

**AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW ARTICLE 2 TO CHAPTER 40,
OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE
TO CREATING A *COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP*
COUNCIL (CPC), FOR THE PURPOSES OF
IDENTIFYING SITES AND FUNDING FOR THE
CONSTRUCTION OF MULTIPURPOSE CENTERS FOR
EVERY VILLAGE, WHICH *SHALL* BE KNOWN AS
THE “COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP ACT OF 2010.”**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that as the population of Guam increases, the spirit of the island community is

1 becoming increasingly introverted. As well, there is a new emphasis throughout
2 the island and around the world on living a healthy lifestyle.

3 Since time immemorial, schools in our communities have represented a
4 central point to showcase the talents and pride of the village residents. During
5 times of impending disasters, these same schools also serve as typhoon/emergency
6 shelters. Gyms, while serving as a primary center for sports and recreation, have
7 always been an alternate venue for large community gatherings.

8 Each municipality in Guam has been promised, either through well
9 intentioned legislation or initiatives, gymnasiums that would serve as sports and
10 recreation centers, and meeting spots for community functions. Due to limited
11 funding, these plans are often placed on the backburner. While some communities
12 are able to boast of a beautiful gymnasium, others are left wanting.

13 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that in order to address this disparity and ensure
14 that every municipality in Guam is outfitted with a gymnasium, community facility
15 and when necessary, a typhoon/emergency center; a Council *shall* be created to
16 develop viable and feasible funding sources and design plans.

17 The Council *shall* be comprised of representatives from the Mayors Council
18 of Guam (MCOG), the Department of Education (DOE), Guam Homeland
19 Security Office of Civil Defense (GHS/OCD), the Department of Parks and
20 Recreation (DPR), the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA),
21 the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), the *Chamorro* Land Trust
22 Commission (CLTC), and two (2) members from the community-at-large
23 appointed by *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*.

24 The goal of the Council *shall* be to ensure that every village is outfitted with
25 a multipurpose center, by the year 2020, to serve as a central point for village
26 functions and other requested usage, and as the primary gymnasium of the village
27 and when necessary, a typhoon/emergency center.

1 In keeping with the evolution of our communities, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*
2 finds that the Council *shall* consider a single cookie cutter design for a
3 multipurpose center which *shall* be developed for construction in each village. The
4 Council *shall* work with the respective village Mayors and the Department of
5 Education to identify sites within the confines or on the border of an elementary
6 school within the village boundaries.

7 It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to commission the Council to
8 present a plan and funding option to *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* and *I Liheslaturan*
9 *Guåhan* for the construction of a multipurpose center or retrofitting existing gyms
10 to serve as multipurpose centers in each village in Guam, beginning with the
11 municipalities of *Mangilao* and *Inarajan*.

12 **Section 2. Creation of “The Community Partnership Council.”** A new
13 Article 2 is hereby *added* to Chapter 40, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

14 **“ARTICLE 2**

15 **The Community Partnership Council (CPC)**

16 **§40201. Creation of the Community Partnership Council.**

17 **§40202. Membership of Council.**

18 **§40202.1 Municipal Subcommittees.**

19 **§40203. Eligibility; Terms of Service.**

20 **§40204. Convening and Meetings.**

21 **§40205. Goals and Purposes of the CPC.**

22 **§40206. Action Plan.**

23 **§40206.1. Design Recommendations and Financing**
24 **Options.**

25 **§40206.2. Maintenance, Staffing Projections and Review**
26 **of Existing Village Facilities.**

- 1 (f) a representative from the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal
2 Authority (GHURA), appointed by the Director of GHURA,
3 who may appoint himself;
- 4 (g) a representative from the Guam Economic Development
5 Authority (GEDA), appointed by the Administrator of GEDA,
6 who may appoint himself;
- 7 (h) two (2) volunteer members of the general public, appointed by *I*
8 *Maga'lahaen Guåhan*, who *shall* serve at the pleasure of *I*
9 *Maga'lahi*; and
- 10 (i) a representative from the *Chamorro* Land Trust Commission
11 (CLTC), appointed by the Board.

12 **§40202.1 Municipal Subcommittees.** Individual municipalities
13 *shall* appoint a subcommittee from among its Municipal Planning Council
14 with one (1) representative serving as the Chairperson, who *shall* also serve
15 as a liaison between the community and the CPC.

16 **§40203. Eligibility; Terms of Service.** Members may be
17 employees of the government of Guam, appointed by their respective
18 organization head as directed in §40202 (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g) and (i),
19 *unless* otherwise delineated. Upon acceptance, appointees, and their
20 appointing authority, *shall* consider the members' service on the Council as
21 a part of the prescribed duties relative to their regular position within the
22 government of Guam. Members *shall* serve so long as they retain the
23 position within the organization from which they were appointed.

24 **§40204. Convening and Meetings.** The President of the Mayors
25 Council *shall* convene the *Community Partnership Council* and *shall*
26 administer the oath of office of the chairperson, and members, *unless* the
27 President is also a member and chairperson of the Council. In such case, the

1 President *shall* make arrangements with the Office of *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*,
2 or *I Segundo Na Maga'lahaen Guåhan* so that *I Maga'lahi* or *I Segundo Na*
3 *Maga'lahi* may administer the oath to members of the *Community*
4 *Partnership Council*. The governance of the Council *shall* be determined by
5 its membership.

6 Meetings *shall* be held during regular business hours of the
7 government of Guam, Mondays through Fridays, and *shall* be held *no less*
8 *than* once monthly. *No* stipends *shall* be paid if the members pursuant to
9 §40202 (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g) and (i) are employed by the government
10 of Guam. Members pursuant to §40202(h) *shall* be volunteer members.

11 **§40205. Goals and Purposes of the CPC.** The Mayors Council
12 of Guam, together with the Department of Education, the Guam Homeland
13 Security Office of Civil Defense, the Department of Parks and Recreation,
14 the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, the Guam Economic
15 Development Authority, and the *Chamorro* Land Trust Commission *shall*
16 convene a Council as prescribed in §40202. The CPC *shall* develop a
17 feasibility study that will outline marked timelines and proposed funding
18 sources *or* financing proposals for the construction of a multipurpose center
19 in each village by the year 2020, to serve as a central point for village
20 functions, and other requested usage; and as the primary gymnasium of the
21 village.

22 **§40206. Action Plan.** The CPC *shall* create an action plan with
23 the sequence of the order for consideration and construction of multipurpose
24 centers in the respective municipalities and *shall* rotate the proposed
25 construction schedule as follows:

- 26 (a) The CPC, in coordination with the respective village
27 Mayors, *shall*, when available, identify within the confines or along

1 the border of an existing public elementary school under the operation
2 of the Department of Education, adequate property for the
3 construction of a multipurpose center in every village.

4 (1) For the purposes of the location of a multipurpose center,
5 when property is identified the Mayor of each respective village
6 *shall* have the right of first refusal for said property, provided,
7 that it is in the inventory of the government of Guam or listed
8 as a parcel/s in the inventory of the *Chamorro* Land Trust
9 Commission.

10 (b) Villages considered for construction of a multipurpose
11 center *shall* be the most populous village without a gymnasium and
12 rotate to villages without a gymnasium that have populations with *less*
13 *than* five thousand five hundred (5500) residents recorded based on
14 the most recent statistics (Year 2000) of the United States Census
15 Bureau; and when available, data from the 2010 U.S. Census *shall* be
16 used. Villages that currently have gymnasiums *shall*, by default, be
17 moved to the second rotation for retrofitting, if necessary, to meet the
18 purposes of a multipurpose center.

19 (1) According to the 2000 U.S. Census, Dededo had a
20 population of forty-two thousand nine hundred eighty (42,980)
21 residents; *Yigo* had a population of nineteen thousand four
22 hundred seventy-four (19,474) residents; and the tri-village of
23 *Tamuning*, *Tumon* and *Harmon* had eighteen thousand twelve
24 (18,012) residents. However, all three (3) municipalities
25 already possess village gymnasiums, thus in this instance, based
26 on the U.S. Census of 2000, the village of *Mangilao*, with a
27 recorded population of thirteen thousand three hundred thirteen

1 (13,313) residents, *shall* be the first qualified village for the
2 construction of a multipurpose center.

3 (2) Concurrently, according to the 2000 U.S. Census,
4 *Agana Heights* had a population of five thousand two hundred
5 (5,200) residents, and *Talofofo* had a population of three
6 thousand two hundred forty-five (3,245) residents. However,
7 both municipalities already possess village gymnasiums, thus in
8 this instance, based on the U.S. Census of 2000, the village of
9 *Inarajan*, with a recorded population of three thousand fifty-
10 two (3,052) residents *shall* be the second qualified village for
11 the construction of a multipurpose center.

12 (c) The cycle of consideration for the rotation of the
13 construction of multipurpose centers in villages without gymnasiums
14 *shall* continue in the order as formulated in §40206 (b)(1) and ((2).

15 (d) The CPC *shall* also incorporate a sequencing
16 formulation, at the discretion of the CPC, for the programming of the
17 construction for multipurpose centers in each village that takes into
18 account a fair rotation of northern villages, central villages and
19 southern villages.

20 **§40206.1. Design Recommendations and Financing Options.**

21 The CPC *shall* include in its plans, the basic design and requirements of a
22 multipurpose facility by utilizing proven “cookie cutter” design concepts.
23 Designs considered *shall* be for “Hardened Facilities” able to withstand
24 typhoon strength winds.

25 The CPC *shall* research all known available grants and funds as
26 recommended:

- 1 • United States Department of Housing and Urban Development,
2 through GHURA
- 3 • United States Department of Agriculture for Rural
4 Development, through GEDA
- 5 • United States Department of Homeland Security
- 6 • A Finance, Build, Operate & Leaseback Option, through GEDA
- 7 • Any available or known availability of funds or revenue
8 sources, or recommended revenue sources of the government of
9 Guam.

10 The CPC *shall* include in its recommendations, proposals for
11 the financing and construction of these facilities to include necessary
12 collateral equipment to ensure a fully operational facility upon
13 completion of construction.

14 **§40206.2. Maintenance, Staffing Projections and Review of**
15 **Existing Village Facilities.** The CPC as part of its planning process *shall*
16 also take into account the maintenance, staffing needs, and future projections
17 for the upkeep of the newly constructed facilities; as well the CPC *shall*, at
18 its discretion, conduct a review of existing village facilities and make
19 recommendations on retrofitting *or* expanding the purpose and service of
20 each facility in the respective municipalities of Guam.

21 **§40207. Logistical Needs, Support Structure and**
22 **Coordination of the CPC.** The logistical needs, support structure, and
23 coordination of the Council *shall* be underwritten by the MCOG at the
24 direction of the chairperson.”

25 **Section 3. Presentation.** Upon convening of the CPC, the Council *shall*
26 meet *no less than* once monthly, and effectuate a draft plan *no later than* two

1 hundred forty (240) days of the Council's first meeting for presentation to *I*
2 *Maga'lahaen Guåhan* and *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for consideration.

3 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act *shall* take effect upon enactment.”

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COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 461-30(LS)

I. Overview

The Committee on Municipal Affairs, Aviation, Housing and Recreation convened a Public Hearing on Wednesday, October 20, 2010 at 1:00 P.M., in I Liheslatura's Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of **Bill No. 461-30(LS)** -**"An act to add a new Article 2, to Chapter 40, of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to creating a *Community Partnership Council (CPC)* for the purposes of identifying sites in each municipality in Guam, and funding for the construction of multipurpose centers for every village. This act shall be known as the 'Community Partnership Act of 2010.'**"

Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via-email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Wednesday, October 06, 2010 and Monday, October 11, 2010, (5-Day Notice), and again on Wednesday, October 13, 2010 (48-Hour Notice). On Tuesday, October 19, 2010 an amended noticed was sent out to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets.

II. Summary of Testimony and Discussion

Opening statement: Sen. Tina Rose Muna-Barnes, Chairperson, Committee on Municipal Affairs, Aviation, Housing and Recreation.

Sen. Tina Rose Muna-Barnes opened the public hearing at 1:05p.m. She invited Sen. Judi P. Guthertz, as the author of Bill 461-30(LS) to introduce the measure.

Sen. Guthertz, Author of Bill 460-30(LS)

Sen. Guthertz spoke about the Bill 461-30(LS). She noted that the measure creates a *Community Partnership Council* (CPC) for the purposes of identifying sites in each municipality in Guam, and funding for the construction of multipurpose centers for every village

She explained that the measure would promote a partnership effort for a healthy safe community. The partnership would consist of various government entities that have access to grants, knowledge of securing funding for Capital Improvement Projects for the community and other areas of expertise related to community development, education and recreation.

Cited as the Community Partnership Act of 2010, the council will be led by the Mayors' Council of Guam and include various government professionals tasked to develop a plan of action with the goal of ensuring that each village in Guam realizes a multi-purpose center as a hub for community engagement, a central point for recreation and as a disaster center so that schools are no longer burdened as disaster/typhoon shelters.

The Honorable Vicente “Ben” D. Gumataotao, Mayor of Piti

Mayor Gumataotao spoke in favor of Bill 461-30(LS). He stated that the village of Piti currently lacks a village gym and a multi-purpose center would be most welcomed. The mayor added that the village in fact does not have a fallback center for disaster; rather his people have to trek to Santa Rita or Barrigada in times of need for adequate shelter.

The Honorable Paul M. McDonald , Mayor of Agana Heights

Mayor McDonald testified in favor of Bill 461-30(LS). The mayor said that his village already has a gym, but added that it was in need of renovation. He said he utilizes the village's community center as a multi-purpose center of sorts and noted its value as a central point as a disaster shelter versus the use of the village's only public school – Agana Heights Elementary.

The Honorable Robert “Bob” S. Lizama, Mayor of Yigo

Mayor Lizama testified in favor of Bill 461-30(LS). The mayor said that he, along with the municipal planning council, and the Mayors' Council, was in support of the measure and its intent. He shared his hope that other senators would sign on as co-sponsors. Mayor Lizama noted that in terms of vastness, his municipality encompassed the largest land mass as well; his village was 2nd in population in Guam. The mayor noted that the multi-purpose center would serve as a great venue for a community type center. He alluded that he would prefer the gym and multi-purpose center be separate, especially since his village contained the largest geographical

footprint. The mayor also requested that Yigo be assigned the 3rd consideration for the construction of the multipurpose center and he requested that a representative of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission be included as a member of the council.

The Honorable Melissa B. Savares, Mayor of Dededo; President, Mayors' Council of Guam

Mayor Savares testified in favor of Bill 461-30(LS). She requested that the Chamorro Land Trust Commission be added to the Council membership as well as a member of the respective villages' Municipal Planning Councils. The mayor requested that the model used for the multipurpose centers be hardened facilities. Mayor Savares also testified that she agreed with the need to take away the practice of utilizing schools as shelters during times of disaster Mayor Savares added that she appreciated the "Team Concept" that he legislation encompassed.

The Honorable Carol S. Tayama, Mayor of Agat

Mayor Carol S. Tayama testified in favor of Bill 461-30(LS). She noted that her village's current gym is in need of repair. The mayor stated that the measure encapsulated a great concept, but she hoped that the council would consider additional staffing and maintenance costs with any new CIP assigned to the mayors of Guam. Mayor Tayama stated that empanelling a council was a great idea as it ensure a fair and equal distribution

The Honorable Robert Hoffman, Vice Mayor of Sinajana; Vice President, Mayors' Council of Guam

Vice Mayor Hoffman testified in favor of Bill 461-30(LS). The vice mayor said he appreciated the fact that the measure called for a multipurpose center versus a gym.

Mr. Angel Sablan, Executive Director fo the Mayors' Council of Guam

Mr. Sablan testified in favor of Bill 461-30(LS). He stated that he especially supported the measure in light of the fact that all Mayors that had testified were in support of the measure. He suggested new language in the legislation that would provide respective mayors the right of first refusal should properties identified as ideal for a multi-purpose center be listed as owned by the Government of Guam or in the inventory of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. Mr. Sablan concluded that the measure contained a fair mechanism for the planning and construction of multipurpose centers in every village.

The Honorable Franklin M. Taitague, Mayor of Inarajan

Mayor Taitague testified in favor of Bill 461-30(LS). The mayor shared that he thought that the Bill was well-written and thought out. He said the village of Inarajan and Malojoj would be well served with a multipurpose center.

Discussion

Sen. Tony Ada

Sen. Ada congratulated Mayor Taitague in light of the fact that Inarajan would be among the first in line for a center should the measure come to fruition.

Sen. Telo Taitague

Sen. Taitague stated that she appreciated the measure and appreciated the collective positive testimony from the Mayors of Guam in support of Bill 461-30(LS)

Sen. Judi P. Guthertz

Sen. Guthertz, as the author concluded discussion on Bill 461-30(LS) stated that she appreciated the recommendations from the Mayors as they are the front lines and know the needs and desires of their respective communities. Sen. Guthertz stated that the marked-up measure would include a provision to have the CPC do an assessment of current facilities and needs of the villages to serve the public and incorporate those needs in the planning.

Sen. Tina Rose Muna-Barnes, Chairperson, Committee on Municipal Affairs, Aviation, Housing and Recreation.

Sen. Barnes, Chairperson of the Committee concluded the hearing, and noted that as the oversight chair of municipal affairs, she thought the timeline of ensuring that a multipurpose center is built in every village on Guam by the year 2020 was doable. The Chairperson thanked all who testified and invited the general public to submit additional testimony on Bill 461-30(LS).

III. Findings and Recommendation

Instances of reprogramming or the outright cancelation of initiatives to construct a community facility, gym or center in every village coupled with the use of island schools as shelters in times of natural disasters prompted the author to proffer Bill No. 461-30(LS). The measure seeks to ensure through proper planning and execution, that every village on Guam is earmarked for the construction of a multipurpose center by the year 2020 to serve as a central point for village functions and other requested usage, and as the primary gymnasium of the village and when necessary, a typhoon/emergency center.

Bill 461-30 addresses the disparity of constructing facilities in one municipality versus another through a Community Partnership Council (CPC) that is led by the Mayors' Council of Guam. The CPC will be tasked to develop viable and feasible funding sources and design plans for multipurpose centers. The CPC will be comprised of representatives from the Mayors' Council of Guam and other segments and entities of the island community. The Council shall work with respective village Mayors and Municipal Planning Councils to identify sites within the village boundaries for the eventual construction of multipurpose centers in every village in Guam.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to commission the Council to present a plan and funding option to *I Maga'Lahen Guahan* and *I Liheslatura Guahan* for the construction of a multipurpose center or retrofitting existing gyms to serve as multipurpose centers in each village in Guam, beginning with municipalities of Mangilao and Inarajan. On Oct. 20, 2010, a public hearing was held to receive testimony on Bill No. 461-30(LS). Public comment reflected overwhelming support for the measure. Mayors from seven separate municipalities and the executive director of the Mayors' Council of Guam (MCOG) expressed genuine and unbinding support for the measure and also gave recommendations to improve the proposed legislation. The measure was marked-up by the Committee to incorporate the concerns of Mayors via Substitute Bill 461-30(LS).

Thus, based on a survey of preferred action by members of the Committee on Municipal Affairs, Aviation, Housing and Recreation; **Substitute Bill No. 461-30(LS)** "An act to add a new Article 2, to Chapter 40, of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to creating a *Community Partnership Council* (CPC) for the purposes of identifying sites in each municipality in Guam, and funding for the construction of multipurpose centers for every village. This act shall be known as the 'Community Partnership Act of 2010,'" is hereby reported out of the Committee with the recommendation to to pass _____.

2 population of 5,200 and Talofoto had a population of 3,245. However,
3 both municipalities already possess village gymnasiums, thus in this
4 instance, based on the US Census count of 2000, the village of Inarajan
5 with recorded population of 3,052 residents shall be the second qualified
6 village for the construction of a multipurpose center.

7 C.) The cycle of consideration for the rotation of the construction of multipurpose
8 centers in villages without gymnasiums shall continue in the order as formulated
9 in subitems (B)(1) and (B)(2) of §40206.

10 D.) The CPC shall also incorporate a sequencing formulation, at the discretion of the
11 CPC, for the programming of the construction for multipurpose centers in each
12 village that takes into account a fair rotation of northern villages, central villages
13 and southern villages.

14 **§40206. Design Recommendations and Financing Options.** The CPC shall
15 include in its plans, the basic design and requirements of a multipurpose facility by
16 utilizing proven 'cookie cutter' design concepts. Designs considered shall be for
17 "Hardened Facilities" able to withstand typhoon strength winds.

18 The CPC shall research all known available grants and funds as recommended:

- 19 • United States Housing and Urban Renewal Authority through GHURA;
- 20 • United States Department of Agriculture for rural Development, through GEDA
- 21 • United States Department of Homeland Security
- 22 • A Finance, Build, Operate & Leaseback Option, through GEDA
- 23 • Any available or known availability of funds or revenue sources, or recommended
- 24 revenue sources of the government of Guam.

1 The CPC shall include in its recommendations, proposals for the financing and
2 construction of these facilities to include necessary collateral equipment to ensure a
3 fully operational facility upon completion of construction.

4 **§40206.1 Maintenance, Staffing Projections and review of existing village**
5 **facilities.** The CPC as part of its planning process shall also take into account the
6 maintenance, staffing needs, and future projections for the upkeep of the newly
7 constructed facilities, as well the CPC shall, at its discretion, conduct a review of
8 existing village facilities and make recommendations on retrofitting or expanding
9 the purpose and service of each facility in the respective municipalities of Guam.

10 **§40207. Logistical Needs, Support Structure and Coordination of the CPC.**

11 The logistical needs, support structure, and coordination of the Council shall be
12 underwritten by the MCOG at the direction of the chairperson.

13 **Section 3. Presentation.** Upon convening of the CPC, the Council shall meet no
14 less than once monthly, and effectuate a draft plan no later than 240 days of the
15 Council's first meeting for presentation to *I Maga'Lahen Guåhan* and *I Liheslaturan*
16 *Guahan* for consideration.

17 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall take effect upon enactment."


