AN ACT TO AMEND §80115 OF TITLE 10 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO RESTORE PUBLIC ACCOUNTABILITY TO THE FINANCES OF THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* recognizes that since its creation the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority ("GMHA") has struggled to operate as a fully functional autonomous agency.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan has determined that GMHA is unable to meet its operating expenses on the basis of revenues generated by the hospital. I Liheslaturan Guåhan has been requested over the years for subsidies directly from the General Fund, from special funds established for other uses, as well as major allocations from Compact-Impact Reimbursement Funds. I Liheslaturan Guåhan further notes that while the Medically Indigent Program ("MIP") provides substantial payments for services of GMHA, MIP is funded exclusively by the General Fund.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan also recognizes that despite these subsidies, GMHA is unable to reliably maintain adequate supplies of medicines and supplies, resulting in critical shortages of both for patients, as well as use in the hospital, including use

during surgical procedures. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that this inability to maintain adequate stocks of necessary medicines and supplies results in degraded service to its patients and presents the possibility of a threat to life and health. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* also finds that despite requested subsidies, GMHA remains unable to guarantee timely payments to the Retirement Fund and other routine payments obligated by law. Through these and other administrative shortcomings, GMHA has undermined public confidence in its readiness to serve the medical needs of our people and neighbors in the region's only full service civilian hospital.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan has determined that since GMHA is heavily subsidized by the General Fund, and since GMHA continues to experience multi-million dollar miscalculations in regard to its annual financial needs, and in consideration of the advantages of a full public review and scrutiny of GMHA's expenditures, it is appropriate that GMHA submit its budget to I Liheslaturan Guåhan for approval at this time, in the same way that most executive departments and agencies do, including autonomous agencies such as the University of Guam.

**Section 2.** Section 80115 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"Section 80115. Mandatory Annual Budget. Annually, before August 1 May 1, the Board shall submit a comprehensive program and financial plan, which shall be the budget for the Authority and all its operations for the subsequent fiscal year, to the Legislature in a budget format utilized by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research for the Executive Branch. The program and financial shall contain the information set out in 5 GCA § 5106 4106, which is used by Executive Branch departments and agencies, except that in all cases the information must include all proposed expenditures by object category

and by line item and a complete proposed staffing pattern, including all contractual, classified, unclassified, part-time, limited term or temporary employees. If the Legislature does not reject the comprehensive program and financial plan within sixty (60) days of its submittal to the Legislature, the program and plan is deemed approved. The Legislature must approve, and may amend, the comprehensive program and financial plan, in bill form, in the same manner as the Legislature must approve the annual budget law for the Executive Branch."

**Section 3. Interpretation.** This act is intended to require Legislative approval of the annual budget of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority. Any apparent conflict between the provisions of this act and any other section of the Guam Code Annotated shall be resolved in favor of this act.
