AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §43.31 TO CHAPTER 43 OF ARTICLE 1, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING A SPECIAL ALLEGATION TO BE KNOWN AS A "CRIME AGAINST THE COMMUNITY".

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Crime Against the Community Act".

Section 2. Legislative Statement of Intent. Most crimes adversely affect one or more persons within our community and are not to be tolerated. However, committing crimes that affect the community as a whole are particularly heinous. These types of crimes may include the theft of government property or services that result in a threat to the public health or public safety. The theft of government property (i.e.: a generator used to sustain the operation of a water pump after a typhoon), damaging property (i.e.: cutting open a water bladder placed at a school) or using services for purposes not related to the original intent for which the property or services

- 1 were provided and any other action(s) that result in a denial of government
- 2 property or services necessary to sustain life, can cause far-reaching negative
- 3 consequences. It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan that any person who is
- 4 charged with the theft of any government property or services whether
- 5 owned, leased, or borrowed, or the denial of the same, shall have the special
- 6 allegation "Crime Against the Community" added to the charge sheet.
- 7 Section 3. A new §43.31 is added to Chapter 43 of Article 1, Title 9,
- 8 Guam Code Annotated. A new §43.31 is added to Chapter 43 of Article 1,
- 9 Title 9, Guam Code Annotated to read:
- 10 "§43.31. Crime against the Community; Defined and Punishment
- 11 Classified. (a) A person is guilty of a crime against the community if he
- 12 unlawfully takes or obtains or exercises unlawful control over government-
- owned, leased, or borrowed property necessary for the delivery of public
- 14 services;
- 15 **(b)** A person is guilty of a *crime against the community* if he unlawfully
- 16 takes or obtains or exercises unlawful control over government-owned,
- 17 leased, or borrowed property or services that result in a threat to the public
- 18 health and safety;
- 19 (c) A person is guilty of a *crime against the community* if he unlawfully
- 20 takes or obtains or exercises unlawful control over government-owned,
- 21 leased, or borrowed property or services for purposes not related to the
- original intent for which the property or services were provided;

(d) A person is guilty of a *crime against the community* if he unlawfully performs any other action(s) that result in a denial of government property or services."

(e) A crime against the community constitutes a felony of the third degree and the court shall impose a sentence of imprisonment of a minimum term of one (1) year and may impose a maximum sentence of imprisonment of up to three (3) years; the minimum term imposed shall not be suspended nor may probation be imposed in lieu of the minimum term nor shall parole or work release be granted before completion of the minimum term. In addition to imprisonment, the court shall include, as part of the penalty, a mandatory sentence of five hundred (500) hours of community service to be performed upon completion of the prison sentence."
