents when he appeared in federal court before visiting Chief Judge William H. Alsop of the Northern District of California on Friday afternoon.

"Fitial is charged with violating a person's civil rights when he used his position of authority to force the person, a minor child, to engage in sexual acts while the minor was in the custody of the juvenile detention unit, located in Kagman on the island of Saipan," according to a statement from U.S. Attorney for the District of Guam and the CNMI Leonardo M. Rapadas.

A federal agent described the case as "horrible."

Fitial's arrest comes as part of a wider and ongoing investigation into abusive behavior by guards at the Kagman detention facility, the statement added.

DPL remits \$2.5 million to help out CUC

SAIPAN – The Department of Public Lands has remitted \$2.5 million to the general fund to help the government address the Commonwealth Utilities Corp.'s fuel problem.

DPL Secretary Oscar M. Babauta, in an interview, said he was sure that other government agencies will remit what is due to the general fund.

Babauta said the amount his department remitted came from DPL's collections.

He said the money does not go directly to CUC as it was remitted to the general fund.

"But of course this will eventually help the CUC," he added.

He said DPL remits some \$800,000 to the general fund each quarter for administrative and other expenses like payroll and utility costs.

Fuji Maru visit helps NMI economy

SAIPAN – The MV Fuji Maru cruise ship's visit to Saipan last week helped provide a much needed boost to the CNMI's economy.

Pacific Micronesia Tours manager Takashi Nagaoka told the Variety that 16 buses from PMT and Tasi Tours transported the passengers from the port to the Fiesta Resort Hotel & Spa beach.

"The young businesspersons spent the afternoon getting ready for the friendship party scheduled at American Memorial Park with the local residents," Nagaoka said.

This year marks the 37th JC Youth Voyage Tokaigo and the third time for Fuji Maru to come here. The first and second times were in 2006 and 2007.

The Fuji Maru departed Saipan over the weekend.

Saipan seaport manager Mary Ann O. Lizama said 589 young businesspersons were on board the Fuji Maru, while 200 others flew in from Nagoya.

"Having this big group of businesspersons come to the island is a big boost to the economy," Lizama said.

The cruise passengers went out shopping and sightseeing in Garapan, and toured the northern part of Saipan including the Last Command Post and Banzai Cliff before the ship departed.

The 547-foot Fuji Maru cruise is one of the ships regularly used by Japanese businesses to give their workers incentive cruises mostly to Southeast Asian destinations.

Fuji Maru and its sister ship Nippon Maru are now regularly used for cruises throughout the

world including to popular destinations such as Australia, New Zealand, Canada and Alaska.

The MV Fuji Maru is operated by the Mitsui OSK Cruise Lines. Weighing 23,340 tons, the ship carries 600 passengers.

It is just one of several interesting options for Japanese who want to take a cruise, ranging from conventional luxury cruises around the world, to one night cruises for a romantic getaway.

There are also inland Japan waterway cruises like those on the Sumida and other rivers, popular especially during the spring as well as ferry services that network the Japanese archipelago.

There are also international ferries plying between Japan and the outlying islands of other countries.





1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslatura Guåhan* finds
3 that the standard practices of the greyhound racing industry condone the
4 inhumane and cruel treatment of canines.

5 *I Liheslatura* further finds that the closure of an on-island canine
6 racetrack in 2008 lead to the mistreatment and abandonment of over 200
7 greyhounds, which required a significant amount of resources by both
8 community members and advocacy groups, totaling nearly \$150,000, to
9 mitigate. While there are no current canine racing tracks on Guam, existing
10 law does not prohibit this inhumane industry from being reestablished in the
11 future.

12 *I Liheslatura* thus finds it necessary to remove language within Guam
13 Code Annotated that permits pari-mutuel wagering on greyhound races, and,
14 with such a prohibition on greyhound racing, promote the values of Guam
