



9 promulgated by Executive Order 95-29, *shall not* be applicable or available
10 to any employee who:

11 (1) is the subject of an investigation involving drug use;

12 (2) is the subject of an investigation that could result in an
13 adverse action;

14 (3) is required to submit to a drug test for immediate
15 employment or possible promotion;

16 (4) was involved in an incident that may require or warrant a
17 drug test;

18 (5) has been found to be in violation of a rule or regulation
19 of the government of Guam; *or*

20 (6) has been arrested for a drug-related offense.”

Bill No. 172-31 (COR) – “An act to amend §75107 of Chapter 75 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to Safe Harbor exemption and restrictions.” – sponsored by Senator Frank F. Blas, Jr.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement and Judiciary convened the public hearing on May 27, 2011 at 9:04 a.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 172-31 (COR) – “An act to amend §75107 of Chapter 75 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to Safe Harbor exemption and restrictions,” sponsored by Senator Frank F. Blas, Jr.

Public Hearing Requirements

Notices of the hearing were disseminated via facsimile and email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on May 20, 2011 (5-day Notice) and on May 24, 2011 (48-Hour notice), pursuant to meeting the requirements of the Open Government Law. Notice of the hearing was also posted on the Guam Legislature's website.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr. convened the public hearing for the Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement and Judiciary at **9:04 a.m.**, read the agenda, recognized the senators in attendance, read the title of the bill, read the testimony of Captain Andy Arceo and invited Senator Frank F. Blas, Jr., to provide an overview of the Bill. Captain

Arceo wrote that the Guam Fire Department supports the bill. The Department should hold its employees to a higher standard to assure the people of their safety.

Senator Frank Blas stated that during the session, he felt that the program should be clarified by preventing the abuse of the program by applying the program when it is not appropriate.

Chairman Palacios stated that he believes this bill would strengthen the no tolerance bill for test designated positions. He stated that employees should not be able to circumvent the Drug Free Workplace Program. The Chairman asked the Senators present if they wanted to provide comments.

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., declared that Bill No. 172-31(COR) is duly heard. The Chairman concluded the hearing and requested that written testimony be submitted within the next ten (10) days. He adjourned the hearing at **1:32 p.m.**

Dear Senator Blas:

Buenas yan Hafa Adai. I am submitting this written testimony in regard to Bill 172-31, an act to amend §75107 of Chapter 75 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to Safe Harbor exemption and restrictions.

Executive Order 95-29 adopted and promulgated the Department of Administrations Drug Free Workplace Program Operating Procedures in order to achieve a drug free workplace while protecting the privacy of government employees. The executive order also necessitates that "government employees who use illegal drugs must themselves be primarily responsible for changing their behavior and, if necessary, begin the process of rehabilitating themselves" (para 9). We can surmise that if a government employee is in any of the conditions set forth in items (1) through (6) of the proposed amendments, he or she has not made the necessary decision to seek the provision of "Safe Harbor" in a timely manner, and should not be afforded the opportunity of this benefit, as prescribed in the Drug Free Workplace Program.

Therefore, the Guam Police Department is in support of this bill and respectfully request that the recommendations mentioned herein be considered and included in Bill 172-31. *Si Yit'ns Ma ase!*

Section 75107, Chapter 75 of Title 10 GCA has yet to be added to the GCA as of the date of this fiscal note. When revised in the GCA and then amended based on Bill no. 77-31, there may be some litigation and operational cost associated with such amendment; but, in its present form, this cost impact cannot be determined at this time.

The joint letter, signed by Delegate Madeleine Bordallo and eight other federal lawmakers, asks the Department of State and Department of the Interior to discuss — this summer — their concerns with the island nations that have free association agreements with the United States. Citizens of the freely associated states can enter the United States to study and work.

The U.S. lawmakers gave the two departments an Oct. 1 deadline to address their concerns and report back to them.

Bordallo said there are a number of federal laws that govern entry into the United States that prohibit regional migrants with felonies and restrict those who are likely to become public charges.

TOMORROW is going to be a busy day for Senator Adolpho Palacios' Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement & Judiciary.

Chaired by Senator Adolpho Palacios, the committee is hearing testimony on three bills in the morning at 9:30, and three more in the afternoon at 1:30 p.m.

Among the bills to be discussed are Bills 148 and 172.

Bill 148, authored by Palacios, would further ensure the safety of drivers, passengers and construction workers in areas where there is major road construction taking place.

The measure also doubles the fines for traffic citations and requires the Department of Public Works to place appropriate signs by contractors at the start and end of construction zones. The signage would include a reduced speed limit

Bill 172, authored by Frank Blas Jr., would amend the "Safe Harbor" exemption and restrictions in Chapter 75 of Title 10 in the Guam Code Annotated.

According to the bill, Safe Harbor is a term used in the Department of Administration's Drug-Free Workplace Program, which, "promulgated by Executive Order 95-29, shall not be applicable to law enforcement personnel, employees and positions, as the term is defined in subsection 75100(a), Chapter 75 Title 10 Guam Code Annotated and shall be applicable to all Test Designated Positions of the Government of Guam."

The amendment would amend the subsection as "shall not be applicable or available to any employee who among things is subject of an investigation involving drug use; the subject of an investigation that could result in an adverse action and has been arrested for





AN ACT TO *AMEND* §75107 OF CHAPTER 75 OF
TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED
RELATIVE TO SAFE HARBOR EXEMPTION AND
RESTRICTIONS.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** §75107 of Chapter 75 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is
3 hereby *amended* to read as follows:

4 **“§75107. Safe Harbor Exemption and Restriction.**

5 (a) Notwithstanding any other law, rule, executive order, regulation or
6 policy, the provision of “Safe Harbor” as the term is described in the
7 Department of Administration Drug-Free Workplace Program as promulgated
8 by Executive Order 95-29 shall not be applicable to law enforcement personnel,
9 employees and positions, as the term is defined in §75100(a), Chapter 75, Title
10 Guam Code Annotated and shall be applicable to all Test Designated
11 Positions (TDP) of the government of Guam.

12 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, rule, executive order, regulation or
13 policy, the provision of “Safe Harbor” as the term is described in the
14 Department of Administration Drug-Free Workplace Program as promulgated

1 by Executive Order 95-29 shall not be applicable or available to any employee
2 who:

3 (1) is the subject of an investigation involving drug use;

4 (2) is the subject of an investigation that could result in an
5 adverse action;

6 (3) is required to submit to a drug test for immediate
7 employment or possible promotion;

8 (4) was involved in an incident that may require or warrant a
9 drug test;

10 (5) has been found to be in violation of a rule or regulation of
11 the government of Guam; or,

12 (6) has been arrested for a drug-related offense.”
