I. OVERVIEW

BILL NO. 123-31 (LS) – “AN ACT TO AMEND 22 GCA § 7118; RELATIVE TO REQUIRING EMPLOYERS TO OBTAIN EXIT CLEARANCES FROM THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY FOR NON-IMMIGRANT TEMPORARY WORKERS” was introduced by Vice Speaker Benjamin JF Cruz on March 24, 2011; and was subsequently referred to the Committee on Rules; Federal, Foreign & Micronesian Affairs; and Human and Natural Resources on March 25, 2011.

Senator Rory J. Respicio, Chairperson of the Committee on Rules; Federal, Foreign & Micronesian Affairs; and Human and Natural Resources convened a public hearing on Bill 123 on Tuesday, May 24, 2011 at 9:00 A.M. in the Legislature’s Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on the measure.

Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on May 17, 2011 (5-Day Notice), and again on May 20, 2011 (48- Hour Notice), thereby meeting the noticing requirements of the Open Government Law. Invitation letters were also sent to the appointing authority and to the nominee.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Senator Respicio called the hearing to order and read the title of Bill 123-31 for the record. He mentioned that his office received a call from an interested individual who will be submitting written testimony*; and also mentioned that the Committee received favorable testimony by former Senator Matt Rector in his capacity as the president of the Guam Federation of Teachers.

There being no individuals present to provide oral testimony, **Senator Respicio** concluded the hearing and declared Bill 123 publicly heard.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. 22 GCA § 7118 is hereby *amended* to read:

**“§ 7118. Mandatory Registration of Non-Immigrant Temporary
Worker.**

It is unlawful for a non-immigrant temporary worker to report to work prior to obtaining a work permit identification card duly signed by the Director of Labor and sealed by his office. The work permit identification card constitutes a work permit and shall be renewed upon approval of importation, transfer or extension of non-immigrant temporary workers contract.

(a) Work permit identification cards must be carried at all times by the non-immigrant temporary worker and conspicuously displayed during working hours at his place of work. Failure to do so constitutes violation of this Section.

1 (b) The mandatory requirements for work registration and
2 identification cards are applicable to the importation, transfer and
3 extension of non-immigrant temporary workers.

4 (c) Each non-immigrant temporary worker is required to report
5 to the Guam Department of Labor prior to repatriation to point of hire.

6 ~~(d) Employers or their agents shall not purchase repatriation
7 transportation of a non-immigrant temporary worker without
8 obtaining exit clearance from the Guam Department of labor.~~

9 (d) Employers or their agents shall not purchase or procure
10 repatriation transportation of a non-immigrant temporary worker

Testimony on Bill 123

Buenas Yan Hafa Adai!!!

My name is Matt Rector, President of GFT, Guam's Local Union and I am here to testify in favor of Bill 123 and offer some suggestions to make it self-enforcing. Currently only about a fourth of the people that go to GMH pay their bills. This puts a huge strain not just on our hospitals ability to function and give our families the quality of healthcare that we desperately need and deserve but on our entire public structure, including education as well.

It's no secret to anyone in this room or on our island that our public school system, fire and police department and every other Public Agency struggle, due to lack of funding, to give our people the quality of services that we need. That is why it is critical that we start closing the loop holes that allow some businesses to not pay their fair share and this bill is a great start toward doing that. If a company brings a temporary foreign worker to our fair island, they need to be responsible for their care and up keep. The people of Guam should not have to subsidize their profits by paying for their employees medical bills. We struggle enough as it is paying for our own people's healthcare needs. That is why I stand in favor of this bill.

Unfortunately, if this passes I fear that this will be just another law that our public agencies don't have the resources to enforce. Therefore, I have the following suggestions that I believe will make this law self enforcing. I suggest that we add the following amendments to the bill:

§ 7118.1. Temporary Labor Certification for Non-immigrant Workers;

Restrictions; Penalties.

(a) The Director of Labor, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, shall promulgate rules and regulations to establish operating guidelines for the certification and employment of non-immigrant alien temporary workers in Guam (the Rules). Such Rules shall establish the conditions under which such workers may be temporarily employed and COL 012610 housed in Guam because of a need for their skills which are not readily available in Guam. The Rules shall be periodically reviewed by the Department of Labor (the Department), at least once every two (2) years, and shall include the following:

(i) A temporary labor certification issued by the Department shall be limited to one (1) employer and only to those projects approved by the Department, shall be non-transferable, and shall be valid only for the specific activity designated in the certificate and only for the occupation specified for each temporary worker covered by the certificate.

(ii) Civil penalties for violations of the Rules by an employer or by a temporary worker, ~~not to exceed a fine of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) per person for each such violation.~~ Shall be:

- 1) \$100 fine to the non-immigrant temporary worker and a \$1,000 fine to the Employer of the non-immigrant temporary worker for the first offense.

- 2) \$200 fine to the non-immigrant temporary worker and a \$2,000 fine to the Employer of the non-immigrant temporary worker for the second offense.
- 3) \$500 fine to the non-immigrant temporary worker and a \$5,000 fine to the Employer of the non-immigrant temporary worker for the third offense.

(b) Any employer who is a persistent violator of the Rules is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be imprisoned for not less than one (1) but not more than six (6) months ~~or~~ and shall pay a fine of not less than five thousand Dollars (\$5,000) but not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), ~~or shall suffer both such imprisonment and fine.~~

(c) Persistent violator means an employer who commits, with criminal negligence as defined in 9 GCA § 4.30, a second violation of the Rules and who has been cited and fined for a previous violation within any twelve (12) month period immediately preceding the second violation.

(d) Any employer with a temporary labor certification found guilty of intentionally or knowingly violating 44017 of this Chapter, or of the Rules, in addition to any sanctions imposed under such § 7118 and § 7118.1, ~~may~~ shall have his temporary labor certification suspended and be barred from any temporary labor certification program for a period not of not less than one (1) year but not to exceeding three (3) years.

(e) Ten percent of the Fines collected by the Department under the provisions of this section as a result of a crimestoppers tip shall be paid directly to the active citizen that placed the tip, the remainder shall be deposited in the Manpower Development Fund to be employed exclusively for the surveillance and enforcement operations within the Alien Labor and Processing Certification Division and other divisions at the Department of Labor with similar tasks. The Director of Labor shall complete an annual report of all expenditures and activities under this subsection to the Legislature.

Thank you so much for your consideration and your diligence of trying to address this very real issue for our island.



BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. 22 GCA § 7118 is hereby *amended* to read:

**“§ 7118. Mandatory Registration of Non-Immigrant Temporary
Worker.**

It is unlawful for a non-immigrant temporary worker to report to work prior to obtaining a work permit identification card duly signed by the Director of Labor and sealed by his office. The work permit identification card constitutes a work permit and shall be renewed upon approval of importation, transfer or extension of non-immigrant temporary workers contract.

(a) Work permit identification cards must be carried at all times by the non-immigrant temporary worker and conspicuously displayed during working hours at his place of work. Failure to do so constitutes violation of this Section.

1 (b) The mandatory requirements for work registration and
2 identification cards are applicable to the importation, transfer and
3 extension of non-immigrant temporary workers.

4 (c) Each non-immigrant temporary worker is required to report
5 to the Guam Department of Labor prior to repatriation to point of hire.

6 ~~(d) Employers or their agents shall not purchase repatriation
7 transportation of a non-immigrant temporary worker without
8 obtaining exit clearance from the Guam Department of labor.~~

9 (d) Employers or their agents shall not purchase or procure
10 repatriation transportation of a non-immigrant temporary worker

13 (e) Actual departures shall be made within thirty (30) days from
