





**AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §66104.2 TO CHAPTER 66,
TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; AND TO
AMEND SECTION 5 OF CHAPTER XII OF PUBLIC
LAW 31-77, RELATIVE TO THE EMPLOYMENT OF
CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER POLICE RESERVE
OFFICERS.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve (CVPR) Officers have served as a useful
4 supplement to the full-time professional police force of the Guam Police

1 Department. Their service to the Department reduces the budgetary impact of the
2 force and helps to protect and serve the people of Guam.

3 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that Police Officers are public-spirited
4 and often serve their country in the military reserve programs or the Guam
5 National Guard. The activation and deployment of these military forces have an
6 impact on the performance of the Department where inadequate replacements are
7 available. For this reason, *I Liheslatura* regularly adopts provisions in the
8 government of Guam budgets to ensure that the needs of the Department are met
9 by the temporary employment of retired Guam Police Officers. Unfortunately,
10 there are occasionally insufficient interested retired Officers to fill all positions
11 which are temporarily vacated.

12 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that CVPR Officers must meet similar
13 qualifications as Police Officers, and are provided training which mirrors the
14 standards for Police Officers. Given the needs of the Department, this makes
15 CVPR Officers an ideal additional resource to draw upon when military activation
16 deprives the Department of full-time Police Officers.

17 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to allow Officers of the
18 Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve to be employed if a critical need arises because
19 of military activation of police officers or absence due to a long-term disability
20 status, by adding a new §66104.2 to Chapter 66 of Title 10 of the Guam Code
21 Annotated, and amending Section 5 of Chapter XII of Public Law 31-77.

22 **Section 2. Authorization for Full-Time CVPR Officers.** A new
23 §66104.2 is hereby *added* to Chapter 66, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

24 **“§ 66104.2. Authorization for Full-Time CVPR Officers.**

25 The Guam Police Department (GPD) *may* employ CVPR Officers on
26 a temporary, full-time basis, if such Officers are active members and have
27 attained at least two thousand eighty (2,080) cumulative service hours, if a

1 critical need arises because of military activation of police officers or
2 absence due to a long-term disability status which has been certified by a
3 medical doctor. The GPD *may* exercise this authority *provided* its
4 authorized budget for personnel is *not* exceeded. The CVPR Officer *shall*
5 return to volunteer status pursuant to this Chapter when the incumbent
6 returns from military service or long-term disability, or at the discretion of
7 the Chief of Police. CVPR Officers may *only* serve as equivalent of Police
8 Officer I and be compensated hourly *only* as a Police Officer I, Step I, and
9 *shall* be eligible to receive sick leave, and be eligible for the Government of
10 Guam Health Insurance Program, and *shall not* be eligible for a stipend as a
11 Reserve Officer for the duration of their temporary employment by the
12 Department.”

13 **Section 3. Funding for CVPR Officer Employment.** Section 5 of
14 Chapter XII of Public Law 31-77 is hereby *amended*, to read:

15 “**Section 5. Temporary Employment of Retired Guam Police**
16 **Officers and Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Officers.** The Guam
17 Police Department (GPD) may hire retired Guam Police Officers or employ
18 CVPR Officers, pursuant to Title 10 GCA §66104.2, if a critical need arises
19 because of military activation of police officers or absence due to a long-
20 term disability status which has been certified by a medical doctor. Retired
21 police officers hired under this Section may receive their retirement annuity
22 while employed under this temporary basis. The GPD may exercise this
23 hiring authority or employ CVPR Officers, pursuant to Title 10 GCA
24 §66104.2, *provided* its authorized budget for personnel is *not* exceeded. The
25 retiree hired *shall* fill such a vacant position and *shall* be terminated when
26 the incumbent returns from military service or long-term disability. Retired
27 officers may be hired *only* at the ranks of Sergeant I and below, *only* at Step

1 I, and *shall not* receive sick and annual leave. Officers hired under this
2 Section *shall* first meet the requirements for the position in question, *except*
3 for written examinations, and the Chief of Police of GPD *shall* certify that
4 every retiree hired is fit for duty. Notwithstanding §8121(a), Title 4, Guam
5 Code Annotated, retirees hired temporarily pursuant to this Section may
6 continue to receive retirement benefits. The GPD *may* pay for Civilian
7 Volunteer Police Reserve stipends to a police reserve officer to provide
8 temporary services in the absence of a regular police officer. Any employee
9 hired under this Section *shall* only be eligible to enroll in the Government of
10 Guam Health Insurance Program as an active employee.”

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 429-31 (COR) — “An act to *add* a new §66104.2 to Chapter 66, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated and to *amend* Section 5 of Chapter XII of Public Law 31-77, relative to the employment of Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Officers.” — sponsored by Senator Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement & Judiciary convened the public hearing on March 9, 2012 at 8:35 a.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of **Bill No. 429-31 (COR) — “An act to *add* a new §66104.2 to Chapter 66, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated and to *amend* Section 5 of Chapter XII of Public Law 31-77, relative to the employment of Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Officers”** sponsored by Senator Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr.

Public Hearing Requirements:

Notices of the hearing were disseminated via facsimile and email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on March 1, 2012 (5-day Notice) and on March 6, 2012 (48-Hour notice), pursuant to meeting the requirements of the Open Government Law. Notice of the hearing was also posted on the Guam Legislature’s website.

Fred Chargualaf, Major, Guam Police Department, provided oral testimony in support of the Bill.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES

Chairman Palacios convened the public hearing at 8:35 a.m. and read the agenda. The Chairman recognized the presence of Senator Aline A. Yamashita, Ph.D., Senator Mana Silva Taijeron and Senator V. Anthony Ada. Chairman Palacios explained the

procedures of the public hearing, invited Major Fred Chargualaf and Chief Deputy Attorney General Phil Tydingco to the panel.

Chairman Palacios said that the law currently allows the temporary employment of retired officers to fill in for deployed officers. The Chairman said that the Bill would allow a CVPR Officer to fill in when there is a vacancy created by a deployment or long-term medical issue. Chairman Palacios asked if CVPR Officers are allowed to patrol alone after completing 2080 hours alongside regular full-time officers. Major Fred Chargualaf said that they may patrol alone with only 490 hours. Chairman Palacios said that the Bill would allow a CVPR Officer to fill in on a full-time basis during such conditions.

Major Fred Chargualaf said that he had discussed the issue with Chief of Police Fred E. Bordallo, since Major Chargualaf serves in the National Guard. He said that if there was a full-time officer who is on deployment, this would allow a CVPR Officer to be hired on a limited term to fill the shortfall.

Chairman Palacios invited Chief Deputy Attorney General Phil Tydingco to begin his testimony.

Chief Deputy Attorney General Phil Tydingco said that the Office of the Attorney General supports efforts to maintain a full complement of officers with the Department. He said that page 3 lines 6-7, should probably include language about the compensation as Police Officer I, Step I. He said that there should be a look at the classification for DOA. Mr. Tydingco said that it might be good if they are not provided the benefits since they would not yet receive the full benefits of a Police Officer I. He said that it might be perceived as circumventing the police academy. He said that it might be made clear that it is an unclassified position. Major Chargualaf said that it is like they would be serving as a contract worker.

Chairman Palacios said that when the Reserve Officer is put on a full-time schedule, the officer should not be allowed to claim the stipend, since they are paid per hour. He said that it would not be considered fulfilling his time as a CVPR officer.

Senator Mana Silva Taijeron said that perhaps there should be consideration of taking on recruits for this.

Chairman Palacios said that this is similar to the amount of time required for a Police Officer I. He said that including recruits might be something that the Chief could consider. He said that this would enhance the incentive to increase the time in service for CVPR officers.

Senator Taijeron thanked Major Chargualaf for his service.

Senator V. Anthony Ada asked if CVPR Officers get hazardous pay. Major Chargualaf said that they are volunteers and get a stipend, but no hazardous pay. Mr. Tydingco said that they would be able to get hazardous pay and overtime.

Major Chargualaf said that they can be activated immediately, but Basic Law Enforcement Academy (BLEA) recruits would still need more training.

Chairman Palacios said that some CVPR officers are BLEA graduates. He said that CVPR Officers can eventually be hired as Police Officers.

Chairman Palacios declared that Bill No. 429-31 (COR) had been duly heard. The Chairman concluded the hearing and requested that written testimony be submitted. Chairman Palacios adjourned the hearing at 10:25 a.m.

III. WRITTEN TESTIMONIES

Fred E. Bordallo, Jr., Chief of Police, Guam Police Department. *(Summary follows.)*

Fred E. Bordallo, Jr., Chief of Police, Guam Police Department. Chief of Police Fred E. Bordallo, Jr., supports the Bill. Chief Bordallo said that the Bill provides an employment option which could address personnel shortages for the Guam Police Department. He stated that allowing CVPR Officers to serve temporarily for full-time limited term appointments generates an opportunity for increased levels of police presence for response and law enforcement services. *(See attached written testimony.)*

No further written testimony was received in the ten (10) days following the public hearing.

IV. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Bill 429-31 (COR) will allow hiring Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve (CVPR) Officers on temporary full-time basis when needed. Per GPD, currently, CVPRs receive a \$250 monthly stipend if 42 hours of work is completed. Although an employee on military leave status may not draw a salary during his/her absence, the Government of Guam is still required to pay life insurance and retirement benefits. Also, it is not determined if employees who are absent due to long term disability will also be receiving salary with possible leave/ leave sharing opportunities. GPD supports this bill with the utilization of the CVPRs to assist in providing the needed manpower, however, in its present form, the fiscal impact can not be determined at this time.



1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve (“CVPR”) Officers have served as a
4 useful supplement to the full-time professional police force in the Guam
5 Police Department. Their service to the Department reduces the budgetary
6 impact of the force and helps to protect and serve the people of Guam.

7 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that Police Officers are public-spirited
8 and often serve their country in the military reserve programs or the Guam
9 National Guard. The activation and deployment of these military forces have
10 an impact on the performance of the Department where inadequate
11 replacements are available. For this reason, *I Liheslatura* regularly adopts

1 provisions in the government of Guam budgets to ensure that the needs of the
2 Department are met by the temporary employment of retired Guam Police
3 Officers. Unfortunately, there are occasionally insufficient interested retired

18 **“§66104.2. Authorization for Full-Time CVPR Officers.**

19 The Guam Police Department (GPD) may employ CVPR Officers
20 on a temporary, full-time basis, if such Officers are active members and
21 have attained at least two thousand eighty (2,080) cumulative service
22 hours, if a critical need arises because of military activation of police

1 officers or absence due to a long-term disability status which has been
2 certified by a medical doctor. The GPD may exercise this authority
3 provided its authorized budget for personnel is not exceeded. The CVPR
4 Officer shall return to volunteer status pursuant to this Chapter when
5 the incumbent returns from military service or long-term disability, or at
6 the discretion of the Chief of Police. CVPR Officers may only serve as
7 equivalent of Police Officer I and be compensated hourly only at step I,
8 and shall not receive sick leave, annual leave or be eligible for the
9 Government of Guam Health Insurance Program unless otherwise
10 eligible.”

11 **Section 3. Funding for CVPR Officer Employment.** Section 5 of
12 Chapter XII of Public Law 31-77 is hereby amended, to read:

13 **“Section 5. Temporary Employment of Retired Guam Police Officers**
14 **and Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Officers.** The Guam Police
15 Department (GPD) may hire retired Guam Police Officers or employ
16 CVPR Officers, pursuant to 10 GCA §66104.2, if a critical need arises
17 because of military activation of police officers or absence due to a long-
18 term disability status which has been certified by a medical doctor.
19 Retired police officers hired under this Section may receive their
20 retirement annuity while employed under this temporary basis. The
21 GPD may exercise this hiring authority or employ CVPR Officers,
22 pursuant to 10 GCA §66104.2, provided its authorized budget for

1 personnel is *not* exceeded. The retiree hired *shall* fill such a vacant
2 position and *shall* be terminated when the incumbent returns from
3 military service or long-term disability. Retired officers may be hired
4 *only* at the ranks of Sergeant I and below, *only* at Step I, and *shall not*
5 receive sick and annual leave. Officers hired under this Section *shall*
6 first meet the requirements for the position in question, *except* for
7 written examinations, and the Chief of Police of GPD *shall* certify that
8 every retiree hired is fit for duty. Notwithstanding §8121(a), Title 4,
9 Guam Code Annotated, retirees hired temporarily pursuant to this
10 Section may continue to receive retirement benefits. The GPD *may* pay
11 for Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve stipends to a police reserve officer
12 to provide temporary services in the absence of a regular police officer.
13 Any employee hired under this Section *shall* only be eligible to enroll in
14 the Government of Guam Health Insurance Program as an active
15 employee.”

16 **Section 3. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
