AN ACT RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THE PROPER RESTORATION OF ROADWAYS AND HIGHWAYS THAT ARE PARTIALLY DAMAGED DUE TO CONSTRUCTION WORK TO THEIR PRE-CONSTRUCTION CONDITION BY THE CONTRACTOR PRIOR TO THE **FULL** DISBURSEMENT OF PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION FUNDS FOR SUCH PROJECTS, AND EMPOWERING GUAM'S VILLAGE MAYORS TO CERTIFY THE COMPLETION AND **ROADWAY** PROPER RE-SURFACING OF THE HIGHWAY TO ITS PREVIOUS CONDITION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings/Intent.

I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that many of Guam's roads continue to 3 be destroyed by contractors or government of Guam agencies while trying 4 to repair underground waterlines, sewage lines or other utility 5 requirements. Although there exist requirements that such roads/highways 6 be restored to the condition it was in prior to the construction work, in 7 many instances this has not been the case, and the repair work conducted 8 in these minor areas has resulted in poor road conditions, affecting 9 vehicles, i.e. tire damage, alignment problems, etc. In some cases, the 10 repair work on the roads has led to serious safety concerns, at times 11

causing people to swerve away from the repaired road area, and nearly causing accidents.

It is therefore the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to insure that any construction work conducted on Guam's roadways and highways, due to repairs of underground utilities, lines, or for other purposes, that such roads are returned to their pre-construction condition, and properly resurfaced with asphalt. Thus insuring that the people of Guam no longer have to be concerned about vehicle safety or endure unnecessary inconvenience due to minor roadway patches that are not completely or properly repaired.

Section 2. Requirement for the Proper Restoration of Guam's Roadways to Pre-Construction Conditions Prior to Complete Release of Public Construction Funds, and Empowering Mayors in the Process.

The Government of Guam, which include any and all government agencies or instrumentalities, shall henceforth be required to withhold five percent (5%) of any funds for specific projects that require the destruction of any of Guam's primary or secondary roadways or highways for the purposes of addressing utility repairs, expansions, or other work. Such funds shall be withheld until such time that the roadway or highway is appropriately repaired to pre-construction condition.

The Mayors of each village shall be empowered to certify the proper completion or resurfacing of the roadway or highway as required herein, and shall provide such written certification to the Department of Public

- 1 Works or to the contracting government of Guam agency within five (5)
- 2 working days of the request for certification. The retention of the
- 3 aforementioned construction funds shall then be immediately released by
- 4 the contracting government of Guam agency, in accordance with applicable
- 5 rules, regulations and mandates.

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Section 3. Severability Clause.

If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters held a public hearing at 9:00 a.m.. on September 01, 2005 in the Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Public notice was given to all media (see facsimile confirmation page) on August 25 and August 29, 2005 and posted in the Government Meetings Section in the August 31, 2005 edition of the PDN.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals that appeared before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill were as follows:

Marc Gagarin, Chief Engineer, Rights of Way, Department of Public Works, Oral testimony Against of Bill No. 66. Mr. Gagarin said that he believes the five percent mark, in reference to the first part of the bill, is too low and that it currently cost the government sixty percent on the construction. He said Department of Public Works is not responsible for the inspection of the repairs. He said that there are consultants and inspectors contracted by those excavating or digging up the roadways who are liable for the completion of the roadway repairs. Mr. Gagarin said that there are standards are enforced in repairing the roads. He also said that a contractor hired by a utility company to repair a trench can temporarily do patchwork on a road, but that DPW will require that the contractor hired by the utility company complete a permanent repair on the road. He said that in emergency situations, a permanent repair is not required immediately thereafter.

Nito Blas, Mayor, Mangilao, oral testimony in support of Bill No. 66. Mayor Blas said that he needs to be provided with a checklist for inspection when there is a road repair done in his village. He said the mayors need to watch out for repairs done by those excavating the roads and to "clean up the process" to ensure that repairs are done right.

Robert Lizama, Mayor, Yigo, oral testimony in support of Bill No. 66. Mayor Lizama said the term "destruction" used in Section 2 of the bill was too strong of a word and that the word should be replaced with the appropriate term "excavation". He cited a project were a contractor excavated a roadway in his village and the contractor failed to meet the requirements for repair. He said he does not want to have repeated repairs on the same excavated road when the road could be done correctly if it were inspected and certified as a "permanent fix".

John Blas, Executive Director, Mayor's Council of Guam, oral testimony in support of Bill No. 66. Mr. Blas briefly said he was present to offer support for the mayors.

Discussion:

Speaker Forbes asked Mr. Gagarin of his thoughts on GWA posting a bond for repairs or construction on roadways. Mr. Gagarin said that it would be preferable if GWA did post a bond. Speaker Forbes asked Mr. Gagarin if DPW is working on getting GWA to pay for the repairs and if they have a list of potholes identified for repairs. Mr. Gagarin said that the CCU has been given a list of potholes identified for repairs and that DPW has yet to see action from the CCU in response- specifically funding for the repairs.

Senator Kasperbauer inquired about the cost of the road repairs. Mr. Gagarin said that funding for the repairs are based on the contract's cost.

Speaker Forbes asked Mr. Gagarin if DPW has objections to the mayor's being empowered? Mr. Gagarin said yes and he was concerned about the mayor's empowerment in regards to roadway repairs. He said the language in the bill should be clarified to avoid future disputes about its authority over these matters.

Senator Won Pat, in reference to the powers of the Mayors over road repairs, briefly remarked that the word "empower" be re-written to "shall be required". She suggested that DPW conduct seminars with the mayors to be informed and educated on the process and to know what to certify off on as a complete project.

Senator Tenorio was concerned about the warranty of such road projects and the possible detoriation of roads due to faulty construction. He asked Mr. Gagarin the financial loss amount if such a situation occurs and a project needs to be re-done? Mr. Gagarin said the amount would be approximately one hundred fifty thousand (\$150,000) dollars. Senator Tenorio said that he would like to see a warranty period for any road repairs as a result of utility excavations, citing that he is aware of too many roadway projects recurring due to a project not done right, causing DPW to put out more money to have the job redone correctly. Mayor Lizama interjected by saying that a two year warranty is too long and the insurance is too expensive for the company who is liable for the repairs. Mayor Lizama said that every project must have a bond and that the bond be returned to the contractor after the project has been certified and completed.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters finds that the intent of Bill No. 66 would insure that roads that are excavated for utility repairs and or construction are rebuilt and resurface to its preconstruction state. The committee further finds that many accidents have occurred along Guam's roadways as a result of a driver's diversion to avoid bumps, dips or potholes along Guam's roads and has presented a expense burden on the many taxpayers and victims of these accidents. The committee finds that our resident's are unnecessarily burdened with increasing cost on their car insurance for auto repairs and/ or damages resulting from the poor conditions of Guam's roads and are also challenged with maintaining good driving skills in a poorly constructed road filled with bumps, dips and potholes. The committee further finds that this measure will make those excavating the roads accountable for its repairs.
