AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 18121 AND 18122 OF CHAPTER 18 OF TITLE 16 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND SECTION 3423 OF ARTICLE 4, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 3, TITLE 11 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO ASSISTING OUR TOURISM INDUSTRY BY ALLOWING THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL RESTRICTIVELY WITHIN LIMOUSINES AND CHARTERED VEHICLES TRAVELING ON PUBLIC HIGHWAYS AND ROADS.

## 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Section 18121 of Chapter 18 of Title 16 of the Guam Code
- 3 Annotated is amended to read:
- 4 "§ 18121. Possession of Opened Container in a Motor
- 5 Vehicle. Any person who has in his or her possession on his or
- 6 her person, while in a motor vehicle upon a highway, any
- 7 bottle, can, or other receptacle, containing any alcoholic
- 8 beverage which has been opened, or a seal broken, or the
- 9 contents of which have been partially removed shall be guilty

of a misdemeanor. A. It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly transport in any moving vehicle upon a public highway, street or alley any alcoholic beverage as defined within 11GCA §3104, or any intoxicating beverage, except in the original container which shall not have been opened and from which the original cap or seal shall not have been removed, unless the opened container be in the rear trunk or rear compartment, which shall include the spare tire compartment in a station wagon or panel truck, or any outside compartment which is not accessible to the driver or any other person in the vehicle while it is in motion. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

B. The provisions of subsection A of this section shall not apply to the passenger area of buses and limousines; however, it shall be unlawful for the driver of the bus or limousine to consume or have in the driver's immediate possession any intoxicating beverage or alcoholic beverage.

C. The operator of said vehicle shall have available a copy of a valid business license and a Alcoholic Beverage Control general license specifying that the business is permitted to offer alcohol for leisure purposes on such vehicle. D. No passenger less than eighteen (18) years of age is permitted to purchase, handle or consume alcoholic beverages or intoxicating beverages of said vehicle. E. As used in this section: 1. "Bus" means a vehicle chartered for transportation of persons for hire. It shall not mean a school bus transporting children or a vehicle operated pursuant to a franchise with a city or town operating over a regularly scheduled route; and 2. "Limousine" means a chauffeur-driven motor vehicle, other than a bus or taxicab designed and used for transportation of persons for compensation.

**Section 2.** Section 18122 of Chapter 18 of Title 16 of the Guam Code Annotated is amended to read:

"§ 18122. Storage of Opened Container. A person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor if he or she is the registered owner of any motor vehicle or the driver if the registered owner is not then present in the vehicle, keeps in a motor vehicle, when the vehicle is upon any highway, any bottle, can, or other receptacle containing any alcoholic beverage which has been opened, or a seal broken, or the contents of which have been partially removed, unless the container is kept in the trunk of the vehicle, or kept in some other area of the vehicle not normally occupied by the driver or passengers, if the vehicle is not equipped with a trunk. A utility compartment or glove compartment shall be deemed to be within the area occupied by the driver and passengers. This section shall not apply to the living quarters of a house car or camper. This section shall not apply to persons and vehicles excepted by §18121 supra."

- Section 3. Section 3423, Article 4, Division 1, Chapter 3 of Title 11 of the
- 2 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read:
- 3 "§3423. Consumption on Public Way Forbidden. A
- 4 person shall not consume any alcoholic beverage on any public
- 5 highway or road while operating, or traveling in a motor
- 6 vehicle unless excepted by 16GCA §18121."
- 7 **Section 4. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its
- 8 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to
- 9 law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this
- 10 Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application,
- and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
