**AN ACT TO *AMEND* § 61542 OF CHAPTER 61, TITLE
21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO
REGULATION OF POLITICAL SIGNS.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that the erection of political signs during election season requires a massive
4 amount of human and natural resources. In an effort to protect our natural
5 resources and to ensure that political signs do *not* impede public use of streets or
6 endanger pedestrians, *I Liheslatura* intends to adjust the regulations relative to
7 allowable sizes of political signs.

1 **Section 2.** § 61542 of Chapter 61, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is
2 hereby *amended* to read:

3 **“§ 61542. Regulation of Political Signs.**

4 Candidates for public office or other persons having an interest in an
5 election may place political signs which advocate voting for or against
6 candidates, or other matters to be considered by the electorate, on
7 government property in accordance with the following provisions:

8 (a) **Definitions.**

9 (1) *Candidate* means a person seeking public office.

10 (2) *Government property* means any tangible or real
11 property held by the government of Guam.

12 (3) *Organization* means any political organization or
13 political action group advocating an issue in a special or general
14 election.

15 (4) *Political sign* means all billboards, posters,
16 banners or displays which advocate a candidate for political
17 office or any matter to be presented to the electorate for vote.

18 (5) *Utility pole* means any pole erected for street
19 lighting, power lines, and cable television lines.

20 (b) **Notice.** Notice *shall* be posted on the campaign sign that
21 the advertisement has been approved or authorized by the candidate
22 or, if the advertisement has *not* been authorized by the candidate the
23 name and mailing address of the individual(s) or organization that
24 paid for the advertisement.

25 (c) **Permit: Fee; Deposit.** Any candidate or organization
26 may apply for a permit to post campaign signs with the Department of
27 Public Works. The Director of Public Works is authorized to charge a

1 non-refundable permit fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and a
2 deposit of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), or as increased from time
3 to time by rules and regulations promulgated by the Director of Public
4 Works in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law.
5 Such rules and regulations *shall* provide for procedures governing
6 approval or rejection of permits, manner and location of posting,
7 maintenance of sign and surrounding area, procedures for notification,
8 removal of signs, forfeiture of deposit of any sign found in violation
9 of this Section, and any other rules or regulations necessary to ensure
10 the safety of the public.

11 (d) **Restrictions on Posting of Political Signs.**

12 (1) No political sign may be erected or posted upon
13 the shoulder of any roadway unless it is eight (8) feet from the
14 paved portion of the roadway and in such a manner that would
15 *not* impede traffic or a driver's visibility, or erected upon any
16 traffic median strip, sidewalk, road, or driveway.

17 (2) No political sign may be erected upon, on or
18 within any government building, or nailed to any tree or
19 attached to any fence on government property.

20 (3) No political sign may be erected or posted within
21 one hundred (100) feet of any entrance to a public school, or
22 upon any public school property, including school fences and
23 gates, *except* after 6:00 p.m. on the day before the election date.

24 (4) No political sign may be posted upon any utility
25 pole.

26 (5) No political signs may be posted upon any public
27 park within the jurisdiction of the Department of Parks and

1 Recreation, the Department of Public Works, or the village
2 Mayors.

3 (6) No political sign may be erected or posted within
4 one hundred (100) feet of any intersection.

5 (e) **Period for Posting of Political Signs.** Political signs
6 *shall not* be erected any earlier than ninety (90) days before any special
7 or primary election.

8 (f) **Size Restriction.** No political sign may exceed thirty-
9 two (32) square feet in gross sign surface area. Any sign which
10 exceeds thirty-two (32) square feet *shall* be removed immediately by
11 the Department of Public Works, and all sign materials and any deposit
12 made *shall* be automatically forfeited to the government of Guam.

13 (g) **Maintenance of Political Signs.** It *shall* be the
14 responsibility of every candidate or organization to maintain their sign
15 in a manner which does *not* impede the safety of the public, and which
16 complies with applicable rules and regulations as adopted by the
17 Department of Public Works. Failure of a candidate or any
18 organization to maintain campaign signs *shall* be grounds for forfeiture
19 of any deposit and all sign materials.

20 (h) **Removal of Signs.** Any sign in violation of any of the
21 provisions of Subsections (b), (d), (e), (f) or (g) *shall* be removed
22 within forty-eight (48) hours by the candidate or organization after
23 notification by the Department of Public Works *or* a Mayor of the
24 village in which the sign is located. A sign *not* removed within forty-
25 eight (48) hours of notification may be removed immediately by the
26 Department of Public Works *or* the village Mayor.

1 Failure to remove any political sign in violation of this Section *shall*
2 be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit. Every political sign *shall* be
3 removed *no later* than fifteen (15) calendar days after the conclusion of any
4 general or special election. Failure to remove any political sign within
5 fifteen (15) days after the conclusion of any general or special election *shall*
6 be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit.”

7 **Section 3. Severability.** *If* any provision of this law or its application to
8 any person *or* circumstance is found to be invalid *or* contrary to law, such
9 invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this law which can be
10 given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the
11 provisions of this law are severable.

II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

(a) Bill Sponsor Summary

Senator Vicente Pangelinan. The next bill on the agenda is Bill No. 203-31 (COR), As Introduced: “An Act to Amend §61542 of Chapter 61, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Campaign Signs”. The author of the bill, Senator Aline Yamashita is with us this morning and we would like to give her an opportunity to give us the intent behind the legislation.

Senator Aline Yamashita. Thank you very much, Speaker Ben. Very briefly, this is simply an effort to amend our current code addressing campaign signs. We all know, most certainly everyone up here knows (referring to Senators) what we do to try to get our message to the people in hopes of becoming one of their representatives.

I proffered this amendment in an effort to ensure that our roads and our walkways are safe. We invest in our campaign activity. It’s a part of Guam that is Guam. Already I see campaign signs up for the next election throughout the village of Agana Heights. This would simply... it doesn’t change anything, except the signs. I am asking for good dialogue conversation on restricting the size of campaign signs from one hundred ninety-two square feet to eight square feet. Actually, I would go smaller but my staff says we should start with this. This size is actually posted on the window that was on top of the coffee table that you have for our visitors (referring to table in the lobby of Legislature just outside the public hearing room).

It’s an effort that would save on resources, I believe. We spend a lot on plywood and on paint. But, my biggest reason for doing this is really safety. With the travel, traffic, it’s hard to see... we do comply because I believe Public Works does a good job in ensuring that we follow the rules. I think environmentally it will make it a little bit safer. But again the biggest thing is the safety issue.

Thank you very much Speaker Ben.

Senator Vicente Pangelinan. Thank you very much. For the record, we sent letters of invitation and notice of this public hearing to the Governor’s Office, G, DPW, Mayors Council, Chamber of Commerce, Guam Election Commission, Democrat Party Chair and Republican Party Chair to solicit their comments on the bill. They are not here this morning, but we will keep the record open to ensure that if they wish to make some contribution to the discussion on this bill, that we will include it in the committee report for review by all Senators.

Thank you very and *Si Yu’os Ma’ase*. Bill No. 203 has duly received its public hearing.



3 the erection of political signs during election season requires a massive amount of human

5 political signs do not impede public use of streets or endanger pedestrians, *I Liheslatura*

22 ~~hundred ninety two (192)~~ eight (8) square feet shall be removed immediately by the
23 Department of Public Works, and all sign materials and any deposit made shall be

1 automatically forfeited to the government of Guam.

2 ~~(f)~~ **(g) Maintenance of Political Signs.** It shall be the responsibility of every
3 candidate or organization to maintain their sign in a manner which does not impede the
4 safety of the public, and which complies with applicable rules and regulations as adopted
5 by the Department of Public Works. Failure of a candidate or any organization to
6 maintain campaign signs shall be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit and all sign
7 materials.

8 **(g)(h) Removal of Signs.** Any sign in violation of any of the provisions of
9 Subsections (b) (c), (d), (e), ~~or~~ (f) or (g) shall be removed within forty-eight (48) hours by
10 the candidate or organization after notification by the Department of Public Works or a
11 Mayor of the village in which the sign is located. A sign not removed within forty-eight
12 (48) hours of notification may be removed immediately by the Department of Public
13 Works or the village Mayor.

14 Failure to remove any political sign in violation of this Section shall be grounds
15 for forfeiture of any deposit. Every political sign shall be removed no later than fifteen
16 (15) calendar days after the conclusion of any general or special election. Failure to
17 remove any political sign within fifteen (15) days after the conclusion of any general or
18 special election shall be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit.”

19 **Section 3. Severability.** *If any provision of this law or its application to any*
20 *person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not*
21 *affect other provisions or applications of this law which can be given effect without the*
22 *invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this law are severable.*

**AN ACT TO AMEND § 61542 OF CHAPTER 61, TITLE 21, GUAM
CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CAMPAIGN SIGNS.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds that
3 the erection of political signs during election season requires a massive amount of human
4 and natural resources. In an effort to protect our natural resources and to ensure that
5 political signs do not impede public use of streets or endanger pedestrians, *I Liheslatura*
6 intends to adjust the regulations relative to allowable sizes of political signs.

7 **Section 2. § 61542, Chapter 61, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is hereby**
8 ***amended to read:***

9 **“§ 61542. Regulation of Political Signs.**

10 Candidates for public office or other persons having an interest in an election may
11 place political signs which advocate voting for or against candidates, or other matters to
12 be considered by the electorate, on government property in accordance with the following
13 provisions:

14 **(a) Definitions.**

15 (1) *Candidate* means a person seeking public office.

16 (2) *Government property* means any tangible or real property held by the

1 government of Guam.

2 (3) *Organization* means any political organization or political action group
3 advocating an issue in a special or general election.

4 (4) *Political sign* means all billboards, posters, banners or displays which
5 advocate a candidate for political office or any matter to be presented to the
6 electorate for vote.

7 (5) *Utility pole* means any pole erected for street lighting, power lines, and
8 cable television lines.

9 **(b) Notice.** Notice shall be posted on the campaign sign that the advertisement
10 has been approved or authorized by the candidate or, if the advertisement has not
11 been authorized by the candidate the name and mailing address of the
12 individual(s) who or organization that paid for the advertisement.

13
14 **(b) (c) Permit: Fee; Deposit.** Any candidate or organization may apply for a
15 permit to post campaign signs with the Department of Public Works. The Director of
16 Public Works is authorized to charge a non-refundable permit fee of One Hundred
17 Dollars (\$100.00) and a deposit of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), or as increased from
18 time to time by rules and regulations promulgated by the Director of Public Works in
19 accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law. Such rules and regulations shall
20 provide for procedures governing approval or rejection of permits, manner and location
21 of posting, maintenance of sign and surrounding area, procedures for notification,
22 removal of signs, forfeiture of deposit of any sign found in violation of this Section, and
23 any other rules or regulations necessary to ensure the safety of the public.

1 **~~(e)~~ (d) Restrictions on Posting of Political Signs.**

2 (1) No political sign may be erected or posted upon the shoulder of any
3 roadway unless it is eight (8) feet from the paved portion of the roadway and in
4 such a manner that would not impede traffic or a driver's visibility, or erected
5 upon any traffic median strip, sidewalk, road, or driveway

6 (2) No political sign may be erected upon, on or within any government
7 building, or nailed to any tree or attached to any fence on government property.

8 (3) No political sign may be erected or posted within one hundred (100)
9 feet of any entrance to a public school, or upon any public school property,
10 including school fences and gates, except after 6:00 p.m. on the day before the
11 election date.

12 (4) No political sign may be posted upon any utility pole.

13 (5) No political signs may be posted upon any public park within the
14 jurisdiction of the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Department of Public
15 Works, or the village Mayors.

16 (6) No political sign may be erected or posted within one hundred (100)
17 feet of any intersection.

18 **~~(d)~~ (e) Period for Posting of Political Signs.** Political signs shall not be erected
19 any earlier than ninety (90) days before any special or primary election.

20 **(e) (f) Size Restriction.** No political sign may exceed ~~one hundred ninety two~~
21 ~~(192)~~ eight (8) square feet in gross sign surface area. Any sign which exceeds ~~one~~
22 ~~hundred ninety two (192)~~ eight (8) square feet shall be removed immediately by the
23 Department of Public Works, and all sign materials and any deposit made shall be

1 automatically forfeited to the government of Guam.

2 ~~(f)~~ **(g) Maintenance of Political Signs.** It shall be the responsibility of every
3 candidate or organization to maintain their sign in a manner which does not impede the
4 safety of the public, and which complies with applicable rules and regulations as adopted
5 by the Department of Public Works. Failure of a candidate or any organization to
6 maintain campaign signs shall be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit and all sign
7 materials.

8 **(g)(h) Removal of Signs.** Any sign in violation of any of the provisions of
9 Subsections (b) (c), (d), (e), ~~or~~ (f) or (g) shall be removed within forty-eight (48) hours by
10 the candidate or organization after notification by the Department of Public Works or a
11 Mayor of the village in which the sign is located. A sign not removed within forty-eight
12 (48) hours of notification may be removed immediately by the Department of Public
13 Works or the village Mayor.

14 Failure to remove any political sign in violation of this Section shall be grounds
15 for forfeiture of any deposit. Every political sign shall be removed no later than fifteen
16 (15) calendar days after the conclusion of any general or special election. Failure to
17 remove any political sign within fifteen (15) days after the conclusion of any general or
18 special election shall be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit.”

19 **Section 3. Severability.** *If any provision of this law or its application to any*
20 *person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not*
21 *affect other provisions or applications of this law which can be given effect without the*
22 *invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this law are severable.*
