BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. §1103.1 of Chapter 1, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended*
to read:

“§ 1103.1. Vehicles Leased by the Government of Guam.

1 Except as exempted by § 1103, Chapter 1, Title 4 GCA, vehicles leased
2 by the government of Guam *shall* be clearly identified by either (a) a removable
3 decal or sticker identifying the agency/department to which the vehicle is
4 leased, or (b) by a removable decal or sticker stating that the vehicle is leased
5 by the government of Guam; and *shall* be also identified by the attachment of a
6 government of Guam license plate, notwithstanding § 7120 of Title 16, GCA.
7 The decal or sticker *shall* be placed in the lower left corner of the rear window
8 of the leased vehicle.

9 In addition to those vehicles exempted in § 1103 of Title 4 of the Guam
10 Code Annotated, the following vehicles *shall* also be exempted from the
11 provisions of this Section:

12 (a) vehicles transferring Justices or Judges of the Supreme or
13 Superior Courts of Guam;

14 (b) vehicles used for security or undercover purposes by
15 instrumentalities of the government of Guam involved in law
16 enforcement activities;

17 (c) vehicles transferring the Lieutenant Governor of Guam; and

18 (d) vehicles, *except* para-transit and emergency transport vehicles,
19 transferring clients of the Department of Youth Affairs, the Department
20 of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, and the Child Protective Services
21 Division of the Department of Public Health and Social Services.”

22 **Section 2.** §1103.3 of Chapter 1, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended*
23 to read:

24 **“§ 1103.3. Identification of Agency or Department.**

25 All vehicles leased or owned by the government of Guam *shall* display a
26 distinguishing word, letter and symbol indicating to which agency or

1 department the vehicle is assigned. If the vehicle is part of a government-wide
2 motor pool, the identification *shall* reflect the department or agency operating
3 the motor pool, and that the vehicle is part of the motor pool. This logo *shall*
4 include the proper name of the agency or department and *shall* be affixed to the
5 sides of the driver and passenger doors in a fashion that makes it easily visible.
6 The letterings on the signs *shall be no less than* two (2) inches in height. If an
7 agency or department does not have a logo, the full proper name of the agency
8 in letters will meet the requirements of this provision.

9 The only vehicles exempt from this provision are those listed in §1103
10 and §1103.1(a), (b), (c) and (d) of this Chapter.”

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 322-31 (COR) – “An act to amend §§1103.1 and 1103.3 of Chapter 1 of 4GCA relative to exempting certain government vehicles from logo requirements.” – sponsored by Senator V. Anthony Ada

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement and Judiciary convened the public hearing on October 12, 2011 at 1:30 p.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 322-31 (COR) - “An act to amend §§1103.1 and 1103.3 of Chapter 1 of 4GCA relative to exempting certain government vehicles from logo requirements,” sponsored by Senator V. Anthony Ada.

Public Hearing Requirements:

Notices of the hearing were disseminated via facsimile and email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on October 5, 2011 (5-day Notice) and on October 10, 2011 (48-Hour notice) pursuant to meeting the requirements of the Open Government Law. Notice of the hearing was also posted on the Guam Legislature’s website.

James W. Gillan, Director, Department of Public Health and Social Services, provided written testimony in support of the Bill.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., convened the public hearing at 1:30 p.m., read the agenda, recognized the Senators present, explained the procedures of the hearing,

called Director Adonis Mendiola to the panel to testify and deferred to Senator V. Anthony Ada to provide an overview of the Bill.

Senator V. Anthony Ada said that there are cases when vehicles are used to convey clients and exemption would refrain from labeling those clients that are transported by a government agency.

Director Adonis Mendiola thanked Senator Ada for offering the Bill. Director Mendiola read his prepared written testimony. He said that the staff and management of the Department of Youth Affairs feel that the exemption is appropriate to avoid a social stigma. Mr. Mendiola said that giving the children anonymity during intensive treatment and rehabilitative phase, despite their status as offenders, will avoid grief for the children, help with the reintegration and transition at their lives at school, with their peers, and at home. He said that the Bill would additionally avoid costs for the removal of decals from leased vehicles.

Administrator Annie Unpingco read her prepared written testimony. She stated that the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse supports the Bill. She said that the families, especially the young people are embarrassed to be identified as having any association with the mental health agency. She noted that they would not respond to the worker driving the DMHSA government vehicle. She stated that she wholeheartedly supports this Bill and that mental health services are very sensitive and requires a confidential relationship between the Department and its clients. (*See attached written testimony.*)

Senator Ada thanked Director Mendiola and Ms. Unpingco for their testimony. He said that the confidentiality of such clients is very important.

Senator Aline A. Yamashita, Ph.D., stated that there is much to do to address the needs of persons with challenges and each step matters.

Chairman Palacios read the written testimony of Director James W. Gillan. Mr. Gillan noted in his written testimony that he is in favor of the Bill. He asked that some changes be made. He believes that vehicles transferring clients or those that are on certain enforcement activities should remain as anonymous as possible. He asked to include any leased vehicle used by the Division of Environmental Health in the proposed exemption. Mr. Gillan said that inspectors are involved in investigations of misuse and improper labeling of controlled substances. He also asked to exempt vehicles by the Division of Public Welfare when they are used for fraud and abuse investigations. Lastly, he asked to not require leased vehicles to have any government identifier such as government plates, and noted that a listing of leased vehicles and their commercial plates could be provided annually to any oversight agency. (*See attached written testimony.*)

The Chairman stated that there is a reason for labeling vehicles, which is to curtail abuse of public vehicles for personal purposes. He agrees that certain vehicles need to be exempted and he feels that there should be internal policies to determine which vehicles are exempt from logo requirements. He stated that the Bill should probably be amended to ensure that there is an established policy to designate which vehicles are exempted from the logo requirement.

Director Mendiola stated that DYA currently uses removable magnetic logo plates.

Administrator Unpingco stated that they have tried using the magnetic logos, but it was indicated that such use is illegal because of the logo requirements. She stated that they would want to use such logos so that confidentiality could be maintained where it is appropriate.

Chairman Palacios reiterated his interest in amending the Bill to allow for the establishment of policies and procedures.

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., concluded the public hearing at 1:50 p.m.

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., declared that Bill 322-31 (COR) has been duly heard and that the Committee would continue to receive written testimony following the hearing. The hearing was adjourned at 1:50 p.m.

Buenas yan Saluda! On behalf of the Department of Youth Affairs (DYA), this written testimony is hereby submitted in support of Bill No. 322-31

Exemptions given to the Department of Youth Affairs from having or indentifying its leased or owned vehicles with permanent logos will greatly help to avoid stigmatism while ensuring client confidentiality during transport. As a part of DYA's After School Program and day to day routines clients and/or children being transported in DYA's vehicles are too easily identified as being under the care and custody of our rehabilitative programs. Giving the child(ren) anonymity especially during the intensive treatment and rehabilitative phase, despite their status as offenders, will avoid grief for the children and help with reintegration and transition in their lives at school, with their peers and at home.

Bill No. 322-31 would further avoid the costs to remove and/or pay for damages / repairs that may occur during the removal of the decals/stickers made necessary upon the expiration of leased vehicles as per contractual agreements.

The Child, Adolescent Services Division and I Famagu'on-ta Program work with our children, youth and their families with mental health challenges. This in itself is a very sensitive and highly confidential type of relationship which requires the utmost respect and privacy. Our families, and especially our young people are embarrassed to be identified as having any association with our mental health agency. Literally, the young people will hide inside the government vehicle, embarrassed to be seen as riding a DMHSA government vehicle. They also will not respond to the worker driving the DMHSA government vehicle when the worker arrives at their home for a home visit, or to transport them to an activity or to a related function. The individual/family will not respond to the worker knocking on their door, especially when neighbors are outside looking and waiting to see what happens.

An identified DMHSA government vehicle visiting the homes of the family whom we serve violates the confidentiality of the client, and this may also be a violation of HIPAA. The privacy of our clients is critical in them feeling respected, safe, and thus comfortable in receiving mental health services. Riding a vehicle identified as simply a government vehicle is not embarrassing or humiliating as a government vehicle identified as DMHSA. I therefore, wholeheartedly support this Bill as it is sensitive to the needs of human beings to be respected and given the privacy that we all deserve.

Thank you for sponsoring this important Bill. It would help in improving the services for our people and our community and it would also reduce the stigma to receiving mental health services.

My name is James W. Gillan; I am the Director of the Department of Public Health and Social Services. I am here to testify in favor of the above referenced bill.

I would ask that some changes be made. I believe that vehicles transferring clients or those that are on certain enforcement activities should remain as anonymous as possible. For that reason I would ask you to include any leased vehicle used by the Division of Environmental Health in your proposed exemption. The inspectors are involved in investigations of serious complaints regarding eating and drinking establishments as well as investigations of misuse and improper labeling of controlled substances. I would also ask you to exempt vehicles used by the Division of Public Welfare when they are used for fraud and abuse investigations.

And last, would ask you to not require leased vehicles to have any Government identifier such as Government plates. A listing of leased vehicles and their commercial plates could be provided annually to any oversight agency

3 **Section 1.** Section 1103.1 of 4GCA is *amended* to read:

5 **§1103.1. Vehicles Leased by the Government of Guam.**

6 Except as exempted by § 1103, Chapter 1, Title 4 GCA, vehicles leased by
7 the government of Guam shall be clearly identified by either (a) a removable decal
8 or sticker identifying the agency/department to which the vehicle is leased or (b)
9 by a removable decal or sticker stating that the vehicle is leased by the government
10 of Guam; and shall be also identified by the attachment of a government of Guam
11 license plate, notwithstanding §7120 of Title 16, GCA. The decal or sticker shall
12 be placed in the lower left corner of the rear window of the leased vehicle.

13 In addition to those vehicles exempted in § 1103 of Title 4 of the Guam
14 Code Annotated, the following vehicles shall also be exempted from the provisions

16 (a) vehicles transferring Justices or Judges of the Supreme or Superior

15 the vehicle is assigned. If the vehicle is part of a governmentwide motor pool, the
16 identification shall reflect the department or agency operating the motor pool, and
17 that the vehicle is part of the motor pool. This logo shall include the proper name
18 of the agency or department and shall be affixed to the sides of the driver and
19 passenger doors in a fashion that makes it easily visible. The letterings on the
20 signs shall be no less than two (2) inches in height. If an agency or department
21 does not have a logo, the full proper name of the agency in letters will meet the
