



1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Volunteers.** A new §77302 is *added* to Article 3, Chapter 77
3 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

4 “§ 77302. **Volunteers.** Pursuant to §3401.1(h) of Article 4,
5 Chapter 3 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, the Chief of Police is

1 authorized to recruit volunteers to assist the Guam Police Department in the
2 enforcement of the accessible parking and littering laws. In addition to these
3 duties, the Chief of Police *shall* authorize the use of volunteers to patrol the
4 school campuses of the Guam Department of Education during non-school
5 hours. The volunteers *shall* take no enforcement action during their patrol of
6 the school campuses, and *shall* notify the police of suspicious activity or
7 crimes in progress. The Superintendent of Education *shall* cooperate with
8 the Chief of Police to implement this Section.

9 The Chief of Police is further authorized to recruit volunteers to assist
10 the Guam Police Department with traffic direction, security, and crowd
11 control for events such as, but *not* limited to, the Guam *Ko'ko'* Road Race,
12 the Guam-Micronesia Island Fair, and the Liberation Day Parade.
13 Volunteers are required to obtain a certificate from the Chief of Police
14 demonstrating the completion of a required course of instruction and training
15 that includes training relative to traffic direction and crowd control.”

16 **Section 2. Funding.** The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to use funds
17 available in the Police Services Fund pursuant to Public Law 31-152 to cover
18 expenses relative to providing training and support for volunteers of the Guam
19 Police Department’s Community Assisted Policing Effort (CAPE) Program.

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 412-31 (COR) – “An act to add new §77302 to Title 10 Guam Code Annotated, relative to volunteers patrolling school campuses of the Guam Public School System during non-school hours.” – sponsored by Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement & Judiciary convened the public hearing on February 27, 2012 at 8:37 a.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of **Bill No. 412-31 (COR) – “An act to add new §77302 to Title 10 Guam Code Annotated, relative to volunteers patrolling school campuses of the Guam Public School System during non-school hours”** sponsored by Speaker Judith T. Won Pat.

Public Hearing Requirements:

Notices of the hearing were disseminated via facsimile and email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on February 15 and 20, 2012 (5-day Notice) and on February 24, 2012 (48-Hour notice), pursuant to meeting the requirements of the Open Government Law. Notice of the hearing was also posted on the Guam Legislature's website.

Phil Tydingco, Chief Deputy Attorney General, Office of the Attorney General, provided oral testimony on the Bill.
Maria Espinoza provided oral testimony in support of the Bill.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., convened the public hearing at 8:37 a.m., read the agenda, explained the procedures of the public hearing, and deferred to the author, Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, to provide an overview.

Speaker Won Pat said that the Bill would authorize the Chief of Police to assign volunteers to maintain the safety of the schools. She pointed to the use of civilian volunteers in Guam and in the United States. Speaker Won Pat said that they would be the eyes and ears of the police in the schools, to act as a deterrent. She said that members of both the CAPE and the CVPR could serve in this capacity.

Chairman Palacios called Mr. Tydingco to testify.

Chief Deputy Attorney General Phil Tydingco said that the Office of the Attorney General supports the intent to safeguard the property of the school system. He said that vandalism and burglarizing of schools is problematic. Mr. Tydingco said that the Police Reserves are more trained and may be better equipped to address the issue. He noted the non-enforcement provision. Mr. Tydingco said that the people who break into campuses are not necessarily violent. He said that the volunteers are intended to be proactive, to issue citations but not necessarily to confront the violator.

Speaker Won Pat asked whether the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserves should be included in the Bill, but Mr. Tydingco stated that the CVPR are more extensively trained and more able to enforce the law. Speaker Won Pat discussed the funding that is available to train and equip volunteers.

Maria Espinoza said that she lives near George Washington High School and there were a number of thefts in her neighborhood. She stated that a number of neighbors discussed how they would work together to ensure the safety of their neighborhood. Ms. Espinoza suggested a tax credit for volunteers. She said that they should be treated credibly by GPD. Ms. Espinoza related her experiences.

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios declared that Bill No. 412-31 (COR) had been duly heard. The Chairman concluded the hearing and requested that written testimony be submitted. Chairman Palacios adjourned the hearing at 10:20 a.m.

III. WRITTEN TESTIMONIES

Fred E. Bordallo, Jr., Chief of Police, Guam Police Department. *(Summaries follow.)*

Taling Taitano, Interim Superintendent of Education, Guam Department of Education. *(Summary follows.)*

Fred E. Bordallo, Jr., Chief of Police, Guam Police Department (January 26, 2012). Chief of Police Fred Bordallo stated that he and his command staff support the intent of the Bill. The Community Assisted Policing Effort (CAPE) and Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve (CVPR) Programs could both be available for the purpose intended in the Bill. *(See attached written testimony.)*

Fred E. Bordallo, Jr., Chief of Police, Guam Police Department (February 24, 2012). Chief Bordallo supports the Bill. *(See attached written testimony.)*

Taling Taitano, Interim Superintendent of Education, Guam Department of Education. Interim Superintendent Taitano supports the Bill, but noted concerns by school administrators with the Bill. Some school administrators expressed concern how volunteers would be screened and what credentials they would present prior to being allowed to patrol the campuses. She stated that a key could be provided to GPD, but school administrators are protective of limiting who has keys to campus gates and raised concerns regarding accountability of volunteers. *(See attached written testimony.)*

No further written testimony was received in the ten (10) days following the public hearing.

IV. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS


Dear Senator Palacios,

One of the main concerns expressed by school administrators is how the volunteers will be screened and what credentials they must present prior to being allowed to patrol the campuses.

The other concern voiced by the school administrators was in regard to access for the volunteers to patrol the campuses. While a key could be provided to the Guam Police Department, school administrators are very protective of limiting who has the keys to their campus gates. Further, what type of mechanism(s) will be put in place to monitor the volunteers while they patrol the campuses?



AN ACT TO ADD NEW §77302 TO TITLE 10 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO VOLUNTEERS PATROLLING SCHOOL CAMPUSES OF THE GUAM PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM DURING NON-SCHOOL HOURS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new §77302 is added to Title 10 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

§77302. Volunteers. Pursuant to section 3401.1 (h) of Title 16 Guam Code Annotated, the Chief of Police is authorized to recruit volunteers to assist the Guam Police Department in the enforcement of the accessible parking and littering laws. In addition to these duties, the Chief of Police shall authorize the use of volunteers to patrol the school campuses of the Guam Public School System during non-school hours. The volunteers shall take no enforcement action during their patrol of the school campuses and shall notify the police of suspicious activity or

- 1 crimes in progress. The Superintendent of Education shall cooperate with
