



AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE GUAM ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (GEPA) FOR ACTIONS ARISING FROM THE ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES OF CHAPTER 76 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that support for the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) is crucial in
4 this period of our island's history. Due to activities related to the expansion of the
5 military's footprint, GEPA's role in protecting the island's environmental

1 resources is pivotal to ensuring a sustainable quality of life for the island's
2 residents and visitors.

3 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* therefore intends that funds be provided to GEPA,
4 where available, to ensure that compliance and enforcement activities are carried
5 out, and that the department's missions are satisfactorily executed.

6 **Section 2. Appropriation.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* hereby appropriates
7 the sum of One Hundred Four Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$104,400) to the
8 Guam Environmental Protection Agency for the purpose of funding actions arising
9 from the enforcement activities of Chapter 76 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated.
10 The aforementioned funds *shall* be appropriated from the unreserved fund balance
11 of the UST-LUST Fund. Funds appropriated in this Section may be expended for
12 employee training in the regulations of UST, administration, the purchase of
13 equipment and supplies, and the personnel cost arising from the enforcement
14 activities of Chapter 76 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated. The funds
15 appropriated herein *shall* be available for expenditure by the Guam Environmental
16 Protection Agency for Fiscal Year 2011. The GEPA *shall* submit a report to the
17 Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the Guam Legislature) on the expenditures
18 authorized herein.

19 **Section 3.** §58B106 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended*
20 to read as follows:

21 **“§58B106. Pledge of Section 30 Revenues.** Rental payments under
22 the Lease and the Lease-Back *shall* be secured by a pledge or other
23 reservation of revenues received by or on behalf of the government of Guam
24 from the United States of America pursuant to Section 30 of the Guam
25 Organic Act (48 U.S.C.A. Section 1421h). Any pledge or reservation of
26 Section 30 revenues authorized by the Act *shall* be subordinate *only* to the

1 existing lien securing the Government of Guam Limited Obligation (Section
2 30) Bonds, Series 2001A. Any such pledge or reservation authorized
3 hereunder *shall* be valid and binding from the time the pledge or reservation
4 is made and *shall* be *limited* to Two Million Nine Hundred Thousand
5 Dollars (\$2,900,000) per year during the Lease-Back Period, as prescribed
6 in Section 3 of Public Law 30-178. The Section 30 revenues pledged or
7 reserved and thereafter received by the government of Guam *or* by any
8 trustee, depository or custodian *shall* be deposited in a separate account and
9 *shall* be immediately subject to such reservation or the lien of such pledge
10 without any physical delivery thereof *or* further act, and such reservation *or*
11 the lien of such pledge *shall* be valid and binding against all parties having
12 claims of any kind in tort, contract *or* otherwise against the government of
13 Guam or such trustee, depository *or* custodian, irrespective of whether the
14 parties have notice thereof. The instrument by which such pledge *or*
15 reservation is created need *not* be recorded. The remainder of the funds
16 from the existing lien, *supra*, not utilized for this project *shall* be subject to
17 legislative appropriation.”

18 **Section 4. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its application to
19 any person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such
20 invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can
21 be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the
22 provisions of this Law are severable.

PANEL COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: Mr. Quinata, the inspections that are conducted. Are there set times for these inspections for these tanks?

Ivan Quinata: Yes there are and I will let Vince respond to that.

Vincent J. Perrera: On our grants we are required to do at least 60 inspections per year with those grants from USEPA to provide some funding currently.

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: The money will be used wisely?

Ivan Quinata: Of course I am Mr. Chairman.

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: Ok I have no further questions. Senator Mabini?

Senator Sam Mabini: Thank you Mr. Quinata. You had mentioned that you wanted to give us the status of the funding? Do have a dollar amount?

Vincent J. Perrera: The dollar amount currently showing on the appropriations \$104,400.00.

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: Senator Ada?

PANEL COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Senator V. A. Ada: What is the anticipated cost to enforce the USDA regulations?

1. Vincent J. Perrera – Program Manager, GEPA

Vincent J. Perrera: What we are doing now with each program and facility that we have and what we do is conduct inspections on those facilities. Once the regulation is passed there's some matrix's, like enforcement matrix's that we have to fill out citations and charge them for any violations they have. In addition to that any violation could come up to \$11,000.00 per violation per day and serve jail time.

Senator V. A. Ada: What is the anticipated cost to the agency to enforce the regulations

Vincent J. Perrera: It's probably the personnel fee to do the inspection, equipments to do it, supplies. I have a list of the budget that we submitted.

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: We asked them to submit the list...

Vincent J. Perrera: We can provide that draft budget to you to foresee what we anticipate is \$104,400.00. We can provide that now.

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: Yes, copies can be made. That would be the use of this money. The current budget for the division for the program itself.

Vincent J. Perrera: What we have is grants that are being given to us by USEPA and from that we get salaries, equipment and so forth.

Conchita S. N. Taitano: We anticipate roughly about \$350,000.00.

Senator V. A. Ada: Thank you Mr. Chairman.

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: Thank you very much. There being no other questions. Any last comments?

Vincent J. Perrera: I just appreciate you sponsoring the bill to appropriate funds.

**Testimony of
Ivan C. Quinata

Buenas yan Hafa Adai! My name is Ivan C. Quinata, Acting Administrator of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (Guam EPA). Mr. Chairman, thank you for introducing Bill Number 73-31(COR), an *Act* to appropriate funds from the UST-LUST Fund to manage the program, and being given the opportunity to provide my testimony

The regulation of underground storage tanks (USTs) is important in protecting our natural and fragile island environment from releases of petroleum products. Since December 1998, the United States Environmental Protection mandated States and Territories to develop and implement an underground storage tank program that would require facilities to upgrade their underground tanks to prevent spills, overfilling and corrosion. There are approximately 260 USTs and 134 individual facilities (local and federal governments and commercial and private businesses) throughout the island.

In response, Public Law 30-36 was enacted, which provided the necessary authorities for Guam EPA to develop its UST Program. As part of Public Law 30-36, an interim annual permit tank fee (\$250/tank) was authorized to be collected by Guam EPA and deposited into the UST-LUST Fund.

To date, fees have been collected since January 2010. However, the appropriation of these funds was not included in the 2011 Budget Law. Therefore, Guam EPA respectfully requests that the fees deposited in UST-LUST Fund be appropriated in its entirety to this Agency. These funds are necessary in implementing the requirements mandated by Public Law 30-36 and fulfilling the intended purpose of this fee as described in the aforementioned Law. Your favorable consideration to this request is greatly needed and appreciated.

I would also like to take this opportunity to give this Committee the status of the upcoming UST Regulations, which were developed in partnership with USEPA, Region IX. In addition, as part of this Agency's longstanding community engagement and involvement initiatives, multiple stakeholder meetings were held to obtain input from the public. Moreover, Guam EPA conducted a public comment period that extended to a period over 2 months to ensure maximum participation. Guam EPA transmitted the *draft* UST Regulations to the Office of the Governor, this Agency's Oversight Chairman, Senator Rory Respicio, the Office of the Attorney General of Guam, the Legislative Secretary and Senator Tom Ada. This Agency anticipates the promulgation of the UST Regulations by June 2011.

Thank you again for this opportunity to provide my Testimony on Bill 73-31 (COR).

Philippines marks 25 years since 'People Power'



MANILA (AP) — Philippine President Benigno Aquino III said Friday that the struggle for good governance and the fight against the corruption that characterized the brutal regime of Ferdinand Marcos continues 25 years after the late dictator's ouster in the "People Power" revolution. In a speech to mark the four-day revolt in 1986 that restored democracy and ended Marcos' 20-year regime, Aquino recalled that Marcos ruled with an iron fist as he enriched his family and associates amid the nation's poverty. Marcos died in exile in Hawaii three years after his ouster. Poverty, corruption and insurgency are still major problems in the Philippines.

raided government coffers," he said. "With good governance to fight corruption, we can free our people from poverty."

Arroyo held power for nine years, surviving several coup attempts by disgruntled military officers and impeachment bids by the opposition, who accused her of corruption, election fraud and human rights abuses. She has denied the charges.

Aquino is the son of the country's two democracy icons. His mother, Corazon Aquino, claimed victory against Marcos in the fraud-marred elections two weeks before the revolt, and was installed as his successor. His father and Marcos' archrival, former Senator Benigno "Ninoy" Aquino, was assassinated by soldiers in 1983.

Aquino has resumed peace talks with communist insurgents and Muslim separatist rebels to end more than four decades of armed conflict that has also stunted the country's economic growth.

Aquino said the revolt raised hopes that democracy would also bring prosperity and a government that would safeguard the people's money, but said that did not happen in the decade under his predecessor, Gloria Macapagal Arroyo.

"There were some who betrayed the public trust and

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

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE GUAM
ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (GEPA) FOR
ACTIONS ARISING FROM THE ENFORCEMENT OF 10 GCA
CHAPTER 76

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

1 **SECTION 1. Legislative Statement and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds
2 that support for the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) is crucial in this
3 period of our island's history. Due to activities related to the expansion of the military's
4 footprint, GEPA's role in protecting the island's environmental resources is pivotal to
5 ensuring a sustainable quality of life for the island's residents and visitors.

6 *I Liheslaturan Guahan* further finds that funds shall be provided to GEPA, where
7 available, to ensuring compliance and enforcement activities to assure that the
8 department's mission are satisfactorily executed.

9 **SECTION 2. Appropriation.** *I Liheslaturan Guahan* hereby appropriates
10 \$104,400.00 (One Hundred and Four Thousand Four Hundred Dollars) to the Guam
11 Environmental Protection Agency for the purpose of funding actions arising from
12 enforcement activities in 10 GCA Chapter 76. The aforementioned funds shall be
13 appropriated from the unreserved fund balance of the UST-LUST fund. Funds
14 appropriated in this section may be expended for employee training in the regulations of
15 UST, administration, purchase of equipment, supplies, and personnel cost arising from
16 enforcement of 10 GCA Chapter 76. The funds appropriated herein shall be available for
17 expenditure by the Guam Environmental Protection Agency for Fiscal Year 2011. The

1 GEPA shall submit a report to the Guam Legislature via the Speaker on the expenditures
2 authorized herein.

3 **SECTION 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Law or its application to any
4 person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not
5 affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the
6 invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
